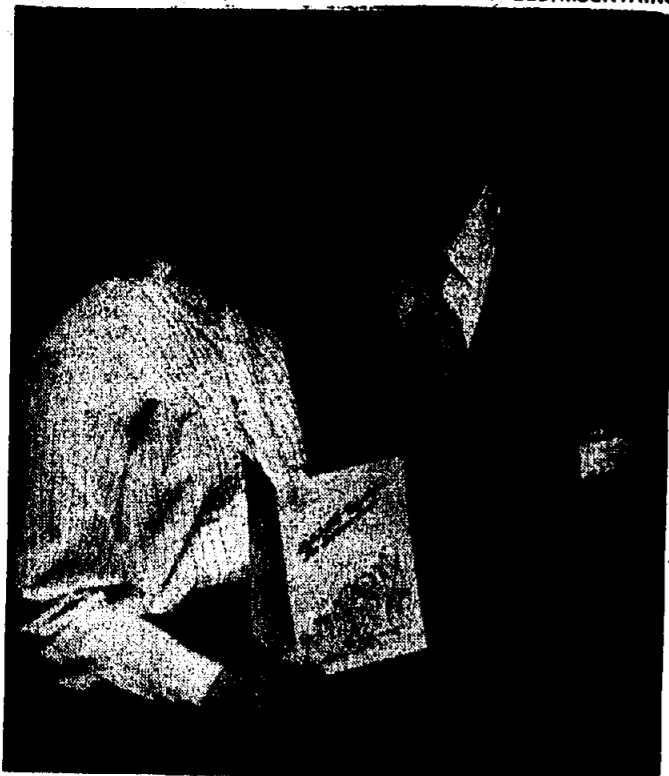

These were some of the thoughts expressed by Italian students who spent a few weeks last summer with families in Union, Kenilworth, Roselle Park, Cranford and Springfield.

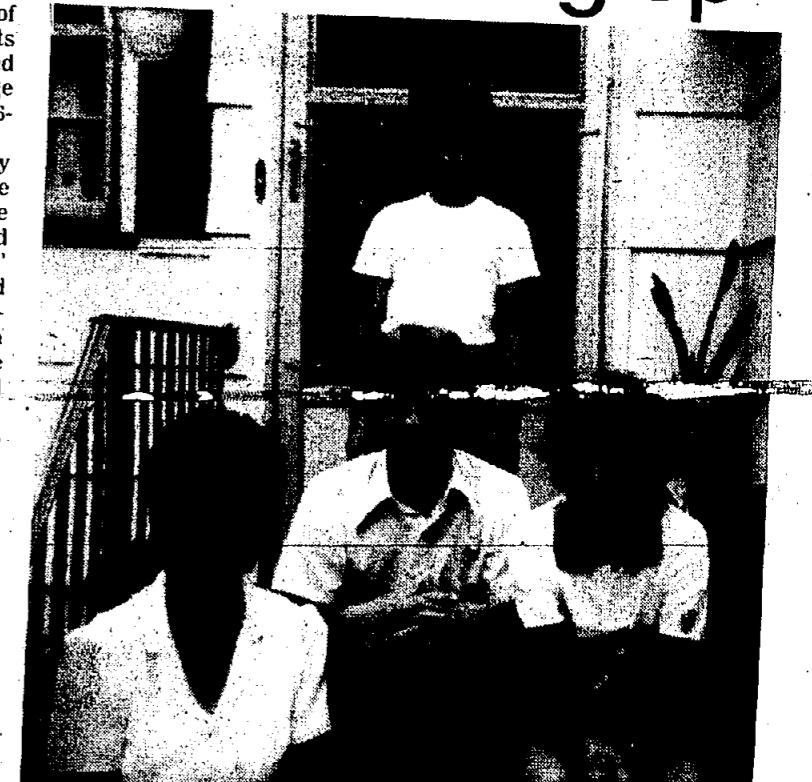

A new series of Respiratory Evaluation and Support Program (RESP) classes for those who have emphysema, chronic bronchitis or other long-term breathing problems will begin May 25 at Alexian Brothers Hospital, Elizabeth.

The program is offered by Alexian Brothers in cooperation with the American Lung Association of Central New Jersey.

Interested patients are invited to call the hospital at 351-9000 or the Lung Association at 388-4556 for RESP information and application forms.

Understanding of the condition; to stress the benefits of planned physical therapy, and to provide an incentive for the patient to sustain a routine of exercise, proper diet and good health habits.

The program is open to adults 18 years of age or older with problems involving the respiratory system and who are under the care of a physician. The RESP service augments the care provided by the physician and a physician referral is required for entry into the program.

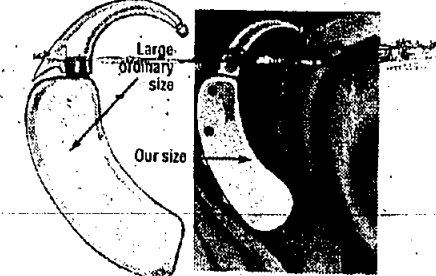

## State's second peace site dedicated at Kean College

A Peace Education Resource Center dedicated at Kean College of New Jersey in Union recently is one of 16 peace sites around the country.

