Bank approved; opponents mull appeal

UNION — A controversial application to build a TD Bank at a busy intersection near the Elizabeth border has won the support of the local Zoning Board, much to the chagrin of a concerned citizens 1,000 signatures opposing the proj-

Paula Borenstein, a member Concerned Citizens of Union County, said she and many others are disappointed by the outcome.

The amount of time the CCUC has to file an appeal was not known at press time.

In addition to citizens, elected officials in Hillside and Elizabeth have voiced opposition to the proposal, which calls for the 3.2-acre site at the intersection of North Avenue and Morris Avenue to be

subdivided into two lots.

The 3,800 square-foot, singlestory bank would be built on the larger of the lots, a 2.1-acre parcel. The remaining 1.1-acre space would be donated to Union County for open space.

LINDEN -They were in the presence of greatness and they knew it.

School 9 students belted out patriot hymns as Lt. Michael Sojka of Roselle and Sgt. Gus Paez of Linden greeted most of them for the first time on June 22.

The pair recently returned from their posts in Iraq and visited the school. Not only were they met by the faces of their own children, but hundreds of others who have been sending them care packages, containing lotion, chocolate chip cookies, and cranberry juice, in the past few months. Beyond the snacks and necessities, packages also included letters from the students thanking

The visit was organized by teachers Jennifer DeTrolio and JoAnn Lord for K-Kids, or Linden's junior Kiwanis Club.

The soldier detailed their experiences across the Atlantic, bringing with them gas masks and Kevlar helmets. They even discussed how their camouflage uniforms work, showing off a patch that can be seen at night with infrared cameras to find lost soldiers.

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




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Student's memory lives on in garden



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Solar panels at high school tops list of desired projects

Rahway school board seeks \$34 million for capital projects

RAHWAY — Improvements to the curriculum and facilities are a top priority for the Board of Education, especially if it means earning money for city schools.

During their June 11 meeting, district officials proposed a \$34 million capital projects referendum voters can weigh in on this fall. "We've been looking at our facilities during the past few years, and some of our areas need improving," Superintendent Frank Buglione admitted.

Among the proposed projects are the construction of twelve new instructional spaces at Grover Cleveland School and the addition of solar panels on the roofs of both the high school and middle school - this could be a key source of revenue for the district upon completion, according to Buglione.

The solar panels could generate as much as \$123,000 annually in revenue, while saving nearly \$49,000 each year in the districts electrical bills, according to project architect Faridy Veisz Fraytak, a firm based in Trenton.

on the roof that we can actually sell back to the utility company so its almost like a commodity,' Buglione said.

Justin Tupik, Board of Education vice president and chairman of the Building and Grounds Committee, said a \$730,000 Customer Onsite Renewable Energy rebate — offered through the state's Clean Energy program to support the solar additions came at the perfect time, considering the poor state of the economy. 'If we did not accept the grant for the solar panels within a year of being accepted, we would lose it," Tupik said.

The CORE program helps organizations implement renewable energy technologies and systems. The systems will help an organization produce its own electricity, while protecting the environment, according to its Web site.

Buglione assured school officials are working to the keep the out-of-pocket costs for the capital projects as low as possible, saying the Board of Education has already applied for several state

"It will help create electricity grants. "The state has grants available for construction, and we're on line for that," he said. "We expect some of the projects will be funded 47 percent from state grants and funds."

Buglione said the solar panels are important to the project, but the main push behind the referendum is the need to improve the math and science departments at the high school. "We're trying to get more students to go to college and major in math and science,'

He explained more students should consider majoring in math or science because it is where the future lies for employment opportunities.

"Rahway is a community that looks toward the future, and we want education to be a part of that."

If the capital projects are approved by voters Sept. 29, district officials hope to accept bids on the plan by spring, and begin construction by next summer.

Fla. man embezzles \$900,000 from photo supply company

MOUNTAINSIDE — The former technology chief at Comstock Images Inc. in Mountainside admits he embezzled approximately \$900,000 from the international supplier of professional photography images.

Robert Gonzalez, 36, entered the guilty plea before U.S. District Judge Dennis M. Cavanaugh on June 17.

He reportedly used the money to pay for furniture, electronics and vacations, according to a press release issued by Michael Drewniak, a spokesperson from the U.S. Attorney General's Office.

The Lake Mary, Fla., resident, who worked for Comstock from home, said the company's former chief financial officer, Geraldine Manuel, and others in the financial and technology departments were also involved in the scheme.

Both Gonzalez and Manuel were arrested last October.

Gonzalez admitted he and Manuel charged \$16,700 to his Comstock American Express card during a visit to Circuit City in Union in July 2003. The pair later created expense reports for what would appear to be legitimate company computer equipment in order to conceal the personal purchases. They used checks to pay the American Express bills.

The company credit card was also used to fund personal trips. In June, Gonzalez had allowed Manuel to ment.

eral years ago, in 2002, Gonzalez used the company card to pay for a Royal Caribbean cruise with his wife, which cost more than \$10,000. On another occasion, he paid for air fare, restaurant bills and Walt Disney World tickets for his family and friends. He then sent a \$21,089.31 expense report to Comstock, and Manuel allegedly sent a check in that amount to pay for the fraudulent expenses.

Gonzalez also pleaded guilty to tax evasion, as he admitted to failure to report \$271,329 in taxable income from the scheme in 2002 and \$391,390 in taxable income in 2003.

