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Hillside tutoring seeks to help children succeed

An educational movement to deliver free, private tutoring to children from lowincome families is brewing in Union Coun-

Nuno Pereira, a 20-year-old studying at John Jay College of Criminal Justice, in New York City, can remember growing up in Hillside without access to the resources that help students succeed - books, classroom supplies, financial stability. Pereira comes from "a not wealthy background, to say the least," he says, and credits any success he's had in school - Pereira has a 4.0 grade-point average at John Jay College to his mother, who repeatedly pushed him to do well.

"Growing up, I didn't have opportunities, really," said Pereira. When students struggle to grasp concepts in the classroom, and also lack the resources that make learning accessible, it's easy for them to get stuck, he added. "You get frustrated. You get confused and anxious. You think, 'maybe I can't do this.' But that's not the case. You don't want children to think they can't figure it out, you want them to think 'I can't do this now, but I will figure it out and I will do better.

Many other children in Union County, and elsewhere throughout the country, are in the same boat as Pereira was, financial-

So last week, after a visit to Washington, D.C. that left Pereira feeling particularly inspired, he founded Educate the Future, a nonprofit that offers free tutoring to Hillside children who could use the help. A staff made up of Pereira and his peers are providing the tutoring sessions.

"This has always been in the back of my mind, to find a way to give back to the community and spread that message of helping our children," said Pereira. "I found some articles and research talking about how, when children get held back in their class by one or two grades, the chance of them actually graduating high school drops dra-

In less than a week, four families have requested tutoring sessions from Pereira, who's recruited a handful of fellow students and friends as staff members to launch Educate the Future.

These include Nadyr Vidal Loo, a Spanish tutor from Linden; Laura Fuenzalida, the social media coordinator, who also lives in Hillside; Kimberly Camia, the staff secretary, a Roselle resident; and Weronika

Zamlynny, a web developer and programmer from Clark.

Educate the Future is a small operation at the moment, says Pereira, but the potential to make a difference in children's lives is already on the table. So, for the immediate future, the group is focused on two objectives: Getting the infrastructure together to ensure Educate the Future has reach in Hillside, and proving that the organization works, by helping the families who have already asked for tutoring.

If Educate the Future can meet those two objectives, says Pereira, then he'll set his sights on grander goals.

"I want to do well. I don't want it to just be a Hillside thing. I said it's an educational movement because it's a movement to show people that, if we work together as a community, we can do this," said Pereira. "Those are the things I want to target, and if I can prove the organization can work if I can prove this movement is something people can back, then that's something I want to do. If it means increasing my staffing to 100, if that's what it takes, that's what I will do.'

School aid numbers tick upward in U

Several Union County cities will noticeably benefit from the New Jersey Department of Education's proposed state aid numbers for the 2016-17 school year, although the amount being granted in Elizabeth - where the brunt of state aid in the county goes - and elsewhere in New Jersey is staying relatively flat, year-to-year.

There are 14 subcategories which make up state aid, including standbys such as equilization, transportation, special needs and security aid. A pair of these subcategories are new for the 2016-17 school year, though. There's professional learning community aid, created to help districts analyze student and teacher data, and host district support aid, which goes to districts that have a high rate of transfers to charter schools.

In Union County, Plainfield will benefit the most from these two additions. For the 2016-17 school year, the Department of Education is granting Plainfield a projected \$1.71 million in host district support aid as part of a \$124 million package, the 12th largest amount of state aid going to any district in New Jersey. Elizabeth is fifth on that list.

Union County towns are generally exempt from major shifts in the projected state aid they'll receive, though. This is also true for most municipalities in New Jersey, with only three of the state's 585 municipalities expected to receive an increase of 6 percent or more. The median increase, for New Jersey districts, is projected to be about \$30,000. In 2013, every school district in New Jersey with at least 400 students paid its teachers of an average of \$45,000,

UHS robotics team excels

Members of Insert Team Name Here, the senior robotics team at Union High School, spend about 15 hours a week working on their robot during competition season, which extends from early November to the end of February.

Their efforts are carefully documented may 45 page engineering notebook, including what works, along with what doesn't work. Among the things that work is their robot, Scorpio Scoobert, that won a design award at a VEX competition in January.

But like the moniker, "Insert Team Name Here," implies, the students have a sense of humor about what they do, even when their robot breaks down in the middle of a tournament, after countless hours of perfection in practice.

"The process of it is stressful, especially when it breaks down in a competition. One of the most stressful parts is troubleshooting," said Luther Joseph, a senior at Union High School and the team's head programmer. "But once it actually works, it's one of the best feelings in the world."

The Union High School robotics club is at the end of its sophomore season, and the past few months have been a clear step forward for its eight members, said Michael Atzbi, the club's advisor and the engineering teacher at the high school.

A \$5,000 grant from the Union Education Foundation enabled the team to buy a practice surface for the robot, aluminum supplies, a toolbox, specialized sensors and other parts which "really helped us get the competitive edge this year," he said.

The end result was a polished robot. Insert Team Name Here made waves in regional tournaments and received a And the state of t

design award on Jan. 9, the club's first piece of silverware.

"For this project, we started on it in April of last year, that's when the topic of the competition was released. There's almost a year's worth of design in there," said Atzbi. "The way the design award works is there are awards for the competition itself, and there are other awards the judges can give out, like the excellence award. For the design award, the judges go around and say, 'which robot deserves an award, but doesn't necessarily fit

into these categories?"

While Atzbi oversees the team's progress during competition season, the students do virtually all the work: They come up with the ideas by themselves, meet most days before or after school, and stay late on Thursdays to make sure the robot's always ready for the next competition.

