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Roselle school board asks for state probe of district office

ROSELLE - The local school board approved a measure at its Feb. 26 meeting to have its counsel contact the state to investigate its central office.

School board member Archange Antoine motioned for a vote to ask the state Office of Fiscal Accountability and Compliance to investigate the district's central office. The move comes weeks after former school board administrator Jason Jones was "relieved" of his responsibilities, the district's superintendent said in a Feb. 6 email.

The OFAC works on behalf of the state commissioner of education to review any school that receives federal or state funding. The office also conducts audits by the state Department of Education and performs criminal background checks on applicants to school jobs.

School board President Patricia Fabrizio said at two meetings in February that an outside auditing firm was conducting a forensic audit in the district after the former business administrator and his assistant were relieved of their duties. Fabrizio said at a Feb. 26 meeting that "misappropriations of funds" was being investigated.

It's still not clear why Fabrizio announced the a firm's hiring for the forensic audit at a Feb. 8 special meeting, when there was no item on the agenda to do so. A resolution to hire a firm to do a forensic audit wasn't put on the agenda until Feb. 26, but school board attorney Allan Roth said it was never approved.

Roth previously said Feb. 9 that Donohue, Gironda, Doria & Tomkins, of Bayonne, would conduct forensic audit, before any vote had taken place to hire them. When

asked if the firm was conducting work in the school district without board approval, Roth said "I cannot answer that question. I don't know.'

Roth told LocalSource that he would send a letter to the state commissioner of education March 1 to ask for an OFAC investigation of the district. However, state DOE spokesman Michael Yaple said March 2 that he was unaware of the request.

"If the district has made a request for the DOE's Office

of Fiscal Accountability and Compliance to review its financial situation, we haven't received it yet," Yaple said in an

Roth said the board is asking the OFAC to look into "business practices" from last year to January of this year. He said if OFAC were to investigate, it would probably be "far more than the scope of the forensic audit."

County judge convicted in St. Theresa School basketball dispute

KENILWORTH - A Union County Superior Court judge has been found guilty by a Middlesex counterpart of defiant trespass in the latest development of a highly publicized dispute between St. Theresa School and the parents of girl who sued to play on the boys basketball team.

Criminal charges against Judge Theresa Mullen were filed as part of a legal battle between her family and the school, which expelled Mullen's two daughters after she and her husband, Scott Phillips, sued the school. St. Theresa School had eliminated its girls basketball team due to lack of interest, so Mullen and Phillips sued in 2016 to force the school to allow their daughter, Sydney, play on the boys

The Feb. 27 ruling on the trespassing by Judge Alberto Rivas is too recent to know what, if any, sanctions Theresa Mullen, a judge in Union County Family Court, will

face, according to New Jersey Judiciary spokesperson MaryAnn Spoto. While Spoto initially said she would notify Local-Source when a determination occurred, she said in a subsequent call that the New Jersey Judiciary would no longer comment on the matter, but issue updates as necessary.

Mullen and Phillips prevailed last year when the court said their daughter must be allowed to play, but Sydney and her sister Kaitlyn were later expelled from the school. The school's handbook states that any student involved in litigation against the school will be asked to leave.

"If a parent implicates St. Theresa's in a legal matter, or names St. Theresa's as a defendant in a civil matter, the parent/guardian will be requested to remove their children immediately from the school," the handbooks states.

When the parents challenged their daughters' expulsion, a ruling in August 2017 upheld the expulsion. According to a previous report by LocalSource, Judge Donald A. Kessler said the court lacked the authority to interfere with a private school's decision.

Mullen's conviction stems from an incident in which she "flatly refused" to leave the school Feb. 2, 2017, after police and administration requested she do so, according to the opinion by Rivas.

During the bench trial, Mullen acknowledged that she had received a letter from the school superintendent regarding the school's policy on expulsion. When she went to the school Feb. 2, school officials read her another statement declaring that her children were expelled and demanded that she leave the premises.

"If you refuse to comply then you will be considered trespassing," the school's state-

However, Mullen indicated that she would not leave. In her defense, Mullen argued that the Rev. Vincent D'Agostino, a school official, explicitly gave her permission to remain in the school so she therefore was not guilty of trespassing.

To support this claim, Mullen also submitted into evidence a video that captured a conversation in the office with school officials and the police chief, the opinion states.

"The judge did not take into account sufficient weight of the video," Edward Kologi, Mullen's lawyer, told LocalSource in a March 2 phone interview.

He added that the video shows reasonable doubt as to whether Mullen was allowed to stay on the school property

Mullen's sentencing is scheduled for

Kologi told LocalSource that he will file an appeal following the sentencing.

"The video entirely exonerates her in our view," he said.

Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office spokeswoman Andrea Boulton told Local-Source that the case was heard in Middlesex to alleviate any potential conflict of interest.

Temporary Berkeley Heights library nears debut

BERKELEY HEIGHTS — The local public library, closed for nearly three months, is slated to reopen at the beginning of April in its new temporary home, the former "upper church" rectory of the Church of the Little Flower at 110 Roosevelt Ave.

A mid-December transaction between the library, township and church resulted in Berkeley Heights receiving 15 acres of land.

The library will operate inside the former rectory until the town completes its new Municipal Building at 29 Park Ave.

"The rectory was built in the 1960s, which was before American Disabilities Act was a phrase — so we are adding ADA-compliant bathrooms, two handicap parking spaces," library director Stephanie Bakos told LocalSource in a March 2 interview.

"We also cut two really big windows in the wall to create a circulation department," she added.

Other required renovations include wider door openings and a wheelchairaccessible entrance.

While residents are still encouraged to use libraries in neighboring Summit, Providence and Long Hill during the construction, Bakos said they can still call and request books from the Berkeley Heights library, and staff will try to work that out for them.

No fines will be charged while the library is closed.

Library officials are anticipating their new permanent library space inside a three-story building to be erected on Park Avenue that also will house the police headquarters, municipal administrative offices and a community room.

