

Which leads us right into our topic-the important part "rain" may again play in the coming Township elections. Of course, it appears like stretching the idea a bit that "rain" could have any hearing on the outcome of a Township Com?" mittee contest but if the flooded conditions, as experienced by a great number of residents after last week-end rains, continge, it wouldn't purprise anybody that things may happen in the sheltered confines of the voting booth.

An aroused group pounded their wet and muddled feet into the Township Meeting room just before last years elections to protest against the apparent indifference and neglect on the part of somebody in eliminating a deplorable condition which has not improved even after a year of engineering conferences and proposals.

Last Sunday's heavy rains, racing and cascading over the spill ways of water swollen back yards into the cellars, has again stirred up home owners especially in the Hawthorn and Henshaw avenue sections. They are organizing to march on to the Town-Hall-anddemand some relief. Their plight should get immediate action from somebody-whether it is the township committee or the county.

We have no way of knowing the answers-but the developer, the contractor who had to deal-with Springfield authorities in building-those homes in the Henshaw and Hawthorn avenue section might even, at this late date have some responsibility in the matter and should be compelled to cure these conditions if it is caused by improper draining or some faulty construction.

There is one case where the home is built below the street or sewer grading-we don't know which except that the developer blames the Springfield engineer and the town engineersays it is the contractor's mistake. Anyway-this particular house has an indoor swimming pool throughout most of the year with stagnant, greenish_covered_water filling the low part of the cellar. It became so serious at one time that the owner sent in a frantic call to the Township authorities and a pump was amployed to keep the rising waters from apreading to other parts of the home.

Flood conditions aren't typed just for the Henshaw and-Hawthorn avenue sections. Residents of other parts of Springfieldthese in the Battle Hill and Washington avenue area-have some warped pieces of furniture to show for-last Sunday's heavy rain.

We will admit that it was a very heavy rain and this monthmay go on the record as the wettest March in history. In the first fifteen-days, there was 6.06 inches of rainfall which was only .84 of an inch below the record high for the month-7.9 inches in 1876. And it seemed as though most of this record rainfall could he found in the backyards and collars of those aroused citizens in the Hawthorn avenue area.

If we have sunny weather right before election-then, just like the chap-with the leaky root, everything will be quiet. But, If it happens to rain and the back yards begin to look like Jones Beach, they had better come rushing with their pumps and buckets. There's no fury like a home owner with wet and mudded galoshes.

THAT'S HOW POLITICAL PARTIES ARE BORN

William S. Quinlan who wields a very articulate typewriter and knows whereof he speaks, gives us another lesson in political history in the very interesting letter printed below. The first paragraph/starts off with the promise of some atom bombing but it cools off in the second and then levels off into a very fine dissertation on how political parties are born. We would like to see Mr. Quinian really aroused in front of a typewriter; that would make some real reading.

Here's Mr. Quinlan's letter:

Editor. Sun:--Your issue of March 12 carried, on page one, two news articles referring to "splinter parties" in a derogatory way. It is safe to infer that the motive in each case is to induce voter opposition to any appirant for office who does not choose to use the regular party machinery,

Without "splinter partles" the political history of the United States would-not be the thrilling story that it is. Let us first examine the origins of the two important parties of our time.

"The "Republican Party" was the name applied to the group organized by Thomas-Jefferson, patron saint of present day Democrats. Later it was called the "Democratic Republican" party and then the "Democratic Party".

The Republican party we know today originated in the 1850's, being composed of splinters of the Democratic and Whig Parties. supported by groups from the Free Soil Party, the Abolitionists and the Know-Nothing Party.

Serious cleavages have occurred throughout its century of history, the most important perhaps being that of 1912 when Theodore Roosevelt became the leader of the Progressive or "Bull Moose" party.

The Democratic Party was not thus officially labeled until two years-after-Jefferson's death. It, too, has a long history of dissen slon, cleavage, and factional disputes that have, on many-occasions, produced parties within the party. One great display of Democratic-disunity came in the 1928 presidential election. History is replete with instances of splinter movements in other fields of human endeavor; the cause is always the same-the unquenchable spirit of man driving him to seek change and progress. We must not assume that OUR great political parties cannot -disappear. In England the Liberal Party was formed in 1832, and in its one hundred years of service to Britain and the Empire produced great leaders, among them being Palmerston, William Ewart Gladstone ("The Grand Old Man" of English politics) and David Lloyd George. For many reasons, chief among which was the -advent of the Labour Party, the Liberal Party began a steady decline and was gasping for breath in the 1945 elections. In 1951 this once great organization won only six of six hundred twentyfour seats in Parliament. For good or evil a similar, fate probably awaits one of our large political groups if and when the powerful labor aggregations-unite-their-efforts-in-the-field of-government,-The great leaders who brought forth this nation were men of faith, of vision, men great in mind and spirit, and above all they were_INDEPENDENT-men.
