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Hillside's superintendent of DPW resigns

Hillside's superintendent of the Departments of Public Works has resigned after only three months on the job.

Sandra Caceres cites a demotion to general supervisor, a 30 percent cut in pay, and difficulty working under Hillside Mayor Angela Garretson as the deciding factors in leaving her post.

According to Caceres, she sent a letter to Garretson on April 21, in which she clearly outlined her grievances — Caceres's response to a letter Garretson had sent to her just three days earlier, a letter which she refers to as the "90-day-offer" letter.

According to Caceres, she was installed by the town council at their Jan. 19 meeting as acting superintendent of Public Works and public engineer. However, a meeting with Garretson on April 13 — the end of Caceres's 90-day acting position — Garretson informed her that she could no longer keep her in that position, instead offering Caceres the position of general supervisor of Public Works at a salary of \$80,000, a pay cut of \$35,000 dollars.

According to Caceres, Garretson's excuse for the demotion was the absence of a salary ordinance in place for a permanent position. "You indicated that the problem was that you did not have a salary ordinance for the permanent position I am currently holding as acting," wrote Caceres. "At this moment, I am not in the position or in any desire to continue working with the municipality if my compensation and my titles are not what I was hired for. Unless I hear from you by the end of business day tomorrow, April 22, 2016, you can consider this my resignation letter."

Caceres, who formerly served as the assistant township engineer in both Clark and Cranford, as well as serving as director of public works in Cranford, said that she left her job as a consultant at an engineering firm in order to take the position in Hillside — a decision she now deeply regrets. "I'm a professional woman," said Caceres. "This is not the kind of treatment I'd expect. I probably would never have quit my other job."

According to Caceres, working under Garretson was a nightmare. "It was a crazy time," said Caceres. "She wanted to be more involved with everything than necessary."

Caceres said that it was Garretson's dictatorial attitude, along with her outrageous demands, that made her working environment miserable. "She wanted keys to my office," said Caceres of Garretson. "She also wanted to relocate the DPW into the basement of town hall and not give them their own building. I told her that was not a good idea. She told me that I had to do what she said and that she was the boss."

Caceres cites issues with snow removal as a point of contention with Garretson, although she asserts that her department was handling the situation diligently. Despite this, however, Caceres said that Garretson hired an outside contractor to remove the snow off Hillside's streets — to the tune of \$400,000 dollars. "We did the best we could," said Caceres. "We cleaned the roads, got the snow off the streets. But she hired an outside firm to deal with the snow removal. She was not happy with the workers," she said of Garretson.

Calls made by LocalSource to both Garretson and the DPW were not returned. Hillside business administrator See HILLSIDE. Page 11

Union County's NAMI is for mental illness awareness

It was an emotional evening as state Sen. Richard Codey spoke at the National Alliance on Mental Illness of Union County monthly meeting on April 26 in Westfield at the American Legion building. He remains dedicated to the cause of educating the public about mental illness by working with the Codey Foundation to convert towns throughout the state to stigma free zones.

"Senator Codey not only talks the talk, but he walks the walk when it comes to the topic of mental illness," said Joann Mehalick, of Clark, a member of NAMI. Mehalick spoke about NAMI's police training program on interacting with the mentally ill. "Through the assistance of our program, police throughout New Jersey are able to see these people as human beings. We made a video and have speakers with mental illness educate them on the subject. Our crisis intervention training program has been very successful."

Codey became interested in helping people with mental illness at a young age. When he was only 19 years old, he worked for a funeral director and visited facilities such as Greystone Psychiatric Hospital where he witnessed patients being mistreated. He swore that if he ever got the chance, he would do everything in his power to help these people.

"I discovered that 35 percent of the employees at the mental health facility had a criminal background," said Codey. "No one was saying anything, but I went public with the atrocities I saw and heard."

About one in four people suffer with mental illness, and while no one plans to lead a life plagued by mental health problems, it's a condition that affects many people and their families. Finding the right treatment can be a challenge, and many people suffering with mental illness fail to receive the proper treatment. NAMI works with families to help them find the appropriate treatment.

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

Lesniak, Fulop clash on **North Jersey casinos**

Reacting to Jersey City Mayor Steve Fulop's declaration that he may not want a casino located in his city after all, state Sen. Raymond Lesniak issued a statement saying that the new gaming facility would be "more than welcome in Elizabeth," the largest city in Lesniak's legislative district.

"If Mayor Fulop doesn't want a new casino for Jersey City, we will take it for Elizabeth, and we will take the jobs, the economic growth, the private-sector investment and the property tax relief that will come with it," said Lesniak. "This will be a multi-billion-dollar facility that could produce 20,000 jobs, leverage up to four billion dollars in private investment and generate 60 million dollars in property tax relief for local residents. We have a marketable location, an available workforce and public officials who will work to get it constructed and succeed. We even have waterfront property. What's not wanted in Jersey City is an opportunity that is more than welcome in Elizabeth. What is lost to Hudson County will be gained by the entire Union County region."

Voters in November will decide whether the state constitution should be changed to allow casino gaming outside of Atlantic City.

As recently as last month, Fulop supported an initiative that would bring the gambling industry to north Jersey. Plans for Liberty Rising, a \$4 billion dollar resort spa and casino spearheaded by venture capitalist Paul Fireman, is being proposed for a location just outside of Liberty State Park.

Lesniak told LocalSource that a casino in Elizabeth would be a boon for the city's economy. "Any municipality would welcome a \$4 billion dollar private investment that would generate \$60 million in property tax revenue and thousands of permanent and construction jobs," said Lesniak of the proposed casino.

Lesniak said that it is unfortunate that Elizabeth has not seriously been considered as a possible site for casinos, citing its location as the main drawback. "Elizabeth doesn't have the same view of Manhattan and the New York skyline that makes the Jersey City site so attractive," Lesniak said.

But Fulop said that after speaking with Atlantic City leadership and community See TALK, Page 10

ALJ senior is Presidential Scholar finalist

The first student from Arthur L. Johnson High School in Clark has been selected as a finalist for the U.S. Presidential Scholar Program. Each year, a total of 161 students from across the country are inducted in the program to receive recognition for their outstanding achievements in areas such as career and technical training, visual and performing arts and creative writing.

Each year more than 4,000 candidates are identified based on academic achievement and scores on the SAT or ACT. Approximately 20 students will be selected from the visual arts field and another 20 from the career and technical training fields. Andrew Kamichoff, of Clark, has been nominated for his performance in the career and technical training fields. He is the first student from the Clark school district to make it past the state level reviews.

Kamichoff has been recognized as the only student from his school as a National Merit scholar based on his PSAT scores during his junior year. He is the recipient of several awards such as the Scout Scholar Athlete Award. He became an Eagle Scout at 13 with nine Eagle Palms, which included more than 45 additional merit badges. He is the first and only scout in New Jersey to receive an Outdoor Medal of Achievement. He's one of 56 in the country to receive the award.

"Andrew is very humble," said his mother, Martha Kamichoff. "He rarely mentions any of his accomplishments. He is proud to have an impact for his school district."

Andrew said he was very excited by the news of his nomination.

"My initial reaction to be nominated for the program was two-fold because I heard of my presidential nomination by the school and national merit on the same day," said Kamichoff.