Louis Kousin of New Jersey SANE, who presented a plaque to Dr. Nathan Weiss, president of the college, said peace sites will be established nationwide in colleges, houses of worship, schools and other institutions. He said they would be an "antonym for the military sites all over the landscape."

Weiss accepted the plaque, which is inscribed with a quotation from the prophet Isaiah on beating swords into plowshares.

He said that just as warring is a subject for study, so peace should be too, so that the resolution of conflicts on the international through the personal level should occur in non-destructive creative ways.

Kousin said that Ramapo College houses the other college peace site in New Jersey. He said he hopes that the establishment of peace sites on campuses eventually will lead to a curriculum in peace and that such a curriculum is being considered at Harvard University.

Kean College will hang its peace plaque in a room to be designated in September. The center will contain literature and other materials for the study of peace.

Dr. George Burt of Fair Haven, a professor of philosophy at Kean College and advisor to the peace center student leaders, said the center is something the students put together themselves. He called it a place for many points of view since there has been no good thinking so far on how to achieve world peace.

Dr. Elizabeth Huberman of

Maplewood, a professor of English and chairperson of the English department, said the people have to force the government to see the necessity for nuclear control.

Professor Alan Gilchrist of Rutgers University-Newark, a co-founder of Social Scientists against Nuclear War, told the nearly 100 persons gathered for the dedication not to become immobilized by focusing on the danger.

He urged the consideration of a "realistic route toward disarmament," which he maintained will be through negotiated treaties between the two superpowers. He said 14 treaties signed by the U.S. and the U.S.S.R. since 1962 have been kept, with the exception of the non-proliferation treaty.

Gilchrist accused the Reagan Administration of misleading the U.S. public by stressing the superiority of Soviet land-based missile systems without regard to America's much more strikeable sea and air launched missile armada. He said the Administration ignores the fact that U.S. bases surround

the Soviet Union and that Soviet missiles are not as accurate. He also said the Soviets have nothing comparable to the B-52 long range bomber.

## Young job seekers must apply for Social Security card

Young people who are planning to apply soon for their first summer job and who do not have a Social Security number should remember to apply for a number at least three weeks before they will need it, John H. McCutcheon, Social Security district manager in Elizabeth, said recently.

Most employers will not accept applications from people who do not have a Social Security number, so it is a good idea to get a number before looking for a job, McCutcheon said.

To get a Social Security number, the applicant must provide proof of date of birth, identity and U.S. citizenship or immigrant status. Those 18 or over must apply in person.

The best proof of date of birth and

citizenship is a public or hospital birth record recorded before age five or a religious record of birth or baptism recorded before age five. Foreign born applicants should provide their immigration or naturalization documents as well.

Identity can be established by such records as driver's license, state identity card, voter's registration, school record, school ID, report-card, marriage record, work badge or building pass, labor or fraternal organization record, draft card or military ID, U.S. passport, newspaper birth announcement, adoption record, court order for change of name, church membership or confirmation record, welfare case record, medical or hospital record, vaccination certificate, in-

urance policy, day care or nursery school record, Boy or Girl Scout membership, or any other document showing identifying data such as physical description, photograph, or signature.

Applications for a Social Security number can be obtained at the Elizabeth Social Security office, located at 342 Westminster Ave. The telephone number is 800-272-1111.

## 'Man of La Mancha' set for Paper Mill Playhouse

Jerome Hines, star of the Metropolitan Opera, will repeat his dual roles in the stage musical, "Man of La Mancha," which opens May 18 at the Paper Mill Playhouse, Millburn. It will run through June 26.

Hines, who appeared at the Paper Mill in the roles of Miguel Cervantes, the great Spanish novelist, and Don Quixote, will be seen transforming himself on the stage from one role to the next in about 50 seconds.

"Man of La Mancha" is both an adaptation of "Don Quixote" to modern musical terms and an incorporation of the life of Cervantes himself. Cervantes, who loved the theater, wrote about 40 plays in 20 years, which were successful. In 1597, he was excommunicated for "offenses against His Majesty's Most

Catholic Church," narrowly escaping more drastic punishment. He served from three to five years in prison on various charges. His imprisonment, it was reported, may have prompted him to write his story about the slightly balmly Spaniard, who imagined he was a medieval knight confronting dragons; who went questing around the country for good causes he could defend.

Dale Wasserman wrote the television drama, "I, Don Quixote," that was nominated for a 1960 Emmy and won that year's Writer's Guild Award. He enlarged his television script into a non-musical stage play which was at once opted for a Broadway production. Persuaded to rewrite it as a musical, Wasserman later was introduced to Mitch Leigh and Joe Darion, who would provide the music and lyrics.
