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



PD: Need for decreased speed in Hillside

HILLSIDE — Although their everyday lives may be fast-paced, motorists have to slow down on Hillside roads in the coming weeks, if they hope to avoid receiving a pricey ticket.

Between Wednesday and July 31, Hillside Police Department will increase efforts to reduce the number of drivers disregarding the speed limit on township roads. This endeavor is part of "Obey the Signs or Pay the Fines," a statewide campaign to enforce safer driving in New Jersey. This is the first year Hillside will participate.

"Speeding is an ongoing priority for us," said Robert Quinlan, Hillside police chief.

The initiative is funded by a grant from the

About \$4,000 received from the state will be Hillside. More than 22,000 speeding-related used to increase patrols and radar details, according to local police.

Offenders will receive summonses upon being stopped and could face fines ranging from \$77 to \$272, depending on how many miles per hour over the speed limit the driver is traveling

Areas surrounding schools are a top concern for police during the academic year, but business and residential areas will be the main focus during the summer, township police said

The Division of Highway Traffic Safety launched the "Obey the Signs or Pay the Fines" campaign in 2006 as a response to excessive speeding on state roadways.

In a manner similar to the state's "Click It or Ticket" seatbelt enforcement campaign, "Obey the Signs or Pay the Fines" increases police presence and consequently, decreases crime, authorities say.

On a few days per week throughout July, four to six additional Hillside officers will patrol streets on six- to eight-hour tours. "When they see police all over, [lawbreakers] think twice about committing a crime," Quinlan said.



Roselle officer cleared in shooting

ROSELLE — The Borough police officer who shot a suspect during an April narcotics raid has been cleared of criminal charges by a Union County grand jury.

The jury determined Roselle Police Detective Joseph Osty slipped on wet pavement, causing him to accidentally discharge his gun and hit the victim, Andre Doss of Roselle, in the upper shoulder, according to Union County Prosecutor Theodore Romankow.

No details regarding the findings of the raid have been disclosed, and no charges have been filed against Doss, according to UCPO spokesman John Holl, who added the investigation is still active and charges can still be issued.

RAHWAY — First Ward Councilman Bobby Ackbar is eager to return to his duties after pleading guilty to disturbing the peace.

The Rahway school teacher was arrested Feb. 26 for simple assault, a charge his attorney Michael Campagna successfully pleaded to have reduced during his June 10 court hearing in Clark. Municipal court Judge Antonio Inacio ordered Ackbar to pay a \$500 fine.

Clark Municipal Prosecutor, Jon-Henry Barr, said the court, as well as the alleged victim, was satisfied with the outcome, and stressed the nature of domestic violence privacy laws set forth by the state prevents disclosure of the details related to the incident. "The public should not think Mr. Ackbar is being protected because of who he is " he said.

Ackbar said he wants to move

forward. "I would have fought for case on those terms," he said. being charged with nothing, but I wanted the case...over," he said.

According to Clark police, charges stemmed from Ackbar exiting an undisclosed city parking lot at an inappropriate speed, a crime Campagna compared to bringing one's garbage out on the wrong day or failing to pay a parking meter. Barr said the outcome of the case will not count as a criminal conviction on Ackbar's record. "Generally speaking, many municipal prosecutors will permit a defendant charged with petty disorderly persons offenses to be downgraded in appropriate circumstances to violations of municipal ordinances, in order to allow defendants to avoid getting a criminal record," Barr explained.

Baker said he is pleased with the outcome. "There will be no negative effect on [Ackbar's] status on the council," he said. He added any action or penalty affecting Ackbar's position would be handled by a court or prosecutor, not the council. The council will "put this distraction behind us," Baker said.

Ackbar's case was transferred to Clark courts by Rahway officials to avoid a conflict of interest.

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Angry voters protest the results of Roselle's 5th Ward primary outside Union County Board of Elections, Elizabeth, June 17.

Borough voters protest election

ROSELLE - Some borough voters are crying fraud. They say Union County Board of Elections unfairly threw out votes earlier this month in the town's Democratic primary.

About two dozen residents, led by Mayor Garrett Smith and other council members, marched in the rain in front of the board's Elizabeth offices June 17, disputing election results for Roselle's 5th Ward primary.

They claimed 80 absentee ballots were not sent out to voters and 50 write-in votes for Marc Baltimore, endorsed by Smith, were rejected because the county found similar handwriting on the ballots. Baltimore, who was not on the ballot - another point of contention — organized a write-in campaign but lost to incumbent Christine Dansereau by a vote of 317 to 36.

[We] just want to expose the unfair treatment and the corruption that takes place with the election process. Nobody's allowed to interfere with that process," said Councilwoman and Smith ally Samantha Dow, who marched with other officials, including Councilwoman

Sylvia Turnage and former another ballot. Board of Education President Rev. James Moore.

"If the state won't step in and investigate, we should move to the national level, and ask the attorney general to look into what's going on in Union County," added Ismael Hislop, a Roselle resident.

Smith labeled the protesters "disaffected Democrats" and vowed they would pursue any legal action against the county.

Union County officials offer a different story — one of fraud on the part of Baltimore's supporters.

Board of Elections administrator Dennis Kobitz said approximately 50 Baltimore votes were disallowed because the handwriting was similar on the ballots. He added a 20-year-old college student counting votes noticed and informed the Election Commission, which unanimously rejected the votes. "On the inside of the ballot, it appeared to be the exact same handwriting, which means voters had assistance. No one marked the portion asking if anyone assisted you," he said.

