



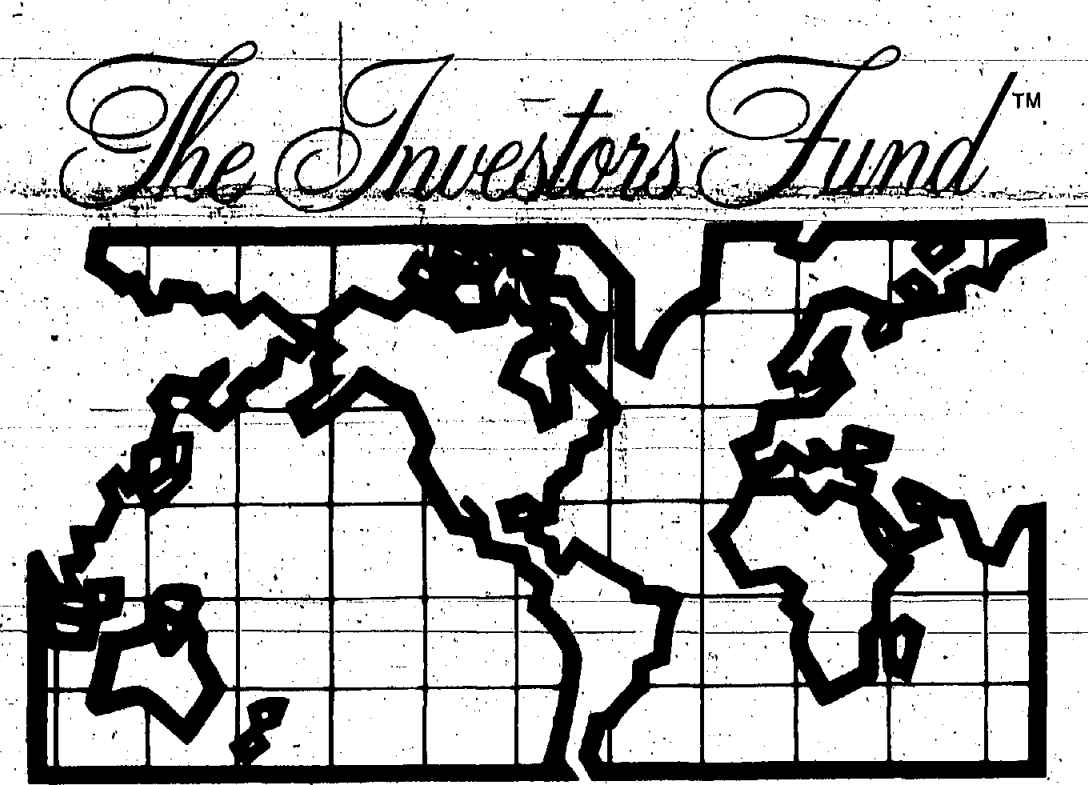

## Golfers outnumbering skiers so far

"When there's snow, it really gets packed out there," a Union County Parks official said of the slopes at Galloping Hill Golf Course, "especially on the sleigh hills."

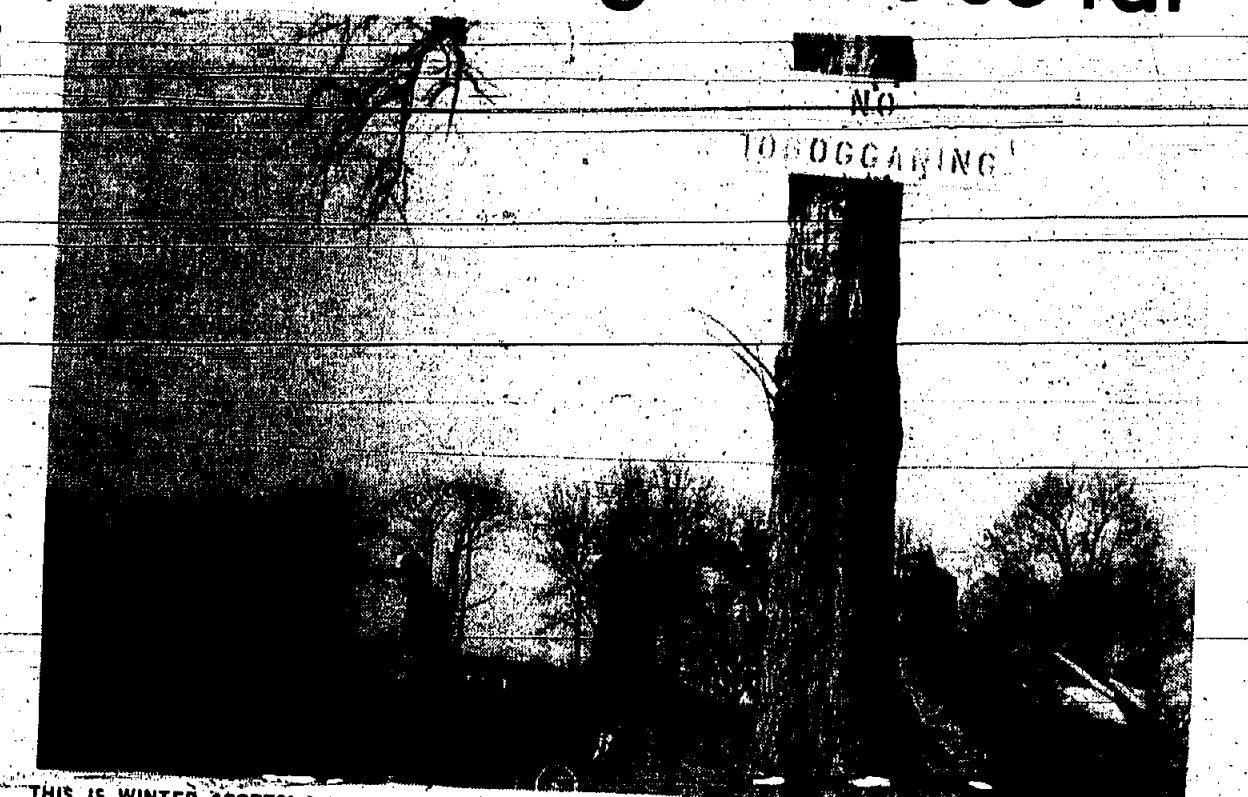
Well, two weeks into January, the rolling hills at the county-run course in Union are indeed packed with local residents, but there's a darty sleigh-rider among them. In fact, winter sports enthusiasts in Union County have had little opportunity to don their skis or to slide the Christmas sled out of the garage this year. Golfers, on the other hand, — and not just die-hard links-lovers either — are enjoying one of the warmest winter playing seasons in recent memory.

