Critters' need care in winter

In the dead of winter, when most people are concentrating on keeping themselves and their families warm and fed, it can be easy to forget there are many animals without owners and in need of the same necessities.

Union County's animal shelters and animal control facilities typically experience a slowdown in the rate of adoption during the winter months, resulting in a risk of overcrowding.


Carla Prince, a member of the Friends of Linden Animal Shelter's executive committee, said the facility tends to see a drop in adoptions during the winter months.

"Usually we see a little bit of a slowdown on adoption of dogs," she said.

Prince said this could be because the winter months offer little opportunity to engage in the outdoor activity that is part of the responsibility and fun of owning a dog.

The Friends of Linden Animal Shelter, one of the county's largest facilities, currently houses seven dogs and about 50 cats, as well as more animals in outside foster homes.

The shelter averages two dog adoptions each week. Many cat adoptions occur at off-site locations

such as the Pet Smart store in Union.

Pet Smart Operations Manager Mike Gorga said this partnership has been fruitful, with the Union branch of Pet Smart seeing particular success.

"I believe we lead our district most of the time in weekly, monthly and total adoptions," he said.

The district encompasses a total of 12 stores in the Northeast New Jersey area.

Gorga said that the exception to the winter slump in adoptions is Christmas, when many cats become gifts.

"Toward Christmas time the numbers do spike," Gorga said.

Gorga said it makes sense for pet stores to partner with animal shelters to help animals find homes.

However, domesticated animals are not the only critters that need more attention this time of year. Harbor Animal Control, a private wildlife company based in Elizabeth, which deals only with non-domesticated animal problems, also reported an increase in work during the winter.


"Calls generally increase as the weather gets colder," said owner Frank Spiecker.

He said many jobs involve wayward raccoons and squirrels that seek shelter in homes and garages.

"They are acquiring a new home, generally in attics, because it is away from any predators that may be in the area," Spiecker said.

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Linden man faces theft, forgery charges

Last week, a former Linden resident was arrested and charged with 13 separate counts after an investigation revealed that he used another man's identity to secure \$270,000 in loans, said Prosecutor Theodore J. Romankow.

John Melchionna, 42, faces charges of theft by deception, identity theft and forgery Romankow said. The charges were filed following an investigation by the Prosecutor's Office and Linden Police Department Detec-

According to the complaints, Melchionna allegedly used the money, obtained by using a business associate's name, to purchase real estate in Elizabeth. He then forged the associate's name on mortgages to secure the loans, Romankow said.

In addition, Melchionna was charged with running up approximately \$300,000 in credit card charges between 2006 and 2008 on credit cards he obtained in the victim's name.

Romankow said the credit card statements and correspondence regarding the real estate transactions used the address of an investment property the victim owned in Linden where Melchionna allegedly collected the rents on his behalf while also intercepting the victim's mail.

The victim went to the Linden Police in December 2008 when he ran a credit check on his name and discovered numerous mortgages and credit cards had been taken out by Melchionna in his name.

Melchionna is currently under indictment for using another friend's identity in November 2007 to obtain a \$40,000 loan from The Hamilton Group, a New York lender.

In that case, authorities allege that Melchionna secured the loan by preparing fraudulent invoices for non-existent accounts receivable.

The fraud was discovered when the owner of The Hamilton Group contacted the company listed on the fraudulent invoices and demanded payment.

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St. Agnes School rumored to close

Dwindling enrollment could force archdiocese to close Clark school

CLARK — The news that St. Agnes School plans to close its doors permanently in June due to dwindling enrollment has sparked efforts to keep the Roman Catholic school operational.

All requests for comment from the school administration were deferred to Father Dennis Cohan, who serves as pastor at St. Agnes church. Cohan did not return repeated calls for comment. No information regarding the closure was mentioned on the school's Web site.

Kim Broadwell, president of the school's Home School Association, reported the reason for the closure is that enrollment dropped from 180 students to 133 over the last two years.

She said the announcement, which came during the first week back to school after Christmas vacation, saddened many students, some of whom had attended the school since kindergarten.

"We weren't even given a chance," Broadwell said. "It was like, 'okay you lost 40 students, you're gonna shut down," she said.

Broadwell said it would be a waste to close the school, pointing out that half the facility is brandnew with brand new equipment and plenty of space.