The project is projected to cost \$28 million.

When the new space becomes operational, the rectory and its surrounding land will later be transformed into a housing development.

LocalSource previously reported that the 15-acre parcel of land, also known as the Hamilton property, is to be turned into townhomes with units set aside for the town's Mount Laurel obligation.

No plans are final, Berkeley Heights Municipal Clerk Ana Minkoff told LocalSource.

With regard to the Municipal Building project, the council has received two proposals, but the council won't award a contract until later this month or April, Minkoff said.



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'Pay-to-play' issue returns to Cranford committee

CRANFORD — The issue of elected officials accepting campaign contributions from firms that perform services for the municipality returned to the spotlight at the township committee on Feb. 27, about a month after some were excoriated for the practice during discussions about a redevelopment study.

The practice is legal — though contentious — if campaign contributions of more than \$300 are reported to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission

Resident Jim Carvalho, who has publicly addressed Cranford officials in the past regarding the issue, targeted the committee's chosen bidding process, the "fair and open process," calling it a loophole in allowing pay-to-play.

"In fact, the process is neither fair nor open," Carvalho said during the public comment portion of the Feb. 27 township committee meeting. "There are four groups of people who love the so called 'fair and open process': contractors who want government work, who then become campaign contributors; candidates, who the contributions go to; and the governing body."

The fair and open process, under New Jersey law, requires the request on a bid for a contract be advertised, that it be a "process that provides for public solicitation" of proposals; that a contract be awarded on the basis of on a procedure that is in writing; and that the awarding of the contract be publicly disclosed.

Any contract of more than \$17,500 must be subjected to this process, according to state law.

Carvalho said the New Jersey State Comptroller has previously condemned the process.

"In practice, the system of fair and open has multiple weaknesses. As a result, it presents few, if any, real obstacles to a gov-



ernment entity seeking to award a contract to a politically favored vendor," a 2011 report by Mathew Boxer, who served as the state comptroller at the time, said.

However, Mayor Thomas Hannen disagreed with Carvalho at the meeting.

"That is your characterization," the mayor said. "I don't happen to agree with you. Or if you are saying the comptroller's office has objections to it, then they would have had the Legislature change it, if you are saying it is the red flag that it is."

"We post (the request for bids) to our website — we solicit (vendors') responses, and then make decisions based on who we think is the most qualified for the prices that are submitted," Hannen said. "Most of the time they are the least expensive, not always."

The issue came up in January when the Cranford's planning board and township committee received a redevelopment study from engineering firm Harbor Consultants that suggested large swaths of the downtown area — including many viable business — be declared "in need of redevelopment."

At the Jan. 10 planning board meeting during the public comment portion, Carvalho said Commissioner Ann Dooley's campaign had received \$1,000 from Harbor Consultants, and fellow Commissioner Mary O'Connor had similarly received \$800 from the firm.

O'Connor's campaign also received a \$500 contribution from Maser Consulting, according to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission.

Citing a Feb. 13 pledge by O'Connor before the committee to no longer accept campaign contributions from contractors who have worked for the township, Carvalho urged other members on the committee to make the same pledge during the public comment portion of the Feb. 27 committee meeting.



Schools increase security measures following Florida shooting

UNION COUNTY -- Several Union County schools have tightened security measures following the shooting in Parkland, Fla., that killed 17 high school students Feb. 14.

From a resolution in Springfield calling for an end to gun violence, to working closely with Summit security guards and the police department, local school districts have strengthened their safety pro-

In Westfield, the security consulting firm StoneGate Associates, to which the district has paid more than \$6 million, made a presentation to parents at the Feb. 27 school board meeting.

Pointing to the school shooting cases in Parkland, Fla., Columbine High School in Colorado in 1999 and Virginia Tech University in 2007. StoneGate consultant Errol Brudner implored teachers, administrators and parents to be vigilant to the warning signs of troubled individuals.

'All the red flags on this person in crisis -- which is really what he was -existed," Brudner said of the Nikolas Cruz, the Florida gunman. "He was hurting, posting pictures of violence, making threats on social media. He was suspended and expelled, and bullied."

"Forget it if he never became a school shooter. He was still somebody that needed help and nobody helped him," Brudner added.

In addition to some school districts acting to increase security beyond what is legally required by the New Jersey Department of Education, the National Association of School Resource Officers, which has trained security personnel for 28 years, has advocated for the prevention of violence via individuals such as its

The organization, based in Hoover, Ala., said with the expansion of SRO programs in schools, incidences of school-

associated deaths, violence and nonfatal crimes - such as theft - have decreased.

"This trend mirrors that of juvenile arrests in general, which fell nearly 50 percent between 1994 and 2009 -- 17 percent between 2000 and 2009 alone, the report reads.

NASRO Director of Operations Mac Hardy, told LocalSource in a recent phone interview that an SRO must be properly

Hardy, who has been both a teacher

and a police officer, told LocalSource that while he had experience in both roles, he did not know what to do when he first became an SRO.

"They need to be specially trained to work inside the school to deal with adolescents and children," he said. "They need to understand the teen brain."

This includes being knowledgeable on drug trends, social media and how to take care of special needs students, he said.

When it comes to security, Hardy high-

lighted several methods, both proactive and reactive, that schools can take to keep students safe.

One active measure, he said, is to identify all access points and to control that

This means knowing who is coming into the school and how we limit visitors from moving into the school," Hardy said.

Schools also struggle with perimeter security, he added. Keeping doors closed is a big part of this.

While cameras are also good tools, he said that unless someone monitors them constantly they become a reactive system, and camera footage is viewed after an incident has already occurred.

To address violence in schools, the NJDOE undertook additional safety initiatives in 2014, and requires schools to follow certain safety regulations.

"A recent law requires each school district to designate a school safety specialist to serve as coordinator of school security programs," NJDOE spokesperson Michael Yaple told LocalSource recently.