According to Jean Laham, program coordinator of special events for the Union County Department of Parks and Recreation, two of the three public courses in the county are still open to golfers. Oak Ridge Golf Course, which was scheduled to close for the season Dec. 27 but will remain open indefinitely, weather permitting, she said. Ashbrook Golf Course, Scotch Plains, is closed and not slated to reopen until March.

The Department of Parks and Recreation oversees a variety of winter sports throughout the county, including ice skating, downhill and cross country skiing and sleigh riding. Laham noted, however, that the absence of snow and ice has not halted all of the department's winter activities.

Besides golf, area residents also can take advantage of the trap and skeet range in Lenape Park — on the border of Kenilworth and Cranford — the Watchung Stables in Summit or the Trailside Nature and Science Center in Mountainside. All three are open year-round, closing only for "real bad snowstorms," Laham said. And unless the temperature climbs too high, Warinanco Park Ice Skating Center in Roselle will offer skating, complete with lessons, all season long.

If the mercury and the snow happen to fall this year, Galloping Hill Golf Course will be the center for winter sports in Union County, Laham said.

ed. The course has two downhill ski slopes — one beginner, one intermediate — and two cross country ski trails — a half-mile trail and a three-mile trail. It also has a pair of sleigh riding and cross country skiing and sleigh riding. Laham noted, however, that the absence of snow and ice has not halted all of the department's winter activities.

Unsupervised cross country skiing also is available at Ashbrook, with a two mile trail, and Oak Ridge, which has a one mile trail. While the man-made ice at Warinanco is the only county spot with skating now, some 16 other sites may yet be utilized this winter. Lighted ice skating areas are: Warinanco Park Lake, Roselle; Rahway River Park at Meisel Avenue Lake; Rahway River Park Lake; Bryant Park Lake, Springfield; Galloping Hill on the flooded practice green; Echo Lake Park, the upper lake; Mountainside, and Unami Park on a flooded parking lot, Garwood.

Until skating areas are: Warinanco Park Lagoon; Elizabeth River Park Woodruff section (Hooded); Union and Hillside; Black Brook Park, Kenilworth; Nomahegan Park Lake, Cranford, and Milton Lake Park lake, Clark and Rahway. The Watchung Reservation, Springfield, has two skating sites on Surprise Lake — upper and lower — as does Green Brook Park, Plainfield.

Some upcoming county park-sponsored events include: Hat Night at Warinanco rink, tomorrow from 8:30 p.m. to 10:30 p.m., with prizes awarded for best hats; a cross country ski tour of the Watchung Reservation, beginning at the Trailside Nature and Science Center Jan. 23 at 2 p.m. (cross country ski movies will be shown if there is no snow); a winter search party will get underway at Trailside Jan. 30 at 2 p.m. to "search for evidence of life in winter's deep freeze," and maple sugaring will take place at Trailside Feb. 20 at 2 p.m.