The 80 requests for absentee ballots had similar discrepancies with matching signatures, he added, saying a letter was sent to each voter telling them how to get

He also said his office has asked the Union County Prosecutors Office and Attorney General to investigate Baltimore for voting more than twice — once by absentee ballot May 29 and once at the polls June 2.

Smith said if Baltimore sent in an absentee ballot, he should have been removed from the list of eligible voters. Kobitz claims his office incorrectly sent out the final voting list before the last absentee ballots arrived, but added the candidate knew he should not have voted twice. "I find it ironic that when all the handwriting on [ballots] looks the same and voters vote twice, there are claims we are not having a fair election," he

Union County Clerk's Office was scheduled to hold a recount yesterday at 9 a.m. at the voting machine warehouse in Scotch Plains.

"If the recount is denied, we're definitely going to court. There's no doubt about it," said Dow. 'Unfortunately this is not new in America. People are not afforded due process. We're willing to go to the ACLU. We're willing to go all the way to the federal level if we have to." "

Youth Academy hits; teens urged to apply

Union County Sheriff Ralph Froehlich recently announced the creation of the Sheriff's Youth Academy, designed to familiarize children with the role of a sheriff's officer. The group will operate similar to an actual police academy for those interested in law enforcement.

The two week program, which will meet daily from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the John H. Stamler Police Academy, Scotch Plains, begins Aug. 3, and concludes Aug. 14.

"The youth academy will teach our youth about law enforcement, what a sheriff's office does, and is a great first step for those interested in the field of law enforcement," Sheriff Ralph Froehlich said. "Showing them the human element of law enforcement will help our young people connect with the men and women in a way they never thought they could."

The academy is not a boot camp for troubled youth, Froehlich noted. Participants will receive hands-on experience in a variety of emergency services and law enforcement functions and training. In addition, they will have the opportunity to learn respect for law enforcement through positive interaction during their attendance in the program. Participants will be provided with uniform attire at no cost. Uniforms must be worn each day and should be kept clean and neat.

"In his many years in law enforcement, Sheriff Froehlich has been an innovator in developing outreach programs," said Union County Freeholder Chairman Alexander Mirabella. "This Academy will help youngsters see the many sides of law enforcement, and encourage them to pursue a career in public service. We encourage interested youth to apply and learn about law enforcement."

Youngsters enrolled in high school, between ages 14 and 17, can apply. Applicants also must have a minimum GPA of 2.70, and obtain consent of a parent or guardian and medical release notes from a physician.

Also to be included with the application is an essay, limited to one typed, double-spaced page, explaining why the student would like to attend the Union County Sheriff's Youth Academy. Applicants must also submit two letters of reference and a copy their most recent report card.

The deadline for applications are Monday. Applications can be obtained from school guidance counselors, or by calling the Sheriff's Identification Bureau at 908-558-2630.





An 'overwhelming interest of cost'

The usually soft-spoken Dan Sullivan was a little louder and firmer when it came to his public remarks at the last Freeholder meeting. His target was a critic who Freeholder Sullivan claimed liked to champion transparency except when speaking about her-

The transparency issue, which has become the new political buzz word, has a good chunk of its basis in the Open Public Records Act, commonly known as OPRA. It is the system for seeking public

The courts say "OPRA's clear purpose is to maximize public knowledge about public affairs in order to ensure an informed citizenry and to minimize the evils inherent in a secluded process."

The daily newspapers love it with the strict time frames to respond. Others use it as an economic businesses tool. It also makes life easy for attorneys and engineers wanting information on a location, Linden Clerk Joe Bodek estimates he gets about 30 OPRA requests a week. Hillside Clerk Janet Vlaisavlgeic has seen a drop in requests with the decline in real estate sales.

selves birdogging requests through the array of municipal agencies. It is time-consuming.

Therein lies one of the warts. There is a cost in meeting the requests of individuals in terms of time frame and effort. It's predictable that those who champion the "informed citizens" aspect aren't the ones having to birddog the requests which, if not met, can result in fines from the aggressive state agency which oversee the act.

The numbers in Union County get pretty big: in 2007, an estimated 450 requests for 2,964 pages were made; last year, 378 requests for 1,290 pages. The county utilizes an assistant county counsel who spends a large chunk of his day on OPRA requests and the complex maze of rules and statutes which are part of its application.

decision narrowing OPRA, their was barely a murmur.

In Plainsboro, a request and denial for information via OPRA unleashed a battle to the State Appellate Division. The gist of the argument was the desire to see police records regarding weapons possession on school grounds. The plaintiffs asserted the school's anti-violence policy was selectively enforced.

The court balked, saying the police records are not subject to production under OPRA. The court added the "overwhelming public interest in keeping the records private outweigh any interest in production." This OPRA decision got virtually no notoriety. That's unfortunate because the case sets new standards for police and OPRA responsibility.

Maybe the recent observations by Sullivan and the court will be a good thing. The review of transparency should, in a word, be transparent.

Measuring the cost to the taxpayers of the OPRA compliance and those who frequently use the process goes beyond transparency. It goes to the overwhelming interest of cost to the taxpayer.

Councilman should resign

I attended the most recent Rahway City Council meeting on June 10 and could not help but notice Bobby Akbar conspicuously absent after pleading guilty in court earlier that same day. I was also present at this court case.

