My effort to ban the sale of drug paraphernalia has received a big boost from the U.S. Supreme Court.

The court ruled that communities have a right to ban the sale of drug-related accessories to minors and to control sales to adults.

The Illinois ordinance upheld by the nation's highest court was similar to a New Jersey law, which I sponsored, that bans the sale of drug-related accessories.

Yet unlike the New Jersey law, the Illinois ordinance does not bar the sale of drug paraphernalia to adults, it merely requires that retailers be licensed and keep a log of sales to customers for police inspection.

Enforcement of the New Jersey law has been delayed for more than a year pending the outcome of a court challenge.

As a result of the Supreme Court ruling, I am confident that we can move swiftly in New Jersey to crack down on those businesses that glorify the use of drugs.

The New Jersey statute is based on a model statute drafted by the Federal Drug Enforcement Administration that

bars the sale of such items as spoons, pipes and scales if they are "intended for use" in sniffing, smoking or weighing illegal drugs.

The nation's highest court has given an encouraging sign that New Jersey was on the right track when it enacted my ban on drug paraphernalia.

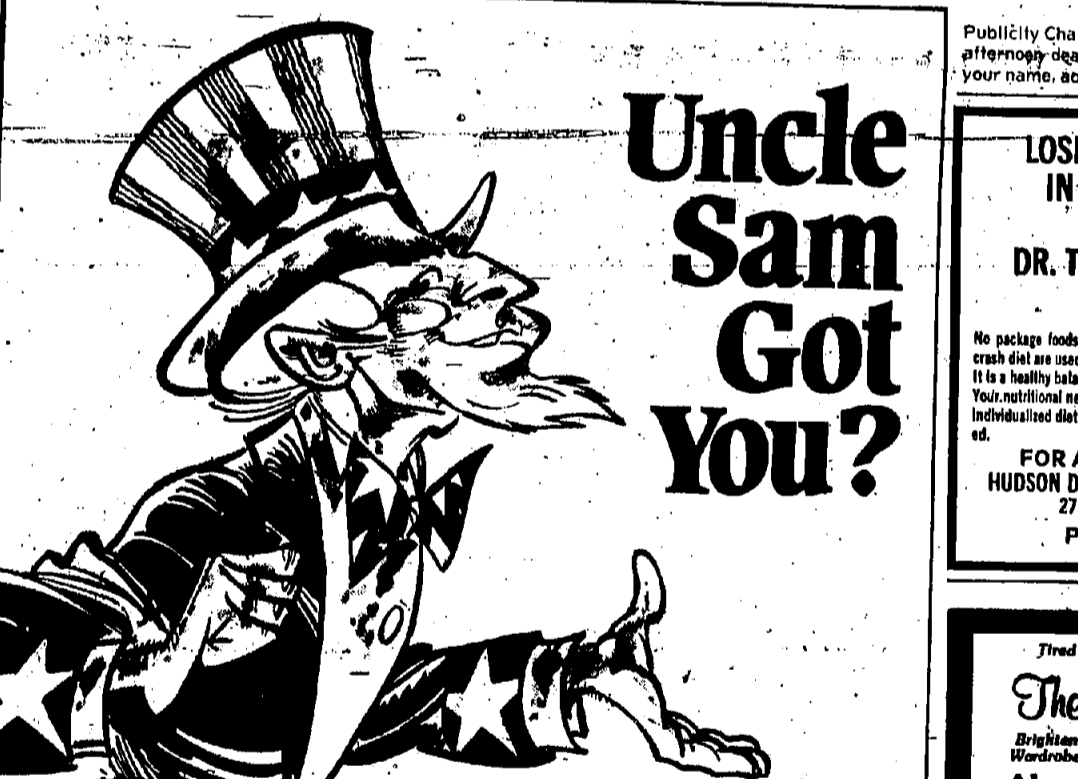

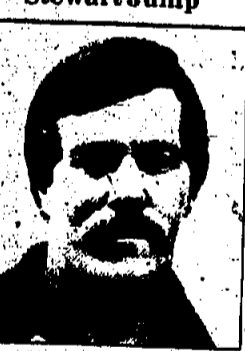

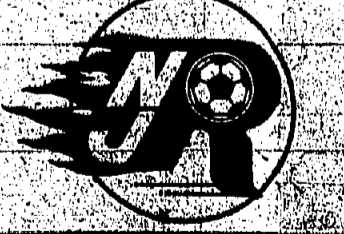