The law also requires the NJDOE to establish a School Safety Specialist Academy to train the school safety specialists," he said, adding that the DOE is currently in the process of creating this body

New Jersey schools are required to hold at least one fire drill and one school security drill every month. There are four primary kind of drills, Yaple noted. They include: active shooter, lockdown or shelter in place, non-fire evacuation and bomb threat.

"That is more than 50,000 drills a year in New Jersey's public schools every year," Yaple added.

The measures have recently come under scrutiny by some government officials, including President Donald Trump, who suggested the drills, or at least the term "active shooter," unnecessarily frightens students.



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Union high students plan to join March 14 walkout

UNION — School officials are taking a neutral position on high school students' planned walkout to protest mass shootings in the wake of last month's mass shooting at a high school in Parkland, Fla.

Students across the nation are planning to walk out of class around 10 a.m. on March 14, for 17 minutes of silence, a symbolic gesture for the 17 victims killed at the Florida school on Valentine's Day.

Sabrina Prevost, who is a senior class president at Union High School and is one of the organizers for the local walk out, said students will first walk to the football field on campus for 17 minutes of silence and then march to town hall.

She added that the focus of the demonstration would be "school safety." Media reports have also indicated that students will demonstrate to promote stricter federal gun-control laws.

"We are fighting for students to feel safe in their learning environment," she wrote in a March 5 email to LocalSource. "Parents should not have the worry of their children dying once they step foot in the building. We are walking for those who have died... for those who support, and even those who do not. Students, teachers and administrators should all feel safe at school period."

Prevost said she and four other students are organizing the walkout and that they've spoken to school officials about their plans to demonstrate.

"We are being nice and letting them know the plan," she wrote. "Once we walk out, the ability to deliver us consequences is in their hands and continuing the fight and making a difference is in ours."

Union school board President Vito Nufrio did not come out in support of the students, nor did he admonish them.

"No statement or comment has been made by the board as of yet," Nufrio said in a March 1 phone call with LocalSource.

School district spokeswoman Akua Boakye said she and other administrators had been in contact with some of the organizers of the planned demonstration and said March 14 will be "just like a regular day" and "classes will be held as usual."


"No, it's not a school-approved organized event," she said in a March 5 phone interview. "The kids were planning on doing this regardless, from what they told us."

When asked if students would be reprimanded for walking out of class in the middle of the school day, Boakye added, "I'm not sure at this moment. The high school has not given me any information."

Police Director Daniel Zieser said a high school resource officer has been in contact with the student organizers. He told LocalSource on Feb. 28 that school officials would not allow students to march to town hall.

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

Roselle Park mayor decries NJ Transit station repairs

ROSELLE PARK — Mayor Carl Hokanson has added his voice to a growing list of of Union County mayors frustrated with NJ Transit about the condition of their local train stations.

One of Hokanson's main concerns is the lack of an elevator at the Roselle Park station, making the platform inaccessible to disabled riders. Hokanson laid out his concerns in a Feb. 21 letter to the the newly installed NJ Transit Executive Director Kevin Corbett.

"We have been informed by media relations types at NJ Transit that because the condition of the station's platform is in worse shape than anticipated, the project has been relegated to square one," Hokanson wrote, referring to a project that had been set to include an elevator and rebuilt platform.

The NJ Transit Board of Directors on Oct. 26, 2016, approved a \$2.8 million contract with Anselmi & Decicco Inc., of Maplewood, to rehabilitate the platform, records show. Hokanson said the plan included painting the station and fixing concrete stairs, but did not include building an elevator.

The original plan was upgraded to include the construction of an elevator to

the platform about a month after a September state Legislative Oversight Committee hearing with Steven Santoro, the former NJ Transit director. But the original upgrades approved in 2016 have yet to be completed, Hokanson said, which has stalled the elevator project.

NJ Transit spokesman Jim Smith said plans for the elevator and platform rehabilitation at the station are still in "the early stages of design."

"NJ Transit is upgrading the original plan for platform repair at Roselle Park to include an elevator for improved customer access," Smith said in a March 1 statement. "We are working to put contracts in place to continue advancing this project, which is currently in the early stages of design. It is too early in the process to set a construction timetable."

State Sen. Thomas Kean Jr., asked Santoro about the station's accessibility last year at the Oversight Committee meeting. He said in a letter to the mayor last year that NJ Transit confirmed in October that it would install an elevator as part of the statition's rehabilitation project.

Kean is a Republican who represents the state's 21st Legislative District, which includes parts of Union County, including Roselle Park.

"The difficulties experienced by a dance

troupe with various disabilities that were traveling to the Roselle Park Arts Festival in September only underscored the urgency of the need (for an elevator), and our mutual desire to work together to ensure that Americans with Disabilities Act access was included as part of the expanded station project," Kean wrote in the letter

Kean was referring to a group of disabled performers who had to get off at the Union Train Station because it was ADA accessible, then travel from Union to Roselle Park, Hokanson said.

Hokanson said the borough does not have a contract with NJ Transit. The parking lot is owned by SP Plus Parking, a Chicago-based company, and the platform is owned by NJ Transit, he said.

The Roselle Park station sits on the Raritan Valley Line. Hokanson is part of an advocacy group that has called for more routes to Manhattan on Raritan Valley Line trains that don't require a transfer in Newark. Limited "one-seat" service in offpeak hours began four years ago on the line, and the coalition is now seeking peakhour service.

However, it has been told that peakhour service is unlikely until another tunnel under the Hudson River, part of the Gateway Project, is completed. Hokanson said the train station is pivotal to attracting and retaining new developments in the municipality.

"Additionally, let me emphasize that our local train station has been a major impetus to the recent development occurring in the borough," Hokanson wrote in his letter to Corbett. "New businesses and housing construction is directly related to our centrally located train station. Each day of delay impacts negatively on these improvements."

Officials in Linden and Elizabeth also have called on NJ Transit to complete improvements to their local stations in recent months, with little response from the transit agency.

In November, Elizabeth Mayor J. Christian Bollwage called on Gov. Phil Murphy to nominate people to NJ Transit's executive team who will help move along the projects.