According to police and lawyers Akbar was arrested for assault in connection with a February....incident which took place in the parking lot of the elementary school where he is employed as a fifth grade teacher in Rahway. Union County Board of Public Utilities in maintaining Rahway Riverfront Park, a 10-acre park along the shores of the Rahway River. On May 27, dozens of Covanta employees, representatives of the Union County Board of Public Utilities and volunteers expanded a butterfly garden that was built last year with funding by Merck & Co. The garden composed of native flowers, shrubs and trees will provide a food source for beneficial insects, butterflies, hummingbirds and later a source of seeds for migratory birds.

While the Covanta employees provided the "sweat equity" to double the size of the butterfly garden replete with new plants and mulch, other activities were taking place, including the participation of children of the John F. Kennedy Community Center on a nature walk. Donning binoculars, the children saw mockingbird, yellow warbler, double crested cormorant and snowy egrets among others. Signage, an educational brochure and a blue bird trail are all planned for the future thanks to a pledge of future support by Covanta Energy.

In 2007, Merck & Co. provided the much-needed funding to build the first stage of the butterfly garden at Rahway Riverfront Park and furnish the Rahway River Association with a grant to buy binoculars and field guides for the children of the JFK Community Center.

For 2009, Merck & Co. provided much-needed funding to assess the natural resource values of the Red Hill section of Ashbrook Swamp Reservation, a unit of the Union County Park system. The Red Hill area appears to be a relict Pine Barrens habitat disconnected from the southern New Jersey habitat thousands of years ago.

The Rahway River Association retained the service of a Pine Barrens expert to study the fauna and flora of this remarkable biological community billed by regional botanists as the place where "the glaciers met the sea." The muchneeded funding will determine the health of globally rare plants that were discovered here during a Rahway River Association sponsored bioblitz in 2007 and make recommendations for ensuring their survival intro the future.

Covanta Energy, Comeast Corporation and Merek & Co. are the first members of the Rahway River Association's Watershed Business Partners who recognize the need to contribute to the improvement of the parks, nature preserves and natural areas of the Rahway River watershed as part of their corporate philosophy. The Rahway River Association is deeply grateful for their financial support and commitment to the environment.

Mayor did an 'about-face'

The Union County section of a local daily paper ran an article about the Roselle Borough Council race that omitted important issues voters must weigh when going to the polls. In interviewing incumbent 5th Ward candidate, Christine Dansereau, the reporter mentioned her scrutinizing of Mayor Garrett Smith's effort to serve as the business administrator. It did not, however, mention Smith's demand for a 500 percent increase in his salary, which Dansereau fought against.

Ethics suspension stands, DOE says

HILLSIDE - An ex-Board of Education member, voted out of office earlier this year, has lost his appeal to overturn a six-month sus-

Nine-year board member Elbert Smith was first issued the suspension by the state School Ethics Commission in May 2007.

According to the original ruling, Smith was accused of sending various letters, e-mails and confidential memos undermining then-high school principal, EvaMarie Raleigh, directly to other board Davy said in her ruling. members.

Last month, after a final appeal, state Commissioner of Education Lucille Davy upheld the ruling.


line between proper board activity and school administration," Davy said in her decision. "While he protested he was not micro-managing or passing judgment on principal Raleigh, his writings reveal that he was.'

Smith's suspension came after several school officials, including the superintendent at the time, Raymond Bandlow, testified he overreached his bounds of power in his harsh criticism of Raleigh.

During the ethics hearing, staff testified Smith frequently questioned Raleigh's leadership during the 2006-07 school year, and was particularly critical of a senior prank in which students drove a vehicle on the school track. The students were not charged criminally, according to Bandlow, who testified Raleigh handled the matter appropriately.

Smith was also accused of targeting the new principal due to her treatment of his wife, who still works as a physical education teacher at Hillside High School.

"Even if [his] wife's view of actions, he...projected the appearance of bias and impropriety,"



township, after reviewing how governments in nearby communities operate. Two forms had the township administrator or manager answer directly to the mayor, potentially giving them too much power, officials had said. Adding more committee seats, as the mayor-council form would have required, was also nixed because of additional costs in salaries and benefits.

The change to a township committee has worked successfully in both Cranford and Hillsborough, the governing body said.

Some residents, however, said the current form of government is fine. Instead, they blamed political problems on the people in power.

Vauxhall resident James Scott said elected officials have to worry more about "small" issues like overgrown playgrounds and massive potholes

"If the people in there now need to rededicate themselves to what they were elected to do, I do not believe the topic would ever have surfaced that we need a new government," Scott said after the June 22 Charter Study meeting. "We vote for these people, now we need to vote them out."

The commission's next order of business is to polish and refine their final report, due on or before Aug. 4. After their recommendation for a change in Union's government, the public must vote on the plan.

The commission plans to review their final report with the Township Committee July 9, decide on a tentative final draft July 16 and give a final presentation of their recommendation by July 27.

Ex-Union resident, state officer killed in shootout

Suspect kidnapped nine-year-old son from estranged wife

UNION - A former township man was shot to death in a gunfight with Pennsylvania state police, after he kidnapped his nine-yearold son and shot two pursuing state troopers, killing one.

Daniel Autenrieth, 31, was armed with a 9 mm handgun when he allegedly snatched his son, Trevor, from his estranged wife's home in Nazareth, Pa., June 7, state police said in a report issued the day after the gun battle.