After they've been given design guidelines for the robot in April, they go online, look at comparable models, do research, buy parts from a company, and then get started on building the actual robot, using knowledge they learned in Atzbi's engineering classes.

"As soon as it's done, you get a serious sense of pride and accomplishment," said Mike Zmuda, a junior and the team's driver. "It definitely gives you an opportunity to either grow your creativity, and put a use to it."

Almost by accident, Zmuda, Joseph and four other students chartered the robotics club at Union High School last year. At first, they were getting together with the intention of starting a STEM club, where people could come in and work on science-related projects together.

"Then, Mr. Atzbi told us that there's a VEX competition every year that we could go to. We were like, 'sure, why not?'" said Luther. "We started doing that, and it became more and more a robotics club, because that's what we focused on. The school recognized us, after the first year, as the robotics club."

The team performed "very well" in its first year, said Atzbi, when the students See STUDENTS, Page 4

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New BOE member in Union

There's a new voice on the Union Board of Education, although it might be a familiar voice to anyone who's a regular at the board meetings.

After a month-long search, the Board of Education recently approved longtime educator Nellis Regis-Darby to fill its final open seat, which was left vacant by the resignation of former member Lois Jackson on Wednesday, Jan. 6. Regis-Darby, one of three candidates who applied for the position, was sworn in before the Board of Education meeting on Tuesday, Feb. 16.

"I think I'm going to be on the Educational Committee, considering my educational background. Anything that's happening in education, anything we need to make our education system better, I'm for it," Regis-Darby said, whose three children are all working their way through the Union school district. "We've been here a long time, and I just think that sometimes you give back. I always say you have to give back, it's time to give back. And if you don't then you're just going to keep saying it — 'I'm going to give back, I'm going to give back' — so when an opportunity presented itself, I thought it was time."

In the 13 years that her family has lived in Union, Regis-Darby has served as a PTA leader at Livingston Elementary School and Kawameeh Middle School and regularly attends the district's Board of Education meetings, in addition to working professionally as a coordinator at Jackie Robinson Public School.

In that time, says Regis-Darby, she's learned that accountability and responsibility are the cornerstones of a successful Board of Education.

"I'm big on accountability. That was my main focus, being accountable to children. I think we have a responsibility, as people

in Union, to take care of our children — they are our future here," Regis-Darby said. "If we're not responsible for them, who will? I think, for the board, the community has to trust the board members to do the right thing. You have to be honest. You have to be realistic about the things you want to see done and the things you want accomplished."

Being open, honest and transparent about the Board of Education's goals is why the candidates' interviews for the unexpired term, which took place publically on Friday, Feb. 5, were broadcast by Channel 34 and are available on the network's Vimeo channel, for the first time ever. It was also a central theme in the district's Board of Education Elections in November, when the ticket of David Arminio, Jeff Monge and Guy Francis — who voted to approve Regis-Darby — championed the need to keep politics out of education.

That's a goal Regis-Darby can get behind, she says.

"I believe that we should. This is the business of children. People sometimes say there's politics and stuff involved, but I think when you're in the business of children, you have to put children in the forefront and do what's best for them," Regis-Darby said, adding that she's also "excited to work" to improve the quality of education for children in Union, along with the rest of the board. "I've worked with some of them in the past, going to the meetings and listening to their goals, listening to the vision. So I'm really, really excited to be working with some of them — especially to make sure that we're doing the right thing."

Board members Arminio, Monge, Francis, president Vito Nufrio, Nancy Zuena and Ronnie McDowell approved the appointment of Regis-Darby in a vote taken at the Union High School library on Friday, Feb. 5, during a special Board of Education meeting. Angel Salcedo was absent, and Steven Le abstained from casting a vote.

(Continued from Page 3) created a "claw blot" that picked up items. But the students excelled in the 2015-2016 season with Scorpio Scoobert, a robot which launches balls into a net for points.

At competitions, "Insert Team Name Here" played alongside another high school robotics club — picked at random, in many cases — in games against two other robots, in a 2 v. 2 format. It was sometimes frustrating to be partnered with a team that didn't show up, or whose robot was broken, but the tournament system teaches students "a lot about how to work as part of a team," said Hanson-Lee Harjono, a junior on "Insert Team Name Here."

The students also know that even when they fix an issue with their own robot, they're oftentimes creating 10 new problems to deal with. One member of Insert Team Name Here, junior Kristine Padolina, compared building the robot to "raising Pokemon," because the team constantly needs to help it grow and become stronger.

And, like Pokemon, the students have fun while building the robot — hence the name, "Insert Team Name Here."



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State school aid numbers analyzed

(Continued from Page 1) according to reports from the time.

As a unit, the 21 municipalities of Union County are projected to receive more than \$646 million in state aid for the 2016-17 school year, the fifth largest amount behind Essex, Hudson Passaic and Camden counties, and well above the New Jersey county average of \$378 million. That represents an increase of 1.1 percent over the amount of aid given to Union County for the 2015-16 school year, which was estimated at about \$640 million, according to data from the Department of Education.

But several towns are pushing the

Union County average, in addition to Plainfield, which is receiving an increase of 2.4 percent in state aid, thanks to the addition of host district support aid.

New Providence and Summit are being granted increases of at least 3 percent in state aid, while Clark isn't far behind, at 2.9 percent. Almost all of the state aid spending in these districts goes to special education aid, which is based on how many students are eligible for special needs programs and classes.

