Taxpayers, officials react to proposed cuts and legislation

Salaries of school superintendents have raised the ire of taxpayers and legislators alike for years, but last week one state assemblyman decided it was time to do something about it.

On April 23 Assemblyman Dave Rible, R-Monmouth, introduced a bill that he believes would rein in the excessive salaries paid to school superintendents in New Jer-

The proposed legislation would \$136,000, which is \$5,000 less than the \$141,000 the New Jersey State Commissioner of Education cur-

rently is receiving annually.

According to information supplied by the New Jersey Department of Education there are 60 school superintendents in the state receiving salaries of \$200,000 or more each year. In Union County, superintendents in Summit and Union are making more than this amount, with many more edging closer to this number.

For instance, when all the salaries of Union County superintendents are tallied, the average base salary is \$173,986 without cap school administrator salaries at stipends, bonuses, health benefits or retirement packages that are negotiated at the time of hire.

Compared to the state average

average of \$138,000, Union County superintendent salaries are higher than what is considered to be within the normal range.

With aid to schools accounting for nearly 20 percent of the state budget, Rible points out that a good place to start bringing costs down would be to cap school administrator salaries. The money saved, he said, could be used to pay the salaries of teachers and aides whose jobs might be on the chopping block due to the proposed cuts in state aid to school districts.

But, while the proposed bill could save school districts money in the future, current superintendent

salary of \$152,000 and the national and administrator salaries would not be affected. If the bill is approved, only new superintendents hired by a district would be required to accept a capped salary.

Roselle Park Superintendent of Schools Patrick M. Spagnoletti said the bill could present some problems in local school districts.

"While I understand that the public is reacting to the economy and that they want to cut costs and cap salaries whenever possible, it becomes a problem because there are many principals that actually make more than the superintendents, so if the employees they supervise make more it becomes

Authorities track police imposter

the public to exercise caution as detectives search for a burglar who has been gaining entry to residences in the Northeast section of the city by impersonating a police officer.

Three of these incidents have occurred within the last three months, one occurring on the 600block of Adams Street on Jan. 5, another on Feb. 1 on the 1900block of Caroline Avenue and the third on March 17 on the 400-block of Garfield Street. Investigating detectives believe that at least two of the crimes are connected and

possibly all three.

According to police, the suspect LINDEN — Police are urging has been described as a bald, cleanshaven black male in his 30s with medium to muscular build who wears a police-type I.D. badge on a chain around his neck. He was wearing a black or dark-colored Tshirt and dark pants to approximate the appearance of a law enforcement officer.

"He entered the homes forcibly by impersonating a police officer,' Detective Lt. James Sarnicki said. "He restrained the victims with duct tape and proceeded to ransack the house."

Sarnicki said the victims were emotionally traumatized, but no physical injuries were reported. The burglaries occurred in the morning or afternoon hours.

Taken from the victims' homes were jewelry, watches, cash, electronic equipment like laptops and cell phones, and in one case a 9 mm handgun. Sarnicki said residents should be wary of opening their doors for people claiming to be police officers who do not display formal police uniforms or badges.

"What we're asking the people to do is, if you're not expecting anybody, don't open the door, not even for the police," Sarnicki said.

Residents can verify a visitor's status as a law enforcement professional by calling the local police department center or even 911, where dispatch officers can confirm whether there is indeed a legitimate officer at the site.

According to police, the suspect gains entry acting alone, but in two of the incidents the victims reported hearing what sounded like other footsteps, indicating additional actors may have entered later.

One neighbor reported seeing a small, green vehicle that may have been scouting for potential victims.

The Police Department has increased both marked and unmarked patrols in this area, but is asking the public to be extra vigilant in protecting their neighborhoods and reporting anything suspicious to the police department.

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wo arrested for prostitution in Cranford

CRANFORD Police arrested two employees of the Natural Healing massage parlor last week following a four-month investigation into acts of alleged prostitution occurring at the establishment.

Police arrested Christina Lew, 47, of Flushing, N.Y. and Jie Wang, 49, of Fresh Meadows, N.Y. at approximately 5:30 p.m. on March 25 at the North Avenue parlor after a combination of police surveillance and undercover operations by detectives. Both

suspects were charged with engaging in prostitution. Cranford Police Chief Eric Mason spoke to some of my customers," he said. "I lauded the arrests, noting that prostitution is frequently associated with organized crime, drugs, and gangs.