Bollwage has previously raised concerns about a slow-moving reconstruction project at Elizabeth's midtown train station that was unveiled in 2015.

A NJ Transit spokesman told Local-Source in November that no timetable was set for fixes to the Linden Train Station. Linden City Council passed a bond resolution for \$950,000 in December to start repairs to its station.

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Union County bank robber pleads guilty

A Passaic man has admitted to robbing or attempting to rob six banks in three counties, including banks in Union, Kenilworth, Linden and Elizabeth in 2016, according to a Feb. 6 press release from the U.S. District Attorney's Office in Newark.

Quentin Morales, also known as Quinton Morales, 27, pleaded guilty before Judge Peter G. Sheridan in Trenton Federal Court on Feb. 6 to three counts of bank robbery. He also admitted to robbing two additional banks and attempting to rob another, the release said.

Prior to his arrest in August 2016, Morales was one of Newark FBI's most wanted bank robbers.

Court records indicate Morales' spree began with the robbery of a Wells Fargo in Kearny on June 24, 2016. He then attempted to rob the Capital One Bank in Elizabeth on June 27, 2017 and did rob the Wells

Fargo in Kenilworth three days later. He also robbed the Wells Fargo in Linden on July 6, 2016; a Wells Fargo in Clifton on July 13, 2016; and a Wells Fargo in Union on July 25, 2016.

At each bank, Morales presented a note demanding cash from bank tellers, the release said. For example, during the June 24, 2016, robbery, Morales handed the teller a note stating "You are being robbed. Give me all the large bills you have, no alarms, no noise."

On at least two occasions, Morales said he had a gun and urged bank tellers to hurry. He was apprehended on Aug. 2, 2016, by officers of the N.J. State Parole Board.

The charges to which Morales pleaded guilty each carry a maximum penalty of 20 years in prison and a \$250,000 fine. His sentencing is scheduled for May 14.

Westfieldbased accounting firm Suplee, Clooney & Description of the second se annual audit of the school district, which is separate from a forensic audit, at the Feb. 26 school board meeting. This regular audit showed, in part, that vendors had not received their 1099 tax forms; expenditures went hundreds of thousands of dollars over the board's threshold; and the treasurer's reports were not reconciled at the end of each

Meanwhile, the school board at its last meeting approved John D'Angelo as the interim business administrator and secretary, a combined role. Dorian Timmons, the former school board secretary, resigned in January.

D'Angelo warned the school board at that meeting of a potential state takeover of the district, especially if the board did not approve the bill list. All bill lists, which hadn't been approved since about December, were approved Feb. 26. Roth said.

'You're going to have a hundred lawsuits on your hands with all kinds of collection agencies, and our credit will go down too," D'Angelo said at the Feb. 26 meeting. "The county - the state government - is going to step in. I can tell you right now, you're triggering incentive and they don't like to get involved in local dis-

Yaple said that DOE staff members plan to meet with local school officials in the near

"The DOE's goal is to assist school districts and provide technical support whenever possible," Yaple said in an email. "In fact, staff from the DOE plan to meet with local school officials in the near future."

A special meeting was scheduled for March 7 at Abraham Clark High School to consider approving a professional services contract for a forensic audit, according to a March 4 press release from the school district.

Linden police seek suspect in shooting

A Linden resident was recovering after being shot during the late night hours of Wednesday, Feb. 28, and police said they were still searching for his assailant, according to a press release.

At around 11:30 p.m. on Feb. 28, police received reports of gunfire. Officers responded to the area of E. St. George Avenue and Bower Street, where they located the 20-year-old Linden resident. who was not identified by police. The victim was taken to Newark University Hospital with non-life-threatening injuries and was in stable condition. The shooter. described as a black male wearing all black. reportedly ran from the scene toward Roselle, police said.

"Violence like this has no place in our community," Linden police Chief David Hart said in the release. "We can only realize safer streets in our neighborhoods when we collectively accept the responsibility to come together to protect our loved ones and neighbors.

The incident remains under investigation.

YWCA celebrates a 40th anniversary in its 98th year

ELIZABETH — The YWCA Union County opened its doors in 1920, and is celebrating a 40th anniversary throughout the year to commemorate a mission it undertook four decades ago.

"We are very proud that we have been running domestic violence programs for 40 years," Chief Executive Officer Janice Lilien told LocalSource in a phone interview on Feb. 21. "As far as events go, we will be incorporating the anniversary theme into all of our events this year."

At its origin, the YWCA focused on lending help to young women during the Great Depression, and also worked to inform women of workers' rights laws and regulations.

"We were among the first organization to open a domestic violence shelter," Lilien said. "And since the late 1990s, we have only increased our services."

Since its inception, the organization has grown to take on other important social issues.

"The women's movement did not come around until the 1960s," Lilien said.

And in 1978, the battered women's movement stretched across the nation, targeting domestic violence. Up until that point, the issue was not openly discussed, but as people became more aware of it, it was considered unacceptable, she said. This year, one of the YWCA's premier events will be the daylong fifth annual Union County C.A.R.E.S. Domestic Violence Symposium at Kean University on April 12.

Lilien who has been with the nonprofit organization for nine years, recounted stories of women who depend on the various free services of the Yto escape trauma and to get their lives back on track.

In one case, a victim of domestic violence was repeatedly called at work by her abusive boyfriend. She left her job and nearly became homeless before turning to the YWCA for help.

The workforce development service was able to find another job that "turned her life around." Lilien said.

The Y also manages the Family Justice Center at the Union County Courthouse Cherry Street Annex, which opened in September and offers counseling, legal and social services to domestic violence victims.

"These programs are designed to allow women additional time to build self-sufficiency and independence," according to the organization's website.

Domestic violence impacts one in three women, Lilien told LocalSource.

"We always say to people, you know someone impacted by it, that person just doesn't talk about it," she said.

The violence often impacts both the victims and their children, she added.