Kamichoff is a member of Arthur L. Johnson's varsity bowling team. He's been a four year gold letter winner for the team. He is also the vice president of the Youth Executive Committee of Patriots Path Council, specializing in community service. He's a member of the science league team, currently the physics II league team. Science is a subject in which he has excelled greatly, especially during his freshman year. He received a perfect score on the freshman state biology exam. After graduation, Kamichoff plans to attend college to study mechanical and aeronautical engineering. He hopes to attend Rowan University or Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute.

"Andrew's mind is always thinking," said Martha Kamichoff. "He has researched and built his own computer gaming system and plays and communicates with people from all over the world daily. His sites in the science league testing speak for themselves."

In addition to his achievements in other areas, Kamichoff also demonstrates outstanding leadership ability. He received a National Youth Leadership Society Award and a Patriots Path Council Leadership Award. He's also a Leadership Excellence Direct Results alumni.

Kamichoff was required to submit a series of essays along with his resume and school transcripts for the program. If selected as one of the scholars, Kamichoff will join the other 161 scholars for a trip to Washington, D.C. this June. He will find out during the end of May if he has been selected for the program.





Court approves Cranford housing units

On April 26, The State Appellate Court affirmed Superior Court Judge Lisa Chrystal's decision to permit Cranford Development Associates to build 360 affordable housing units on Birchwood Avenue. Citizens have expressed financial and environmental concerns regarding this project.

A resident of Cranford, who wishes to remain anonymous, feels the judge was very disrespectful to Cranford residents by permitting the project to be built on an area that's been devastated by Hurricane Irene. He feels that too many towns in the area are concerned about those with a low income while neglecting the needs of the middle class. He also states that while the area itself has been restored from the flood damage, the judge failed to pay attention to the surrounding areas.

"I believe that with all the new developments in town, Cranford has officially met its obligation for low-income housing," stated the resident. "It's been more than friendly to these people. The town could answer that. At this point, it's just over the top exploitation. Although this may not have been the case six years ago."

The project has been negotiated for the past six years to determine if it was environmentally suitable. In order to avoid repetitive litigation, a decision as to whether to permit the affordable housing units had to be made. The judge stated that building the units would actually improve the flooding issues.

"A strong argument has been advanced that this plan actually improves flood control in Cranford. It removes the 215 Birchwood Ave. from the floodway, thus keeping flood waters closer to the channel of the stream," the judge wrote. "It increases the flood storage capacity of the site, thus lowering the peak flood levels in the homes downstream."

"The developer has to elevate Birchwood Avenue by one foot in order to bring the road above flood elevation levels," said Liz Sweeney, of Cranford. "People are concerned about the flooding coming from Birchwood Avenue, not the affordable housing component of the proposed development."

There was a perceived need to set the apartment buildings further back from the street, lowering the height of one of the

buildings and ensuring adequate parking, which would result in the construction of fewer units. However, none of these proposed changes were based on the finding that the site was environmentally inappropriate for the proposed development.

The project would involve raising a large building that was sitting directly in the floodway, thus improving drainage. It would also increase the extent to which the property could safely retain some flood water. These measures could protect the rest of the town from flooding.

Plaintiffs Cranford Development Associates and its members Samuel Hekemian, Peter Hekemian, Jeffrey Hekemian, and Ann Krikorian as trustee for Richard Hekemian and Mark Hekemian filed suit against the township, alleging that Cranford had failed to provide its fair share of low to moderate income housing, and that its current zoning prohibited construction of affordable housing.

Chrystal found that Cranford had an unmet housing obligation of 410 units. She also concluded the plaintiff would likely be able to satisfy any requirements regarding flood hazard areas and stormwater management.

In order to raise funds for Home for Good Dog Rescue, a foster-based dog shelter located in Berkeley Heights, Cranford's Nomahegan Park hosted a 5k run and doggy dash on April 30. Registration began at 8 a.m. as runners and their dogs arrived at the park. They received a bandana and treat bag for their pets prior to the race.

This was the second year for the Cranford event that was organized by Shari Gold. Gold adopted her dog, nicknamed "Cassaroo," after falling in love at first sight. She's worked for Good Dog Rescue for the past year and a half, and she's volunteered her time for the past few years.

"My dog, Cassie, is a terrier mix," said Gold."Her name was originally Dixie. She came from the south, but all my pets' names begin with the letter 'C', so I had to change her name. Plus 'Dixie' didn't sound like she belonged living in New Jersey."

Last year's event took place during trop-

ical storm Joaquin, so this year's weather was much more suited to the event, although the sun didn't start shining until closer to the end. A total of 243 participants attended, and the winner of the 5K was Will Smith of Cranford. The Doggy Dash winner was Michael Postaski of Maplewood and his dog Louie. Both winners finished in first place during last year's race, too.

"We are very grateful that the weather turned out much better this year," said Public Relations and Social Media Coordinator Matthew Holowienka. "When I first started working with Good Dog Rescue, I wasn't even a dog person. Now I absolutely love them."

Good Dog Rescue originated five years ago in Berkeley Heights. During that time, the foster-based shelter has placed more than 4,200 dogs with foster families. Each family's home is inspected after completing an application with the rescue.

"Different dogs have different needs,' said Holowienka. "We look for families

with fenced in yards and things like that. All our dogs are examined by our vet before placed into a family. We've placed dogs in homes throughout the state as well as in states such as New York and Pennsylvania."

Sean Gorman and his daughter, Abby, from Cranford, arrived with their shichon, Sadie, for the 5K. Abby and her friend, Caitlyn Farago, were advocates supporting the dog rescue for Girl Scout Troop 40332. The girls were excited to participate in the event.

"The girl scouts are also supporting the water station on riverside," said Gorman.

Prior to the start of the race, Union County Freeholder Bruce H. Bergen took the podium. He informed residents about the county's plans to partner with the animal shelter to start a regional shelter that would provide animal control while promoting humane treatment. The county also passed a resolution to support a bill to ban or curtail the operation of puppy mills in New Jersey.

"Welcome to the beautiful county park," said Bergen. "We are happy to host the 5K Doggy Dash today. As a dog owner myself, I'm happy to support dogs without a home. They deserve a second chance at life."

The 5K began at 9 a.m. promptly followed by the Doggy Dash, where owners and their dogs ran the 5K together. At 9:30 a.m. a one-mile dog walk began. There were signs along the way that told the story of Good Dog Rescue. The race started at the baseball diamond and ended by the parking lot.

Mimi Nguyen and her brother, Michael Nguyen, of Scotch Plains, attended the dog walk with their dogs Maggie May and Ashley. Maggie May is a terrier mix, and Ashley is a poodle. Maggie May was a rescue, and Mimi talked about their experience together.

"Rescuing Maggie May has been a challenging but rewarding experience," said Nguyen. "She's afraid of other dogs. We brought her today to try to socialize her. This is her first 5K. My brother runs marathons, and he suggested we come today."

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Union County municipalities receive grants

Union, Cranford, Berkeley Heights and New Providence were chosen to receive Sustainable Jersey grants funded by the Public Service Enterprise Group Foundation at a meeting held in Cranford on April 12. They will go toward the implementation of several projects targeted at environmental concerns such as water conservation and park revitalization.