These crimes have no place in Cranford and we will continue to work tirelessly to ensure that they don't take root here," he

Fred, an employee at a barber shop nearby, said he was not familiar with Natural Healing until some of his customers informed him about the arrests.

"I didn't know anything about it until I was surprised. It's always a surprise in a small town like this."

A North Avenue business owner was not concerned with the illegal activity taking place on North Avenue.

"I guess they gotta make money too," said the businessman, who preferred to remain anonymous. "Every town has one. It doesn't affect my business.'


"Prostitution has been around for hundreds of years," he said. "You're never gonna get rid of it."

Detective Sgt. Gerard Quinn said several years ago an arrest was made at a different North Avenue massage parlor for similar charges. He said an additional investigation is being conducted.

"At this point no official action has been taken against the business itself," Quinn said.

Chiefs make use of grant funding

Editor's note: The following is part of an ongoing series on Union County Fire Departments.

SPRINGFIELD — You do what you have to do when it's a matter of life and death. Just ask any Union County fire chief.

The job of fire chief is never easy. Between budget cuts and staffing problems, as well as ensuring the public that firefighters will be there when they dial 911, a fire chief must be a strong leader, innovative and a financial wiz at finding grant money.

When Springfield Fire Chief Jim Sanford stepped into the role of fire chief last year he knew his job would not be easy. The department had come through a trial by fire for more than a year after the former chief allegedly rigged the fire department entrance exam in favor of his son.

Not only was firefighter staffing in the department down to a level that compromised firefighter safety during a structural fire, according to firefighters, but morale was very low and the volunteer firefighter core had dropped dangerously low.

Still, Sanford rolled up his sleeves and began the task of rebuilding morale in the department. The chief candidly admits that while the job is never easy, he has a career firefighter staff that is exceptional and a few remaining volunteer firefighters that continue to put their lives on the line.

There is no doubt that municipal budget cutbacks have limited Sanford and other local fire chiefs from expanding staff and obtaining equipment that is needed. All but a few county fire departments continue to grapple with the ongoing problem of reduced staffing levels on all shifts. Despite efforts to keep an adequate number of firefighters on the roster, some, like Springfield and Roselle, maintain shifts with fewer than four firefighters. This presents a problem, the chief said, when there is a structural fire and mutual aid is 15 minutes from arriving on the scene. Sanford said he definitely loses sleep over what could happen at a major fire, while brainstorming ways to bolster the department budget so he can bring in additional firefighters.

One way is through federal and state grant programs which funnel funds specifically for recruitment and retention of firefighters as well as equipment. The Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response -SAFER — is a federal grant under the Emergency Management Agency's Assistance to Firefighters grant program, that provides financial assistance to help fire departments increase their cadre of frontline firefighters.

The goal is to assist local fire departments, like Springfield and Roselle, in order to respond to emergencies when they occur. The grant specifically is for communities needing additional fire department

"The township gave me their blessing to apply," said Sanford, mentioning that although many departments apply, there is only so much money to go around.

While the chief has not yet heard if the township is getting the grant, he is optimistic and ready to use the funds to bring additional firefighters aboard. In Linden, Fire Chief Joseph Rizzo saw an opportunity to apply for federal grant money specifically for emergency communication and breathing equipment for firefighters and he grabbed it. He knew there was slim chance he would get it, but he decided it was worth the try. And he was right. "Any time we can get a grant that helps our firefighters its a plus," said Rizzo.

Linden was the only Union County municipality to be awarded the \$180,000 grant that will enable the city to buy 83 face pieces, 30 voice amplifiers and 40 self-contained breathing apparatuses.

The city had to provide \$20,000 in matching funds, but they agreed the money would be well spent.

Salary cap proposed for administrators

problematic," Spagnoletti said earlier this week.

He added that a capped salary may also result in less of an incentive for people to apply for superintendent jobs.

Whether this proposed legislation makes it through all the channels required to become a law depends heavily on the support Rible is able to muster. Although many proposed bills are introduced, most fail to get the majority vote required to move through both houses of the state legislature. However, Rible feels strongly that this may not be the case with the bill he proposed.