A spokesperson for Autenrieth's wife, Susan, told a local newspaper Daniel pointed a gun at her and slammed the door on her broken ankle during the kidnapping. She was able to escape through the back door of her home, and yelled for neighbors to call police.

Autenrieth and his ex-wife had been fighting for custody of the boy, along with their two younger daughters, Abigail, 3, and Carolyn, 4. He led Pennsylvania state troop-

ers on a 40through the Pocono Mountains in the northeastern part of the

state, before he was forced off the road in Coolbaugh

Township,

according to state Police Commissioner Frank E. Pawlowski.

When officers rushed toward the vehicle. Autenrieth, standing outside his car, opened fire, killing six-year police veteran Joshua Miller, 34, and injuring another, Robert Lombardo, 35. Police returned shots, hitting Autenrieth eight times. His son, who was rescued from the backseat of the car while the shooting was going on, was not harmed. Pawlowski commended the two officers for distracting Autenrieth, while other police on the scene rescued the boy.

Miller, a former marine, was mile chase married with three daughters, and received a posthumous Medal of Honor from state police during his funeral June 13, what would have been his 35th birthday.

> "Trooper Miller's death is a tremendous loss for the department," said Pawlowski, "His actions will never be forgotten."

> Lombardo, who was shot in the torso during the gunfight, was listed in satisfactory condition at Community Medical Center in Scranton

> Autenrieth was a 1996 graduate of Union High School, though in 2004, he moved to Palmer, Pa. The slain suspect allegedly received the handgun from a girlfriend who purchased it for him in a sporting goods store in May, according to published reports. A court had barred him from owning a gun due to the legal issues with his ex-wife.

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Voters to weigh in on at-large seat extension

SUMMIT - Should the city's at-large council seat remain a twoyear position or should it be extended to four? Voters will have their say in November.

The City Council voted unanimously June 16 to open this option to the public in the form of a ballot question. The proposition to extend the term was supported by both the all-Republican council and Democrat Mayor Jordan Glatt.

"I think it's the right thing to change.

do," Glatt said, adding that a longer term would make the position more attractive to potential candidates.

"People would be more willing to run for that seat if it was for a longer duration," Glatt added.

Council President Ellen Dickson said she thinks changing the term is "an excellent idea."

"It's...time-consuming expensive to campaign, especially if you cover the entire town," Dickson said, noting no residents have voiced opposition to the potential

The at-large seat is currently filled by Councilman Frank Macioce, who has said he will not run in the 2014 municipal elections, when the extension would take effect. He is currently serving his third term.


Macioce said lengthening the term had been mentioned by city officials for several years, but was delayed to avoid extending an incumbent's time in office.

"I didn't want to take any initiative to make a change, because people might think I was making the

change for my own sake," Macioce explained. The current terms limits were first established in 1899.

Macioce said state law requires the public's approval of such a change. He hopes the referendum finds bi-partisan support from voters. "They're better off when their council members are serving the city, instead of trying to get reelected every other year," Macioce

"[The school board has had] some contentious periods. Antonio never got into the middle of that. He was always a calming influence."

Pugliese has been a board member since 2002, when he was selected to fill the vacancy left by Sue Washuda. Annmarie Duda remembered Pugliese's first days. "He was...young, had completed his chiropractic [schooling] and wanted to get involved in the community," Duda said.

Reflecting on his contributions throughout the years, Duda added,

"He has been...genuine with his BOE work, always asking questions, he rarely missed meetings and always there for the needs of the children," she said.

In the past 15 years, the school board has had to fill three other vacancies due to resignations or deaths.

While searching for Pugliese's replacement, Zimmerman said the school board is trying to avoid candidates with a "political ax to grind."

"We want people interested in making our district the best it can be," Zimmerman explained.

She added the board would prefer someone with finance experience or the ability to explain budgets and finances to the public.

Vincent A. Gonnella, board business administrator and secretary, noted two to four people typically apply for an open seat.

While Kriedeweis declined comment, Wilfrid said he was glad to be home.

"It's nice to be back," Wilfrid said, noting he has spent much of his time getting reacquainted with old, familiar faces and some much need rest. "I have been just catching up with friends and hanging out."

Wilfrid, who was honorably discharged, was first stationed in Katterbach, Germany, before being shipped to Balad, Iraq. "I was in Iraq for 15 months," Wilfrid explained.

What surprised him most about his time on the Middle Eastern county was how well the natives spoke English. "I'd be doing guard duty up in a tower, and they would call up to me asking for a Pepsi," he recalled. There were also things from home. "We had DVD players and air conditioning," he explained.

One of the worst parts was the sand. "Oh, it got everywhere," Wilfrid said. "It gets into your clothes, your hair and your eyes."

While Wilfrid was on the base working as a mechanic on generator engines and vehicle engines, other soldiers had it worse, he said.

"It was pretty safe on the base, but for the soldiers who were in the nearby villages, kicking in doors to search for insurgents, it was tough," Wilfrid said.

He described one the terrifying moments at the base. "A mortar hit one of the buildings and bounced off," he recounted.

Now, back home, Wilfrid said he is looking forward to pursuing a degree in physical education and helping his community. "I would love to be a firefighter," he said.

Ringled said the Maple Avenue branch of the American Legion will continue to remember those serving in the military.

"It feels...good to give back to the people who sacrifice for us," she said. "After all, freedom is not free."



Swine flu death

Union County suffered its first swine flu-related fatality June 3 when a 36-year-old man died at Trinitas Regional Medical Center in Elizabeth after being hospitalized two days prior with a cough and fever.