"Environmental, social and economic issues are the cornerstone to the PSEG Foundation's support and we are committed to leading the communities in which we serve towards a more sustainable future," said Ellen Lambert, president of the PSEG Foundation, in a recent press release. "These projects will have a lasting impact to neighborhoods throughout New Jersey."

Cranford's project is titled i-Tree Inventory, and it includes the inventory of approximately 7,000 trees along the municipal roads. The inventory will allow the town to make informed decisions regarding the management of the trees. They were the recipient of a \$10,000 grant.

Berkeley Heights also received a \$10,000 grant for a project called Impervious Cover Reduction and Stormwater Management. This innovative project will address stormwater runoff through the use of rebates to encourage homeowners to construct rain gardens on their properties. The project is being implemented in partnership with Rutgers Cooperative Exten-

sion's Water Resource Program.

The overpopulation of deer is a growing concern among New Jersey residents, and the issue is currently being addressed by municipalities throughout the state. With the \$2,000 grant received by New Providence, they will fund a project called Community Garden, where a deer-free community garden will be built where residents can learn about healthy gardening techniques and have the opportunity to culti-

vate fresh, all-natural produce.

"We've had a lot of support to build the community garden," said Barbara Friedman of New Providence. "With the help of the grant, the cost is defrayed and now we can buy a shed and complete the project quickly. We are very grateful for the support."

Union received a \$2,000 grant to fund a project called Green Team Re-Activation. They plan to encourage a greater amount

of activity to do sustainable action items. The green team will be revitalized with the funds.

"The township of Union is excited to reinvigorate our Green initiatives with the small grant from Sustainable New Jersey. We are proud of how far we have come, but recognize how far we still need to go to ensure a solid, and environmentally conscious future for all of our residents," said Union Mayor Manuel Figueiredo in a press release

Sustainable Jersey is a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization that provides tools, training and financial incentives to support communities as they pursue sustainability programs. Currently, 77 percent, or 434 of New Jersey's 565 municipalities are participating in the municipal certification program and 163 school districts and 428 schools are participating in the new Sustainable Jersey for Schools certification program.

"These grants support green teams and municipalities working to bring innovative sustainability projects forward that will shape the future of their residents for years to come," said Donna Drewes, who codirects Sustainable Jersey with Randall Solomon, in a recent press release. She extended her congratulations to all of the towns that received grants.

"The grants we're awarding today will also help build capacity as municipalities move sustainability programs forward," Drewes said.

Paint Possibilities event fosters hope and healing

Kean University's Occupational Therapy Community Cares Clinic hosted "Paint Possibilities," an event modeled around the popular "paint night" events. Opportunity Project, a nonprofit clubhouse for adults with brain injuries located in Millburn, took part in the program.

Led by a Kean fine arts graduate student, participants were treated to an afternoon of creative expression, with Kean's occupational therapy students and faculty members on hand to partner with participants and oversee the event.

Kellie Furland, an OT student at Kean, said that she, along with other students in the program, came up with the idea to run a paint night from a class assignment. "We were asked to develop a program

that was occupational therapy-related and run it at the Kean University Occupational Therapy Community Cares Clinic," said Furland, who was paired up with a participant in creating a work of art. "While brainstorming some ideas of programs we could run, one of my classmates suggested the adapted paint night. The paint night classes have become such a trend and we wanted to provide an opportunity for people to participate in this popular event by creating adaptations to the painting, the tools used, and the instruction," she said.

Furland said that the most challenging part of the program was anticipating what adaptations the participants might need. "We created a registration form that asked some questions about adaptations that each person could select to attempt to over-

(Continued from Page 6) come this challenge," Furland said. "But the nature of working with participants with brain injury is that everyone is different and you have to be able to make adaptations on the spot."

Medea Valdez, executive director of Kean's School of Physician Assistant Studies, said that events like Painting Possibilities offers participants - who deal with unique challenges on a day-to-day basis an opportunity to express themselves creatively. "Art therapy allows for patients to have non-verbal expressions about feelings - about what's happening to them," said Valdez. "We treat patients medically, but what about other things like depression? There are other things we need to consider after an injury. There is an emotional and psychological impact. There are cognitive issues. I think it's very important for our students and our providers to have a bigger picture of how to help these patients."

Michael Moran, of Opportunity Project, said that the organization was excited to take part in the event, which goes along with the mission of the organization. "Opportunity Project was one of the first clubhouse models in the state," said Moran. "A clubhouse model means that our members have a voice. For members, by members. That's our motto."

Moran said that the organization has social workers, occupational therapists, vocational counselors, and nutritionists on staff to assist members, who are offered a range of activities such as yoga and cooking. "Once you're a member, you are always a member. We're a very tight-knit family," said Moran.

Wilma Curry-Ward, who attended the paint night event, joined the organization about a month ago, two years after she was diagnosed with a brain tumor. "This is one of the few places that you're not penalized for having a brain injury," said Curry-Ward, who is currently going through vocational training and assisting at the organization. "I had to feel my way around when I first got there. You have to learn how to interact with people on a daily basis," she said.

Valdez reiterates this point and said that a holistic approach to brain-injury patients is vital. "You have to treat the whole patients," said Valdez. "The emotional and psychological aspects must be addressed. Patients can easily become depressed by these struggles and it is important to offer them opportunities to still engage in meaningful activities.

Valdez said that creative therapy is a great outlet for those recovering from brain injuries. "Art therapy is beneficial for patients who are left with deficits," said Valdez. "Being able to express that helps. Having a way to express yourself is vital, and it's also beneficial for fine motor skills. I think as medical providers we get

focused on their medical outcomes and need to have a greater understanding of the impact their psychological and emotional needs have on their health outcomes. Communication between the various health professions from medicine, nursing and allied health is key to ensuring the patient is able to reach his or her full potential," she said.

Geraldine Pagaoa, director of the OT clinic at Kean, said that events such Painting Possibilities helps participants gain confidence. "Being able to be with other people and increasing that social interaction gives them confidence," said Pagaoa. "Many of these participants have lost friends, their jobs, their homes. Here they are engaging in a social activity and taking part in the community."

Valdez explains that the program explores opportunities for students to interact with students from other disciplines in order to gain a full understanding of each member's role on the health-care team. "By integrating opportunities for students to work together with patients with brain injuries we can both enhance student education and promote a more holistic approach to patient care," she said.

Furland said that participating in the event gave her a deep sense of pride. "We went in with this idea that we thought was great and it was exciting to see it actually turn out to be great," Furland said. "It was so different than any event I have ever participated in before, and it was so cool to see the amazing turnout. The most rewarding part of the experience was to see how much the participants enjoyed themselves. At the end of the day that was what we really wanted. We wanted to give people a chance to try something new, create a piece of art, and to have fun," she said.

Furland said that pairing up with participants was a unique experience. "It is like painting next to a friend, a friend who gets to try something new and be a part of something awesome," Furland said of the event. "Together we were able to enjoy an experience and in the end, we were both proud. Just because something happened to them, doesn't mean everything is different. It's amazing to have provided these individuals with the opportunity to express themselves through a few colors and a brush, and give them a chance to try something and express themselves."

Kean's OT Community Cares Clinic provides service to individuals of the community, offering occupational therapy services for children and youth, rehabilitation and disability, mental health, productive aging, and health and wellness. Students enrolled in the OT program utilize the clinic for splinting, working with clients during seminar classes, and fieldwork placements.