Elizabeth, which receives the brunt of the county's state aid and the fifth-most of any city in New Jersey, is projected to be given

less than the Union County average, receiving more than \$366 million in state aid this year, an increase of .7 percent, or \$2.6 million. Other municipalities lagging behind the average will be Linden, with a county-low increase of .6 percent; Roselle and Kenilworth, which are proposed .8 percent increases; and Hillside and Union, with .9 percent increases, according to the Department of Education.

The Department of Education's proposed state aid numbers for the 2016-17 school year, in total, will give \$8 billion in direct aid to public schools across the state, including \$715 million in Newark, \$418 in Jersey City and \$399 in Paterson.

A chance to work with former Gov. Jim McGreevey spurred Sheafer to switch to the private sector, working for the child care company, The Learning Experience. As part of the senior management team, he opened and managed more than 50 locations in 12 states.

The job eventually took him to Florida, where an opportunity opened at the YMCA of South Florida. "I always had a connection to nonprofit work," said Sheafer, who served on the Summit Y board of managers while in corporate work.

As vice president of children's services at the YMCA of South Florida, Sheafer oversaw before-

and after-school programs and a preschool for more than 3,500 children, as well 14 summer camp locations. Through collaborations, including a partnership with the University of Miami, the Y made strides in reducing obesity and closing the achievement gap. "We saw a 95-percent increase in fitness and literacy levels," he said.

Sheafer also developed a young professionals group using the Y-USA's Togetherhood model, in which volunteers develop and execute four service projects a year that benefit the community. The group, for example, collected more than 400 holiday gifts for preschoolers living in one of the poorest, crime-ridden sections of Miami.

"Engaging volunteers is at the heart of our mission," he said.

The Y-USA selected Sheafer to help create a training program for future Y CEOs, a course he plans to eventually take on the path to fulfilling his career goal of heading a Y. "I come from a Y family," said Sheafer, whose wife, Lisa, is a Y youth and family development director. The couple has a 3-year-old daughter, Mila, and a 7-month-old son, Maddox.

(Continued from Page 1) school supplies and website which will enable the nonprofit to get off the ground, says Pereira. And when Pereira says "every dollar counts," he means it: Many students don't own school supplies that cost less than a dollar, such as folders, as Pereira found out when he was a tutor at Union County College last year.

"I want some donations to go to school supplies. That's just one issue that these funds will target. When I worked as a tutor at Union County College, even then, some of the students that came for tutoring didn't even have a folder," said Pereira. "They didn't have the basic school supplies that they needed to do well in class. If you have grown women and men who cannot afford their own supplies, then imagine children

in that situation. How are they going to do well in their classes?"

The mission of Educate the Future is to make sure students, from kindergarten to 12th grade, don't feel overwhelmed because they don't come from a family with money. No one should be struggling in class because they don't own a folder, in other words.

More than that, though, Pereira wants to become involved in the way students see the world, so tutors can inspire the children they're charged with teaching.

"The point of the tutoring is not just to increase their grades. That's great, it helps them get through school. But you want the tutor to serve as a role model and someone these children can look up to. You want them to feel that inspiration, and aspire for more," said Pereira. "Unless we get these



Christie needs to fix budget problems now

Gov. Chris Christie was at it again, delivering his Fiscal Year 2016 budget address on Tuesday, Feb. 16, urging people in both elected houses and members of the public that, if we all work together, we can solve the problems of New Jersey. It was a very moving moment, similar to what he has been saying every year since 2011, and he's certainly developed a knack for turning bad news into something uplifting.

Now that his dreams for a GOP presidential nomination have been dashed by early results and he has suspended his campaign, we hope Christie will devote all his time to fixing this state. That his poll numbers have matched a record-low 33 percent approval rating show how much confidence New Jerseyans have in their governor. Unfortunately, his budget address amounted to nothing more than a collection of hot air.

Here's why: Christie identified the three areas where growth has eaten up our revenues — pension, health benefits and debt service — yet he either failed to offer ways to address these problems or presented information inaccurately. It's easy to make a positive speech people can rally behind if you don't present real facts that might actually concern people and depress them or, worse yet, force them to call for an actual solution. Let's examine each, one by one.

In the 2017 budget Christie put forth, \$1.9 billion would be paid into the pension system, the largest single pension payment paid in state history. This is wonderful news, but while it is \$550 million more than the state is expected to contribute this year, the public pension system is underfunded by \$54 billion, with the state responsible for \$40 billion of that. Anyone who borrows money and has to pay the loan back understands the concept of interest, meaning if you don't pay a certain amount in each cycle, the next amount due will be for even more. Christie was quick to tout his administration has made \$6.2 billion in pensions payments, more than the last five governors combined, but until the constitution is changed that ensures the state is required to make such payments, that Sword of Damocles will continue to hang above the heads of New Jersey taxpayers.

The governor offered no solution at all, just a warning that this problem must be addressed or it will get worse. Many of the 800,000 current and

retired workers currently on the pension rolls receive not one but two pensions from New Jersey. If we can't legally alter their contracts retroactively, how about making it so all future contracts with the state recognize that we simply can't afford to be so generous and insist those who receive state pensions need to pay more to offset what they later receive; otherwise, we're just passing the bill on to later generations.

Health benefits are another staggering expense, made so because our medical system is crumbling, even as we're living longer and longer. This is not a new problem, but one that dates back to the '80s, which governors have let escalate from one administration to the next. New Jersey's hospitals are legally required to accept patients who come to the emergency room, but the state reimburses only a portion of what is spent to treat them.