Last week, Rible told *Union County LocalSource* he was encouraged by the bipartisan support he has received so far. He suggested that legislators are listening to taxpayers who continue to voice mounting concerns over the high salaries of school superintendents and administrators.

The fact that New Jersey residents currently pay the highest property taxes in the country — or 11.8 percent of their income, according to a July 2009 report from The Tax Foundation — is a factor in both the Gov. Christie and legislators clamping down on school districts.

In 2004 the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs reported that the statewide property tax average was \$5,617 but in 2009 that number increased 30 percent, rising to \$7,281. School taxes account for a percentage of this increase, as do municipal and county taxes.

When asked about this, taxpayers in Union County were well informed about the salaries of school superintendents but frustrated that school board members do little to change the situation.

Rahway resident Joseph Romero pointed out that if taxpayers would vote down school budgets, go to school board meetings and voice their outrage, perhaps things would be different.

"The problem is people have become apathetic," he said, but he agreed the proposed bill is a "step in the right direction."

Charles Nardo, a longtime Linden resident whose daughter is a teacher, said "finally someone is doing something."

"When I hear my daughter tell me she is getting a four percent raise this year, my head tells me something is wrong here," Nardo said. "These superintendents need a wake up call and a dose of reality."

The proposed bill is just another financial hit school districts have had to deal with in recent weeks that targeted local district spending plans. Christie's March 18 proposal to cut \$819 million in state aid to schools left several Union County superintendents reeling from the prospect of losing millions in state aid

that is depended on to balance school budgets.

When interviewed by *Union County LocalSource*, several superintendents admitted that without state aid there would have to be layoffs of teachers and slashing of programs in order to balance their budgets.

Meanwhile, last week the New Jersey School Boards Association gave its support to Christie's budget, stressing that it was advocating five initiatives for school districts to consider.

Standing out among these initiatives was the NJSBA calling on the state's largest teachers union, the New Jersey Education Association, to urge its affiliates to reopen all existing contracts to freeze salaries for the coming school year.

"Local school districts need to take this approach now," said Marie S. Bilik, NJSBA executive director, emphasizing that "unless they do, the loss of teachers and other staff will diminish the quality of school programs and hurt New Jersey's children. More importantly, Bilik said the salary freeze should extend "to all employees, including administrators."

This week Christie extended an olive branch to teachers, saying that if teachers agreed to a salary freeze for a year, he would ensure that their district received some of the slashed state aid back.

While most county taxpayers thought this was a step in the right direction, Union resident Angela Boothe felt teachers and superintendents "need to understand they are being selfish."

"They have no clue about how it is out here in the real world," she said, adding "it is time they realized taxpayers are wise to them."

The NJSBA also supported immediate approval of a bill that would require all school employees to contribute 1.5 percent of their salaries to health benefits.

Each year, Billik said, close to \$1 billion of the state budget underwrites the cost of lifetime health benefits for most public employees, including school district staff. They also suggested state leaders consider strategies to reduce this burden on the state budget.

Christie responded saying that while he believes the rank and file teachers understand a practical response and short-term sacrifice is the right approach and in the interest of the entire community of teachers, he knows this position is not shared by "those who profess to lead and represent them."

"In the end, hunkering down and grudgingly adhering to the narrow self-interests of the few, versus standing up for the wider public interest, will indeed hurt our children," the governor said.

Shondra Billonski, Springfield, had a suggestion for all teachers, superintendents and legislators.

"Here is my advice, start listening to us taxpayers, we pay your salary, we vote and we are madder than hell," she said.

The \$25 million project, which is being funded and overseen by the Union County Improvement Authority, calls for three new firehouses and the renovation of a fourth, already-existing structure.

It was spurred by safety and health code violations in the city's existing fire houses, which date back to the turn of the century. The new station on Wood Avenue houses two engines, an ambulance and the deputy fire chief's vehicle. It is staffed by 52 people including civilian employees.

Numerous city and county officials were present at the ribbon-cutting ceremony, including UCIA President Charlotte DeFillipo, who said she was pleased to note that the project was "on schedule and within budget."

Richard Gerbounka said.

