ORDINANCE AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A CONCRETE SIDEWALK AND THE PERFORMANCE OF WORK INCIDENTAL THEREON ON THE NORTHWESTERLY SIDE OF MOUNTAIN AVENUE BEGINNING AT HANNAH STREET AND EXTENDING IN A NORTHEASTERLY DIRECTION FOR A DISTANCE OF 300 FEET, AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF SOUTH MAPLE AVENUE, INCLUDING THE PROVIDING OF ADDITIONAL DRAINAGE AND CONCRETE CURB AND THE PERFORMANCE OF WORK INCIDENTAL THEREON, FROM RIVERSIDE DRIVE TO A POINT 350 FEET NORTHERLY THEREFROM, AND PROVIDING FOR PAYING THE COST THEREOF AND APPROPRIATING THE NECESSARY FUNDS TO PAY THEREFOR.