Charity care has tripled since Christie took office in 2010, yet the governor glossed over this topic during his budget address. He mentioned that Burlington County is collaborating with its employees, generating year-to-year savings, which he suggests can be done statewide. This problem is far too serious to just give a cursory mention, particularly after findings in a study done for Legal Services of New Jersey found 2.8 million adults and 800,000 children lived in poverty in our state in 2014. New Jersey must implement a Charity Care formula that targets the distribution of funds to hospitals with large volumes of both uninsured and Medicaid patients. This is another concern we're still waiting for the governor to address.

Finally, Christie warned a report released by the New Jersey Business and Industry Association had concluded high taxes and expensive mandates resulted in 2 million residents and \$18 billion in annual income left our state in the last decade. He said these people fled to Pennsylvania and New York for more inviting tax structures and that these facts are not debatable. Actually, they are debatable, unless our governor contacted every one of these 2 million former residents and interviewed them about why they left the Garden State. Further, while he highlighted the estate tax he called for a repeal on and the doubling of the min-

imum wage, a move he said would cause a \$3 billion tax increase to taxpayers, his only mention of the Transportation Tax Fund was that a gas tax to further fund it would be a mistake. On that he is right, yet he offered no solution to the dwindling fund, which has been siphoned off to pay the annual pension debt. As we said in last week's editorial, the Transportation Tax Fund needs to stop going almost exclusively to pay the annual pension debt, largely an interest payment now, and be used for what it was originally intended: to repair our failing roads and bridges.

Christie was quick to brag that the budget was balanced, but that's easy to do if you don't pay for everything and delay it for a future generations. If people really don't want to raise taxes, and that might not be possible, then there has to be cutting, Draconian cutting that will slash services. The essentials — police, fire, hospitals and EMS services, basic school expenses, road and bridge repairs, maintenance and very limited government — will be funded, but that's the only way we'll ever dig ourselves out of this quagmire in which we're stuck.

Perhaps the only fortunate news about Christie's 2017 budget proposal is that it's just that: a proposal. Budget hearings will be conducted from March through May, when every department head goes before Assembly and Senate budget committees. The public also has the opportunity to tell lawmakers which programs should be slashed and which should be restored. In April, income tax revenue comes in and it can be assessed how well income was forecast, which might necessitate even more cutting in the budget. The treasurer will reveal how much or little of a gap exists in May, although the final wheeling and dealing won't occur until June, behind closed doors.

The Democrat-led Legislature then presents a budget bill in the middle of June, which Christie slices through with his line-item veto pen. Although Democrats have majorities in both houses, it hasn't been enough to override his vetoes in the past six years. The state Supreme Court could adjust the budget after it has been passed, as it might this year with regard to the cost-of-living adjustments, putting the pension system in even bigger trouble, one more reason the problem needs to be fixed now, not later.

There can be no more delay.

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A debate is raging in New Jersey right now about the legal age at which someone

own convenience stores, could lose sales, the state would actually be saving money in the health care sphere if the number of smokers were reduced. It is a fact that smoking ciga-

rettes is really bad for your health; we aren't debating that.

But this isn't about money — this is about personal choice and freedom.

In the past two years, more than 20 municipalities in New Jersey have passed strict ordinances prohibiting the sale of tobacco to anyone under 21. In the past month, this issue has been popping up on agendas for municipal meetings across the state.

But at what point do we say that enough is enough and that our rights should be sacrosanct? Even if we make bad choices, they are ours to make.

A main argument for the change is that smoking habits are formed at a young age. By raising the age restriction, the government would be keeping cigarettes out of the hands of high schoolers by keeping them out of the hands of their slightly older peers. We agree: Children should not smoke. Children need to continue to be educated about the dangers of smoking. They need to be reined in by a firm hand and told that smoking is unacceptable.

But you can't take cigarettes - a legal commodity - away from adults because they might give them to someone underage. Where does it stop? A child can sneak a cigarette from his or her father. Should it be a law that all fathers and mothers cannot purchase cigarettes? What about neighbors?

This comes down to one question: Is an 18-year-old an adult or not? If they are adults, they should be able to purchase cigarettes. If they are not, maybe they shouldn't be sent to the Middle East to fight our enemies. You pick, because we can't have both.

can purchase cigarettes. In our state, anyone 19 and older can buy cigarettes; many are advocating for that age restriction to be raised to 21. Not

only do we think this is excessive and an infringement of civil liberty, we think the age limit should be lowered back to 18. In our country, an 18-year-old is considered an adult under the law. At 18, a person can sign up to join the U.S. Armed Services and go halfway around the world to shoot people and be

shot at. They can fight and die for their country, and vote in a presidential election to determine who will lead the free world, but they can't buy a cigarette in New Jersey? Either an 18-year-

old is a child or not - you can't have it both ways.

The age to purchase alcoholic beverages in New Jersey is currently 21, and until our society figures out how to eliminate the scourge of drinking and driving, we agree with that prohibition. Unlike smoking tobacco, drinking and driving has too many innocent victims.

In January, Gov. Chris Christie vetoed a bill that would have prohibited the sale of tobacco and vaping products to anyone under the age of 21. Part of the reason for this veto is the economic effect it would have on businesses. Business owners have argued that when someone enters their store to buy a pack of cigarettes, they usually also buy a cup of coffee or a muffin. Should 19-year-olds no longer be able to purchase cigarettes, the stores would be losing business beyond tobacco. Companies that sell electronic cigarettes and vaping products additionally argue that their goods can also serve as a safe step for smokers who are looking to cut back and eventually quit the harmful practice.

The problem is compounded by the two percent state cap on rising health costs and expected salary increases.