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

"NAMI's mission is to educate, advocate and support the families of those with mental illness," said the association's Vice President Pat Roman, of Clark.

Codey spoke about his wife's personal battle with mental illness. As he opened the doors of communication, more people felt comfortable to discuss their experiences as well. People were very empathetic with one another, and they expressed their wishes for legislators to work with the public to make sure people receive the treatment they need

"At age 36, I finally met someone who would marry me," said Codey. "She's a teacher, and she loves kids. She got pregnant with our first child at age 39. Toward the end of her pregnancy, she wasn't herself. After she gave birth, she admitted she felt depressed and was having thoughts of killing our 3-month-old baby."

Codey brought her to Carrier Clinic to receive treatment for her depression. She had doubts about her recovery and told her husband to find someone else because she would never get better. Fortunately, her doubts were misguided as she was able to get well with medication. When she got pregnant again with their second child, she went off the medicine and her depression returned. Her only options at this point were to receive electric shock therapy or abort the baby. She opted for the shock treatment, which was a success.

After giving birth to their second child, she was able to start taking the medication

again. One day, Codey received a call from their son that the police were at the house and that his wife had suffered a seizure due to high serotonin levels. The doctors had failed to prescribe the appropriate dosage of the medication. Later, when his wife was diagnosed with breast cancer and had to go for a double mastectomy, her depression returned.

"Mental health has come a long way," said Codey. "My wife claims she would rather have breast cancer than suffer one day of depression. There's still a stigma that surrounds mental health. No one wants to talk about it, but everyone is more than willing to wear pink to show their support for breast cancer. There aren't too many advocates for mental health. It's more common now, too. Alzheimer's disease is on the rise, and it's increased 700 percent in the last 12 years. Because it's a disease of the brain, no one is marching on Washington."

According to Codey, although suicide is on the rise among white women, men and minorities are less likely to admit they are suffering with mental health conditions. As a part of the Codey Foundation, he plans to work with psychiatrists to get them to relocate to urban areas so more people can receive treatment. In exchange for working in a less affluent community, Codey promises to pay off their medical school costs.

Greystone's closing, it's now reopened and is providing patients with satisfactory care. Gov. Chris Christie recently closed another state mental health facility that was running properly to cut costs, which has caused an outrage among many people that need treatment. Audience members expressed wishes that Codey return to the office of governor so that people with mental illness will be more likely to receive the best treatment. As he turned the conversation over to audience members, many of them became emotional as they responded to Codey's speech.

One woman was unable to express herself verbally, and she instead responded with a handwritten letter to express her concerns. A young man living at a group home for the mentally ill expressed his gratitude for people like Codey who are dedicated to the needs of those suffering with mental illness. Lastly, a father expressed his grief for the loss of his son, whose life was taken by the hands of the Westfield police during a psychotic episode ten years ago. Codey expressed his sympathy for the man's loss and assured him that police have also come a long way when it comes to handling the mentally ill.

Codey concluded the meeting by urging citizens to write to their legislators about the importance of treating mental illness and providing the right care for those suffering with these diseases. He expressed his interest in electing Phil Murphy into office as governor because of his genuine concern for the public. He reinforced the fact that we need to elect leaders that care for people and will work to make sure they receive the best possible care.

Matthew Lorenzetti, supervisor of Fine and Performing Arts for Linden public schools, comes from a background firmly rooted in music, with his father also serving as supervisor of the performing arts program. Lorenzetti has served both as a music teacher and band leader before becoming supervisor three years ago.

Lorenzetti said that involvement and support of board members, faculty and the community has made all the difference in bringing the program to the level it is at today. "I believe one of the main things that set us apart from other districts is that we are committed as a district and community to support all our arts programs," said Lorenzetti. "At any given event you might find multiple board members, our superintendent and assistant superintendent, and city officials. Our students can see that their involvement in the arts matters. It's just the dedication of everyone in Linden. There's a lot of support from the community, the Board of Education, and the superintendent. And we have a very dedicated

Linden Superintendent of Schools Danny Robertozzi said that he is thrilled that the program has received this recognition. "We are so honored to be named one of the Top 100 Communities for Music Education in the entire United States," said Robertozzi. "The Linden School District has always prided itself on developing wellrounded students. One way we have always strived to do that is through our Fine and Performing Arts Department. Too often, when school districts need to cut the budget, music and art become the first casualties. That has never been the case in Linden and never will be. We strongly believe in providing a strong music education program for our students and we feel strongly that a high-quality fine and performing arts department also facilitates success in traditional classroom subjects."

Lorenzetti said that students are exposed to a broad spectrum of skills and programming that provides unique opportunities and experiences. The program, which is offered to students from K-12, also provides a wide variety of musical instruction. "Third grade is a very big year for our students," said Lorenzetti. "They are allowed to start studying band or orchestra

instruments, and students in 4th grade can begin participating in our school choruses. At the middle school level all students are given the opportunity to take music as an elective where they learn piano skills, how to read and create music, as well as about the history of music."

Lorenzetti said that the middle schools each offer a variety of vocal, band, and orchestral ensembles. Twenty different courses are offered at the high school level, including multiple ensembles, guitar, dance, musical theatre and music technology.

Students from grades three to 12 also receive individual MacBook Air computers to supplement their learning or to create music — another factor that sets Linden music programming from other school districts.

Lorenzetti said that students in the program feel a great sense of pride in their accomplishments. "They take pride in what they do because they see that others are proud of them as well," said Lorenzetti of the students.

"Part of leadership is being able to listen to feedback and being willing to learn more about an issue and to admit when you may be on the wrong side of an issue," Fulop told LocalSource. "A couple weeks ago, I had the opportunity to spend the day with leadership and community members in Atlantic City to learn more on the issue of casinos. I have also spoken to Jersey City community members and casino operators,

but I think I need to still learn more on this. For the last year, I have been on record as a strong advocate for a casino in Jersey City and after listening to the Jersey City community, I am committed to learning more before I advocate for this on the ballot in November," said Fulop.

Lesniak and Fulop took to twitter in a heated sparring match over the issue. "Keep an open mind and remember Elizabeth is ready willing and able," tweeted Lesniak.

Fulop shot back. "Don't you think Elizabeth has enough crime? Not sure why you

think casinos are a panacea," Fulop tweeted. Lesniak was quick to respond. "We have

a lot less crime than JC, get a good night's sleep," returned Lesniak.

Fulop tweeted back. "I have no problem sleeping at night. Maybe you can't say the same for yourself Ray," he said in response.

Lesniak believes that a casino in Elizabeth could easily compete with casinos elsewhere. "A casino in north Jersey, wherever located, would attract north Jersey residents who are now going to Pennsylvania and New York for casino gambling." Lesniak believes that Fulop has thrown something of a monkey wrench into the conversation. "The mayor of Jersey City threw cold water on the Liberty Rising in Jersey City, which was the preferred site because of its great vista of the Manhattan skyline."

Gaming revenue from Atlantic City's casinos in 2015 generated \$2.56 billion dollars, down nearly seven percent from the prior year. In 2014, revenue dipped below the \$3 billion dollar mark, the first time since 1991.