According to the National Network to

End Domestic Violence, approximately 15.5 million children are exposed to domestic violence every year. Children exposed to violence are more likely to attempt suicide, abuse drugs and alcohol, run away from home, engage in teenage prostitution and commit sexual assault crimes.

Lilien said many people think of domestic violence only in terms of physical violence, but it can also involve financial and emotional abuse.

"Financial abuse is a big part of this," she said.

Lilien recalled one particular situation when a woman came to the YWCA because her partner controlled her money.

"She had all the documents proving that a spouse had hacked her bank accounts, but the evidence could not be translated to English, and the restraining order was denied," she said.

There is not one typical reason that people come to the YWCA for assistance, Lilien said, but the organization exists to give support to those who need it in a variety of ways.

Hillside man arrested for weapons

A Hillside man and two female associates have been arrested at a Newark residence for handgun possession, the Newark Public Safety Director's Office announced.

Kenneth Portis, 42, of Hillside, and Jocelyn Polanco, 37, and Arleathea C. Edwards, 47, both of Newark, were arrested on Feb. 8 at a home in the 200 block of Weequahic Avenue in Newark. Police went to the house to follow up on a report of a person with a gun selling drugs, the Newark officials said in a press release.

At approximately 1:50 a.m., police responded to the unoccupied house and allegedly observed three individuals inside the residence and detected an odor of marijuana. According to police reports, a Mac 11 subcompact machine pistol, 45 bullets, two hollow point bullets, 712 glassine envelopes of heroin, 317 small bags of cocaine and 25 bags of marijuana were recovered at the scene.

Portis, Polanco and Edwards were immediately arrested without incident. Each is being charged with unlawful possession of a weapon, possession of prohibited ammunition and criminal trespass.

Portis faces additional charges for possession of a weapon for an unlawful purpose, certain persons prohibited from weapon possession and three counts each of possession of a controlled dangerous substance and and distribution of a controlled dangerous substance.

Three indicted for June Union High School burglary

UNION - Three former high school students have been indicted by a grand jury in connection with a June 29 burglary of more than \$26,000 in cash from a secretary's desk.

Christian Pereira, Jason Laurent and Joshua Monica were indicted on a fourthdegree charge of criminal trespassing and third-degree charges for theft and burglary, a court official said. No court date had been set as of March 1.

A grand jury indictment usually involves a prosecutor presenting evidence to a group of people, who decide to dismiss the charges or refer it to a judge for trial.

Overall, nine people were originally arrested and charged in the June incident, authorities said. Kevin Rea, Marlon Roberts and Joshua Cipriano pleaded guilty to disorderly persons theft and entered into a pretrial intervention program, a court official said. Each agreed to pay approximately \$2,250 in restitution.

The criminal trespass charge for Nicholas Zuena, the son of former Union Board of Education Vice President Nancy Zuena, was administratively dismissed, a court official said.

Nicholas Zuena's charge was dismissed at the request of the Union County Prosecutor's Office, a court official said. A judge is not involved when charges are administratively dismissed.

Information regarding the charges against the ninth suspect, who is a minor, was not available.

Police Director Daniel Zieser told Local-Source in August that authorities identified suspects by using interior and exterior surveillance video.

The cash allegedly taken from the desk had been collected for the student activities account for events such as prom, officials said previously. School board policy states that any cash a school receives for the student activities account should be deposited into the bank "promptly".

Superintendent Gregory Tatum said last year that an auditor would present recommendations on Dec. 19, 2017, about the student activities account. Messages left for Tatum and school board secretary and business administrator Gregory Brennan late last month seeking the results of that audit were not returned.

School board President Vito Nufrio previously told LocalSource that "many clubs and fundraisers were specifically itemized and detailed so that we at least have better oversight of the club activities" on the agenda.

School board members last year discussed having parents deposit student activity funds online to reduce the amount of cash kept on hand inside the school building. The board also discussed depositing any cash received "promptly."

A school board faction that included Linda Richardson, Michelle Schulz and Sharon Sherry Higgins used the theft during their campaign leading up to November's elections. Steven Le, the campaign manager for the three, found via a public records request that an additional \$57,000 - including \$45,000 in cash was deposited into the school's bank account one day after the June 2017 theft had occurred.

Richardson and Higgins secured seats on the board, ousting incumbents Nancy Zuena and Ronnie McDowell.

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

"These kids, they're not troublemakers," Zieser said. "They just want to voice their opinion, which is great. And we support them."

Zieser said if students do decide to march to town hall, police would provide an escort to monitor traffic. He added that students would not be arrested if they chose to demonstrate.

"No, absolutely not, unless they start breaking windows," he said, later adding that "the school decides the discipline of students who cut class. It's not a police issue."

Once students reach town hall, they plan to give speeches. Prevost said organizers of the event invited local politicians to speak as well. A township spokeswoman said town officials

slated to meet with the superintendent March 5 to discuss the demonstration.

Students also are raising funds through T-shirt sales and a GofundMe campaign for a bus to take them to the March for Our Lives demonstration in Washington, D.C., on March

Volunteer group marks 10th year of donation program

UNION — Not even a nor'easter that slammed the area on March 2 could stop Kean-based volunteers from gathering over a thousand peanut butter and jelly sandwiches to disperse to those in need across the state.

Be the Change, a community service group that was created by a Kean nursing professor, has been distributing sandwiches to the homeless for a decade. The group teamed up with several organizations to mark the 10th anniversary of the program with a blowout donation drive on March 3.

"I felt like it was Christmas morning today when I got up," said Norma Bowe, the nursing professor and a founder of Be the Change. "This is incredible. With all the bad in the world right now, I think people are really eager to do something good and something outside of themselves."

The program, known as Operation PB&J, began after Be the Change hosted a donation drive in Paterson 10 years ago. Restaurants donated food, and the group administered the leftovers to those at Newark Penn Station afterward.

"That's when we discovered and realized how many people live in the train station," said Bowe while she was coordinating the drive in Kean's Hennings Hall. "That was 10 years ago and then we just started doing it every week."