Gonzalez is being charged with one count of conspiracy to commit mail and wire fraud, which carries a maximum statutory penalty of 20 years in prison, and two counts of tax evasion, each of which carries a maximum statutory penalty of five years in prison. Additionally, he faces a maximum fine of \$250,000 and an order to repay the embezzled funds. Gonzalez is currently free on a \$100,000 secured bond. Judge Cavanaugh has scheduled sentencing for Oct. 15.

Jupitermedia Corp., a Connecticut-based company, bought Comstock in 2004. Seattle-based Getty Images recently acquired parts of Jupitermedia, which has changed its name to WebMediaBrands Inc. Company representatives could not be reached for com-

Research facility OK'd; prompts traffic fears

SUMMIT -- Traffic engineers from Schering-Plough and the city are working to alleviate the potential for gridlock that could be caused by a recently approved application to build a research facility on the company's Morris

A looming merger with Merck Pharmaceuticals, however, could put a hitch in plans to alleviate traffic, according to some planning board

At its June 22 meeting, the Planning Board approved Schering-Plough's request to reduce the size of a research facility on its property from approximately 435,000 square-feet to 239,000 square-feet.

But most of the meeting dealt less with the proposed construction, planned for 2010, and more with how the pharmaceutical company will deal with an influx of new employee vehicles as new jobs are created.

That new research facility, along with another undetermined, 50,000 square-feet construction project slated to kick off in 2015, could add more than a 1,000 new jobs, up to an estimated

total of 3,750 by 2015, according to Schering-Plough representatives. "We had a fairly lengthy discussion in regards to the population of both employees and autos on campus [caused by the new building] and what Schering-Plough intends to do about it," said councilman and Planning Board member Dave

Schering and the city have agreed to study the issue. Traffic engineer Lee Klein, representing Schering-Plough, and Gary Dean, the city engineer, will monitor traffic for the next six months at the location and develop a proposal to improve traffic flow on and off of the property, Bomgaars detailed.

Dean pointed out several measures the company already takes to ease traffic. He noted car pooling, staggered work areas and the use of mass transit are common for employees.

At the latest Planning Board meeting, officials discussed potential strategies to deal with increased traffic, including adding a traffic light near the Passaic Avenue entrance, and moving back the guard shack at the Morris Avenue entrance, in an effort create more space for longer lines of drivers.

Bomgaars also said Schering-Plough was looking at implementing new technologies to speed up 1D checks. "[Electronic] card readers or vehicle IDs would expedite vehicles moving through the guard tower. Employees wouldn't have to stop and have a guard physically look at their cards," he said.

A potential roadblock for any traffic calming plans, however, may be Schering-Plough's future is arger with Merck, which is expected to be official by the end of the company's fiscal

Bomgaars said Schering-Plough officials told him Merck was not involved in designing or reviewing the plans for the two proposed constructions. "Merck could completely change the plan," Bomgaars said. "I would be surprised if they continue with every aspect of [the cur-

He added he expects representatives from Merck to approach the Planning Board in the first quarter of 2010 with a revised design for the two construction projects.

Municipal Building rooms to offer space, savings for pre-K

CLARK - If educating a child takes a village, other schools could take a lesson or two from Clark.

Township officials have offered the use of four vacant rooms in their Municipal Building to the district at no cost to the schools.

The offer comes as the district is expanding its kindergarten program and adding pre-K classes.

Interim Superintendent of Schools Renae LaPrete said the state had pushed for expanded pre-K programs, until funding to support the growth was no longer available. "We're doing it on our own, because it's the right thing to do for kids," she said.

for recreation programs, but nothing on a steady or daily basis," said Clark Mayor Sal Bonaccorso.

Bonaccorso told officials they could use the vacant rooms earlier in the year, leading them to find "creative" ways to take advantage of the free space, like making the entirely new program.

The use of the space will not come with a price tag, though the district will bear the cost of furnishing the rooms, according to LaPrete. Funding and furnishing a state-of-the-art class room could cost up to \$20,000. LaPrete said the amount set aside in the school budget is "minimal," due to the free space, donated supplies and tuition

"[The rooms] have been...used fees. "If I charged the district, the responses from parents. money still would come out of taxpayer pockets," Bonaccorso said regarding the free use of rooms. "It's shared services, it's a great

Three rooms, located in the middle of Town Hall, between the business and recreation wings, will be used for the new pre-K program each will be equipped to handle 15 students. Admittance to the program has been capped at 45 children, though it may be expanded in the future based on need, LaPrete

Of the 45 available spots in the pre-K program, 42 were filled as of last week. Officials said they antic-

The full day program was expected to cost parents about \$7,000 per student, until savings on the classroom space and donations from L'Oreal helped lower that figure. Final costs are not yet known, school officials said.

L'Oreal donated \$6,500 worth of classroom equipment, including cameras, printers, crayons and markers.

"A lot of parents are enthusiastic," said LaPrete, noting the program, which many districts cannot afford, will allow children to meet other Clark peers and bond at a younger age. Roselle cut from list of districts to improve

ROSELLE - Roselle's Public Schools have been adding. Now, the state is subtracting.

Improvements to the district in the past two years have been enough to remove the schools from the state Department of Education's list of districts in need of improvement. The district was added to the list two years ago, after standardized test scores fell below state requirements. Once designated a district in need of improvement, the school faced severe penalties from the state if they did not improve.