(Continued from Page 1) Stephanie Bush-Baskette said that the township was unable to comment.

Caceres said that she performed her duties well and that there was no cause by Garretson to demote her to a lesser position or to cut her salary. "There have been no issues with my job performance," Caceres indicated in her letter to Garretson.

But according to Hillside councilman Gerald P. Freedman, there was never a salary agreement in writing between Garretson and Caceres. "There was some contention over salary, but that was never in writing," said Freedman of the agreement between the two parties. "I don't know where she'd get that from. I guess the mayor told her."

Caceres claims that a salary of \$115,000 dollars was discussed and agreed upon at an interview meeting with Garretson, but that her salary was actually based on just \$110,000 dollars annually - a discrepancy that Caceres tried to discuss with Garretson repeatedly but with no success.

Freedman asserts that the town was not better off with Caceres. "We're not sorry to see her go," said Freedman of Caceres. "Not too many people think she did a good job. The town was not any cleaner."

Freedman said that the council was unaware of when the post would be filled. "I don't even think the job is advertised vet," said Freedman.


Caceres maintains that the department

is equipped with substandard equipment and too little of it. In addition, Caceres claims that unqualified workers have been employed by Garretson. "She hired a DJ to do code enforcement," said Caceres.

Caceres said that she was informed that a code enforcement officer was currently filling her position. "It does not surprise me that one of the code enforcement individuals is currently doing my job," said Caceres. "The person is one of her doit-all kind of guys. He even buys her lunch, dinner, coffee and breakfast. I know this for a fact, as I was at many meetings with her and he brought stuff to eat for her."

Caceres said that she is now on the job hunt once again. "I am a single mother of three who has always worked hard to first provide for my family and to teach my children that in life, when you do bad it will always backfire on you," said Caceres. "I have worked very hard all my life to be where I am now, and I personally do not appreciate when someone like the mayor tries to stab me in the back or tries to make my reputation questionable."

Caceres believes that there is not much that can be done under the Garretson administration. "The mayor is the type of woman who wants to impose herself on you," said Caceres. "If she doesn't get her way she gets very arrogant and disrespectful. There's not very much you can do with a person like that.

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Bill to help ensure equal access to state contracts

Legislation sponsored by Assembly Democrats will potentially ensure that women and minority-owned businesses in New Jersey have equal access to state contracts.

The bill, which was approved last week by the General Assembly and is now awaiting consideration by the Senate, will establish a Division of Minority and Women Business Development in the State Department of Treasury, and will be headed by a state chief disparity officer.

The division will administer and monitor policies and practices in order to further the state's efforts in ensuring equal opportunities for minority-owned and womenowned businesses in the purchasing and procurement of state contracts.

The state chief disparity officer is tasked with monitoring the state's public contracting process for the purpose of compiling information on the awarding of contracts to minority-owned and women-owned businesses including the total and percentage value of all contracts, and would have to periodically report findings to both the governor and legislature.

The bill would provide that contracts valued at less than \$200,000 — awarded through the state's small business set-aside program, which mandates that federal agencies spend 23 percent of their purchases with small businesses — would not be publicly advertised for bids but would, instead, be negotiated with small businesses using a competitive contracting process.

State contracts provide an important source of revenue for small minority and female-owned businesses, and access to these contracts can often remain elusive to those who don't always have the capital or manpower to obtain the necessary information to bid on these contracts.

Union County Assemblywoman Annette Quijano, a sponsor of the bill, said that the state has a responsibility to ensure that its contracting process is equitable and accessible to all qualified businesses.

"When this bill becomes law, it will be another step forward for women-owned and minority-owned businesses in this state," said Quijano. "By establishing the Division of Minority and Women Business Development, we will now be able to monitor and administer policies, practices and programs to ensure there are equal opportunities for minority-owned and women-owned business."

Quijano asserts that access to information is vital for minority and women-owned businesses to succeed.

"Information is power," said Quijano. "One of the major objectives for this new division will be to collect and share information about how each and every department of our state government contracts with women-owned and minority-owned businesses. How the state chooses to spend its money says a lot about what we value as a people. I know the people of New Jersey value our diversity and this is an important way to tell the world what we stand for."

Assemblyman Benji Wimberly, who also sponsored the bill, said that although progress has been made, there are still challenges to overcome. "While progress has been made, women and minority business owners continue to face challenges that limit their ability to grow," said Wimberly. "The provisions in this legislation are necessary to ensure that the equality of opportunity guaranteed by federal and state law are available to minority-owned and women-owned businesses in this state."

While small and minority-owned businesses can often get shut out of the information-gathering and bidding process by larger companies, this bill would ensure a level playing field. "This agency would ensure that businesses owned by women and minorities have an equal opportunity to provided needed services to the state," said sponsor Assemblywoman Vainieri Huttle in a press release. "We want to ensure that the state's public contracting process is fair and equitable, and this legislation does that."

Union Mayor Manuel Figueiredo said the the new bill is a step in the right direction. "I applaud our representatives in Trenton for standing behind such an impactful bill," said Figueiredo. "As a true Democrat, I support things that will level the playing field, especially where it pertains to areas like public contracts. We hope that the forward movement of this bill will mean greater opportunities for a segment of entrepreneurs that continues to grow exponentially."

Suzette Cavadas, Deputy Mayor of Union, said that she applauds the initiative. "As a woman in business, I understand how competitive certain markets can be," said Cavadas. "But the competition for public contracts is something that women, in particular, have traditionally not had access to. This is a huge step in the right direction."

Quijano maintains that this bill ensures equality, not favoritism. "This is not about favoring one type of business over another," Quijano said. "It is about making sure that all businesses interested in bidding for state contracts and capable of doing the work can throw their hats in the ring and be considered."

Other sponsors of the bill include Assembly members Cleopatra Tucker and Sheila Oliver.

When bad news hits

The sadly put-upon residents of the Birchwood area of Cranford knew early on in the twenty seven page published opinion of a state appellate court decision last week they were in trouble. Regarding the appeal of the Union County Court decision to permit 360 new units in their neighborhood, by the second paragraph of the court's decision they knew the results.

The decision led off stating the lower court judge had "issued a series of lengthy comprehensive and correct opinions over the course of the litigation, and we need not repeat her reasoning here."

Instead the court gave a history of the litigation. Just as important was a series of pretty pointed shots at the actions of the former town fathers. In the case alleging "Cranford had failed to provide fair share of affordable housing and that its current zoning prohibited the construction of affordable housing," they let loose.

While the township officials and township attorneys involved in the prior decisions have left the scene, the court's criticism in terms of their inaction remain, in an opinion which has, as the lawyers say, "precedent value." For the poor Birchwood residents, the idea of this new massive housing is chilling. For the taxpayers, the township spent more than an estimated \$750,000 in legal fees.

The decision starts citing to the lower court decision that the township's fair share housing plan was "seriously deficient." As to the legal obligation to negotiate with a developer they concluded "the township had no interest in negotiating."

As to the prior governing body and its advisory staff inaction, "despite prior notice the committee did not place the proposal on the agenda for any of the meetings, did not meet with the developers to discuss the proposal, and refused to share any of its proposals and refused to share any of its professionals report on the proposal." Most telling, the Appellate Court said of Cranford's officials' relationship with the developers, they "showed no interest in considering its proposal."