She said HSA members and a school other parents are coming forward them." to help market the school to prospective students and parents as well as holding fundraisers.

Established in Clark in 1964, the school, located on Madison Hill Road, has become a staple of the community.

Clark Mayor Sal Bonaccorso said he is sad to lose a religious and educational component of the community.

"They always did a good job at St. Agnes. I'm sad it had to happen this way," he said.

District Superintendent Renee LaPrete said she has been in contact with the administration of St. Agnes School regarding the upcoming closure. LaPrete reported that 43 of the school's students are Clark residents, but said it is not known if any of them will transfer to the township's public schools following the closure.

"I can't, at this time, say what the impact will be to my grade levels," LaPrete said.

LaPrete said that if incoming students are spread throughout different grade levels and different regions of the township, their influx into the public schools will proba-

bly have no real impact on the dis-

LaPrete said St. Agnes School has been a cooperative neighbor, noting that during evacuation drills, the students of Kumpf School evacuate to St. Agnes School.

Broadwell said the drop in enrollment was a result of snow-balling rumors that began last summer involving the the cancellation of renovation work scheduled to begin at the school this spring, taking it as a sign of an impending closure.

"There was nobody to dispel any rumors of closing," Broadwell explained. "People got scared and started jumping ship a little."

Broadwell said the archdiocese simply put a hold on the construction in Summer 2009 because of the recession, but parents got "the wrong message" and began pulling their children out of the school.

She said administrators were preoccupied or unavailable and could not provide accurate information.

"They were speculating something that I don't think was every really thought to be happening, but there was nobody in a position of authority to give them any reassurance," Broadwell said.

LaPrete said she sympathizes with the school's situation.

"Even though I'm a public educator, I know it's never easy closing a school," LaPrete said. "I feel for them."

Broadwell reported \$30,000 has already been raised, with more expected.

"We have a lot of support from parishioners, church trustees, and the community as a whole," Broadwell said.


Bonaccorso said he hopes the school may yet be saved by the fundraising efforts of parents and other community members.

"I wish them luck," he said.
"I'm hear they're raising some money, so maybe it'll work out."



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
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

CPL collects 'Pennies for Peace'

Cranford Public Library plans to 10 million pennies in 2009. New had previously existed. honor Abraham Lincoln's bicentennial in a special way by collecting Lincoln Pennies for Peace.

During February and March library patrons are encouraged to donate their pennies, which will be collected at the library's main desk. The pennies will go to build school libraries in Pakistan and Afghanistan. The original Pennies for Peace was conceived by students in a Wisconsin elementary school in 1996. Since then, more than 16 million pennies have been raised by more than 700 schools in

Jersey libraries collected more than \$14,000 in 2009.

The pennies collected this year by New Jersey libraries will be donated to Pennies for Peace, which collects funds for the Central Asia Institute. The Institute was cofounded by Greg Mortensen, author of the best-selling autobiography, "Three Cups of Tea: One Mans' Mission to Promote Peace — One School at a Time." Mortensen has made it his life's work to build schools in Pakistan and Afghanistan in order to educate all 50 states, including more than children in areas where no schools niesforpeace.org.

His mission has been to promote education and literacy, especially for girls, in remote regions. As of 2009, the Central Asia Institute has established 130 schools, educating more than 51,000 children. Now those schools need libraries.


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Man stabbed in alleged dispute over video game

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

Get involved

The community plays an important role in our lives. It's where we spend much of our time, socialize with friends, take care of our home and property and raise a family. A key part of any community is the school system, which affects the education of our children and is responsible for, on average, 50 percent of our property tax

With this in mind, it is essential that each community have good representatives on their district's school board. If you are someone who cares about your community and where your taxes are being spent, as well as the future of the children in your school district, it's time you took—the next step and ran for a seat on your local school board.


The process is easier than you might think. Candidates must be able to read and write, as well as have U.S. citizenship and at least one year's residency in the school district. Candidates must be also registered to vote in the district as of Election Day and have no interest in any contract with, or claim against, the board. They must not hold office as mayor or a member of the municipal governing body or, in the case of county school districts, the county governing body. Finally, candidates must not have two elective offices.

