Voters elect local officials to run their municipalities, boards of education to conduct the operations of their school districts, and freeholders to direct their county governments, but the State Legislature each year enacts more bills taking away from local officers more of the authority and responsibility to do the jobs for which they were elected by their neighbors.

The current Legislature, reports the New Jersey Tax payers Association, has before it many bills proposing to/tie further the hands of the men and women who were elected to run the local governments.

- Under various measures now pending-
- -All school districts with more than 1,000 pupils in/daily attendance would be required to hire a full time school nurse;
- -Local school boards would be required to pay and promote school teachers in accordance with a state-imposed minimum teachers' salary schedule;
- -Local school and county officials would be required to pay the cash equivalent to employees who do not use the sick leave granted under present state law;
- -Local and county offices would be required to close on Saturdays throughout the year under one measure, while another would close them on Saturdays during the-summer-months only: -
- -Monmouth and Atlantic counties would be required to pay their sheriff, county clerk and surrogate \$10,000 a year each under one bill, while other measures would adjust salaries of various county officers throughout the state:
- -A 40-hour week would be established for county, municipal and school district employees;