Volunteers went to Newark, Manhattan, New Brunswick, Trenton, Camden, Burlington, Elizabeth, Plainfield, Montclair and Paterson to distribute over 1,200 sandwiches, fruit, water, toiletries and notes of encouragement.

Over 8,530 people in the state were experiencing homelessness on Jan. 24, 2017, according to New Jersey's Point-In-Time Count through Monarch Housing Associates.

"At Newark Penn, there are many in wheelchairs or with walkers and canes," Bowe said after the drive.

"These are some of the most vulnerable in shelters. At least two that I know are getting chemo treatments and then transported back to the train station."

Be the Change already has a strong network of volunteers, which consists of Kean students, alumni and about 1,350 members who collaborate in a Facebook group. About 100 volunteers showed up on campus to make sandwiches and divvy up into groups to deliver the food to 10 locations.

Union County Freeholder Chairman Sergio Granados, who is a Kean alum, was at the campus with 15 other county employees to package sandwiches. He also presented Be the Change with a resolution recognizing its work.

"Be the Change is something the County of Union will continue partnering with on new ventures, new projects," Granados said. "Life is all about giving back to your community and never forgetting where you come from...everybody comes together as a community and really just wants to give back"

The group is also getting a boost from the newly established county Office of Community Engagement and Diversity, which is coordinated by Nathalie Hernandez, a Kean Uni-

versity alum and member of Be the Change. The office operates under the Department of Economic Development and has created a directory to connect people interested in volunteering with local nonprofits and and other community groups.

"When we do go out, there's tons of times when the homeless do thank us because they haven't eaten in two or three days," Hernandez said of her experience volunteering with Be the Change. "They're just appreciative. It's a meal for them. We do hope to at least make their day in doing that."

Nu Sigma Phi, a fraternity that has a chapter at Kean, said they've helped out at Newark Penn Station in the past and decided to volunteer at the 10th anniversary event too.

"It's good to really help out and give back," said Todd Blackburn, a fraternity brother. "It's one of our philosophies to really help out and give back to the community. So I think this is a great event to really do it for the homeless people that don't have the opportunity to get the food that we can provide for ourselves."

Plainfield and Elizabeth schools, Verizon Wireless, Access Self Storage, Trinitas, the Elizabeth Coalition to House the Homeless and Signature Realty helped in the donation drive effort too.

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Girl Scouts 'do a good turn daily'

March 12 is National Girl Scout Day, the annual celebration of the first Girl Scout troop meeting on this

date in 1912, organized by Juliette Gordon Low. She had met Robert Baden-Powell, the inspiration for the Boy Scouts, the previous year and was inspired to create something similar for girls. At that first troop meeting a year later, in Savannah, Georgia, there were 18 girls present. Since that day, the Girl Scouts of the United States of America has grown to more than 3.7 million members.

From its inception, the Girl Scouts have been organized and run exclusively by women, for girls and women. First calling her group Girl Guides of America, Low unsuccessfully tried to merge with the larger Camp Fire Girls, then tried to merge her group with the Girl Scouts of America, which was founded by Clara Lisetor-Lane in Des Moines, Iowa. Lisetor-Lane claimed Low copycatted her organization and threatened to sue, but its lack of financial resources led to its eventual demise. In 1913, Girl Guides of America changed its name to Girl Scouts of America and moved to Washington, D.C. It became incorporated two years later, moving its headquarters to New York City. Renaming itself the Girl Scouts of the United States of America in 1947, the organization was given a congressional charter on March 16, 1950.

Girl Scouts prepares girls to empower themselves and promotes compassion, courage, confidence, character, leadership, entrepreneurship and active citizenship through activities such as camping, community service, learning first aid and earning badges by acquiring practical skills. Girl Scouts' achievements are recognized by various special awards, similar to Boy Scout merit badges, including the Girl Scout Gold, Silver and Bronze Awards. Girl Scout membership is organized according to grade, with activities designed for each level. And you thought they just sold cookies.

Actually, there's so much the Girl Scouts do that, each year, the organization celebrates Girl Scout Week, always with National Girl Scout Day included within that week. This year, that week runs from March 11 through March 17, with each day representing one aspect of Girl Scouting. The week is bookended on Sunday, March 11, with Girl Scout Sunday, and Saturday, March 17, with Girl Scout Sabbath. These two days give girls an opportunity to attend their place of worship and to be recognized as Girl Scouts. If a place of worship is the troop sponsor, girls may consider performing a service, such as greeting, ushering or performing a flag ceremony. These days can also be a time when girls explore

their faiths. In an attempt to be more accepting and inclusive, in 1993, the Girl Scouts of the USA voted to per-

mit individuals to substitute another word or phrase for "God" in their promise: "On my honor, I will try: To serve God and my country, To help people at all times, And to live by the Girl Scout Law," Prayer is neither banned nor required at meetings.

The Girl Scouts of the USA are 106 years old on Monday, March 12. On this day, Girl Scouts are urged to think about what being a Girl Scout means to them and write a letter re-dedicating themselves to the organization. They should learn about Girl Scout history and its founder; memorize Girl Scout Law and recite it to their family; spend time working on a Girl Scout badge or take a journey; and share the Girl Scout spirit by inviting a new friend to join your Girl Scout troop.

On Tuesday, March 13, Girl Scouts are asked to be gogetters and take action. They should ask how they can improve the neighborhood and create their own small service project; think about people who are homeless in their community and consider serving food or donating clothes and hygiene products to a local shelter.

Be an innovator and explore STEM on Wednesday, March 14. Science, technology, engineering and mathematics have become increasingly important to Girl Scouts, with many STEM-related projects and badges being incorporated in recent years to encourage more interest by Scouts in STEM fields.

Girl Scouts are asked to be a smart risk-taker and step outside their comfort zone on Thursday, March 15. This can include going outside to play games, go on a hike or have an outdoor adventure for at least 30 minutes; explore Girl Scout destinations, or visit your favorite outdoor spot with your family or friends.