According to the State Department of Health and Senior Services, New Jersey has experienced four reported swine influenza fatalities including this Union County resident. The other victims have been residents of Somerset, Essex, and Sussex County.

Swine flu has been detected in the public schools of Cranford and most recently Linden, where the city's Board of Health confirmed one case of H1N1 influenza in a second grade student at School 5 last week.

Superintendent of Schools Rocco Tomazic said June 17 the district is relying solely on the word of local health officials, following a fraudulent claim of H1N1 at Soehl Middle School about two

On Tuesday, City Health Officer Nancy Koblis said it is possible the child has returned to school, having spent the mandatory week-long period out of school.

"The child had been out of school prior to diagnosis and remained out of school for the seven-day period," Koblis said.

Koblis said that once school is out for the summer, the risk of transmitting viruses such as swine flu among the youth population will probably decrease.

Medivac lands on GSP after crash

CLARK - Traffic came to a halt Sunday on the Garden State Parkway as a medivac helicopter landed on the northbound lanes to transport an accident victim to a nearby trauma center.

According to authorities, the driver, a 66-year-old man, sustained serious leg injuries when his pickup truck crashed into a tree on the northbound side of the highway, near exit 135 in Clark.

The parkway was fully shut down for almost half an hour following the crash, which occurred at about 10:32 a.m., authorities said.

Local police and firefighters, as well as state police responded and worked to extricate the man from the vehicle, which was found up against a tree when emergency crews arrived.

Due to the extent of the victim's injuries, a medivac helicopter responded to transport him to University Hospital in Newark.

Clark Fire Chief Robert Venturella said it appeared that the vehicle hit a tree near the right lane of the parkway.

got there but there was no sign of released.

fire," Venturella said. "It was probably just steam from the radiator."

Venturella said fire crews needed steel-cutting tools as well as hydraulic equipment known as the "jaws of life" to extricate the driver so he could be airlifted to the trauma center.

"It was a serious accident," Venturella said.

Venturella said helicopters landing on the parkway to pick up accident victims isn't common, but local police and rescue workers are familiar with the procedure.

"It's not standard, but it's nothing too technical. We've done it many times before," Venturella said.

Venturella praised the Clark fire fighters for their speed and professionalism, "My guys did a great job, They removed the guy as quick as possible," Venturella said.

Clark Police Chief Denis Connell said local police often assist at accidents on the Garden State Parkway. "We just respond with first aid until the State Police get there and they take it from there," he said.

cials are working to keep all district schools clean and disinfected, as well as watch for any additional cases, Tomazic said last week.

"We're doing all the things we need to do," Tomazic said. "I hope we don't get anymore, but you just don't know.'

The superintendent said any child exhibiting flu-like symptoms or fever is being sent home from school.


'It did seem unusual that there were so many flu cases so late in the season," Tomazic said.

The schools have experienced a higher than normal number of absences, but nothing that would justify closing the schools, Tomazic said, noting the schedules of many schools have slowed down in preparation for the end of the school year. The last day of school was Wednesday.

'I don't see anything happening before school ends," Tomazic said.

According to the Department of Health Web site, New Jersey has 465 confirmed cases of H1N1 influenza in 19 counties, with 248 probable cases pending confirmatory testing in the state laboratory. Approximately 88 countries have reported swine flu cases.

'Born Innocent' takes readers to some familiar places

It gives a reader a homey feeling to be able to crack open a book and discover names of familiar towns and cities. And even if the book contains a story abundantly filled with political intrigue, terrorists, stolen identification, love and marriages, it still offers some comfort in knowing one has some connection with the sites.

For example, in Dale K. Nelson's novel, "Born Innocent," in which a terrorist captures the identity of an attorney, is elected to Congress and plans to destroy the country forthwith, one can travel through Cranford, Roselle Park, Clark, Summit and Westfield.

Nelson, an accountant who resides in Clark, graduated from the Roselle school system. He attended Rutgers University and received a bachelor's degree in accounting from Bloomfield College and practiced as a certified public accountant for more than 30 years.

"I had come up with the idea of writing a book after the events of Sept. 11, 2001," Nelson explained during a recent chat. "I realized it was the most devastating thing a terrorist could do—to do the most damage in the country. If they could infiltrate the government, that would really be the worst thing they could do. I came up with that idea for a political mystery novel and mentioned it to my wife, Patricia, who

died in 2005. And she said, 'When you get a chance, do it."

Nelson said, "A year later, I had already outlined the characters and the story and that's when I started writing this book. I started in June 2006 and finished it the following February. I always had a lot of interest in politics, too."

And the reason was because his grandfather, Francis Pitman, was mayor of Roselle in the mid-1950s, and Nelson's son, Kenneth, ran for United States Congress several years ago. He also has a daughter and four granddaughters.

After turning down a publisher's contract that called for up front \$14,000, Nelson contacted his attorney, who suggested RoseDog Books, which offered a contract for \$2,500.

"I signed it," Nelson said, "and the book was printed approximately 180 days later. The first copies of the book came out June 21, and some went to the public libraries and others to book stores."