The court wasn't through. By page 9 they reminded, that a prior project "of a much more modest affordable housing development in the same location" was also rejected. The court found the fair share housing plan was "deficient" and another township argument was termed a "red herring."

As if to add a final slap on the township position, the court adopted the argument "that the proposed development was likely to decrease rather than exacerbate flooding in the area."

Faced with the court's stinging criticism of the township's own action, Mayor Andis Kalnins was at his obtuse best. He was quoted about "the court's lack of understanding of the case." It's understandable that in the case of a terrible impact on the residents of the northeast section of the community, the township officials would take the easy route of a criticism of the court and even imply a further costly appeal was in the offering. Left out of the criticism was some necessary looking inward of the inaction of past officials and advisers which caused the mess in the first place.

Next door in Roselle, they took a somewhat different tact on the receipt of bad news. Union County LocalSource reported last week troubling allegations of violations of the laws against discrimination and presence of a hostile work environment existing in the public works department. While allegations are just that, this community of only 21,000 hired an outside public relations spokesman to address the issue. The article quotes the paid spokesman as saying the "primary interest is to maintain and ensure a harassment-free work-place." Always helpful to merely repeat what the law requires when bad news hits.

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Learn from the past, save the future

Today, May 5, we commemorate Holocaust Remembrance Day, or Yom HaShoah in Hebrew. While Jan. 27 is the day the United Nations set aside to remember the Holocaust, today is the day designated by Israel, Jewish communities and many others to mark that agonizing time in human history.

The Holocaust was the systematic murder of "undesired" groups of people by the German government and army prior to and during World War II. Historians mark the beginning of the Holocaust as the night of Nov. 9 and 10 in 1938, a night now called Kristallnacht, or the Night of Broken Glass. On this night, anti-Jewish rhetoric, hatred and demonization came to a head in a pogrom in Germany and Austria in which Jewish stores, synagogues and homes were targeted and destroyed. It is unknown how many were murdered during Kristallnacht.

However, it is known how many were murdered in ghettos, concentration camps and forced marches during the Holocaust. Germany's government and army stole the lives of 11 million people — Jews, gays, Romani, political dissidents, blacks, the physically and mentally disabled, and anyone else deemed unworthy to live in Adolf Hitler's trag-

ic vision of Utopia. Those who survived were left with unimaginable scars, both physical and emotional. The Nazis would go to schools and sterilize children based on their looks, and Josef Mengele, a Nazi physician, performed disgusting and cruel experiments on Jewish prisoners. And emotionally, survivors have been left to deal with the memories of seeing their families murdered, of being treated worse than dirt, of starving, of hating, of being constantly afraid, and of feeling forgotten by God and by humanity.

There is simply not enough room in this newspaper to expound upon the horrors and atrocities committed during the Holocaust. Rather than dwell on the sicknesses of the past, we must look to the future.

Unfortunately, the future is not looking particularly bright right now either.

Anti-Semitism is on the rise in Europe. Jews have been on the receiving end of hateful speech and violent attacks. According to the European Union's Fundamental Rights Agency, there has been a significant increase in the past few years of anti-Semitism.

In a 2015 report, the FRA reported that throughout Europe anti-Semitism is often openly expressed in the media, schools, governments and just about everywhere. The report states that "denial and trivialisation of the Holocaust are becoming more common, with glorification of the Nazi past also in evidence."

When talking about the Holocaust, "Never Again" has become a battle cry. It is a pledge that man will never again allow such a desecration of human life to occur. We aren't keeping up our end of this pledge. Every time violence erupts based on hatred for someone's religion, appearance, gender, sexual identity or country of origin, we are failing. We failed when the Hutus massacred the Tutsis in Rwanda. We failed when Cambodia's Pol Pot murdered approximately 1.5 million of his own people. We failed when the Bosnian Serbs perpetrated an "ethnic cleansing" against Muslim Bosniaks and Bosnian Croats.

But we do not have to keep failing. We can renew the promise of "Never Again." We can make it clear that hate will not be tolerated.

Budget will impact services

To the Editor

Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski, a resident of Cranford and liaison to the county's Human Services Advisory Board recently delivered the following testimony to the New Jersey Senate Budget and Appropria-

tions Committee during their fiscal hearing on the 2017 State Budget in Newark:

Thank you for this opportunity to testify regarding the impact of state budget cuts on critical services that Union County government provides to our most vulnerable residents.

As you know, the cost of living in our state is one of the most expensive in the country. Many of our residents, who were hit hardest by the financial collapse and foreclosure crisis of 2008, continue to struggle with housing and other basic needs.

In fact, the poverty rate in New Jersey has remained "stubbornly high" according to a report commissioned last November by Legal Services of New Jersey.

In 2007, less than 11,000 households in Union County received food assistance, or SNAP, benefits. By December 2015 our SNAP caseload more than doubled, to 25,416 households. Approximately 70 percent of these households consist of low income families with children. More than 25 percent of SNAP households are seniors and persons with disabilities.

We are faced with the hard reality that more residents need help, including the many who work for wages that do not cover their basic needs. At the same time, we are coping with wave after wave of cuts in state funding that formerly provided for those needs.

Our Paratransit service provides a clear example of the obstacles facing Union County and other local governments. From 2010 to 2015, the number of one-way rides that our Union County Paratransit provided to seniors and disabled people rose from

141,181 to 206,000 rides. Meanwhile, state funding has plummeted.

Paratransit is just one example of the impact that state budget cuts have on our vital services. When the state failed to apply for a federal food stamp waiver, we had an increase of up to 1,200 visits to our One Stop Career Centers by constituents who need to maintain a work activity. We have done all we can to help these constituents, with no provision for extra staff from the state.

We have scrambled to make up for the loss of almost \$900,000 in state Peer Grouping dollars, including programs that help our seniors live at home.

A number of critical state grants have been in stasis for several years, resulting in cuts to programs for homeless prevention, substance abuse prevention and treatment, and personal services for the disabled.

One final example is the intention of the state to eliminate the General Assistance program, an action that would be devastating for low-income single adults.

Our experience in Union County underscores how counties throughout New Jersey are struggling to enable our most vulnerable residents to put food on the table, live in a safe, healthful home, and work to the best of their capabilities.

This is the hidden story, and it will continue to unfold with potentially disastrous consequences for the young, the old, those with disabilities, and many others with limited resources and opportunities to provide for themselves.

As the county of Union steps up to address the needs of our constituents, we ask that the state of New Jersey take up its share of responsibility, and reverse the present course of grant stagnation and budget cuts.

Great to be back in the U.S.A.

To the Editor

I do not travel for the company I work for and if my memory serves me correctly, the last time I travelled to Europe for company business was back in 1990. At the close of business on Friday, March 18, I received a call from my company telling me that a coworker who was in Europe had to leave, and they asked me if I would go over to Belgium to assist with a few things. I was to fly to Brussels and report to our Antwerp office. The people in the Antwerp office were going to be in Germany on Monday and I was to fly on Monday to arrive into Brussels Tuesday morning. About an hour later, I received a call informing me that it would be better for me to have the extra time to adjust from jet-lag, and that I should fly out on Sunday to arrive into Brussels on Monday.