Superintendent of Schools Elnardo Webster summarized the districts achievement in a word: intentionality.

He pointed to a new leadership team that has led to increases in students' standardized test scores this, he said, warranted the school system's removal from the list.

"What we've done is put a new foundation in place... Our approach is not just a quick fix," Webster said.

The effectiveness of this new "foundation" was evident in stu-

since 2007. Student's standardized test scores have increased in mathematics, science and language arts, with improvements of up to almost 20 percent in some areas, according to statistics issued by the Roselle school district.

School report cards issued in 2008 showed an 18.8 percent rise in language arts scores at Polk School; 9.2 percent rise in math scores at Harrison Elementary; 7.5 percent increase in math scores at Washington School, and 6.5 percent jump in both science scores at L.V. Moore and in eighth-grade literacy scores at the same school.

"We commend...your staff, students and stakeholders for the hard work you have done to improve the academic achievement of your students," said NJDOE Director of Student Achievement Suzanne Ochse in a letter to the district. "We recognize the challenges that districts face providing students with a meaningful and enriching educational experience, while implementing the many initiatives under, No Child Left Behind.

¹ Data analysis, staff develop-

ment, parental involvement and student-centered activities are just some of the many areas Roselle has concentrated on, Webster said.

Funding to support new familybased activities has increased, due in part to an analysis of the budget this year, said Webster.

The total budget is \$53.4 million, which represents a 4 percent hike from last year's \$51.3 million spending plan.

This year, school officials found saving from by reviewing several areas, one of which was \$400,000 cut through renegotiations with businesses offering services to the district. Schools also received sevstate grants, including \$800,000 to update the curriculum.

Other budget savings will be used to build much-needed science and computer laboratories, according to Webster.

Noting the importance of more parental presence, Webster explained a women's empowerment program and programs on fatkerhood have been implemented within the past few years. Newsletters are also being issued to ensure the community is informed about

Webster noted more diversity in the schools has also had a positive impact on the student body, with several new administrators hired to reflect the changing demographics in the borough.

According to the U.S. Census, the percent of Asian residents in Roselle moved from 2.7 percent in 2000 to 6.2 percent in 2007. During that same time, residents listed as "other race." such as Caribbean or Haitian, jumped from 6.1 to 13.4

During the 2008-09 school year, the district hired its first Latino. Caribbean and Haitian principals, as well as its first Latino business administrator.

PILOT program approved; to avoid expensive legal battle

ROSELLE PARK -Despite some opposition from residents, municipal officials unwilling to continue litigation against a developer, have OK'd the establishment of a tax exemption program that encourages development at the Romerovski site on Westfield Avenue

Before a crowd of about sixty residents who attended the meeting, the governing body voted unanimously to approve the Payment in Lieu of Taxes program at its June 22 meeting.

Relations between the borough and the Virginia-based developer, Avalon Bay, began disintegrating in 2007, as both parties began disputing the future of the 4.8 acre parcel on Westfield Avenue - the developer called for 249 luxury apartments to be built in a four-and-ahalf story building, while the governing body and residents hoped retail would be included in the plan.

In 2006, the borough designated the site as an area in need of redevelopment. The same year. Avalon Bay submitted its plan to build at the site. The developer sued the borough in 2007 for failing to meet their state-mandated affordable housing needed. To date, the city has spent \$328,000 on the lawsuit.

The Payment in Lieu of Taxes program expected to allow the borough to receive ten percent of the

county would receive 5 percent of would not receive money. Traditional tax revenue from the site is estimated to be about \$775,000.

Finance Officer Ken Blum indicated costs associated with continuing the lawsuit would likely prevent the borough from meeting the state's four percent tax levy cap next year and could also necessitate furloughs for municipal employees.

City officials said these financial factors were a major part of the difficult decision to agree to the developer's terms. "I want to be the David that stands up to the Goliath, but at what cost?" Councilman Michael Yakubov asked.

Mayor Joseph Delorio suggested continued litigation was unlikely to pay off. "Even if we go back to court, the judge could rule in such a way that leaves us even worse off," Delorio said, noting judges have been known to penalize towns that are sued for failing to meet Council on Affordable Housing obligations.

Several hours of public comment that stretched the meeting until into the late hours included repeated complaints about Avalon Bay's conduct, and regarding COAH. Some residents were in favor of accepting the PILOT program, while others urged borough officials to carry on the fight.

Clark hasn't been given \$25 million of "capital funding." These monies totaled \$17,050,000 for three properties to private owners. Clark sold its reservoir to the county for \$1. To date, Clark taxpayers have paid \$2,342,561 into the Open

Space Trust Fund; Cranford has paid \$3,769,526; Elizabeth, \$7,228,628. Elizabeth, which is the seat of Union County government, has seen the least return for their investment into the open space trust fund. So much for political relationships.

When Democrats were in the majority, Cranford taxpayers did not see one dime more of their county tax dollars returned to them. 



City divided on Gateway II plan

SUMMIT — The Gateway II Project is still under construction.

The proposal won the approval of the city's Planning Board during the spring, but was not well-received by the governing body June 16 — the City Council opposed the project in a 6-1 vote. About fifty residents attended the meeting to share their thoughts on the project.

The goal of the plan is to transform major roads leading across the city's eastern border from a commercial corridor dominated by a car dealership into a more residential, pedestrian-friendly area that will appeal to commuters, according to city officials.