Gerbounka praised local firefighters for enduring years of work in sub-standard facilities constructed at the turn of the century and designed for fire engines half the size of those now used.

Fire Chief Joseph Rizzo expressed his satisfaction with the new facility, which he said will hopefully last another hundred years.

'With this building Linden will finally be up to par with our neighboring departments," Rizzo said.

Rizzo thanked DeFillipo and the UCIA, as well as the many engineers and designers involved in the undertaking. The new facility was officially open for service on Monday. The future of the old fire station is uncertain.

"There are no finalized plans for its use once we move out," Rizzo said.

Fire Station 2, located on St. Georges Avenue, was the first station completed in 2008. Fire Station 3 is next in line to be built. It will be located on the site of an older fire station that is currently being demolished.


Safety first

OK, now it's getting scary. When budget cuts prevent streets from getting paved, office supplies from being purchased or annual festivals from taking place, it's disappointing. But when fiscal constraints put the safety of residents at risk, it's time for officials to re-think how taxpayer dollars are being allocated.

In Springfield — as in many Union County towns – cutbacks have resulted in lower fire department staffing levels. In fact, the Springfield Fire Department often must operate with fewer firefighters than state and federal standards recommend. An ordinance that established Springfield's fire-department states that it will consist of 24 total staff members, including higher-ranking officers. Currently, the department is operating with a staff of only 19 and that's when there are no crew members on vacation or sick leave. And even though firefighters from other shifts are permitted to help out, that's not always possible, which means that at times, there are three firefighters covering the town — that seems inadequate. Sure, towns can call for mutual aid from other municipalities, but the fact is, those crews will have a longer response time, leaving local firefighters, residents and their property in danger. That's especially frightening when you consider the fact that a fire can double in size every 60 seconds.

The problem isn't unique to paid squads such as in Springfield. In Roselle, which has a greater population, the fire department often operates with just five to six crew members per shift and in Cranford, there are only six to seven firefighters and officers available to protect the municipality at any given time. The men and women who work these shifts deserve the utmost respect and praise for the risks they take each day to protect the communities they serve. At the same time, local officials should be ashamed for allowing firefighter staffing levels to reach such levels.

So, what's the solution? Well, governing bodies should start by re-evaluating their budget allocations when developing their spending plans. We're well aware of the budgetary restrictions that towns are facing, but public safety should rank among their highest priorities. This issue is about more than just balancing budgets, sacrificing services and finding ways to save money — it's about safeguarding the lives of residents. Officials shouldn't just shrug their shoulders at the problem and blame the fiscal crisis, nor should they assume mutual aid will provide adequate coverage. Such responses are irresponsible. This is not an issue that should be taken lightly. Nothing is more important that the safety of the community.



Green Dot' hits UC

Union County is hoping to send a message to teens this month that behavior leading to violence can be prevented through positive peer influence.

According to Union County Freeholder Chairman Daniel Sullivan, the pilot program dubbed "Green Dot," is a month-long intervention program designed to address issues that few teens want to discuss, but should. Especially if they have been a victim of harassment, stalking, domestic violence or sexual assault.

The concept of Green Dot is to engage community members through awareness, education and skill practice, in an effort to establish intolerance to violence.

"It employs a proactive approach which focuses on changing attitudes and identifying risk factors that lead to violence," added Sullivan.

The pilot will launch at Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School in partnership with the Union County Coalition to Prevent Sexual Violence. Members of this group include country rape crisis members, educators, law enforcement, social service providers, the Union County Prosecutor's office and county residents.

Students from the sophomore

peer leaders and with the permission of their parents, they will engage in role playing exercises.

For example, activities such as understanding consent and establishing appropriate boundaries will help teens recognize the types of behavior leading to sexual violence. Officials hope that, with these exercises, students will be empowered to safely intervene when they witness an abusive sitnation

The Green Dot program is not specific to New Jersey. In fact, it was conceived at the University of Kentucky and has since been adopted by educators nationwide, according to counselors from the Union County Rape Crisis Center.

The green dot actually has great significance and was selected to symbolize an action or expression of intolerance of personal violence. Each green dot is suppose to represent neutralization of an act of personal violence, which is represented by a

Depending on the results of the pilot program, county officials expect to make Green Dot an ongoing county-wide project, according to Sullivan.