Even with the challenges, Fernandez is pushing some improvements. He starts off with revamping the local pool. He explains that a renovated pool will boost membership and fees. He believes that the downtown development, which has been a challenge for past governing bodies, will come to fruition. Fernandez calls it "smart growth," consisting of 140 single bedroom units with commercial units as well.

As for the Fire Department, Fernandez says he has no plans to switch from a paid to a volunteer unit.

weeks ago, he sees the need for federal funds to mitigate the flooding problems which have hit his town hard. As to a future election, he says, "I love the job but I am leaning against running again. I haven't been to my kids' cub scout meetings because of conflicts with town meetings.'

As we end our chat and I leave, over my shoulder I can see Fernandez speaking to the Springfield residents. This morning the breakfast with the kids will have to wait a little longer.

Leaders call for construction of access road to ease traffic

Focusing on the need to remove heavy truck traffic from a roadway that goes through residential communities, state Senate President Steve Sweeney and Sen. Nick Scutari have called for funding for the project that is "ready to go" with all the advance planning and permitting already in place. According to a recent press release, the access road, known as the "Tremley Point Connector," would provide a direct connection to the Tremley Point section of Linden, an industrialized area that relies on commercial traffic and offers the potential for economic expansion.

"Right now, we have 18-wheelers rolling through residential communities, creating traffic congestion and impacting the quality of life of local residents," said Sweeney. "We have a plan ready to go that would alleviate the problems at the same time it contributes to economic growth. But, without a renewed Transportation Trust Fund, we won't have the resources to get the job done."

The Exit 12 access road from the Turnpike now directs traffic through the South Wood Avenue section of the city, creating heavy truck traffic that creates congestion and imposes quality of life problems for the communities. The new access road, running parallel to the Turnpike, would redirect the traffic, offering benefits for the flow of commerce and the potential for additional development in the Tremley Point industrial section.

The project is expected to cost approximately \$150 million.

"I've been fighting to get this access road built for nearly two decades and the need for it has only increased," said Scutari. "During that time, the problems have only become worse. The heavy commercial traffic causes congestion and creates safety problems in residential communities. The new project is critical for both Linden and Union County."

Scutari said the new route would provide "economic benefits and safety benefits," allowing for the more efficient flow of commercial traffic to and from Tremley Point and allowing for the development of about 400 acres of unused property in the area.

"All the permits for the project have been in place, including a Coast Guard permit," said Mayor Derek Armstead of Linden. "The sooner we get this project going, the sooner we improve the quality of life for the community."

Armstead said the traffic problems are especially acute on routes 1 and 9, the main routes leading to Tremley Point. The proposed connector will intersect with Industrial Highway in Carteret, traverse the Rahway River and connect at Tremley Point Road in Linden, providing direct access between New Jersey Turnpike Interchange 12 via Industrial Highway and the Tremley Point area of Linden.

The senators and mayor were joined by assemblymen Jerry Green and James Kennedy in calling for action.

"A properly funded Transportation Trust Fund is the only way to move forward on essential projects like this one," said Assemblyman Green. "Anyone who knows this area knows that the constant presence of 18-wheelers, so close to recreation facilities and residences is a danger to children. We must do everything we can to divert these trucks and improve the local quality of life."

"This is a project that makes perfect sense, and I applaud Senators Sweeney and Scutari for shining a spotlight on it," said Assemblyman Kennedy. "We should be looking to expand economic development wherever possible, and this is a way to do that while also improving safety and relieving traffic congestion."

The importance of the connector stretches beyond the city of Linden and has major implications for the county's transportation network, according to Freeholder Chairman Bruce Bergen and Freeholder Christopher Hudak.

"Union County sits at the hub of one of the nation's most powerful transportation networks," said Freeholder Chairman Bergen. "We not only need to maintain it, but we must also continue to grow it. And that's why the Tremley Point Connector Road project is so important."

"Last year, a crash on the New Jersey Turnpike temporarily knocked out the Wood Avenue Bridge, the main road of access to this industrial section of Tremley Point," said Freeholder Hudak. "The construction of a connector road would have helped emergency management workers better access the site of the accident and ease traffic pressures."

Minister of Congregational Life Rev. Emilie Boggis said the action is "part of a history of efforts for this congregation and Unitarian Universalists to support, include and embrace LGBT people."

Summit school hosts bioethics symposium

More than 500 guests visited Kent Place School's campus for its fourth annual Bioethics Project Symposium on Friday, Feb. 12. The symposium was a culminating event marking the end of an intensive program developed through a partnership with The Ethics Institute at Kent Place School and The Hastings Center in Garrison, NY. The event was planned and hosted by the 10 Kent Place Upper School studentscholars whose work was presented through a series of workshops. The sessions were designed by the students, with questions and case studies presented for audience members to discuss and analyze.

Participating students were selected in spring 2015 after an extensive application process. Their work on the project, "Medical Decision-Making & the Human Lifespan," began with a three-week summer internship, where faculty from both The Ethics Institute and The Hastings Center gathered for 25 hours per week to provide the students with intensive introductions to ethics, bioethics and advanced study of the ethics of medical decision-making.

When the school year began, the students worked on their individual research projects through collaboration with Kent Place faculty and Hastings Center researchers, who served as mentors. These projects were presented at the symposium and included topics relevant to medical ethics, such as patient rights, mental illness, bioprinting in medicine, religious freedom, prenatal health and planetary sustainability.


Neha Bhardwaj '18, a participant in the Bioethics Project, especially valued the mentorship that professionals at the Hastings Center offered, saying, "It was very helpful to have our Hastings mentors to give us aid and constructive criticism. Being able to work alongside professionals in the field of bioethics was enlightening, and it allowed us to create well-rounded papers that explored different perspectives on controversial problems in-depth and with expertise."