"Born Innocent," which may be a bit wordy and overwritten, still maintains interesting characters and volatile situations. It basically concerns attorney, Richard Jeffries, whose marriage to Ariza Gauthier, turns out to be a fiasco. In reality, she is an Islamic jidhadist and is the cause of his downfall. He ultimately redeems himself and his identity after meeting a nurse, Steffi, in Frankfurt, Germany, where he has been taken after a kidnapping. She assists him, falls in love with him, and ultimately, marries him. In between, there is much going on in Trenton and Washington among the Democrats and the Republicans. And Nelson has given the New Jersey governor a new name and personality.

The author also is a musician. "I play guitar," he said, "and play music. In fact, I have a CD out called 'The Class of '61 and Other Memories.' Two of the songs in the album are very significant. They are 'Let's Roll,' which is about Flight 93, and 'Tuesday in September,' which is about the World Trade Center."

Nelson isn't sure that he will write another book, but "I'll tell you one thing," he said. "I learned a lot from the first one."



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

Tonight will be the night for Rahway's Earl Clark

Expected to be high selection in NBA Draft

Clark kept on playing. While his teammates around him gave up, the former Rahway All-America continued to go hard to the basket, whether it was to grab a rebound or to make a hoop, despite his Louisville team falling too far behind against underdog Michigan State.

Television announcers quickly picked up on his stellar, never-say-die performance, specifically commenting on one strong surge he made to the basket late in the game that not only resulted in two points, but prompted the men covering the game to say that it was a "next level" move made by Clark.

Well, the journey to the "next level" for Clark - a Hills, also knows what it's like to be drafted. 2006 Rahway High School graduate - will continue in earnest tonight and close by in New York City.

Every kid who picks up a basketball for the first time dreams of one day playing professionally.

That dream will come true for Clark tonight as he is predicted by some to be selected in the top half of the first round of the 2009 NBA Draft that will be held at the Theatre at Madison Square Garden. Live coverage on ESPN is scheduled to commence at 7 p.m.

The 6-10, 226-pound guard-forward - who lists Plainfield as his hometown - was listed as going to the Toronto Raptors as the ninth pick of the first round according to Monday's latest nbadraft.net mock draft.

The website gave him an overall rating of 93, which includes categories such as athlettcism, size, defense, strength, quickness, leadership, jump shot, NBA ready, ball handling, potential, passing and intangibles. His highest scores were 10 (out of a possible 10) for size and 9s for athleticism and potential. His low scores were 6s for leadership, jump shot and intangibles.

This past season as a junior for the Big East Champion Cardinals, Clark paced Louisville in minutes with 1269 (34.3 average), points with 525 (14.2) and rebounds with 322 (8.7). He grabbed 220 defensive boards and 102 offensive.

Clark is sought after by NBA teams as a versatile combo forward. Some mock drafts last week had him going to the Chicago Bulls as the 16th pick, so his stock has risen in the last seven days.

He led top-seeded Louisville with a 19-point performance in the team's 64-52 loss to second-seeded Michigan State in the March 29 Midwest Region final in Indianapolis, Ind. Clark also helped lead Louisville to the 2008 East Region final in Charlotte, N.C. where the Cardinals fell to North Carolina.

Clark could have come out for the draft last year. but stayed to play one more season for Louisville head coach Rick Pitino. Now he is one of the more sought after players in this year's draft.

"At Rahway, Earl was very quiet and never caused any problems," said Rahway health and physical education teacher Chris Remley, who was the head coach of the boys' team at Rahway for one year, which was Clark's senior season of 2005-2006. Remley succeeded veteran mentor Bill Berger.

"I had him for one year and we asked a lot of him," Remley said. "These guys play AAU ball 24-7 and when you have a short season sometimes it's tough to get them to do what you want them to do. He followed what we needed him to do and we had a successful year."

Just three years ago Clark - a First Team All-State selection - lead Rahway to its first sectional champi-On the last Sunday of March in Indianapolis, Earl onship in 10 years as the Indians captured the Central Jersey, Group 2 crown for the first time after reaching the CJ, G2 final for the first and second times in 2004 and 2005, Clark's sophomore and junior campaigns.

He was the last overall pick of the 1985 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics - the 162nd pick and final selection of the seventh round out of Rutgers.

'I watched him play at Louisville and there's no doubt there was a progression from his freshman year, to his sophomore year, to his junior year," said Remley, who played overseas in Spain, Ireland and Australia. "Rick (Pitino) let him make mistakes and knew there would be more pluses than minuses.

'Louisville was a fun team to watch, with a lot of athletes. How they played should help Earl in the next level. Louisville played a lot of pro stuff, one-on-one stuff, where you shoot it and go get it."

Born Jan. 17, 1988 and the son of Brenda and Larry Clark, the communications major averaged 8.1 points and 5.2 rebounds over the final 16 games of his freshman season of 2006-2007.

As a sophomore at Louisville two years ago, Clark averaged a team-leading 13.8 points, 8.5 rebounds and two blocked shots, while shooting 63.6 percent from the field - 42-of-66 - over his last eight games. In four NCAA Tournament contests, Clark averaged a teamleading 14.5 points and 8.3 rebounds and blocked seven shots, while making 62.2 percent of his shots -23-of-37. He produced a double-double in 10 games.


"The entire city and the Rahway school system is enormously proud of Earl Clark's accomplishments," said Thomas Lewis, the Director of Alternative Education and Athletic Director at Rahway.

"Earl has brought such positive accolades back to the city of Rahway and the athletic department in particular."

Perhaps Clark's signature game at Rahway came on Friday afternoon, March 3, 2006 in Newark. At George Washington Carver School, the fourth-seeded Indians ousted top-seeded Weequahic 75-63 in a CJ, G2 semifinal. Weequahic previously lost as the top seed to Hillside 83-74 one year earlier in a North 2, Group 2 semifinal game at the same site.