Once these legal requirements have been fulfilled, to be included on the school board ballot a candidate must complete a nominating petition that includes the signatures of at least 10 qualified voters living within the district, one of whom may be their own. The petition must be submitted to the district's school board at least 50 days before the election. Details are spelled out in the 2010 School Board Candidate Kit, which can be obtained from the New Jersey School Boards Association.

New Jersey's annual board of education election is currently scheduled for April 20, when approximately 1,500 school board seats will be on the ballot throughout the state. This year, the deadline for candidates to file nominating petitions is March 1, so those who are interested need to get moving.

Ours is a system run by volunteers, people who care enough about their school district to devote the time to meet and discuss the direction in which their schools are headed. School boards typically meet twice a month and a packet of information is distributed to members every week, so there is some work involved in this position, but it's worth the effort.

Some substitutions of judgment

The consideration and approval of plans to move forward with a coal degasification plant in Linden brought out a diversified group last week.

Present at the City Council meeting were the union members, who called each other brother, carried signs, were organized and had well versed speakers. The construction and estimated 125 full-time jobs from the project brought out the rhetorical fire from their leaders.

Less organized, were a small group of self-styled environmentalists who pointed to dangers they perceived exist from the "carbon capture and sequestration process." The labor speakers called them extremists. They weren't — just lousy organizers that evening as shown by the unanimous vote by the City Council to move forward with the revised process.

For the past decade, the DuPont Property has laid fallow serving as a full source of employment for the public and private sector lawyers squabbling over its use.

A few months earlier, a plan to end the litigation as pushed by the Superior Court stumbled when Council President Bob Bunk actually read the proposed settlement and decide how little it would have done for Linden. Even though he took some heat, Bunk voted no and set up a council committee of three to look at the anemic agreement prepared by the city's outside council.

Bunk's committee did a whole lot of substituting of judgment and came up with a revised memoran-

dum of understanding. Mayor Rich Gerbounka proclaimed before the second vote that he would not, "be influenced by people outside of Linden, telling Linden what is right for us." He was right, except he probably should have included the outside lawyers who drafted the first agreement.

Second Ward Councilman Richard Koziol was one of the three members who served on the Bunk committee. He said to the crowd, "the previously presented (memorandum of understanding) left vital questions unanswered, and as a result of negotiations, the committee was able to secure safeguards and compensating settlements not considered in the previous memorandum of understanding. We saw the need to develop a process to end the current litigation, and to take control of our destiny."

Koziol added, "We are representatives of this city who must chose the path of progress and end the statement of litigation — to make certain that the proper proceedings be put in place to safeguard Linden throughout he process."

The Union leaders, armed with a new project labor agreement which guarantees them the construction jobs by the MOU, left that night a happy group. It may be a sign of the

times just how desperate we all are for 125 full time jobs, plus the temporary construction jobs. At the other end of the county, the closing of the popular Exxon station on Route 22 in Union near the Hillside line in the eastbound lane and the fancy Spa Car Wash on Route 22 in Hillside in the westbound lane show how bad things still are in the county.

The environmentalists are not going away. Their argument about better and more environmentally sound projects that could be built on the site sounded like substituting their judgment for the property owner.

Still city environmentalist Beatrice Bernzott was quoted that "a coalition of groups opposed to the project may file a lawsuit over not being able to fully present their views."

In the end, the evening belonged to Bunk and the council. They took the heat for saying no to the flimsy first agreement. The new MOU increases the city's benefits by more than \$100,000 a year. The applicant will have to provide up front a series of milestones in terms of permits for the project to go forward.

I was disappointed earlier this month when I read Mayor James Kennedy's address to the city of Rahway. 

Celebrating 100 Years

HISTORY, THE EARLIEST DAYSThe Boy Scout movement was founded by British Lord Robert Baden-Powell

Scouting's first manual was both written and illustrated by Baden-Powell in 1908. Baden-Powell was a war hero because of his conduct at Mafeking, a strategic holding action during the South African war with the Dutch Boers in 1899

The early American troops took their cues from Baden-Powell's Scouting for Boys because there was no semblance of a national movement in the United States. The YMCA menwho started most of the early troops saw Boy Scouting merely as a promising adjunct to their programs for boys.