This year's symposium marks faculty member Rose Chaffee-Cohen's fourth year of involvement with the program. She believes that the project offers a great opportunity for intellectual growth for students and teachers alike. "For me, I am often learning about these topics for the first time, right along with them. For the students," she stated, "it may be a new way of thinking, researching, and justifying their ideas, and accepting a considerable amount of feedback from multiple coaches. All of this yields immense growth in the scholar leaders. In that way," she added, "the challenge also brings reward."

This sentiment was shared by senior Lauren Burr, another student participant, who said she appreciated the freedom that the project offered. When asked about what she enjoyed most about the program, Lauren said, "So often high school writing has a highly specific, predetermined question that must be answered, but in the bioethics project, I was free to research anything I wanted and write about anything I wanted. Of course we were still limited to 'Medical Decision Making & the Human Lifespan,' but this topic was so broad that it offered any and every ethical dilemma one could think of."

RHS students attend Lemkin Summit in D.C.

Rahway High School junior Sincere Murray is grateful to have had the opportunity to sit down with state senators and representatives in an attempt to "abrogate the atrocious things that are occurring in foreign areas."

Murray, along with classmate Kai Whitfield and teacher Debra Maller, attended the three-day Lemkin Summit at American University in Washington, D.C., at the end of January.

Named in honor of Raphael Lemkin, a Polish Jewish lawyer and ardent activist who coined the term "genocide" in 1944, the Lemkin Summit was organized to connect and strategize with students and community activists from across the country who are taking action toward ending and preventing genocide and mass atrocities.

Murray and Whitfield, along with the other participants, learned to network with one another, received advocacy training, and learned how to leverage their connections, media and other resources to engage their communities and policymakers in taking action.

During the summit, the students were made aware of the current plight of many African nations and of how the United States can play an active role in halting mass atrocities and crimes against humanity. They viewed films on corrupt officials and business people benefitting from illegal trade, and about combating atrocity financing of terrorist organizations. They were also instructed on three bills to be addressed on "Lobbying Day," the final day of the summit.

Murray, Whitfield and Maller had the opportunity to meet with N.J. Representative Legislative Counsels Dorcas Adekunle, Sophia Lalani, and David McFarland to lobby them in the hope that they will cosponsor the Global Anti-Poaching Act, or H.R. 2494, when it comes to the Senate floor.

It is clear the Lemkin Summit succeeded in making Rahway's students, as citizens of the world, passionate enough to utilize the avenues open to them to play a role in influencing policy decisions. Whitfield said he has "come back with a better mindset and a desire to learn more about events in the world to which most students my age pay no mind."

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

1/2 tsp. salt, more to taste

1/2 tsp. paprika, more to taste

1/4 tsp. garlic powder, more to taste 1/8 tsp. ground black pepper, more to

taste

3 Tbs. butter, preferably grass-fed butter. I like Kerrygold brand which is much less expensive at Costco and Trader Joe's

Steps

Preheat the oven to 425 degrees. In a pie plate or shallow, mediumsized bowl, place the coconut flour, almond flour, salt, paprika, garlic powder and black pepper and stir to combine.

On a large plate, place the chicken thighs and dry them off with a paper towel.

Put the butter in a 9-inch-by-13-inch baking dish and then place the dish on the middle rack of the oven.

When the butter has melted, remove the baking dish from the oven, and place on the stove or other heat-proof

Dip the chicken into the breading on both sides and place each piece, skin side down, onto the buttery baking dish.

Place the dish on the middle rack of the oven and bake for 30 minutes.

After 30 minutes, flip the chicken and bake for another 15 to 20 minutes.

Bayway Lumber owner admits fraud

An owner of Bayway Lumber, a Linden company that sold commercial and industrial products to numerous public and private entities, admitted his role Thursday, Feb. 18, in a scheme to defraud customers out of \$708,386, U.S. Attorney Paul J. Fishman announced.

Robert R. Dattilo, 61, pleaded guilty before U.S. District Judge Peter G. Sheridan in Trenton Federal Court to an information charging him with one count of conspiracy to commit mail and wire fraud.

According to documents filed in this case and statements made in court: From 2007 to November 2015, Dattilo conspired with others to defraud certain customers by engaging in fraudulent business practices, including overbilling, charging for more expensive items or larger quantities of items, and providing free items to employees of customers, then recouping the cost of the items and additional profits by overbilling and fraudulent billing.

At Dattilo's direction, Bayway Lumber inflated the prices on items sold or intentionally failed to provide the prices called

for in contractual agreements between Bayway Lumber and customers, including the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey and its successor entities -Rutgers University and University Hospital; the city of Elizabeth; and the New York Transit Authority. These methods included:

· concealing the true cost of items to Bayway Lumber, sometimes by manually altering vendor invoices, in order to enable Bayway Lumber to bill UMDNJ higher mark-ups;

· charging Elizabeth prices that did not apply the discounts called for by contracts;

· consistently billing the Transit Authority for the most expensive items, such as doors, frames and door hardware, permitted by the contract, although Bayway Lumber was providing less-expensive items than what was ordered.

Dattilo also conspired to provide certain customers, such as the Philadelphia Housing Authority, Con Edison, the New York Department of Corrections and the city of Newark, with lower-quality lumber than the customers had ordered and paid for.

The lower-quality lumber, including "reject" lumber, did not meet certain industry specifications and was not of construction-grade quality, as required by contract. To conceal this product-substitution scheme, Dattilo directed Bayway Lumber employees to spray paint or rearrange the lower-quality lumber sent to the customer entities in order to hide any markings on the lumber that would indicate that it was the lower-quality product. At Dattilo's direction, Bayway Lumber also issued invoices to customers that falsely described the lumber.