The Rape Crisis Center will provide training for local educators so that the program can be brought to other schools and and junior classes will serve as organizations in the county.

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Agreement paves way for Union County parkland

As Union County moves to close the last missing links in the county parks system, an agreement with Mountainside will pave the way for a connecting path between Echo Lake Park and the Watchung Reservation.

The link would create a path through the Mountainside Community Pool complex, from Mountain Avenue through to the Route 22 pedestrian overpass that links to an off-road path parallel to New Providence Road.

The new bicycle path would utilize the access road to the pool complex and then pass around the far side of the pool's picnic grove, connecting to an existing path that leads to the municipal building.

Under the plan, half of the existing fitness loop path will be reserved for walkers, while the remaining section will become a multi-purpose trail to be shared with bicyclists.

In late December, the borough council unanimously passed a resolution supporting the county's plan to create the off-road bicycle path, citing the importance of creating safe bicycle paths that "link key destinations.3

The resolution noted that the path would enable bicyclists to have an off-road connection between the parks.

Mountainside Mayor Paul Mirabelli said he and the members of the governing body were thrilled at the prospect of connecting the

"The borough does not have a lot of sidewalks, which while aesthetically pleasing, presents a challenge when it comes to providing for the safety of walkers and bicyclists," the mayor said.

In recent years, through land acquisition funded by the county's Open Space, Recreation and Historic Preservation Trust fund and other funding sources, some of those gaps were filled in.

"The county continues to look for every opportunity to enhance the park system, which is truly one of the great jewels, not just of Union County, but the state," said Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski, the freeholders liaison to the parks. "We live in one of the most densely populated counties, with some of the most heavily travelled roads," Kowalski said. "So if we can enable residents, and especially children, to have a way to bike and walk to the parks that keeps them out of harm's way, that is something we should strive for."

When the link is completed, it will be possible for residents in the center of the county to bike or hike from Nomahegan Park in Cranford, go through Lenape Park and then Echo Lake, cross Route 22 and then head to within a block of the Watchung Reservation while never having to utilize a public roadway.

The new link also provides additional options to bicyclists travelling the East Coast Greenway, which runs from Maine to Florida and passes through Union County.

With Mountainside now signed on, the county can move ahead with seeking possible grant money to help defray the cost of the connecting path.

However, between funding applications, engineering and design work and construction, it will likely take at least two years to complete the project, county officials said.






"I saw a Bob Fosse review that was outstanding," she said. "The students just blew me away. They just performed their hearts out."





GL baseball team primed for an outstanding season Hosts Cranford in season-opener today

Governor Livingston has never won the Union County Tournament championship.

Twelve months from now the Highlanders would like to be preparing for the 2011 season as defending champs.

Today GL will host Cranford at 4 p.m. in the season-opener for both. Cranford has won the most UCT titles since 1999 - five - and GL lost to the Cougars the last time it reached the final, which was in 2007.

After a very promising 20-8 season a year ago, the Berkeley Heights squad is ready to seriously challenge for not only county honors, but conference and state as well over the course of the following two months.

"Our season depends on pitching, which is our No. 1 thing right now," said seventh-year head coach

His top three starters include senior right hander Mike Rielly, junior righty Mike Cranston and sophomore right hander Joe Graziano. Rielly fashioned a 6-4 record and 3.43 earned-run average last season, Graziano was 6-0 with a 2.63 ERA and Graziano was 2-2 with a 2.90 ERA.

Rielly, a three-year varsity performer who will next pitch at Division 3 Washington University in St. Louis, tossed a six-hitter in blanking Delaware Valley 7-0 last year in a Central Jersey, Group 2 home quarterfinal.

Cranston's sixth and final win - against no losses of the 2009 season was a complete game win at topseeded Delran 9-4 in the CJ, G2 semifinals.

Graziano tossed a six-hitter - striking out 10 and walking two - in beating New Providence 6-1 at home.

"If those three boys step up their games a notch from last season we should be a pretty successful team," Roof said.

Roof considers all three hurlers to be of equal value to his team.

"Whoever pitches for us on Thursday will not be our No. I," Roof said. "I have three aces.