Millionaire Chicago publisher William Dickson Boyce became involved in Scouting in 1909. He was visiting London in August of that year. One afternoon, the city was enshrouded in pea-soup fog. Boyce lost his bearings in the murk and was approached by a boy of about 12 carrying a lantern who offered to guide him to the address he was seeking. When Boyce produced a shilling, the boy replied, "No, sir, I am a scout. Scouts do not accept tips for Good Turns.

The Unknown Scout took Boyce to British Scout headquarters. From that moment forward, Boyce's interest in Scouting grew. Boyce came home determined to start Boy Scouting in America. He apparently knew nothing of the troops already operating or of the YMCA's

On February 8, 1910, Boyce filed incorporation papers for the Boy Scouts of America in the District of Columbia The purpose, he said, "Shall be to promote, through organization, and cooperation with other agencies, the ability of boys to do things for themselves and others, to train them in Scoutcraft, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance, and kindred virtues, using the methods which are in common use by Boy Scouts.

"I think he will be an excellent leader and confident that he will take the Roselle Police Department in the right direction," Smith said.


Orlando said his time spent as acting chief gave him plenty of opportunities to get acclimated and address important public safety issues in Roselle.





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

"I think we learned from multiple experiences this year that we can't stop playing," Skrec said. "Today I don't think we did at all, which is a credit to the whole team.

"We talked about that a lot after Monday, like staying together, and I think we did that."

Roselle stayed together in the form of Malone getting the ball to Skrec or Skrec getting the ball to Tobie or Malone getting the ball to Faughnan for an advantageous 3-point attempt.

"I think our passing was on point," Skrec said. After a couple of games we emphasized setting better screens and that opened things up."

Cranford jumped out to a 4-0 lead on Johnson and then the home team Crusaders scored the game's next seven points for a brief lead.

A 3-point basket by sophomore Morgan Miller tied the score for the last time at 9-9.

Cranford went on to outscore Johnson 10-5 the rest of the first quarter and led the remainder of the game.

Miller and senior guard Jamie Webb hit back-to-back 3-point baskets to give Cranford a 25-18 lead.

The Cougars led 35-27 at the half and then 38-31 in the third before Johnson made what turned out to be its last run - a 6-0 surge got the Crusaders to within one at 38-37 with 3:20 to play.

Two free throws by Danielle Gross began a 5-0 Cranford run and then after a basket by Johnson senior forward Gina Trani – who paced all scorers with 17 points – Kaitlin McGovern and Taylor D'Antico hit shots for a 47-38 lead.

Cranford cruised the rest of the fourth quarter. In their first conference meeting in Cranford back on Dec. 22, the Cougars downed the Crusaders 46-31.

"The fourth quarter is always our best quarter, so we just came out and did our thing," Webb said.

What makes Cranford play better in the fourth quarter? The Cougars won the eight-minute stanza 15-11 Friday night.

"Some of our lapses during the first three quarters, we have to fix that, we have to make up for that, so it just happens that way," Webb said. "This was actually our most consistent game of the year. This one and also the first one we played against them.

"We haven't been consistent and our coach (Jackie Huber) keeps saying to us, 'try to play a game where we're up every quarter."

That was almost the case against Johnson Friday night, with Cranford winning three of the four quarters and the only one it did not win Johnson outscored the Cougars only by one at 13-12 for the third quarter.

"We really want to do that because we don't want to be nervous or worried if we're going to win or not," Webb said

Miller had to sit down for almost the entire third quarter after picking up two quick fouls to give her four. Webb fouled out with 2:25 left.

However, others stepped up. Gross – a senior - finished with eight points, freshman Jessica McCoy and junior Sara Gugliuci with five each and freshman Kaitlin McGovern with four.

Webb paced Cranford with 15 points, hitting two 3-pointers; Miller was next with 13, making three 3s and D'Antico was next with 12, putting in two 3-point baskets.

Cranford finished with the seven 3-pointers the above three players connected on.





Villaverde sought ALJ career points mark

ROSELLE – Nick Villaverde should have become Johnson's all-time leading scorer this week, with the Crusaders scheduled to play Scotch Plains Tuesday at Warinanco and Westfield yesterday at Warinanco.

More importantly, the Crusaders sought two more conference wins after tying Cranford and then falling to non-league foe Ridge last Saturday at Bridgewater.