Employees of some of Bayway Lumber's customers, including Amtrak, the Plainfield Board of Education and a Bergen County company identified in the information as "Company 1," were given a variety of items, including electronics, tickets to sporting events, merchandise and gift cards. Bayway Lumber then overbilled and fraudulently billed those customers to recoup the cost of the gifts, plus additional profits. Dattilo kept a running tally of how much Bayway Lumber overbilled and fraudulently billed those customers, which Dattilo referred to as the

"bank," to ensure that Bayway Lumber recovered the full cost of the free items.

The charge to which Dattilo pleaded guilty carries a maximum potential penalty of 20 years in prison and a maximum fine of \$250,000 or twice the gross gain or loss associated with the offense, whichever is greatest. Sentencing is scheduled for

U.S. Attorney Fishman credited special agents with the Office of Inspector General, U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, under the direction of Special Agent in Charge Christina Scaringi; special agents of the FBI, under the direction of Acting Special Agent in Charge Andrew Campi; and the Office of Inspector General, Amtrak, under the direction of Special Agent in Charge Robert Koons, as well as investigators of the U.S. Attorney's Office, for conducting the investigation leading to the guilty

The government is represented by Assistant U.S. Attorneys Barbara R. Llanes and Cari Fais of the U.S. Attorney's Office Special Prosecutions Division in Newark.

Linden responds to Helen Street fire

At 7:23 a.m. on Monday, Feb. 15, the Linden Fire Department responded to a structure fire at 317 Helen St. Upon their arrival, the first responding fire companies found heavy smoke coming from the second floor and attic. The occupants and pets were exiting the structure and reported that everyone was out. Crews stretched hose lines into the structure and found fire in a second floor bedroom and the attic. Searches were conducted to ensure no one was still in the building. After extinguishing the fire, crews conducted overhaul operations to make sure the fire did not spread to other parts of the structure. Crews also took measures to

protect the contents and property of the tenants.

The fire appears to have started in the area of the second middle bedroom and is under investigation by the Linden Fire Department's Fire Investigation unit. The cold temperatures made operations difficult and may have played a role in the fire.

The second floor tenants reported that they were woken up by their dogs. They promptly called 9-1-1, alerted the other occupants and evacuated the building. This early notification was an important factor in fire crews being able to contain the fire quickly.

Deputy Chief George Kuhn described his platoon's quick actions as a "good stop," extinguishing the fire quickly and limiting the damage to the areas of origin.

There were no injuries to the tenants or to the firefighters. The five occupants were moved into the John T. Gregorio Center across the street. Mayor Derek Armstead visited the tenants at the Gregorio Center, which was closed for Presidents Day.

The Linden Police provided scene security and helped coordinate the response of the Red Cross to assist the tenants if necessary. Mutual Aid coverage was provided by the Elizabeth, Rahway and Roselle fire departments.

are convicted of such crimes and offenses from serving as an employee or volunteer in a non-profit youth serving organization, and authorizes nonprofit youth serving organizations to conduct a criminal history background check on prospective employees or volunteers; and WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mountainside have determined that the Borough's Department of Recreation should obtain criminal background checks on current and prospective employees and volunteers; and WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 15A.3A-3 is not mandatory, but rather permits individuals who would otherwise be disqualified to appeal such disqualification; and cation; and WHEREAS the Mayor and Council have deter-

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council as follows: Section 2-68 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough is hereby amended as follows:

2-68.6 Department of Recreation Criminal Background Check Policy.

All current and prospective employees and volunteers of the Department of Recreation must submit to a criminal record background check. No employee or volunteer shall be permitted to serve in the Department of Recreation if their criminal record background check reveals a record of conviction of a crime or offense cognizable under N.J.S.A. 15A:3A-3 unless authorized by the Mountainside Review Committee as set forth below. The criminal background check process and the appeal process will be conducted in accordance with the following procedures:

a. All criminal background checks will be conducted by the Department of Recreation and will be paid for with funds collected by the Department of Recreation that shall be derived from an additional \$5 fee assessed by each related association on every registration.

b. The Department of Recreation will notify any person whose background check disqualifies them from being employed or volunteering as soon as is practicable under the circumstances and no later than would be necessary for them to file an appeal.

c. Any person that receives notice that he/she has been disqualified from serving the Depart-ment of Recreation as a result of their back-ground check has 20 days from the date such notice is received to file an appeal with the

Once an appeal is filed with the Recreation Director the appellant's submission shall be reviewed by a four (4) member Review Committee composed of the Recreation Director, the Police Chief or his or her designee, the Borough Administrator or his or her designee and the School Resource Officer. e. In reviewing an appeal the Mountainside Review Committee shall consider the appellant's entire submission, the circumstances surrounding the criminal record, any statements or information provided by the appellant and any other relevant circumstances including, but not necessarily limited to:

The nature and responsibility of the position which the appellant is seeking.
 The nature and seriousness of the offense that disqualified the appellant initially.
 The date of the offense.
 The age of the appellant when the offense was committed.
 Whether the offense was an isolated or repeated incident.
 Any social conditions which may have con-

repeated incident.

6. Any social conditions which may have contributed to the offense.

7. Any evidence of rehabilitation, including evidence of good conduct, a positive reputation or mental health treatment.

f. The final determination as to whether an appellant will be permitted to serve in the Department of Recreation lies exclusively with the Mountainside Review Committee which can overturn a disqualification only by unanimous vote.

g. In all instances of such an appeal the final determination will be issued by the Mountainside Review Committee within forty-five (45) days of the date the appeal was filed. 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





Grand highlight in victory for Visconti

Arthur L. Johnson senior reaches 1,000 points

When her senior season began, Johnson girls' basketball standout Stephanie Visconti played a large role in her team's first game, scoring 11 points in a league loss at Governor Livingston.