In Rahway's win over Weequahic, Clark paced all scorers with a 41-point effort in leading the Indians to their third consecutive CJ, G2 championship game. Weequahic standout senior Keon Lawrence led the home team Indians with a 40-point performance. Fellow Rahway senior Ishmyl Johnson - who is now playing football at Michigan State after enrolling at Miford Academy - poured in a very key 18 points to help spark the visiting Indians. Lawrence transferred from Missouri to Seton Hall.



Hillside mentor Power honored to coach stars

Comets have Spruill in Monday's grid game

For the first time the North-South All Star Football Game will be played in Union County, with this year's 31st edition set for a 7 p.m. kickoff on Monday at Kean University in Union.

The game will be televised Tuesday night at 8 on MSG Plus by Mike Quick's production group.

Union County has a strong player and coaching representation on the North side, with this being the first contest not played at Rutgers Stadium in Piscataway since the 1997 game was played at The College of New Jersey in Ewing Township.

Union County has both North quarterbacks in Rahway's Troy Eastman and Johnson's Dan Dugan. Eastman was a track and field standout for the Indians who made it all the way to the Meet of Champions, while Dugan's play at third base helped the Crusaders finish with a winning record of 16-7.

Hillside head coach John Power, ready to begin his second season at the helm of the Comets, is one of the North coaches on offense.

"It's an honor to be asked to coach in this game," said Power, who last fall guided Hillside to an 8-3 record, its first winning season in five years and to the North 2, Group 2 semifinals for the first time in eight years.

The Comets were a touchdown away from playing for a state championship after finishing 0-10 the year before. Top-seeded Hillside fell to fifth-seeded Caldwell 28-21 in the N2, G2 semifinal at Union. Caldwell went on to win the championship.

I appreciate Ken Trimmer and John Liberato for asking me to be part of this," Power said. Trimmer and Liberato are both on the North-South committee on the North side. Trimmer is the head coach at Caldwell and Liberato the head coach at Summit.

"It's great to get a chance to coach with (North defensive coordinator) Chet Parlavecchio, (North offensive coordinator) Darnell Grant and Gary Mobley," said Power of the Elizabeth, Irvington and Rahway head coaches, respectively.

Power coached with Parlavecehio at Elizabeth and as a coach at Union against Grant at Irvington and against Parlavecchio at Elizabeth as well. Last year, Power's first Hillside team was the only one to beat Mobley's Rahway squad in the regular season as the Comets beat the Indians for the first time since 2003.

Power, Parlavecchio, Grant and Mobley will all be coaching on the same sideline June 29 at Kean, trying to get the North a second straight victory so it can tie the series up once again.

Power also has one of his best defensive players from 2008 competing for the North squad in linebacker Marquis Spruill, who will continue at Fork Union Military Academy in Virginia.

"It's a great school, with a great tradition and things will work out very well for Marquis there," Power said. "He has the desire, work ethic and ability to play Division I-A ball after that."

Spruill was one of the leading tacklers in the Mountain Valley Conference and his play at linebacker helped the Comets win the Mountain Division title for the first time since 2000.

"We had some problems with that team, with some guys doing their own thing off the court," Remley recalled. "We didn't go into those games at full capacity."

Rahway began state tournament play in 2006 with a convincing 77-44 home win over 12th-seeded Summit in the CJ, G2 quarterfinals. Johnson had 23 points and 18 rebounds and Clark 22 points and 11 boards.

"Earl stepped up his game by scoring down low and dunking on people," Remley said. "Ishmyl was a special player, but Earl had to get him going. Earl had to stay in his ear.

"Earl got other players to play better by talking to them. From a coaches' perspective, that helped us a lot."

Rahway went back to South Brunswick and ended up winning this time, defeating third-seeded Manasquan 62-56 in the 2006 CJ, G2 final. Clark paced the Indians with 19 points, while Johnson netted 17.

After a loss to Haddonfield in a Group 2 semifinal at Perth Amboy, Rahway finished 22-8, which included the team's first Mountain Valley Conference-Mountain Division crown.

"I came in at the end of the (recruiting) process with Pitino and Jay Wright of Villanova," Remley said. "As a senior, I knew that right there this kid would be moving on very quickly. I knew it would happen for him.

"I thought the tough part would be maturing and he did that. He bulked up and I knew if he kept his work ethic at Louisville that he would become a big player.'

A McDonald's All-America at Rahway, Clark averaged 25.2 points, 13.2 rebounds and five assists his senior season and finished with 1,245

Clark wore No. 5 at Louisville and in his college biography he listed the reason for that because his cousin wore the same number when he played football.

"Earl has a lot to offer, has matured and should have a long career," Remley said.

It doesn't happen every year that an athlete from a small town in Union County such as Rahway gets drafted to play a professional sport.

That's what makes Clark's accomplishments all the more special.