Perhaps a 'Guardian Angel' was watching over me because, had the original plan stayed in motion, I would have been in the Brussels Airport at the exact time the March 22 Brussels Airport terrorist attacks were happening. When I arrived on Monday morning I made my way to our office in Antwerp, and on Tuesday morning the

(Continued from Page 15) world heard the news about the bombings, both at the airport and train station.

On the ninth day of my trip, I went over to the Antwerp Central Train Station and took the high-speed train to Amsterdam. Hundreds upon hundreds of people move in and out of the Central Train Station and the high-speed train departs from the lowest level, with many train arrivals and departures on levels directly above. It was a bit unsettling seeing so many people with suitcases and backpacks on the escalators and train platforms and being at the bottom-most level, made it even more uncomfortable.

I again had that same feeling of anxiety when I flew from Croatia to Amsterdam and then boarded the high-speed train to Antwerp. After about a week in Antwerp I had to return to Croatia and after Croatia I had to fly to Germany. Thirty-three days later I found myself back in Antwerp, preparing for my flight home on the 34th day via the Brussels Airport.

Though completely understandable, I have never, ever, experienced the numerous degrees of security checks that Brussels had in place. As I stood in one of the security lines and waited to be cleared to the next check-point, my heart pounded as I continuously thought of the senseless killing of all those innocent people just waiting in line like I was.

SS for same-sex marriages

To the Editor

Last year, the Supreme Court issued a

decision in Obergefell v. Hodges, holding that same-sex couples have a constitutional right to marry in all states. As a result, Social Security recognizes more same-sex couples as married for purposes of determining entitlement to Social Security benefits or eligibility for Supplemental Security Income payments. We recently updated instructions for employees to process claims and appeals when a determination of marital status is necessary.

As part of the new instructions, we have:

- Removed from our policy any mention or consideration of the dates when states first recognized same-sex marriages from other states. These dates are no longer relevant.
- Added the dates when some foreign jurisdictions allowed same-sex marriage,

thereby eliminating the need for a casespecific legal review in many foreign same sex marriage claims.

- Updated and simplified our procedures for processing claims involving a transgendered or intersex person, allowing these individuals to self-identify as members of a same or opposite-sex marriage.
- Streamlined and clarified the policy instructions, addressing questions raised by advocates and employees.

Student from Summit codirects award-winning film

Pingry School juniors Adam Present, of Summit and Matt San Miguel, of Madison, entered a film competition for the first time and have won two awards for their film "Entropy." They tied for Grand Prize in the Experimental category for grades 10 to 12 in the Montclair Film Festival's 2016 Emerging Filmmaker Competition, and they won First Place in the 2016 C3 Cherubs Cinema Contest, operated by the National High School Institute at Northwestern University.

The Emerging Filmmaker Competition is judged by local film and television professionals; 20 winning films came from 17 schools in New Jersey. The C3 Cherubs Cinema Contest is an online film festival whose top three winners are selected through online voting.

"Entropy," lasting four-and-a-half minutes, was filmed during a weekend in February in the woods behind Pingry's Basking Ridge campus and at a local park. The film takes its title from the scientific theory of disorder or randomness in a system, a gradual decline from order to disorder. In the film, a relationship between two characters ends up falling apart, possibly because of domestic abuse or other societal problems — the reasons are not clear.

"We tried to make the story and the characters' actions very ambiguous. There are a lot of different ways that it can be interpreted," Present said. "The whole film is told through flashbacks, and it's not in sequential order. It jumps around in time, and there's no dialogue, just music." San Miguel added, "One of the characters ends up dying, and it's unclear how exactly that happened. You see where things end, and you see a bit of the process, but you don't see the whole thing."

The two have collaborated on smaller filmmaking projects for the past two years,

and this year they are taking a portfolio development honors class taught by Miles Boyd, chairman of Pingry's visual arts department.

"Mr. Boyd is chock-full of ideas and possibilities, he has a wonderful aesthetic for all sorts of art, and he emphasizes the 'why' of a film, the significance," San Miguel said. "He talks about the difference between making a film to try unconventional techniques, and making a film as social commentary. We wanted to do both."

"Entropy" will be screened at the Montclair Film Festival's ceremony on Saturday, May 7, at 11 a.m. at the Wellmont Theater. This summer, Present will attend a film and video program at Northwestern.

Church raises funds for women's shelter in Iraq

Seeking a way to help victims of Islamic State persecution, The Unitarian Church in Summit has raised \$18,000 to support a shelter and rape crisis center in Iraq for Yazidi women who escaped after being abducted by members of the Islamic State militant group.

The Yazidis, a Kurdish-speaking ethnoreligious group in northern Iraq, have been targeted by ISIS in its campaign to "purify" Iraq of non-Islamic influences.

To raise the funds, the Summit congregation contributed the proceeds of plate collections on successive Sundays in January. Yifat Suskind, executive director of MADRE, an international organization that supports grassroots women's organizations in war, disaster and their aftermath, came to Summit to describe the Yazidis' plight and MADRE's partnership with the Organization of Women's Freedom in Iraq, which runs the shelter.

The shelter in Dohuk, Kurdistan is the only one of its kind in the Ninevah region. Most of the 30 residents are under the age of 20 and have survived abductions and enslavement. At the center, they receive clothing, food and shelter, medical care, trauma counseling and basic literacy training. The center also provides job training, including sewing and embroidery classes, so the women can find work in their own communities.

Berkeley Heights students place third in competition

Five Berkeley Heights students have figured out the formula for excelling in a national championship; the group placed third in a national math competition, rising above thousands of other students for a prize of \$10,000 in college scholarships.

The prestigious Moody's Mega Math — or M3 — Challenge drew 5,000 11th- and 12th-graders who were asked to use mathematical modeling to determine the best solutions for issues facing the future of mobility, from car-sharing to driverless technologies. A total of \$150,000 was up for grabs, divided among the finalist teams and top performers nationally.

Eleventh-graders Michael Wu, Gianna Miggins and Niyant Narang and 12th-graders Anna Song and Alexander Ju from Governor Livingston High School placed third in delivering what was found to be an outstanding mathematical solution to how and where carsharing companies can flourish in a rapidly-shifting automotive landscape. The students presented their findings at Moody's corporate headquarters in New York City on Monday, along with five other finalist teams.

Organized by the Society for Industrial and Applied Mathematics in Philadelphia and sponsored by The Moody's Foundation, the competition attracted more than 1,100 teams of three to five students who put the problem-solving skills they learned in the classroom to the test — from recommending U.S. markets where automakers should put their car-sharing dollars, to determining the best business models and technologies to help car companies stay ahead of the curve in a highly com-

petitive market that aims to decrease traffic, pollution and oil dependence.

The M3 Challenge — designed to spotlight the relevancy and power of mathematics in solving real-world issues, as well as motivate students to consider further education and careers in math and science — gave participants 14 consecutive hours to study the issue in question, collect data and devise models before uploading their solutions online.

The first-place winners of the competition were a team from Saint John's School in Houston, Texas, who split a \$20,000 scholarship prize. Runners up were a team from Carmel High School in Carmel, Ind., who shared \$15,000 in scholarship funds. Finalist teams from Rhode Island, Maryland and North Carolina received team scholarship prizes of \$5,000 each.