In a wild, back-and-forth affair that saw five ties, three leads by the visitors and two by the home team, Johnson managed to score with less than four minutes remaining to salvage a 7-7 tie against Cranford last Wednesday night in Union County Ice Hockey League play at Warinanco Rink.

Johnson senior Colin Cieslak scored with 3:10 to go to forge the final tie after Cranford freshman Tom Fitzgerald found the net to give the Cougars a 7-6 lead with 5:49 remaining.

Johnson's record moved to 7-4-2 overall and 4-1-2 in UCIHL play. The Crusaders were 5-0-2 over their last seven.

Cranford's record moved to 9-7-1 overall and 5-3-1 in UCIHL play. The Cougars were 4-0-1 over their last five.

Villaverde had one goal and four assists in the Cranford game and one goal and three assists in the setback to Ridge 7-5.

Villaverde entered Tuesday's game against Scotch Plains with 25 goals and 28 assists this season and 144 goals and 122 assists for his career, giving him 266 points. Dan Kargus, class of 2005, began the week with the team record for points at 269 on a school-record 170 goals and 99 assists.

Villaverde has the Johnson record for most career

Defending league champion Johnson could not hold onto leads of 2-0 and 6-4 in between and after Cranford battled back to take leads of 3-2, 4-3 and 7-6.

"We've said it since the first day we took the program over, a two-goal lead is the worst lead in hockey," Johnson head coach Michael Nudo said. "It's a momentum swinger and we just got caught on our heels a bit."

There were ties at 2-2, 3-3, 4-4, 6-6 and 7-7.

In addition to the many goals that were scored, both goalies came up with several superb saves.

Scoring for Johnson were Cieslak twice, Demarzo twice and Villaverde, senior Kyle Mason and junior Joe Lanza once.

Johnson's No. 1 line of Villaverde at center, Demarzo at left wing and Cieslak at right wing produced a total of 13 points. Villaverde netted a short-handed goal and assisted on four others, Demarzo also had two assists and Cieslak one

"Nick is a special player and a special kid," Nudo said. "Time and time again you think you've seen it all from him and he goes out there and the first goal he scored tonight was shorthanded against two or three guys. He's fun to watch."

After assisting on Johnson's first three goals, Villaverde netted his only goal of the game and the last one scored in the second period less than two minutes away from the end of the 15-minute stanza.

A highlight-reel goal produced with a teammate in the penalty box began with Villaverde skillfully skating around one Cranford player and then going to the backhand to flick the puck past a sprawling Hertz and in the net to give Johnson a 5-4 lead.

"I try to do what I can to help the team win," said Villaverde, who will play club hockey at The College of New Jersey in Ewing Township. "If I need to put the puck in the net, then I put it in the net. I try to be a playmaker, too."




Union's Christina Santamauro was third in the 200-yard individual medley in 2:15.38 and third in the 100-yard backstroke in 1:01.55.



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BOROUGH OF ROSELLE BOROUGH CODE AT CHAPTER 110, "TREES"

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Roselle as follows:

The Code of the Borough of Roselle, hapter 110 ("TREES"), is hereby nended as follows:

§ 110-1 A person having control over a wire for the transmission of an elec-tric current along a public highway shall guard trees through which such wire passes against injury from the electric wire or from electric current carried by it, by means approved by the Shade Tree Division.

§ 110-2 Permit required for certain activities.

No person shall do or cause to be done any of the following acts upon a public highway, public place, park or parkway without the written permit of the Shade Tree Division:

the Shade Tree Division:

A. Cut, trim, break, climb with spikes, disturb the roots of or otherwise injure, spray with any chemical or remove any living tree or shrub, or injure, misuse or remove any structure or device placed to support or protect such tree or shrub.

B. Plant any tree or shrub.

C. Fasten any rope, wire, electric attachment, sign or other device to a tree or shrub or to any guard about such tree or shrub or to any guard about such tree or shrub.

D. Close or obstruct any open space provided about the base of a tree or shrub to permit the access of air, water or fertilizer to the roots of such tree or shrub.

E. Pile any building material or make any mortar or cement within six (6) feet of a tree or shrub.

§ 110-3 Miscellaneous offenses.