"They're all working very hard now and striving to be the best. Who we pitch will be based on who's throwing the best and matchups."

Rielly also started the sectional final at home against sixth-seeded Shore Regional last year, with the fourth-seeded Highlanders falling 11-6. GL was one win away from winning the section for the first time since capturing it for the very first time in 2006.

Defending UCT champion Scotch Plains, also a favorite to become the first repeat county winner since Cranford won three crowns in a row in 1999, 2000 and 2001, also reached a sectional final last year and lost, with the Raiders falling in the North 2, Group 3 final.

In addition to GL and Scotch Plains seeking to be county champions, both of those talented squads will seek to win at least one more game this year in sectional play.

With Rielly on the mound, Roof knows he has a pitcher who can get into the flow of a game and keep his fielders around him sharp.

Mike Mussina," Roof said. "He's very controlled on the mound and competitive. He can throw for pitches at any times for strikes, those being a four-seam fastball, two-seam fastball, curveball and changeup. He's very smart and knows how to pitch.'

Cranston and Graziano, according to Roof, have both been working hard on improving from last season and are both receiving a lot of college interest.

"Cranston has the same size as Rielly, pushing 6-3," Roof said. "He's been in the low 80s, has a very good curveball and changeup and holds runners on very well."

One of Cranston's wins was an 12-8 decision at home over Mountain Valley Conference-Mountain Division champion Cranford.

"He became our ace last year toward the end of the season." Roof said.

Roof reported that Graziano pitched well for four innings against perennial Group 2 and Morris County power Hanover Park in a home scrimmage.

"The sky is the limit with him," Roof said.

Losing sluggers Mike Balboni and Andrew Cunningham to graduation means that GL might find other ways to beat the opposition offensively.

"I know we will hit the ball well, but maybe with not as much power," Roof said. "We'll steal a lot more bases, play hit and run and do little stuff like that."

The No. 3 and 4 batters in the lineup are returning starters Paul Mirabelli and Jake Skinner. Mirabelli is in right, with the lefty also to see time on the mound, while Skinner is in left after having an outstanding season at third base last year.

Skinner earned First Team All-County honors from The Star-Ledger last season, batting .404, slugging six home runs and driving in 24.

"They're both outstanding players," Roof said.

Skinner will continue at Division 3 Wesleyan University in Middletown, Conn., while Mirabelli will next play at Division 3 powerhouse Trinity College in Hartford, Conn.

Mirabelli is coming off a season where he hit .377, blasted three home runs and produced 19 RBI.

In center field is sophomore Billy Worswick, who started as a freshman last season. Worswick batted .377 and stole 17 bases in 18 attempts, only getting thrown out once at third.

"He became our leadoff man toward the end of the year," Roof said.

Back at catcher is his older brother - Zach Worswick. The senior and lefty batting backstop is in his third year on the varsity. Another sophomore and lefty batting catcher is Keith Skinner.

The infield continues with junior Joe DiSarno at first, sophomore Tyler Martis at second, Rielly and Cranston at third and junior John Jennings at shortstop.

Martis and Jennings both started for the first time last year and provide one of the better double-play combinations in the county, Jennings batted .326, hit two home runs and drove in 14,

Another right fielder and who will be a courtesy runner for pitchers and catchers because of his speed is senior Dylan Turner. This is his first year on varsity after playing junior varsity ball last season.

The six returning non-pitcher starters are Zach Worswick behind the plate, Martis at second, Jennings at short, Skinner in left, Billy Worswick in center and Mirabelli in right. Roof said that senior left fielder Kevin Stumpf and DiSarno started some games last year.

Stumpf, who will be the starting designated hitter, split time at catcher with Worswick. Stumpf had 13 hits in 32 at-bats for a .406 average, while Worswick had 12 in 39 for a .308 clip.

DiSarno had 11 hits in 36 at-bats for a .306 average, "We have a lot of experience and had a successful legion season last summer," Roof said.

"I think we're one of the top five teams in the "Mike's a crafty pitcher, one who reminds me of county right now. The county is very tough. Obviously, Scotch Plains returns everybody and Roselle Catholic has three quality arms in (Kevin) Coan, (Matt) Hennie and (Lou) Clemente.