The project had called for the construction of four- to five-story residential buildings, between 40 and 53 feet high, on Broad Street. The site is currently dominated by an auto dealership. About 20 percent of the units were to be designated as affordable housing.

Councilman Mike Vernotico said he was concerned the plan was too restrictive to appeal to prospective developers. He noted the grading proposal was of particular concern.

"If we don't get this right at this one site, then nothing will happen there," Vernotico said. "This is a very complicated site."

Councilman Thomas Getzendanner cast the lone vote in favor of the project. He said he shares some of Vernotico's concerns, but added the plan should be approved, then "tweaked," rather than risk protracting the process. out with the bathwater," Getzendanner said. "This thing has been two years in the making. The concern now is we're going to lose all the momentum, and it will never come to pass."

During her presentation to the council, city planner Eileen Banyra stressed the Gateway II Committee has received feedback from many property owners in the area and worked to create a plan that best represented the goals of the city and residents. "No matter what we build there, half the people in town are going to like it and half the people are going to hate it," she said.

City officials, however, remain skeptical.

Councilman At-Large Frank Macioce said he initially had a favorable opinion of the proposal, until Vernotico raised concerns he felt were not adequately addressed in previous months by the Gateway II Committee and the Planning Board.

Resident Chip Duane, who owns property at the site, said the presentation was impressive, but limiting. "I don't see a developer doing this project," Duane said. "I feel the worst thing you can do is approve this ordinance."

The ordinance has been referred to the Building and Grounds Committee, for changes. "Hopefully they will come up with something that will address the many questions that were raised," Macioce soid

(Continued from Page 1) not disclose the total projected cost of the project, and would not comment on the developer's next move until the plan gains final approval.

Union Zoning Officer Richard Malanda said he felt the developer's application was an improvement from its 2007 proposal, which was withdrawn for reasons he would not discuss. This plan called for two buildings to be constructed at the site.

"People from Elizabeth were pretty passionate, but they did realize this application was much better than the previous one," Malanda said. "This plan has one building, instead of two on the lot, and dedicates more than an acre to the county for Green Acres. They're also doing a lot of work on the public right of way at the intersection."

Safety at the intersection has been a major point of concern, with the project's opponents, proponents and the state Depart-

ment of Transportation citing conflicting accounts of the danger to pedestrians. TD bank has agreed to foot the bill for traffic improvements at the intersection. McClintock would not speculate on the possible cost of these upgrades.

The site is part of the Liberty Hall property, where New Jersey's first governor resided from 1772 through 1790.

Borenstein said the historic status of the site has been overlooked by the applicant,

although a private historical preservation advocacy group, Preservation New Jersey, has recognized the significance of the parcel.

"Our position hasn't changed- it's only deepened now that the site has been named as one of the ten most endangered historic sites in New Jersey," Borenstein said.

The second reading and final adoption of the ordinance approving the application is scheduled to take place in a few weeks.



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

Bank employee steals \$2.5M

CLARK — A township man says a mail fraud scam he operated at two different banks netted him a total of \$2.5 million during a nearly ten year span.

pleaded guilty to one count of mail fraud June 17. This admission made it possible for him to avoid the indictment process, according to the U.S. District Attorney Office of New Jersey.

Pinho is free on a \$250,000 secured bond, with sentencing scheduled for Sept. 21.

Between 2001 through Jan. 21, Pinho worked for two banks, identified only as "P.B.A." and "C.B." in a June 17 press release issued by the U.S. Department of Justice.

Pinho admitted to taking customer funds and depositing them into bank accounts he controlled, rather than purchasing the CDs.

Pinho was able to continue the scam for so long because he paid customers who demanded withdrawals from the CDs, according to Assistant U.S. Attorney Grace

He admitted to the court he used the funds for his personal use. The Department of Justice did not reveal what was purchased with the funds.

Pinho faces a maximum penalty of 30 years in prison and a fine of \$1 million.

Also, as part of his guilty plea, he must pay restitution to an unspecified number of victims to his crimes.

Pinho could not be reached for comment.

Center to house refugees

The county of Union is working with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to provide 15 beds at its Juvenile Detention Center in Linden to youths from other countries who have run afoul of the U.S. juvenile justice system.

This contract, which went into effect June 1, is expected to generate more than \$1 million in annual revenue to the county coffers.

"This is an example of entrepreneurial thinking that will assist abandoned children who truly need society's help," Freeholder Chairman Alexander Mirabella said. "Besides being a revenue generator for the county, this is a great human services accomplishment and I congratulate our county manager and Director Frank Guzzo on making this happen."

In his executive budget letter in January, County Manager George W. Devanney had proposed the exploration of leasing beds at the center for additional revenues.

Union County Human Services Director Frank Guzzo said this arrangement is the first of its kind in the tri-state area and one of perhaps five of its kind in the entire country.

While no youths have been referred to the facility for this purpose yet, Guzzo said he is in contact with federal officials and expects the program will be put to use soon.

Guzzo said most of the youths who will use the center are from Honduras, Guatemala and Mexico. Guzzo said these children have left their home countries for many different reasons. Some come to America hoping to reunite with family members already in the country, while others come fleeing

County hits bull's-eye with archery range

Straight shooters rejoiced last week as the Union County Archery Range was finally completed, the first of its kind in the county.

