 Ludwig A. Norulak of 78 Franklin place, Springfield, an accountant and a double amputee who was active with Phil Ruzuto, former Yankee shortstop in combating juvenile delinquency, died yesterday at the Veterans Hospital, East Orange. He was 36 years old.

Mr. Norulak lost both legs at the Battle of Cassino in Italy during World War II. He did physical therapy work at the Kessler Institute in West Orange.

Born in Newark, Mr. Norulak lived here four years. He was a graduate of West Side High School, Newark, and of the Manhattan School of Music, New York, where he received a bachelor's degree in vocal studies in 1950. He was last employed as a bookkeeper in Summit.

Mr. Norulak was a sergeant in the 45th Division and served in Europe. He entered the Army in March, 1943, and was discharged in June 1945, with injuries sustained at Cassino. He was past commander of the Sgt. Warren F. Conley Post 26, DAV, and of the New Jersey Amputation Chapter No. 53, both of Irvington. He was a member of the Pfc. Joseph Horvath Post, VFW, of Newark, and the Loyal Order of Moose, Irvington.

He leaves his wife, Mrs. Joyce Williams Norulak; a son, Phillip; and three daughters, Judith, Linda and Kim, all at home; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Norulak, and a sister, Miss Helen Norulak of Irvington, and three brothers, August, Victor and Frank of Newark.

The funeral was held Tuesday from the Muha Funeral Home, 263-18th Ave., Newark, with a Mass at 9 a.m. in St. James Church, Springfield.

MY REPORT TO THE PEOPLE

By Congresswoman FLORENCE P. DWYER

The question of ethics in government is seldom very far removed from the thought and mind of official Washington.

And so much the better—for the problem of an adequate and enforceable code of behavior for public officials is, as a matter of principle, of fundamental importance in a representative system of government; and yet, as a practical matter, it is complicated by subtle distinctions, involved relationships and the imponderables of personal motive and purpose.

It should be recognized right at the beginning that as long as people are human there will be no practicable way of guaranteeing that everyone in government service will behave entirely honorably. There will always be the exception, the "weak and the greedy, toward whom "fixers" and "influence peddlers" inevitably are drawn.

But even though it is true that a code cannot be legislated, it can certainly be encouraged and temptation discouraged by a wider recognition and acceptance of certain ethical principles and guidelines as they apply especially to those holding positions of public trust.

This whole question has been raised again recently as a result of the investigation by a House subcommittee of the so-called "swansons lobby." It is also involved in Senate hearings on legislation to establish standards of conduct for judicial-type proceedings before Federal regulatory agencies—not to mention several conflict-of-interest measures which have been allowed to languish on the shelves of Congressional committees.

A Code of Ethics
Despite the different circumstances each of these cases involves, there are basic considerations that make them all, at heart, part of the same question of what constitutes proper official conduct. In an effort to provide guidance toward an answer, Congress last year approved a "Code of Ethics for Government Service." This Code was necessarily general but nonetheless valuable because it stressed a number of these basic considerations.

Briefly, the Code of Ethics distinguished carefully between public and private activities and in effect emphasized that a person's private and personal considerations must not be allowed to influence what he does as a public official. For example, the Code specifies that people in Government service should not discriminate unfairly between others, nor should they dispense special favors or privileges, nor

such as personal friendship with former official employed by defense contractors, have entered into the award of contracts. No conclusions have yet been reached; though a number of proposals have been advanced to regulate the conditions under which former military officers may work for defense firms doing business with the Government. It seems to me that any final rule should respect both the right of the Government to protect itself from undue influence and the right of retired officers to find suitable employment and put their talents to productive use. The line which separates these two "rights" is often a narrow one, but one which must be carefully drawn.

The same principles apply to such matters as the waste and mismanagement sometimes found in foreign aid programs, as in Laos and Viet-Nam.

A Case in Point
At the risk of oversimplifying the issues, these general principles are directly applicable to the cases I've mentioned.

Take the question of defense contracts, for example. The immense cost of the planes, missiles and weapons which our military officers must buy are paid for out of the people's taxes. A heavy responsibility rests on procurement officers to make certain that costs are held to a minimum and that the greatest value is obtained for every dollar spent. The purpose of the present investigation is to learn whether other considerations,



TAKING CARE OF YOUR GARDEN

By Edward A. Cardinal



We have been plagued by Japanese Beetles during the past few weeks. The damage done to shrubs and evergreens is infinitesimal compared to what the beetle grubs can do to a fine lawn. I have seen many beautiful lawns completely destroyed in a few weeks time without any visible warning that grubs were present.

To fully understand the damage caused by beetles we must know its life cycle. The adult beetle is the green and bronze insect that has been feeding upon your rose flowers, pussy willows, sassafras and many other plants too numerous to mention. The period of greatest activity last about 4 weeks, usually late June and early July. Mating takes place during this period and from time to time the female leaves the plant on which it is feeding to lay her eggs in the soil slightly below ground level. In a few weeks grubs hatch out and start feeding voraciously on the tender grass roots, and it is at this critical period that a lawn can be quickly destroyed. Sometimes, so little root is left on the turf that the grass can be rolled up like a carpet and carried away. About ten months of the yearly cycle the beetle spends underground in the grub stage, and after pupation in May and June emerges once again as an adult beetle to start its life cycle over again.

QUESTION: How can I be sure there are grubs in my lawn?

ANSWER: If you have a reasonably good lawn, and have not grub-proofed with chemicals, you can be almost 100 per cent certain there are grubs present.

Q: I applied grub control chemicals—two years ago and it was supposed to be good for 3 to 5 years. Shall I do it again rather than risk losing my lawn?

A: Heavy rains sometimes wash the chemicals down into the soil and when the grubs reach that level they will be killed, but often the grubs can destroy the grass roots at the surface and ruin a lawn before reaching down where the poisons have settled. The expense is so little that I would prefer giving a buffer treatment as soon as possible.

Q: What is the best time to apply grub control materials?

A: Grub damage starts in late July and early August, so the best time is just prior to this period. The chemicals will also rid the lawn of ants, chinch bugs and many other lawn insects.

Q: Are dry powders as effective as the liquids for grub control?

A: Both are equally effective once they are watered down. However, the dry powders are more easily applied by using a spreader. Liquids are sometimes difficult to put on uniformly unless hose siphon sprayers are used.





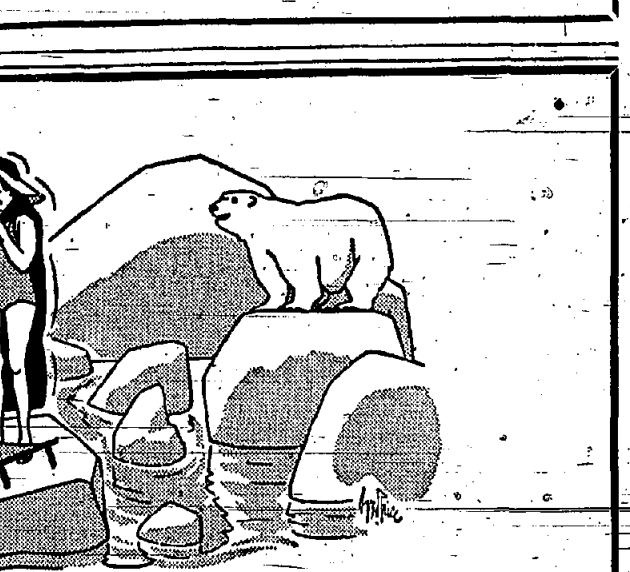
