 of New Jersey's state-supported institutions by 1965.  
 Its proposals refer to specific expansions in New Jersey's state university and five teachers' colleges. With the situation of shortage of facilities in New Jersey, other states are understandably closing their doors to our students, and it becomes obvious that no temporary or short-term measures based upon expediency will solve the problem.  
 The report states that in 1954, about 20% of young people of New Jersey of college age were attending college as full time students. This percentage is estimated to increase to 25% by 1965 and to 30% by 1973. In other words, it is estimated that by 1973 there will be 155,000 New Jersey youths wanting to go to college. On the basis of known expansion plans of colleges, inside and outside of the state, about 72,000 will be able to gain college admission and 83,000 will have no place to go.  
 The final proposal of the State Board of Education for the needed expansion for higher education in New Jersey is for a bond issue, which would amount to \$76,500,000, to be paid off annually at about \$34 million per year.  
 If the ideal of equality of opportunity is to be realized in the State of New Jersey, provision must be made for higher education for all qualified youth. Something must be done immediately. The Legislature must do it.  
 We can take the first step to help solve the problem by writing the Governor and our legislators, letting them know we are aware of the tremendous need, and urging them to make provisions for solving the higher education problem—NOW.  
 Let the Governor and Legislators know you are alert to college needs and encourage them to do something about the situation in the budget now being made up.


## Fear For Lives Of Local Pair In Venezuela

Friends and relatives of Mr. and Mrs. William A. Konrad, of 210 Hawthorne Avenue, are reported very concerned over the safety of the Springfield couple who arrived a few days ago in the revolution torn city of Caracas, Venezuela.  
 Mr. Konrad was assigned to a six-month assignment in Caracas by his employer, the Creole Petroleum Corporation. He and Mrs. Konrad arrived in the capital city just days before the revolt against dictator Perez Jimenez broke out. Dispatches in The New York Times indicated yesterday

that riots had crippled the entire city.  
 Mr. Konrad's home office, in New York told the Springfield SUN yesterday that "Every indication is that everyone is safe." The New York offices are in continuous communication with Caracas, but report that all references to the political situation are heavily censored.  
 Attempts by the Konrad family to get direct word from the besieged couple have been frustrated by military censorship and breakdown in communications.  
 The Konrads sailed from New York on the SS Santa Rosa for the Creole Petroleum Corporation which does a great deal of business in oil-rich Venezuela. Mr. Konrad is now working in the Petroleum Economics Department in Caracas, where Creole's headquarters are located.