Local bowmen were able to begin using the Archery Range at Oak Ridge Park in Clark yester-

County officials said the public range is the first of its kind in Union County. Archers at a ribbon cutting ceremony last week said the nearest public practice ranges are found in Essex and Hudson counties.

Those who worked to build the new range said that, according to state permit figures, there are approximately 4,000 archers in Union County. Range organizer and designer Michael Tully, 58, said about 1,000 of those are hunters and 500 are involved in shooting clubs.

Volunteerism was one of the driving forces behind bringing the archery range to Oak Ridge Park. Tully, a 45-year veteran of archery, said he proposed the idea to the county three years ago while working at an archery supply store. He was pushed to action when he heard the only site for local enthusiasts just closed.

"Ellen (Dilorio, instructor for the Union County 4-H Archery Club) walked in with the glummest look ever seen...she said our kids don't have any place to shoot now that the Trap and Skeet in Kenilworth closed down. We said this won't stand, we have to do something," Tully recalled.

So, after years of meetings with county officials and trying to find a location, volunteers converged on Oak Ridge Park, providing an estimated 1,000 hours of labor to build protective fencing, arrow holders, targets and even warning signs near the range, according to Tully.

Volunteers from the Cranford Rod and Gun club, United Bow Hunters of New Jersey, Traditional Archers of New Jersey, 4-H club and Boy Scouts of New Jersey did most of the work, allowing the county to only pay between \$6,000 and \$7,000 for the fencing, according to county spokesperson Tina

Upkeep costs will be very low as well, she added, as instructors from the 4-H club are already funded, and costs of administering ID cards are nominal.

Some locals helped cover additional costs as well as providing manpower. Boy Scout Eric Rachman gathered \$1,000 in donations, funding two targets and material for a supply shed, which he built with friends. The work was part of his Eagle Scout proj-

The archery range itself is olympic-sized, with space up to 90 meters. Up to 20 archers can use the range at a time, which is open from dawn until dusk,

Seven licensed instructors will also be available to teach anyone interested in archery. Until now, Union County instructors have practiced in borrowed garages and warehouses.

"This has come just in time for the Union County 4-H Archery Club," said Dilorio.

Judge adds jail

Two men charged with escaping from the Union County Jail in 2007 will be serving additional prison time following their June 26 sentencing by Judge Joseph Donohue.

Otis Blunt, 32, of Toms River and Jose Espinosa, 21, of Elizabeth both received five-year sentences for charges of third-degree escape.

The two men escaped from Union County jail in Elizabeth between Dec. 14 and 15 of 2007, crawling through * holes chiseled in the walls of their cells and leaping over a barbed wire fence.

Within month both were recaptured. Blunt was captured in Mexico City and Espinosa found at an apartment Elizabeth.



Otis Blunt was the first to appear in court. According to Assistant Prosecutor Ann Rubin, Blunt has a long history of criminal behavior dating back to 1995 when he was convicted of robbery and aggravated assault in Hudson County. Blunt was acquitted of robbery charges in 2007, a verdict that came after he had escaped from the Union County Jail.

Because of this factor, his attorney, H. Rutherford Livengood II argued Blunt should receive jail "credit" for his time spent in prison before his acquittal.

argued for a reduced sentence on behalf of the fact that Blunt was employed at the time of his arrest and kept an active family life during that period.

Donohue, however, stated that, "there is a need to protect society from Mr. Blunt...the maximum sentence must be enforced."

Donohue did however allow Blunt 530 days of jail credit for the time he served awaiting trial prior to his escape.

Espinosa, who was serving a 17-year sentence for aggravated manslaughter at the time of his

escape, will be serving his additional sentence subsequently.

Espinosa's attorney, Marc D'Arienzo, requested that he serve the two sentences concurrently, claiming that he had been manipulated by Blunt, who D'Arienzo described as "an evil genius."

Donohue, however, stated that Espinosa had committed a gang execution

"This sentence is not for rehabilitation, but for isolation," Donohue said.

Neither Blunt nor Espinosa made any statements themselves.

Following the escape, a series

of reforms were made to address shortcomings at the jail.

These included stricter inspection of cells, additional razor wire fencing and upgraded surveillance equipment.

Both Blunt and Espinosa's attorneys expressed regret on their clients' behalf for the amount of resources expended in the search for them as well as the suicide of corrections officer Robert Zurick, who took his own life shortly after the escape.

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(Continued from Page 24) from abusive families. Still more seek to escape from political or religious persecution, or to find work to support their families in their country of origin. Some are victims of slave trafficking, officials said

"For whatever reason, they have committed a crime and been arrested somewhere in the United States," Guzzo said. "The bottom line is that these are kids who have come into the country and found themselves alone."

Guzzo negotiated the contract with the Division of Unaccompanied Children Services, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the Administration of Children and Families and the Office of Refugee Resettlement.

In the past, cases involving undocumented minors were handled by Immigration and Custom Enforcement, which often led to children being detained in facilities meant for adults.

In March, 2008, the county replaced its 34-bed detention facility with a new, 76-bed secure facility that works to promote the concept of normative justice where secure detention is viewed as an

opportunity to change behavior in a way that will benefit the offender, family and the community atlarge.

This strategy is in keeping with the facility's status as a Juvenile Detention Alternative Initiative site, and has already made a difference, Guzzo said. The center's daily census is now at about 28 residents, while in 2004, Guzzo reported an average of more than 50 residents at the center daily. The low number of residents also frees space to lease beds to the undocumented children.