> "Year in and year out the program to beat every single year is Cranford. They just seem to reload every year and I know they have an outstanding freshman class.

> "It should be one heck of a game when we open with them on Thursday (today). I know our kids will come to play, I just hope that we play well."



Softball pitchers are now hurling from 43 feet back

High school softball games may become a bit more higher scoring and the number of games where pitchers routinely strike out 13, 14, 15 or more batters may decrease as a result of a new rule that was passed last year.

In order for there to be a greater chance of more hits and runs and less strikeouts, the pitching distance has been increased from 40' to 43', with implementation beginning this spring season in New Jersey.

The New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association's Softball Committee unanimously approved the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) rule.

"I'm actually kind of excited about it," said Union Catholic High School's Ed Ryan, who enters his fifth season as the head coach of the Vikings.

"I think it will expand the game and bring more offense," said Ryan, who hails from Piscataway. "I think real dominant pitchers will still dominate, but it will give girls a little more time to see the ball."

The new pitching distance was one of four rules revisions made by the NFHS Softball Rules Committee at its annual meeting last June 8-10 in Indianapolis, Ind. The rules changes subsequently were approved by the NFHS Board of Directors.

Although the new pitching distance is mandatory beginning with the 2010-11 school year, NFHS-member state high school associations were allowed to adopt the 43-feet distance in 2009-10, if desired.

The NJSIAA decided to make the rule change for this school season.

After at least 10 years of debate by committee members, the rule was made after two member state associations experimented with 43 feet - Florida for four years and Oregon for one. Coaches surveyed within these states were overwhelmingly supportive of the change.

Creating a better balance between the offense and the defense was the major rationale for the rule change. Experimentation results from both states indicated more batted balls were hit into play.

"Our main thrust is getting the defense more involved," said Mary Struckhoff, NFHS assistant director and liaison to the Softball Rules Committee. "When more balls are hit into play, the defense is more involved in the game, thus enhancing skill development."

Ryan's pitcher for this season, which commences around the state today, is freshman righty Coleen Down, who is a Scotch Plains resident.

"Fan wise, a little more offense is wanted," Ryan said. "This rule will also give fielders more game play and will expand that part of the game. If you're on a team where your pitcher strikes out 15-16 batters, the fielders are not that much involved. This rule change could change that, with fielders getting more opportunities to field batted balls."

Fellow Union County softball coaches Cherie Zimmerman of Linden, Fran Maggio of Roselle Park and Chris Flinn of Union are in agreement.

"I'm very happy and was hoping it would be passed a little earlier," said Zimmerman, who last year guided Linden to a second consecutive 20-win season and was named Union County Coach of the Year by The Star-Ledger.

Zimmerman starred at Union Catholic, where she graduated from in 1989, and is in her 16th season at the helm of the Tigers, leading them to the 2007 and 2009 Union County Tournament championship games.

"A pitcher that can move the ball real well will have more time for the ball to break," Zimmerman said.

Zimmerman used three hurlers the past two seasons, including righties Angela Riscinti, Rebecca Rotola and Jaconda DosSantos. Riscinti just graduated and is now pitching at Rutgers-Newark. Rotola is a senior and Dos Santos a junior. They will see the bulk of Linden's mound duties this season.

Last year, Riscinti went 8-6, Rotola 6-4 and DosSantos 6-0.

"This will help Rebecca, who is not a speed pitcher and a movement pitcher," Zimmerman said. "It will take away from the girls that just live and die with the fastball."

Zimmerman reported that Rotola had been pitching from 43 feet all last summer while competing for a 23-and-under team called Madison Avenue and guided by Linden assistant coach Wayne Mehalik.

"Scores may go up and hitting will become a little more stronger," Zimmerman said. "Games won't be dominated by pitching as much as you think."

Making the transition on the pitching mounds of certain playing fields will have to be worked out.

For example, Linden played home games at Memorial Field last season, where the UCT semifinals and final are annually played. This year the quarterfinals and semifinals remain at Memorial Field, but the final was moved to Kean University in Union.

"I think they wanted to take away from pitchers dominating the game so much in high school," Zimmerman said.