On Friday, March 16, Girl Scouts are asked to be leaders and show people that they care. Help your family today by doing a chore that helps take care of your home; do something nice for your siblings today; commit two random acts of kindness; make a special gift for a friend; or write a note or letter to a friend to let her know that you appreciate her. As you can see, there is never a lack of things to do for Girl Scouts. They get involved with their community and try to improve it. They are an inspiration for everyone. Whether you're a Girl Scout, thinking of becoming one or are just inspired by what they do, this week do something good for someone, for your community, for yourself. Make a difference and live according to the Girl Scout slogan: "Do a good turn daily."

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A NJ Transit hearing

Joe Palermo knows about battles. He is a daily rider on NJ Transit Bus Route No. 95, which travels along U.S. Route 22 from Scotch Plains to Newark. The Springfield resident, along with a handful of riders, came to Scotch Plains on Feb. 23, to oppose the "proposed discontinuance" of the route by the agency.

Palermo spoke to a less-than-vitally-concerned duo of transit officials running the hearing. After his first foray, he went outside the Council Chambers, where the hearing was being held, to confer with a transit official and then came back in for another shot at the microphone.

Along with the other objectors, Palermo refuted assertions by NJ Transit about low ridership along the No. 95 route. Rider Rosa Bezares from Watchung, armed with photos and ridership statistics, said: "There are over 25 to 30 people on a daily basis, on the 6:55 a.m. alone, toward Newark."

In a bit of a sop to NJ Transit, she concluded: "We are actually New Jersey Transit's positive commuters and future, don't make us join all the other irate commuters you already have."

Bezares had a strong point. A recent report found that bus riders make up almost two-thirds of NJ Transit's ridership. With all the recent uproar over NJ Transit rail service, which has taken up a good deal of focus by Gov. Phil Murphy, the idea of cutting back on bus service can be infuriating to riders. Kara Corridan also from Springfield was previously quoted: "There is no dignity in being a NJ Transit rider, especially via bus."

In his second appearance, Palermo emphasized the crowded roadways including Route 22, whose traffic he suggested would worsen by cutting back on bus sarvice.

The proposed cutbacks has created a small ripple from elected officials, who are swimming against the tide. Last year, Union County Freeholder Sergio Granados called for enhanced service on NJ Transit's No. 58 bus servicing the Bayway area of Elizabeth.

"For many in these communities, including the working poor, buses are the sole mode of transportation." he said.

The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey has involved itself via Rick Cotton, the agency's executive director.

There is always a red flag in this corner when top officials use folksy nicknames like "Rick" and "Chuck."

Anyhow, he accurately predicted last week that "even with the additional bus capacity and added train capacity that Gateway would provide, there's a shortage of seats for commuters."

Cotton was referring to the proposed multibillion dollar Gateway Project, which includes adding an extra rail tunnel under the Hudson River.

As the public hearing for Bus No. 95, inconveniently scheduled for 6 p.m., ended, the handful of protesters filed out with little optimism.

It brought me back to a time far too many years ago when a New York University law school professor from Lower Alabama, with a southern drawl ready made for a 1930s movie, told me that while he would listen to me, he would still do whatever he pleased. No doubt, he would smile at the public hearing held by NJ Transit.

Another drive-through option to consider

I was reading the paper when I came across a story that piqued my interest. The article highlighted an Episcopal priest who was offering "drive-through" ashes in his congregation's parking lot on Ash Wednesday, for people who were too busy to attend church.

This went a bit too far for my taste. Have we come to the point where we can't take time out to go to Mass and receive ashes during a morning, afternoon or evening service on a holy day? I guess so. Sometimes, making things easier for us doesn't always make them better. The whole meaning of church, God and ashes is lost here as we go through the motions like robots without any thought for religion.

Although this act has been played out by Episcopal parishes and some Protestant, Methodist and Catholic churches, the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Newark

offers ashes only in church and during services on college campuses.

Heart disease continues to be the No. 1 cause of death in the United States, claiming the lives of over 366,800 people a year and killing more Americans than all cancers combined.

In 2005, I went through chemotherapy for treatment of non-Hodgkin lymphoma, which killed the cancer but weakened my heart, causing me to be in heart failure. I later found out I was pregnant with my son. Although he was born without any complications, I started to feel sick and appeared more swollen than I was during pregnancy. Knowing something was wrong, I visited my cardiologist who immediately sent me to the hospital. After three months and many complications, I received a left ventricular assist device, which keeps my heart pumping every day. This year marks my 10year anniversary with my device and I have spent this time living life to the fullest.

I will have the honor of sharing more of

my story at the American Heart Association Affair of the Heart Ball on June 2, at The Grove in Cedar Grove. This is our opportunity to come together as a state and help build healthier lives, free of heart disease and stroke.

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

Investigators seek help solving Rahway killing

The Union County Prosecutor's Office is asking for the public's help to solve the killing of a local entrepreneur who was shot in his own downtown Rahway sneaker store two years ago.

On Feb. 26 the Prosecutor's Office released video culled from surveillance footage recorded just after the shooting took place in an attempt to identify the two gunmen seen therein.

Police responded to the 1500 block of Irving Street in Rahway at approximately 9:15 p.m. on Feb. 26, 2016, to find 21-year-old Jamal Gaines suffering from a gunshot wound; he was pronounced dead shortly thereafter.

A joint investigation involving the Homicide Task Force, Rahway police and the Union County Sheriff's Office's Identification Unit revealed that two people, their faces partially covered, entered Gaines's sneaker store through a rear utility door, resulting in a physical struggle that culminated in the fatal shot being fired.

The two perpetrators then ran from the building the same way they had come in, after which they can be seen on surveillance footage sprinting down a rear alley, with one of the two exhibiting a pronounced limp. The perpetrator with the limp appeared to be wearing dark pants, light-colored sneakers and a dark hooded sweatshirt with a light-colored patch on the left arm. The other appeared to be wearing a lighter-colored hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans and brown or beige shoes. Both brandished handguns.