"This has allowed us to pursue revenue generators that might not otherwise have been available if the county had not concentrated its efforts on creating alternatives to detention," said Guzzo.

Trinitas Regional Medical Center will also be participating in this program through a separate contract with the detention center to provide case work and clinical services to residents in their native languages. This service will also be paid for by the federal government.



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

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

Brearley's Mannix and Rahway's Eastman excel

Make big plays for North football All Stars

UNION – Although only one touchdown was scored, there was plenty of drama at the conclusion of Monday night's 31st annual North-South All Star Football Game at Kean University's Kean Alumni Stadium.

A pass interference call on the South at its goal line gave the home team North one more chance to get in the end zone with no time remaining.

The last play of the game resulted in quarterback Troy Eastman of Rahway trying to get his team into the end zone. He took the hand off from the South's six-yard line and rolled to his right.

He looked to pass first, saw nobody open and then decided to try to run the ball in.

Eastman was met at the three-yard line and then brought down by a couple of South defenders.

It was a valiant effort by the Maine-bound Eastman and the North offense, which began its final drive on its own 16 with 2:43 left and ended up marching down the field for the only time of the game.

The South held on for a hard-fought 7-0 victory, winning for the second time in three games to increase its lead in the series to 15-13-2. There was no game played in 2002 because of inclement weather.

The South posted its first shutout triumph in the series since a 3-0 win in 2003 at Rutgers. The game was played at Kean University for the first time because of the renovations going on at Rutgers Stadium in Piscataway.

"The Kean University administration and coaching staff went out of its way to cater to us and I think our kids really enjoyed their experience here," said North committee member John Liberato, who will soon get ready for his third season as the head coach of the Summit Hilltoppers. "It's a lot of fun. We do it for the kids so they can be showcased and what better way than to showcase our kids on MSG."

The game was to be broadcast on MSG Plus Tuesday night.

Liberato explained at halftime that Kean had a live broadcast on the internet and that one of Kean's trustees was in China watching the game live on the web at that time.

The only other sites for the North-South All Star Game besides Rutgers have been Giants Stadium three times in a row in the early 1990s and The College of New Jersey twice three years apart in the mid-to-late 1990s. Those games were also held there because of renovations being made at Rutgers Stadium at those times.

This time a Union County venue was chosen for the first time.

"This was my first choice after Rutgers wasn't available because of construction," Liberato said. "We reached out to a couple of colleges, but to be honest with you, Kean really stepped up to the plate to make sure that we got this game in top speed."

The only touchdown and score of the game was produced less than four minutes into the contest when South offensive MVP and starting quarterback Nick Tyson of Freehold completed a 66-yard touchdown pass down the right sideline with 11:32 left in the 15-minute first quarter.

The South missed three field goals in the second quarter, the first and third ones wide right and the second one wide left.

The North was held to just one first down in the first half, with Eastman running for it late in the second quarter.

The North MVPs were standouts from perennial Group 1 powers. Strong safety Tom Mannix of Brearley was his team's defensive MVP and wideout Chris Looney of Verona was its offensive MVP.

Mannix had two fumble recoveries in the third quarter and came up big with a solo deflected pass and a key assisted tackle in the fourth quarter.

Mannix will continue at Holy Cross.

Looney caught a six-yard pass from Eastman on the North's first play from scrimmage and then caught several other passes as he became a likely target of quarterbacks Eastman and Dan Dugan of Johnson, who will continue at TCNJ.

Looney will next play at Colgate.

Mannix recovered his first fumble with 11:06 left in the third quarter. His second fumble recovery with less than five minutes left before the fourth period was even more impressive.

The South had the ball inside the North five-yard line and was getting ready to go in on a running play. Mannix was then able to wrestle the ball away from the South running back and sprinted up field for 30 yards before being caught and tackled from behind.

"He played a very good game, something I've been seeing for quite some time," said Brearley head coach Scott Miller. "I'm not shocked that he was able to do what he did tonight."

Mannix was a four-sport standout at Brearley who excelled at football, wrestling (for his first two years), basketball (for his last two years) and baseball. He started on the only 12-0 football team in Union County history in 2006 when Brearley came back and then held on to defeat Verona 21-20 in the North 2, Group 1 championship game at Giants Stadium.

That was Brearley's first state title since previously capturing N2, G1 in 1991.

Then this past spring season Mannix was Brearley's No. 1 pitcher during a campaign in which the Bears captured a sectional championship for the first time – winning Central Jersey, Group 1 behind winning pitcher Mannix in the final – and reached its first-ever state title contest – the Group 1 final in which Mannix lost a 4-2 decision to Park Ridge.

Mannix went from playing high school baseball up until June 7 to competing in the second annual Mountain Valley Conference vs. Watchung Conference All Star Baseball Game at Elizabeth's Williams Field on June 10 to then joining his North teammates for practice for the North-South All Star Football Game.

Now he will continue to focus on just football as he will begin preparing for his career on the Division 1-AA level at Holy Cross.

"I think Tommy has a chance to compete right away," Miller said. "The biggest thing with Tommy is now being focused just on football and getting the opportunity to get in the weight room and get some more weight on and get some more size on him.

"He's a very smart player. He's a tough-nosed kid and he sees things well.


He's going to have a great opportunity to get on the field this year and down the road I can see him being at least a two-year starter for them."