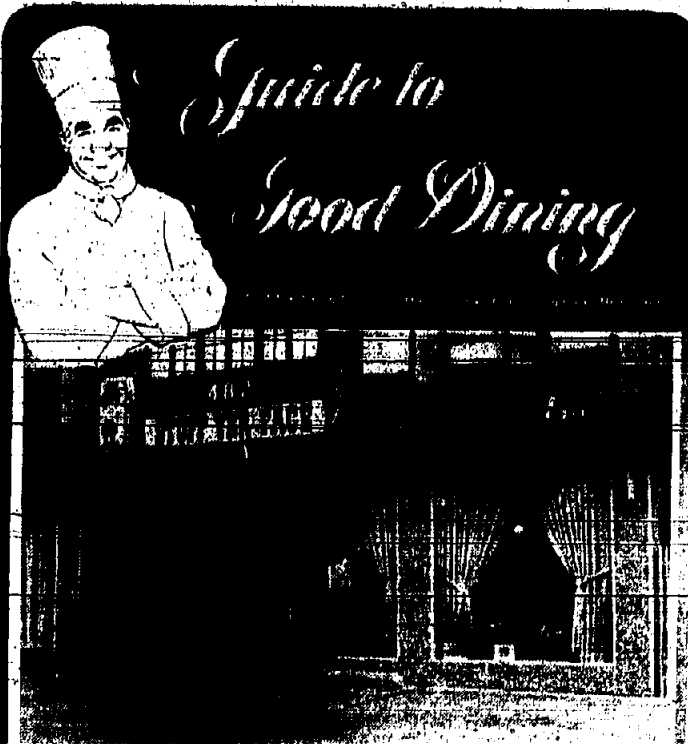

## Stuff Yer Face offers delicious stromboli

Some people go out to eat for a specific kind of food, like chicken or burgers, but let's face it. Chicken and hamburger eateries are dime a dozen. There's only one place in Union County you can't get a chicken or hamburger sandwich. That's Stuff Yer Face located at 482 Rahway Ave. in Elizabeth.

It is truly the fun place to go for a delicious but extremely fulfilling snack. When I first told readers about Stuff Yer Face in mid-August, I categorized a stromboli as one of my favorite things. This song remains the same, and since that time I've tasted other stromboli at Stuff Yer Face that deserve a fond mention.

To refamiliarize you with the pertinent data on the stromboli, allow me to describe this dining delight. A stromboli is a closed sandwich with the bread freshly baked around your favorite filling along with cheese, tomato sauce, onions and peppers. There are over 15 various fillings offered so you can visit Stuff Yer Face repeatedly to sample a different kind each time.

This time around, I suggest Emily's ball made with the usual elements plus eggplant, mushrooms, broccoli and cauliflower. It's more than a mouthful to handle, but each fresh ingredient complements the other, making the effort needed to finish the whole thing well worth it.

My pick is the steak ball. Considerably more basic than Emily's but quite enough to satisfy my appetite. Being a steak sandwich lover, the ball enables me to taste all of my favorite, boardwalk-style toppings with the meat savored in a delicate crust. Neither Sealside Heights nor Wildwood boardwalk food stands have ever served anything as uniquely delicious.

Gourmet food eaters will also find a ball to please. I recommend the cord-on bleu type composed of chicken and ham along with the special added ingredients that provide a rewarding blend.

One of the most enjoyable ways to visit Stuff Yer Face is with a group of friends or colleagues. Each order the same size stromboli and see who finishes first. The challenge is fun but the real contest occurs when a daring but extremely hungry few attempt to tackle the likes of a huge stromboli in one sitting.

The feat is rare, but not impossible. Rick Hathaway, who has owned Stuff Yer Face for nearly two years, can cite some examples of those who have tried and succeeded in devouring a huge (whole) ball. A large (half) is the other size available.

Coming soon to Stuff Yer Face will be "Breakfast" served daily from 7-11 a.m. The name was coined to signify that only fresh ingredients will be featured at breakfast. Start the day off right with a fritata-open omelette with your choice of vegetables and meats.

Accompany this with freshly baked biscuits, muffins, fresh ground coffee and fresh squeezed orange juice. Of course you'll also find egg balls on the menu made of scrambled eggs, meat and the characteristic additions.

Aside from balls, Stuff Yer Face also offers pizza, grilled hamburgers made of 100 percent beef and various Italian and American hot and cold sandwiches.

Probably one of the things I like best about Stuff Yer Face is that it's a casual spot where you can enjoy a satisfying meal, relax, and be yourself. Bring along wine or beer and perhaps try your hand at a video game while visiting the restaurant.

Stuff Yer Face is open daily from 11 a.m. to midnight and until 1 a.m. Friday and Saturday. Visa and Mastercard are accepted.

Stop by Stuff Yer Face for breakfast, lunch, dinner or a late evening snack. After eating a scrumptious ball, you may say to yourself "I can't believe I ate the whole thing," but you'll be glad that you did.

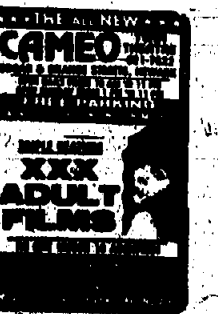