The investigation of Gaines' death remains active, with tips continuing to be submitted and checked to this day, the release said. Anyone with information about the shooting is urged to contact Homicide Task Force Sgt. Michael Manochio at 908-966-2287 or Sgt. Sofia Santos at 908-577-4256.

Rahway boys' basketball shows heart in defeat

Sees special season halted much earlier than expected

RAHWAY – Luke Valerano took it upon himself to make sure Colonia was not headed to overtime for a second straight state tournament contest.

So after Rahway senior Keyshawn Cummings tied the game for the fifth and final time – and for the first time since late in the second quarter – with a free throw with 15.1 seconds left, Valerano decided to take the game into his own hands.

Underneath the Rahway basket, Valerano took one pass from teammate Frank Lehman and then just dribbled full force to the basket. He was able to put up a shot in the lane that went in with three seconds to go.

"I wasn't thinking about anything," Valerano said. "I had full confidence that I could drive and put a shot up."

Rahway got the ball back in and junior Zion Pendleton's shot from between half court and the 3-point line fell short.

Colonia, which led by 12 going into the fourth quarter, saw its lead evaporate, but was still able to come back and stun the host Indians.

Eighth-seeded Colonia, which improved to 17-9, defeated topseeded Rahway 51-49 in a highly-dramatic, quite-thrilling North 2, Group 3 boys' basketball quarterfinal played last Wednesday night at Rahway's Earl H. Walter Gymnasium.

As a result, Colonia moved on to the semifinal round at fifth-seeded Irvington last Friday, where it lost. Irvington, the fifth seed, played at second-seeded Chatham in Tuesday night's final.

Chatham was attempting not to lose in the final for the fourth consecutive season.

For the third straight season, Rahway lost a heartbreaking game in this section, the past two years falling in the semifinals.

Still, Rahway produced a fine season, finishing 23-4, which included a perfect 12-0 league record for a third consecutive Union County Conference-Valley Division championship.

However, right now, that is no consolation for the Indians, who sought to reach the final this time and then win N2, G3 for the first time since 1996.

Both teams played their hearts out and left everything they had on the court.

Valerano, a junior in his second season at Colonia after playing at St. Joseph's, Metuchen his freshman year, led all scorers with a superb 21-point performance.

"We had to stay poised and focused," Valerano said. "It came down to playing Colonia basketball and putting it in our mind that defense is first."

"Luke is a tough kid, who listens and plays hard," Colonia head coach Brandon Hall said.

Cummings, who this season became the 11th player in Rahway history to reach and pass 1,000 career points, paced the Indians with an if-not-spectacular, but gutsy 17-point effort.

Although for most of the game his outside shots were not falling nor were his free throws, Cummings still was able to help Rahway erase its 12-point fourth quarter deficit and give the Indians their fifth and final lead at 48-47 when he made his second 3-pointer of the fourth quarter – this one from the right side – with 31.3 seconds left.

His first 3-pointer of the fourth – which was only his second basket of the second half and first from the outside – pulled Rahway to within the score of 46-45 with 52.4 seconds remaining. This hoop from the top of the key came from the longest distance.

Both of his 3-pointers in the final quarter sent the Rahway crowd into a frenzy. Cummings ended up scoring Rahway's last seven points, including the free throw – after missing the first one – that tied the game at 49-49.

A big reason why Rahway was able to chip away at Colonia's double-digit advantage in the fourth was the play of sophomore Nicolas Galette, who did not score in the first three quarters.

However, Galette came out strong in the fourth and scored the first seven points of the period and Rahway's first nine, which pulled the Indians to within 38-33 with just over four minutes to go.

The only points Colonia scored before making a free throw with 3:14 to go were two technical free throws Valerano made at the 4:58 mark after the officials penalized the Rahway bench.

Colonia's first basket of the fourth quarter was not produced until there were just over two minutes to go. It was an inside basket by junior wide-body Chris Sica, his only points of the game making the score 41-35 in favor of the Patriots.

Rahway cut its 12-point deficit to three and then Colonia went on a 5-0 run to take the lead back up to

Then Rahway came back again to go on a 13-4 run to take its final lead of 48-47 before final baskets by Lehman and Valerano - before and after the final Cummings free throw - clinched the win for Colonia.

Rahway has a high-powered offense and we had to play it like we did, we had to keep the score down," Hall said. "We felt that if this game was played in the 60s or 70s we would have no chance."

After gaining the opening tip, Colonia actually passed the ball around and held it until the 6:17 mark. That's when Valerano drained a 3-pointer from the left side to give his team a 3-0 lead to start.

Rahway would not take its first shot of the game until there was 5:33 left in the first quarter, a layup by Cummings that made it 3-2.

Rahway made its first three field goals and was ahead 7-3 at one point in the first quarter, but the Indians were held to less than 10 shots in the period.

We had to make Cummings work and try to frustrate him," Hall said. "He is a great player and Rahway is well-coached.

We limited them to one-shot possessions, which was big. We didn't expect to have the ball for two minutes on our first possession, but our offense is built on moving the ball around, which we did."

NOTES: Rahway's three-year record under head coach Jeff Lubreski - who guided Plainfield to consecutive North 2, Group 3 championships in 2011 and 2012 - is 65-12.

Rahway went 21-4 and won the UCC's Valley Division title at 9-1 in 2016 and then lost at topseeded Chatham 51-48 in a N2, G3 semifinal.

Rahway went 21-4 again and won the UCC's Valley Division crown for a second straight season, this time at 11-1, in 2017 and then lost at home to fifth-seeded and eventual champion Barringer 70-68 in another N2, G3 semifinal.

Rahway went 23-4 and won the UCC's Valley Division championship for a third consecutive year, this time perfect at 12-0, this season before falling at home to eighth-seeded Colonia 51-49 in a N2, G3 quarterfinal.

The Indians averaged almost exactly 22 wins a season the past three years.