One of the top basketball players to come out of the Mountain Valley Conference and one of the best athletes to compete at Rahway High School had a dream realized Thursday night.

The 6-9, 225-pound junior guard-forward out of the University of Louisville will now get a chance to play with guard Steve Nash, a two-time MVP for the Suns.


Clark, 21, was the second player selected out of Louisville, with teammate Terrence Williams, also a forward, selected by the New Jersey Nets as the 11th overall pick.

Mannix was Brearley's quarterback this past year and helped lead the Bears to a 9-1 record that included an 8-0 regular season.

The only team the Bears lost to was eventual North 2, Group 1 champion Verona 36-7 in a semifinal at Ward Field in Kenilworth.

Brearley's biggest win of the season was its comefrom-behind 20-13 triumph at New Providence, which enabled the Bears to win another MVC-Valley Division crown.

"He was like having another coach on the field,"
Miller said

Mannix was just happy to get out on the field and mix it up with his North teammates. He will play in the secondary at Holy Cross.

"It was a lot of fun," Mannix said. "We had a fun week, a good week.

"We were on the field for a long time, but it was fun just running around and hitting people."

Players like Mannix and Looney proved that those from Group 1 schools could make an impact in a game like this right along players who were competing from larger districts.

"In practice, every day I practiced it was a challenge," Mannix said.
"I know I got better and I think a lot of other play-

"I know I got better and I think a lot of other play ers got better just from practicing."

Right when it looked like the South was getting ready to go in for what would have been a big two-touchdown lead, Mannix was there to take the ball away and give his team decent field position for its very next drive.

"I didn't want him to get in the end zone so I lowered my shoulder and I hit into him and the ball kind of just fell right into my stomach," Mannix said of his second fumble recovery.

As Mannix came up with the ball, he had nothing but an open field in front of him as he began to race down the middle of the field with the ball as if he was on a quarterback keeper after he broke through the line of scrimmage.

"One of my own players knocked into me so I kind of stumbled a little bit," Mannix said. "I saw the open field and then that was it, they got to me."

The North-South All Star Football Game is always more than just 60 minutes of football. It's set up to get these college-bound players ready for their next level of competition.

"This was a great experience and really good preparation for college, which I'm going to be going to in about a month," Mannix said.

Mannix and Looney can both hold their heads high for the way they represented their Group 1 schools among the big boys.

"Usually, Group 1 doesn't get a lot of respect, so I wanted to come out here and represent Group 1 a little bit and represent Brearley," Mannix said.

With Mannix a key member of the Brearley varsity football team the past four seasons, the Bears went on to post a 39-4 (.907) record that included a 6-3 playoff mark, two state championship games, one state title and three conference crowns.

Miller came over to Irvington head coach Darnell Grant after the game and jokingly gave it to him, saying that at least he (Miller) won't go down as the offensive coach with the lowest output by the North, referring to him having a larger role in coaching the North offense during its 14-7 loss to the South in the 2007 game at Rutgers.

Grant is no stranger to being on the sidelines for the North as he has coached in other recent North-South contests.

Still, it's always a challenge to get an offense to come together and be comfortable with each other and know the schemes.

"It's really, really tough," Grant said. "You look at both teams and both sputtered around. We had bad field position all night and we just couldn't get what we wanted to get going, going."

Grant had high praise for Looney, who in the N2, G1 playoffs last year proved to be a target that opponents New Providence, Brearley and Hoboken had trouble containing.

"Chris Looney is a great player in any group," Grant said. "Sometimes you get those kids and it doesn't matter."

Gary Mobley, Rahway's head coach, last coached in the North-South game in 2007 and was on the defensive staff Monday night.

He will surely miss one of the best players Rahway ever produced in Eastman, who was also a track and field standout with the javelin for the Indians this past spring.

Eastman threw a touchdown pass in the first half that was called back because of offensive pass interference. He also broke contain down the left sideline for big yardage and a first down during the North's final and most productive drive of the evening.

"Troy Eastman will go down as one of the all-time greats in Rahway history," said Mobley, who was a special player himself for Lou Rettino at Union before graduating in 1986.

"The kid is a first team all-stater, he brought this Rahway program back to the map and you just saw tonight on the field what kind of kid he is."

Eastman helped lead Rahway to its first North 2, Group 3 title game in nine years last fall and also quarterbacked the Indians to their first 10-win campaign since the 1999 team went 10-2, just like the 2008 squad did. Rahway was defeated by Phillipsburg 20-6 in last December's N2, G3 championship game at Rutgers.

"You could see that, with his talent, among stars he can still stand out," Mobley said.

Like Mannix and Looney, Eastman has an opportunity to make a name for himself on the Division I-AA level at Maine.

"I think Maine has gotten a steal," Mobley said. "Troy is a kid that's a born winner. He has all the great characteristics such as integrity and work ethic, so I think it's a great fit for what they're doing.

"We have a couple of guys up there already. He really feels comfortable with what's going on and they expect him to come in and push for playing time.

"He should do very, very well in a great conference, the Colonial Athletic Association.

"That's top-flight ball. "He deserves to be there and he will do well."

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAP-TER 4, ARTICLE II, \$4-3.31 "OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS AND OPEN PUB-LIC RECORDS", ¶ N "EFFECTIVE DATE AND SCOPE."

