# Of mothers and life

Well, with the annual commemoration of maternity this Sunday, we wonder just what traits we need to make up the deal mother, even in these times of sexual equality.

She should start by giving her Infant a strong sense of proection and confidence. Mothering, with a blend of tenderness and strength, is probably the most important single factor in the ultimate development of a healthy adult.

When a toddler takes those first-uncertain-steps-out-of the nest, the mother is there to provide guidance and encouragement. She should also encourage the father to play his part in the family, from changing diapers to helping the tot realize that the world is full of friendship and love.

At the same time, the ideal mother reassures her husband that he has not lost his place in the family, that the home does not revolve exclusively around the one tiny center. Parenting today is best done as a two person job, but in

most-families it is still the mother who has the most contact with the very smallest members. With her husband, she teaches children that the world-is full-of happiness-and also of decisions between right and

wrong: There are stoves and radiators that it is wrong to touch; games and songs it is right to learn and to enjoy The mother today plays a major part in teaching little boys and girls that it is right to be strong and determined—and that it is equally right to respond to certain situations with

tears and a return to the nest. As children grow older, it is most often the mother who guides her children on the road to responsibility and in-dependence. Homework must be done on time. Mistakes

must be paid for. As children grow into adolescence, a mother's and father's, responsibilities become more complex. Youngsters more and more should learn to make their own decisions, but parents should provide a measure of guidance to avert disasters. A teen—ager merits listening to, not just being ordered. He or she should be able to make his own major educational and vocational decisions, with guidance perhaps, but according to what he or she thinks is best.

Eventually, most children leave the nest for good and start setting up their own homes and, in time, families.