Union's Flinn, Kardys honored for efforts

WHEREAS, the Borough has been designated a Tier A municipality under the NJDEP's Stornwater Regulation Program and, therefore, as part of the Borough's NJPDES permit requirements for its stornwater system the Borough is required to implement certain best management practices through the passage of municipal ordinances including this ordinance requiring retrofitting of existing storm drain inlets which are in direct contact with repaving, repairing, reconstruction, resurfacing or alterations of facilities on private property; and WHEREAS, it is understood that stornwater/nonpoint sources are a significant source of pollution in the waters of our state and the Borough desires to do its part to protect the waters of this state.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mountainside, County of Union State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1.
SECTION I. Purpose. An ordinance requiring the retrofitting of existing storm drain inlets which are in direct contact with repaving, repairing, reconstruction, resurfacing or afterations of facilities on private property to prevent the discharge of solids and floatables (such as plastic bottles, cans, food wrappers and other litter) to the Borough's municipal separate storm sewer system so as to protect public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for the failure to comply.

c. Storm drain inlet - an opening in a storm drain used to collect stormwater runoff and including, but not limited to, a grate inlet, curb-opening inlet, slotted inlet, and combination inlet.

d. Waters of the State - the ocean and its estuaries, all springs, streams and bodies of surface or groundwater, whether natural or artificial, within the boundaries of the State of New Jersey or subject to its jurisdiction.

SECTION III. Prohibited Conduct. No person in control of private property (except a residential lot with one single family house) shall authorize the repair of individual patholes), resurfacing (including top coaling or chipsealing with asphalt emulsion or a thin base of hot bitumen), reconstructing or altering any surface that is in direct contact with an existing storm drain inlet on that property unless the storm drain inlet either:

unless the storm drain inlet either:

1. Already meets the design standard below to control passage of solid and floatable materials; or

2. Is retrofitted or replaced to meet the standard in Section IV below prior to the completion of the project.

SECTION IV. Design Standard.
Storm drain inlets identified herein shall comply with the following standard to control passage of solid and floatable materials through storm drain inlets. For purposes of this paragraph, solid and floatable materials means sediment, debris, trash, and other floating, suspended, or settleable solids.

1. Design engineers shall use either of the following grates whenever they use a grate in pavement or another ground surface to collect stormwater from that surface into a storm drain or surface water body under that grate:

a, The New Jersey Department of

a. The New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) bicycle safe

grate, which is described in Chapter 2.4 of the NJDOT Bicycle Compatible Roadways and Bikeways Planning and Design Guidelines (April 1996); or b. Examples of grates subject to this standard include grates in grate inlets, the grate portion (non-curbopening portion) of combination inlets, grates on storm sewer manholes, ditch grates, trench grates, and grates of spacer bars in slotted drains. Whenever design engineers use a curb-opening inlet, the clear space in that curb opening (or each individual clear space, if the curb opening has two or more clear spaces) shall have an area of no more than seven (7.0) square inches, or be no greater than two (2.0) inches across the smallest dimension.

3. This standard does not apply: a Where the municipal engineer use inadequate hydraulic performance inhat could not practicably be overcome by using additional or larger storm drain inlets that meet these standards;

b. Where flows are conveyed through any device (e.g., end of pipe netting facility, manufactured treatment device, or a catch basin hood) that is designed, at a minimum, to prevent delivery of all solid and floatable materials that could not pass through one of the following:

i. A rectangular space four and five-eighths inches long and one and

i. A rectangular space four and five-eighths inches long and one and one-half inches wide (this option does not apply for outfail netting facilities); or

one-half inches wide (this option does not apply for outfall netting facilities); or ii. A bar screen having a bar spacing of 0.5 inches.

c. Where flows are conveyed through a trash rack that has parallel bars with one-inch (1") spacing between the bars; or d. Where the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection determines, pursuant to the New Jersey Register of Historic Places Rules at N.J.A.C. 7:4-7.1(c), that action to meet this standard is an undertaking that constitutes an encroachment or will damage or destroy the New Jersey Register listed historic property.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 1128-2007 REGULATING THE USE OF FIELDS AND THEIR LIGHTS IN THE BOROUGH OF MOUNTAINSIDE

WHEREAS, the Mountainside Recreation Department maintains and schedules use of all athletic fields in the Borough, and first priority of use of such fields is for Recreation Department- sponsored activities. Other users must comply with the rules for use of such athletic fields as set forth by ordinance; and WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined that it is necessary to amend Ordinance 1128-2007, which ordinance sets forth the rules for use of such athletic fields.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mountainside, County of Union State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. Ordinance 1128-2007 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. Ordinance 1128-2007 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION I: RULES
Borough athletic fields are intended to be primarily used for softball, baseball, and youth soccer. Use of the fields for other activities will be considered on an individual basis.

Use of the lighted fields shall be completed by 11:00 p.m. (Borough Hail) and 10:00 p.m. (Deerfield Schoot).

The applicant is responsible for setting up the field(s). The Recreation Department will not supply bases or other field equipment. The applicant is responsible for clean up after use.

The applicant will be held responsible for the field(s) and accepts full responsibility for damages incurred to the fleld(s) and surrounding areas during use by the applicant.

Applicants, organization members, and participants must adhere to posted parking regulations in the Borough parking lots.

Any applicant or participant not following one or more of the rules set forth herein may be prohibited from using the fields again.

Use of the fields is contingent on weather and field conditions.

SECTION II: APPLICATIONS. Applications for use of the field(s) are required for all groups and may be obtained at the Recreation Office Applications should be completed in full and returned at such times as may be designated by established rules and regulations as outlined on the permit application for approval by Council. Priority of use is divided into five categories as set forth herein. With the exception of sanctioned Mountainside youth athletic organizations, permit applications must be submitted at least 30 days in advance but not more than 45 days prior to the requested date. 