WHEREAS, given the strains upon the Federal, State and Local Governmental agencies during the continuing global financial and economic crises, the Township Council recognizes the serious fiscal constraints under which it must operate in order to responsibly discharge its duties; and
WHEREAS, it has become clear that the expected implementation of this unprecedented Ordinance 0-08-025, also referred to as the Open Public Meetings and Open Public Records ordinance, will require the expenditure of substantial sums of money by the Township; and 'WHEREAS, further delaying the implementation of the Ordinance beyond May 2009 will enable the Township representatives, including the incoming Mayor, to provide input into and to Turther evaluate the manner and timing in which the various components of the Ordinance are to be financed and implemented so as to ensure that the Township is not overburdened with unreasonable, irresponsible or unanticipated costs in the next and subsequent fiscal years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT OR-DAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Hillside in the County of Union, State of New Jersey, that the Township of Hillside Code is hereby amended as follows:

1. Chapter 4, Article II, §4-3.31 "Open Public Meetings and Open Public

1. Chapter 4. Article II, §4-3.31 "Open Public" Meetings and Open Public Records", ¶ N "Effective date and scope" only, as follows:

§ 4-3.31 Open Public Meetings and Open Public Records:

N. Effective date and scope. This act shall take effect on the 365th day after enactment and shall be published as required by law. Minutes, agendas, resolutions and enacted ordinances created on or taking effect after January 1, 2000, but before the effective date of this section shall be made available to the public on the Internet within 180 days after the effective date.

2. Severability. Each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase. If any portion of this Ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstances, shall be adjudged or otherwise determined to be invalid, unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause or reason, such determination shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance, and the application of such remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are severable.

3. This Ordinance is not meant to repeal any provisions of the Code other than those designated herein but to add to its requirements, and all Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 55 (LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES) OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HILLSIDE.

WHEREAS, the Township of Hill-side's Free Public Library has over recent years witnessed increased unresolved late charges from the non-return of library property and materials as well as the destruction and defac-ing of library property and materials; and

and
WHEREAS, the aforementioned conduct has both increased the financial burden of the library and negatively impacted the quality and quantity of library materials available to the public and

ilibrary materials available to the public; and WHEREAS, the Library Director recommend that the Township Council adopt an ordinance setting forth a process providing for adequate notice to library users and a penalty schedule addressing the failure to return library materials and the destruction and/or defacing of library materials.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Hillside in the County of Union, State of New Jersey, that the Township of Hillside Code is hereby amended as follows:

1. Chapter 55 of the Code entitled "LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES", shall be amended by adding a new § 55-3 " Library Materials, Rules and Regulations", to read as follows:

§ 55-3. Library Materials, Rules and Regulations

\$ 55-3, Library Materials, Rules and Regulations

A. Failure to return overdue materials after notice.
"Overdue" shall mean the first day after the due date shown on the item borrowed from the Library.
"Person" shall also mean any parent or guardian who as agreed to be responsible for Library items borrowed by another person.

No person shall detain or fail to return any book, periodical, pamphlet, artistic reproduction, audio-visual material or any other item borrowed from the Hillside Public Library of the Township of Hillside (hereinafter also referred to as the "Library") after 30 days have elapsed from the overdue date. When an item becomes 7 days overdue, the Library shall mail, by regular mail, up to 4 Overdue Notices to any person who fails to return overdue items as set forth above, demanding the return of such overdue items thereof or payment of fines therefore, which Notice shall be addressed to said person at the last address furnished to the Library.

B. Destruction of materials.

No person shall cut, tear, deface, disfigure, damage or destroy any book, periodical, pamphlet, artistic reproduction, audio-visual material or any other item, or any part thereof, borrowed from, owned by or in the custody of the Library.

C. Posting of rules, regulations and procedures.

The Library Board shall adopt and post in a conspicuous place in the Library buildings from which Items may be borrowed, rules, regulations and procedures governing the borrowing of books, periodicals, pamphlets, artistic reproductions, audio-visual materials and any other items available for borrowing by the public.

D. Compliance with rules, regulations and procedures required.

No person shall remove any book, periodical, pamphlet, artistic reproductions, audio-visual material or any other item from the Library bounding without complying with the rules, regulations and procedures of the Library Board is authorized to file a complaint in the Municipal Court after the following conditions have been met: 1) at least 60 days have elapsed

PUBLIC NOTICE

mentioned in § 55-3(A) above, informing the person that the book or other item is still overdue and that s/he is subject to prosecution pursuant to this Ordinance. In the case of a minor, which shall be any person under the age of 18 years, all Notices and Court documents submitted pursuant to this § 55-3 shall be sent to the parents or guardian of the minor involved.

F. Violations and penalties.

Any person who violates or refuses to comply with the provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine for the first offense in an amount of \$100.00, and for any subsequent offense in an amount of \$200.00. In addition to the payments of the fines set forth above, any person upon conviction for violating any provision hereof relating to the failure to return an overdue item to the Library, shall also pay court costs, and shall either return the unreturned Library items or be responsible for the payment of the actual value of the items or materials not returned.

Severability. Each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance and the application to any person or circumstances, shall be adjudged or otherwise determined to be invalid, unconstitutional, vold, or Ineffective for any cause or reason, such determination shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance, and the application of such remaining provisions of this Ordinance are severable.

3. This Ordinance is not meant to repeal any provisions of the Code other than those designated herein but to add to its requirements, and all Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed only to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.
