



OPINION

Please be careful

On any weekday when schools open in the morning and close in the afternoon-and especially in bad weather-the streets in front of most schools are a traffic policeman's nightmare. Horns honk, brakes screech; irritated voices shout confusing directions, cars are double and triple parked, and in the nidst of all this chaos hundreds of-small children are trying

to get to school and home safely. The three ring circus confusion is created by parents who drive their children to and from school. A large percentage of all vehicle traffic around some schools is made up of parents. chauffeuring their children.

The New Jersey Safely Council says parents do not leliberately create hazardous conditions for school children but many parents drive their children to school and home in the mistaken belief, that it is safer, for them to ride than to walk. Actually, the safety agency points out, more children, are injured on the way to and from school in cars than on foot: While responsibility for the parent drop off and pick-up problem rests with the individual parents, schools can ease the problem by asking parents not to create unnecessary hazardous conditions for their children and the-children-of other parents. The Safety Council points out some of the most

dangerops practices of which parents are guilty; 1). Loading and unloading children across the street from the school, encouraging children to open doors on the street side and either run across or dart around the back of the car to the curb.

2) Epading and unloading in mid-block across the street from the school, where there are no crossing "helps" such as _ crosswalks, patrols and lights. This tempts pupils to disregard the safety rules they have been taught. 3) Double parking by parents makes triple trouble by

obstructing the vision of walking children, encouraging their own child to walk from between parked cars, and by their setting bad examples of their disregard for the law. 4) Stopping too close to crosswalks is an unfair act both to the pupils who are crossing and to the safety patrols trying to

aid them. 5)-Stopping_in_areas_designated_for_school_bus_loading_and_ unloading, and blocking service driveways, creates hazards for children and contributes to traffic jams.

6) Disregarding traffic control, ignoring one-way signs, and making U-turns makes for the worst traffic foul-ups and the utmost safety hazards. Congressman