Not only were the Crusaders able to avenge that defeat some two months later, but during the victory Visconti was able to reach an offensive milestone that doesn't happen often.

In last Saturday's 49-46 Union County Conference-Mountain Division home win over GL, Visconti scored a team-high 18 points and along the way reached 1,000 points for her varsity career.

Visconti made seven field goals and four free throws for her 18 points, helping lead Johnson to a final 7-3 Mountain Division mark.

Summit won the Mountain Division at 8-2 - Johnson split with the Hilltoppers - while the Crusaders finished tied for second with Scotch Plains at 7-3.

Johnson also split with Scotch Plains in division competition, both teams winning their games at home.

When Johnson opened its 2015-2106 season on Friday afternoon, Dec. 18 in Berkeley Heights, the Crusaders made a nice comeback from a 13-4 first-quarter deficit before falling 41-34.

Johnson ended up splitting two division games with Summit, Scotch Plains and GL, while sweeping Linden and Plainfield.

Johnson was also defeated at Summit in Union County Tournament first-round competition after the teams won on each other's court during division play.

Johnson rebounded from a 0-2 start to win its own Crusader Tournament in late December. Johnson first defeated South Plainfield 50-36 and then downed Morris Knolls 59-36.

Visconti netted 12 points and teammate Amy Wysocki 13 in the championship game victory over Morris Knolls. Kristina Palella added 10. Amanda Palella was Johnson's high scorer with 13 points in the season-opening setback at GL.

Johnson's final regular season game is scheduled for today at home against Union at 7 p.m., which is a conference-crossover clash. The Crusaders will then turn their attention to next week's Central Jersey, Group 2 playoffs.

Johnson received the 11th seed and is scheduled to play at sixth-seeded Point Pleasant Boro of the Shore Conference Tuesday at 6 p.m.

Johnson's two non-division wins both came in its holiday tournament and both were by double digits over Middlesex and Morris county opposition.

Johnson's biggest divison victory before downing GL last Saturday was its 53-49 win at Summit on Feb. 6 that momentarily prevented the Hilltoppers from clinching the Mountain Division crown.

UCT champs to be crowned at Kean University this week Boys' hoop final Saturday, girls' Sunday

In what is annually the last week before the state tournaments commence, Union County basketball continues its path toward crowning new champions.

The boys' and girls' Union County Tournaments reached the semifinal stages, with the top 4 seeds advancing in both.

The top 4 seeds making it on the boys' side is not news, but a bit of news on the girls' side since there are usually a few upsets along the way there.

The 8oth boys' semifinals were scheduled to take place at Kean University's Harwood Arena last night-Wednesday, Feb. 24. It was fourth-seeded Union Catholic taking on top-seeded The Patrick School of Elizabeth after third-seeded and defending champion Linden faced second-seeded Roselle Catholic in a rematch of last year's championship game.

In a regular-season conference-crossover contest, The Patrick School trimmed visiting Union Catholic 73-46 back on Jan. 7.

Roselle Catholic and Linden split Union County Conference-Watchung Division contests. Linden won the first meeting at Linden by the score of 55-52 on Jan. 14. Defending Watchung Division champion Roselle Catholic downed Linden 59-55 at RC on Feb. 2.

The final is Saturday at Kean at 6 p.m.

Linden came from behind in the second half to defeat Roselle Catholic 60-56 in last year's final. It was Linden's 11th title, third under present head coach Phil Colicchio, and first since 2007.

Roselle Catholic, still seeking its first county crown, made its third appearance in the championship game and second in four seasons. RC also played in the final in 1963 and 2012.

Roselle Catholic has won the last three Non-Public B state championships and two of the last three Tournament of Champions crowns.

Before last year, The Patrick School won two straight UCT titles. Before that, then known as St. Patrick, the Celtics won four straight crowns from 2008-2011.

Plainfield won its first championship in 2012 since 1979.

The 41st girls' semifinals are scheduled to take place today - Thursday, Feb. 25 - but no site had been selected as of Monday.

On the top side of the bracket it's fourth-seeded Roselle Catholic vs. top-seeded and defending champion Patrick School. The bottom side of the bracket semifinal pits third-seeded Cranford vs. second-seeded New Providence.

Roselle Catholic and Patrick School split UCC-Watchung Division games. RC won 47-44 at home back on Dec. 22 and Patrick School won 45-34 at home on Feb. 3.

New Providence - in the semifinals for the first time since 2011 - swept Cranford in UCC-Watchung Division play. The Pioneers first defeated the Cougars 51-46 at home on Opening Night, Dec. 19. New Providence then defeated Cranford 64-57 in Cranford on Feb. 6.

The final is Sunday at Kean at 4 p.m.

Roselle Catholic has won five UCTs. The Lions won their first in 2003, then won three in a row in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and then captured their last one in 2014. RC was the top seed last year after a 21-0 start, but lost to Westfield in the semifinals.

The Patrick School won its only title last year. The Celtics are the top seed for the first time this year.

New Providence and Cranford have both captured one title. New Providence won its crown in 1990 and Cranford its in 2006. Cranford is seeking to reach the final for the first time since 2012. New Providence has yet to reach the final under present head coach Cap Pazdera, who has led the Pioneers to three Group 1 state championships, including last year's.
