There is the possibility, however, that some preparatory engineering work on the freeway could be delayed because of lack of funds, it was reported.

There can be no final work on the specific jobs which will be held up until Gov. Meyner approves the 1959-60 road job program which Palmer has submitted to him. Details of the new program are expected soon from Meyner and Palmer.

However, some of the big jobs in progress and on which new contracts are approved from time to time can be expected to be hurt by the delay.

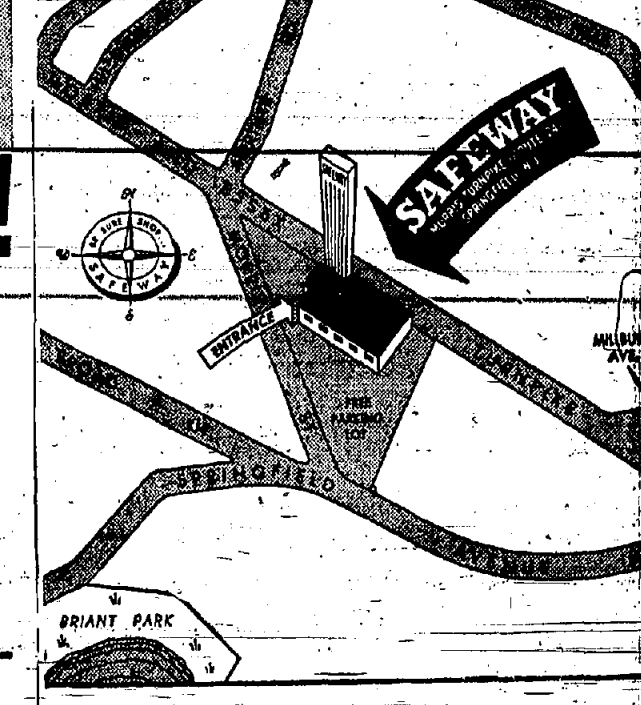

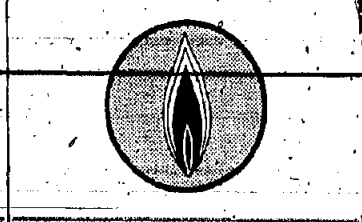



This film, "Green Harvest," takes the viewer through the great forests to see the procedure practiced by lumber companies from the time a tree is actually planted until it is processed into a piece of lumber.