A. No person shall permit any brine, gas or injurious chemical to come in contact with the stem or roots of any tree or shrub upon a public highway.

B. No person shall hitch or fasten any animal to a tree or shrub upon a public highway or to any guard or support provided for the same, or permit an animal to bite or otherwise injure such tree or shrub.

C. No person shall prevent, delay or interfere with any lawful work undertaken by the Shade Tree Division or its authorized agents.

§ 110-4 Violations and penalties.

Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not exceeding five hundred dolars (\$500.) or imprisoned for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both. All moneys so collected shall be paid to the borough and placed to the credit of the Shade Tree Division, to be drawn upon by the Division for its work.

2. Severability. Each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase. If any portion of this Ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstances, shall be adjudged or otherwise determined to be invalid, unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause or reason, such determination shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance, and the application of such remaining provisions shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are severable.

3. Conflict. This Ordinance is not meant to repeal any provisions of the Code other than those designated herein, but to add to its requirements, and all Ordinances or parts thereof, or other parts of the Code, inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed only to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.

C. Powers and Duties. The Shade Tree Division shall bear the ultimate responsibility for all matters concerning the planting, maintenance, control, protection and improvement of shade trees and shrubbery along public streets and other public places within the Borough of Roselle. The Shade Tree Division shall be implemented through and under the direction of the Borough Council, and shall consist of the following:

(1) To exercise full and exclusive control, under the direction of the Borough Council, and shall consist of the following:

2-40.10 Divisions.
The Police Department shall consist of two (2) divisions: a Patrol Division and an Investigative Division. Assignment of patrolmen and/or other superior officers to those Divisions shall be made at the discretion of the Chief of Police.

SECTION II. Section 2-40.11 of the Township Code entitled "Fees for Services from the Police Department" is (i) hereby renumbered as 2-40.12; and (ii) replaced with a new section 2-40.11 entitled "Detectives within Investigative Division". New section 2-40.11 shall read as follows:

2-40.11 Detectives within Investiga-tive Division.

a. The position of detective is hereby established. A detective shall conduct criminal investigations for the investigative Division of the Police Department while in civilian clothing and shall conduct preparation of cases for prosecution and perform such other duties as are from time to time assigned by the Chief of Police.

b. While the Chief of Police may assign a patrolman and/or other superior officer to the investigative Division, appointment to the position of detective shall only be made upon the written recommendation of the Chief of Police and the approval of a majority of the Township Committee by Resolution.

A Patrolman and/or other superior officer appointed as a detective in accordance with sub-paragraph below above shall receive the same salary as he would have received as a Patrolman or other superior officer unless the Township Committee by ordinance, or the applicable collective bargaining agreement provides additional or different compensation for a detective.

d. No person shall at any time serve in the position of detective of the investigative Division unless and until he has been appointed in accordance with the provision of the within section.

SECTION III. If any article, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance and they shall remain in full force and effect.

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
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

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

The Roselle Urban Enterprise Zone Board unanimously approved a plan to share communication services with the borough of Roselle at the UEZ board's regular meeting on Jan. 19.


The proposal calls for the UEZ to perform the duties of three communication services on behalf of the borough. They must develop and maintain a new municipal Web site, publish the Roselle Roundup municipal newsletter and manage the borough's municipal broadcasting station, Channel 34.

The UEZ will assume the cost of all three services, saving Roselle taxpayers a six-figure dollar amount annually.

"Roselle taxpayers need a break and this is something the UEZ can do to help," said Roselle UEZ board member Joseph Jardim, owner of Jardim's Auto Body on East First Avenue. "The plan will allow us to reduce the financial obligations of the borough and improve the communication services offered to residents."

Roselle Mayor Garrett Smith believes the borough needs a more user-friendly Web site. The UEZ shared services plan is the most cost-effective way to pay for a new site's design and maintenance. It will also increase the exposure of the Roselle UEZ by improving the synergy between the borough's Web site traffic and the UEZ's Web site traffic.

"Our current Web site is outdated. Roselle needs a high-quality, interactive Web site that will allow us to operate more efficiently as a municipal government and better serve our residents," said Smith, who is also the chairman of the UEZ Board. "The UEZ is willing to pay for this and other important services, so we should definitely take advantage."