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
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It feels great to eat cookies that are actually somewhat good for you! A friend gave me the famous jam-dot cookie recipe years ago and I converted it to a gluten free recipe made with almond flour

Gluten Free Almond Jam Cookies

Ingredients

1 cup rolled oats

1 cup pecans

1 1/4 cups almond flour or meal — can get at many supermarkets including Trader Joe's

1/4 tsp. baking powder

1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon

1/4 tsp. ground nutmeg

1/8 tsp. salt

1/2 cup avocado oil

1/2 cup maple syrup

1. tsp vanilla extract

1/2 tsp almond extract

Steps

Toast nuts and oats on a cookie sheet at 325 degrees about 5 to 6 minutes or until they start turning golden.

When they cool, pulse the oats in a food processor into a powder and then add the nuts. Pulse until it is a coarse meal.

In a big bowl, add the oats and pecan mixture and all other ingredients.

Form into 1-inch balls and lay on a parchment-paper covered cookie sheet. Cookies should be about 1 inch apart

Make a little indentation in the center of each cookie and place in 1/2 tsp. of jelly of your choice — I like raspber-

Bake at 350 until they start to get a little brown on the bottom, about 20 minutes or so.

Remove and cool and store in the freezer.

On Saturday, April 30 at Linden's Memorial Fields (Flanagan Field complex) the semifinal games took place, with top-seeded Johnson downing fifthseeded Westfield 12-1 and second-seeded Governor Livingston taking out sixth-seeded Cranford 10-2.

Johnson, which is the top seed for the second straight season, has not won the championship since 1981, which was its second.

In the 1996 title game at Linden 20 years ago, the Crusaders were one out away from beating five-time defending champion Union for the crown. However, the Farmers came back from a 3-1 deficit in the top of the seventh to win 4-3 and claim the crown for a record sixth straight season.

Cranford, after it upset Johnson in last year's semifinals, faced GL in the championship game. The Highlanders, also seeded second last year, came out on top by a 4-3 score.

GL has won the championship six times and Cranford five.

Westfield has won the title nine times and Johnson twice.

A look back at the 1996 UCT final

Johnson softball was 1 out away from winning the title

Editor's note: JR Parachini covered the 1996 softball Union County Tournament championship game at Linden's Memorial Field, which turned out to be the agony of defeat for the Johnson Regional Crusaders and the thrill of yet another championship victory for the Union Farmers.

The Johnson softball team last won the Union County Tournament 35 years ago.

It was for the second time and also the second time in three years after the Crusaders captured the fourth tourament in 1979.

Not a bad start.

Although it's been three-and-a-half decades since Johnson took home the trophy, it was 20 years ago when they came oh so close.

One out away. Two strikes away to be even more

That was before five-time defending champion Union staged a 1986-Mets-like rally to tie the game and then win it - all in the final inning - by the final

Johnson head coach Steve Petruzzelli was with his team to my right as I was standing behind the home plate fence., chronicling what was going on that Saturday night at Linden's Memorial Field.

Petruzzelli guided the Johnson Regional boys' basketball team to the 1981 UCT championship and in 1995 guided Johnson's softball team to the Group 2 state championship game after the Crusaders captured the North 2, Group 2 title.

Petruzzelli would lead Johnson to another N2, G2 title and a second straight appearance in the Group 2 state championship game later that 1996 season.

However, in between, it wasn't meant to be for Johnson to win its first county championship in 15 years.

Below is what I wrote in our company's Union Leader and Clark Leader 20 years ago about one of the most memorable Union County high school sporting events I ever covered in person.

Top of the seventh. Two outs and runners on second and third.

Union is trailing Johnson Regional 3-1 in last Saturday night's Union County Tournament championship game at Linden's Memorial Field.

Union has a 23-game UCT winning streak on the line. The Farmers have won the championship five years in a row and are seeking - what a sign on the dugout fence clearly displays - a Six-Peat.

Up steps leadoff batter Kathy Pellerito, Union's more-than-capable third bsaeman the past two seasons. Pellerito is o-for-3 against Johnson sophomore right hander Karen Kolmos, having been retired in the first and fourth innings before reaching on an error and scoring Union's first run in the top of the sixth after Johnson got out to a 3-0 lead.

Pellerito takes the first pitch for strike one. Union, down to its final out, is now down to its final two

Both sideline crowds are silent. Coaches from both teams are pacing back and forth, first-year Union head coach Chris Flinn concentrating as his team's third base coach, Johnson head coach Steve Petruzzelli kneeling down in front of his team's dugout chwing on a fingernail.

Kolmos gets set and delivers the second pitch to Pellerito. This time the diminutive standout athlete takes a level swing and belts a line drive past Johnson second baseman Lisa Muller.

In comes Tara Coon from third base. In comes pinch-runner Fran Pellerito, Kathy's younger sister, from second base. The game is tied at 3-3.

Union fans are ecstatic. Johnson was one out way from its first softball county championship since 1981, the same year Petruzzelli coached the Johnson boys' basketball team to its only county title.

So after Coon reached on an infield error and freshman first baseman Kelly Ford came through with her second hit of the game, Union managed to tie the game at 3-3 with Pellerito's clutch hit.

"I was nervous," Pellerito said after the game. "I knew that I had to do it for the team.'

Michele White followed Pellerito's heroics by reaching on an infield single. Pellerito then moved to third before Laura Labonia wacked a shot over the center fielder's head that bounced off the fence.

Pellerito came around to score what would be the winning run before White was thrown out at the plate for the last out.

With Union ahead 4-3 and Tara Tumminello on second base with two outs in the bottom of the seventh, Labonia wound up and fired a fastball past Kelly Ciccotelli for her eighth strikeout of the game and another county championship belonged to the Farmers.

It was their record sixth straight and ninth overall at the time. Union still has the most titles, now with 11.

Johnson carred a 3-o lead against Union into the top of the sixth.

Kolmos was in complete control and had allowed only two hits through the first five innings.

"She's a very good pitcher, but it looked like she was getting tired toward the end," Flinn said.

Kolmos, who shared pitching duties with Kelly Mulligan, slipped to 8-2 with the defeat and Johnson to 17-2. Kolmos allowed four runs - all unearned - on six hits, while striking out two and walking none.

Union improved to 22-3 with its 11th straight victory. Labonia improved her three-year varsity record to 70-7 with the win, allowing three hits, striking out eight and walking none. All three runs she allowed were also unearned.

Union also won its 24th straight UCT game, its last loss in county competition coming to Westfield by the score of 3-0 in the 1990 final. Labonia, who would go on to win 96 games before graduating in 1997, improved to 12-0 in UCT play.

Union's first run came as a result of three consecutive Johnson errors.

"We felt a lot better about our chances after getting that first run," Pellerito said.

The Governor Livingston baseball team was shut out at Westfield 6-0 when the teams played their first Union County Conference-Watchung Division game back on Apri 115.

The Blue Devils tied the game at 14-14 with two outs when Will Riggs drove in Matt Varakian with an RBI-triple. Varakian, down in his count at 1-2 and o-for-4 at the time, smacked an RBI-single the other way to right-center to drive in A.J. Murray to make the score 14-

Murray, after a stellar college career at Georgia Tech, is now playing Single A ball in the Minnesota Twins organization and to sto
