A Tree Or Not A Tree

To help you identify the Christmas trees usually sold in this area, look for the following characteristics:

Pine trees have two to five needles in a cluster, and needles -are-one-and-a-half-to-three-in ches long.

Fir trees have single, flat needles, one-half to one inch

Needles from spruce trees are sharp and have four sides so that you can easily roll them between thumb and finger. Pines and firs normally retain their needles longer than the spruce, but all will usually give satisfactory service if

treated properly. For suggestions on how to stretch the life of your Christmas greens, the Essex County Extension Service has a leaftitled "Indoor Care of Christmas Trees and Greens.