Maggio has been the head coach at Roselle Park since 1997 and coached one of the state's best pitchers the past decade in Becky Riccitelli, who went on to success at Iona and is now the assistant head coach at Cranford after serving as the freshman coach and the pitching coach for the varsity team last season for head coach Bob Bruno.

"I think it's a good thing and has been something asked about now for several years," Maggio said. "I kind of saw it coming, with some other states starting it."

Maggio's 2009 Roselle Park team went 20-4 and was sparked by the right handed pitching of senior Ashley Gomes (9-3) and juniors Taylor Zengewald (9-1) and Codi Dugan (2-0). Zengewald figures to be the prominent pitcher this season.

"I don't think it will affect the real good kids, the top level pitchers," Maggio said. "It might even help, with increased movement on pitches like a rise or drop.

"What's also interesting is how the sub varsity games will be affected. Some of the junior varsity and freshman games can get ugly at times when there are control problems. That could make for a long day.

"Another problem is middle school. There is really no governing body for them. Some schools, the middle school is the field the varsity game is played on. Those are some things that will have to be worked out."

Riccitelli led Roselle Park to the 2003 Group 1 state championship and to back-to-back UCT crowns in 2003 and 2004. Capri Catalano led Governor Livingston to the 2007 Group 2 state championship. Maggio had the pleasure of coaching Riccitelli, but not the pleasure of losing to Catalano - now at South Florida - in the 2007 Central Jersey, Group 2 state playoffs.

"I was fortunate to have a dominant pitcher, but I like offense too," Maggio said. "I think high school softball was leaning a little too far in favor of the pitcher, especially with pitchers taking lessons as early as 2nd, 3rd and 4th grades and having pitching coaches."

Flinn, at the helm of the Farmers since 1996 and before that an assistant to George Hopkins from 1982-1995, was named the State Coach of the Year last sason by The Star-Ledger. His junior lefty - Amanda Kardys - was named the Union County Player of the Year after leading a 27-5 Union squad with an 18-5 mound record.

Kardys, who hurled four consecutive state tournament shutout victories, also helped lead the Farmers to their record 11th and first UCT championship since 2000 and to their first appearance in the Group 4 final since 1989.

In between, Kardys pitched Union to its first North 2, Group 4 crown since 1995.

There's no doubt that some of the best basketball talent in the state this year was produced right here in Union County.

Leading the boys' was repeat North 2, Group 4 champion Plainfield, which also captured the Union County Conference-Watchung Division title and featured standout junior guard Tyrone Johnson.

St. Patrick of Elizabeth, which finished No. 1 in The Star-Ledger for the second consecutive season, only played the other six Watchung Division teams once and was not eligible for division individual or team honors.

The Celtics were sparked by Duke-bound senior Kyrie Irving of West Orange and highly-touted junior Michael Gilchrist of Camden.

Plainfield won the Watchung title with a record of 10-1. Its only loss was to St. Patrick, which went 6-0 in the league and now 24-3 overall after its final record was reported numerous times at 26-3.

Plainfield finished a fine season at 26-4, losing only to St. Patrick twice, St. Anthony and Cherokee in the Group 4 final.

St. Patrick won the UCT for the third straight year, but was banned from state tournament play for a practice infraction.

Other boys' division champions were Cranford in the Mountain and Roselle Catholic in the Valley.

Cranford was led by senior standout Will Green and Roselle Catholic by sophomore sensation Jameel Warney, who is a Plainfield resident.

Roselle Catholic repeated as the girls' UCT champ for the first time and won its third crown overall after beating Roselle for a fourth time in four tries in the final.

The Lions were sparked by the starting five of seniors Allison Skrec, Jenny Malone, Meghan Faughnan, Anthonia Ajumobi and junior Melissa Tobie.

After winning the final Mountain Valley Conference-Mountain Division crown last year, Roselle Catholic captured the first UCC-Mountain Division title this season.

Other division winners included Summit taking the Watchung and New Providence claiming the Valley after the Pioneers won the MVC-Valley crown the past several years.

Summit, which defeated New Providence, had a fine 23-4 season which included the Hilltoppers reaching the Central Jersey, Group 2 final.

New Providence captured its first state championship by winning Group 1 honors after capturing the North 2, Group 1 title.

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

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
