

Assembly Pro Tem Green remembered by colleagues By Rebecca Panico

UNION COUNTY - Jerry Green, the third-highest ranking member in the state Assembly who died April 18, was remembered by his colleagues in the state Legislature as a leader, friend and mentor. He was 79.

Green, a Democrat, served in the Assembly since 1992 and resigned in January as chairman of the Union County Democratic Committee. He left his position in the county Democratic Party to "focus his energy on recovering from an illness," a January press release from the UCDC said.

State Sen. Nicholas Scutari - who represents the parts of parts of Middlesex, Somerset and Union counties - recalled the former assemblyman as a champion of progressive policies. Green represented the 22nd Legislative District, which includes Clark, Fanwood, Linden and Plainfield, same as Scutari.

"He was so much more than just a colleague and mentor to succeeding generations of politicians - he was a true gentleman legislator who should be remembered for championing progressive policies aimed at helping those in need," Scutari said in an April 19 statement.

Funeral services were private, according to release from the Union County



Hillside teachers press for new contract, pay hike

HILLSIDE - Kelly Ronca, a second-grade teacher, doesn't want to leave the school district over contract negotiations, but she also doesn't want to work three other jobs to pay her mortgage and other bills.

"I don't want to leave Hillside," Ronca said at an April 19 meeting. "I love the families. I love my students. I feel like I've had so many - multiple children of yours - that I've become part of the Hillside family. So I certainly don't want to leave this district, but I also don't want to work four jobs because I'm so tired.'

Ronca, who lives on her own and has been working in the district for 14 years, was one of dozens of teachers who implored the nine-member school board to start negotiations with the Hillside Education Association for a contract. Teachers have been working without a contract since July.

At issue are the rising costs of healthcare premiums

and a lack of contract negotiations since last year with school officials. A three-year pay freeze that began around 2010 also had a domino-effect on teachers' salaries.

The HEA represents 375 teachers, security officers, custodians and secretaries in the district. The union is calling for salary increases and a reduction in employee contributions to health insurance.

The union staged rallies before and after school since about April 16, and rallied again in front of the local board of education before its April 19 meeting.

Teachers and parents were not deterred from remaining for the entire meeting that lasted until about 10:30 p.m. to speak during the public comments portion. The school board did not address the contract issue during the meeting though.

Superintendent Antoine Gayles told LocalSource school officials planned to "propose some dates" on either April 23 or 24 to begin negotiations.

"Please be advised that the HEA and board have agreed to not publicly discuss negotiations at this time,' Gayles said in an April 24 email to LocalSource. "I can say that we are working diligently to reach a settlement."

School board President Hawaiian Thompson-Epps referred all questions regarding contract negotiation to Gayles.

HEA President Angela Lawler said district officials told her they were waiting for more stability in the school board, which has five new members this year. Last year, two former school board members ran for township council, while the former school board president ran for mayor.

Teachers are calling for "relief" from "Chapter 78", a 2011 state law that required faculty to pay larger portions of health care premiums that would rise over a four-year period.

The median annual salary of a teacher in Hillside was See HILLSIDE, Page 4

Elizabeth man sentenced for bank robbery

An Elizabeth man has been sentenced to nine years and seven months for robbing four banks in January 2017, including a TD Bank in Bergen County, the Federal Prosecutor's Office in Newark announced.

Israel Cosme, 36, previously pleaded guilty before U.S. District Judge Esther Salas to four counts of bank robbery. Salas imposed the sentence of 115 months on April 12 in Newark Federal Court. Cosme was originally arrested in January 2017 in connection with two Maryland robberies.

According to prosecutors, Cosme admitted that on Jan. 15, 2017, he robbed a TD Bank in Little Ferry. During the robbery, Cosme demanded money and told a teller that he would shoot her if she didn't comply.

Cosme also admitted robbing a TD Bank in New York three days earlier; a TD Bank in Essex, Md., on Jan. 22, 2017; and a TD Bank in Baltimore on Jan. 23, 2017. During all three of these robberies, Cosme handed tellers a note demanding money and stating that he had a gun.

In addition to the prison term, Salas sentenced Cosme to three years of supervised release.

New York men convicted for drugs in Warinanco crash

A Union County jury has convicted two New York City-area men who two years ago were found to have significant amounts of drugs on them after crashing their SUV in Warinanco Park, the Union County Prosecutor's Office said.

Angel Ernesto Cesar, 27, of Yonkers, and Ariel Jazmin, 29, of the Washington Heights section of Manhattan both were convicted of first-degree possession of cocaine with the intent to distribute and two related third-degree drug offenses, the prosecutor's office said in an April 19 release. The guilty verdicts came after a multi-week trial before state Superior Court Judge Daniel R. Lindemann and several hours of jury deliberations spread over two days.

Cesar was additionally convicted of second-degree eluding police, while Jazmin also was convicted of fourth-degree resisting arrest.

A Union County Prosecutor's Office Narcotics Strike Force investigation assisted by the Linden Police Department led detectives to Alberta Avenue in Linden at approximately 11 p.m. on Jan. 20, 2016, according to Union County Assistant Prosecutor Jeremiah Lenihan, who prosecuted the case. It was there that Cesar and Jazmin were located in a Chevrolet Suburban SUV, and as the detectives attempted to initiate a traffic stop, Cesar sped away, steering around several police vehicles and continuing onto a sidewalk and back onto the street. Lenihan said.

The Suburban shortly thereafter entered nearby Warinanco Park in Roselle and collided with a tree.

Cesar was arrested at the scene, and Jazmin was apprehended following a brief foot chase. A significant quantity of cocaine was recovered at the scene, along with packaged materials made to appear to be additional narcotics.

Sentencing in the case has been scheduled for June 8 before Judge Lindemann, when Jazmin will be facing an extended term.

He was on federal parole for crimes including racketeering and conspiracy to commit murder when arrested. Cesar also has a previous indictable conviction for robbery in New York.

\$60,688 for 2015-2016, the latest year data was available from the state Department of Education.

One teacher's rally sign showed that in 2006, she grossed a \$40,000 annual salary and brought home about about \$29,000, or 73 percent, after health premium payments. After earning a master's degree she now has a gross annual salary of \$63,318, but only takes home \$37,000, or about 58 percent, due to rising premiums.

Meanwhile, the pay freeze teachers experienced was related to the 2010 tax levy cap law. The amount a municipality or school board could increase taxes was limited to 2 percent, with some exceptions.

No strike has been planned for the district yet, said Lawler, the HEA president.

"That's not something that we do lightly," Lawler said at the rally before the April 19 school board meeting.

Roselle teen charged in Linden fatal shooting

A Roselle teen-ager has been charged with murder in the fatal shooting outside a Linden convenience store on April 17, officials said.

Darwin Cadet, 18, of Roselle also was charged with two related weapons offenses for his alleged role in the death of 27-year-old Brian Pierre, also of Roselle, the Union County Prosecutor's office announced in a joint April 18 release with Linden police.

At approximately 10:30 p.m. on April 17, Linden and Roselle police units responded to the 1800 block of East St. Georges Avenue, also known as state Route 27, for a report of shots fired.

In the parking lot of the 7-Eleven convenience store, they found Pierre suffering from multiple gunshot wounds, and he died while being transported to a local hospital, the release said.

A Union County Homicide Task Force investigation, assisted by members of the Linden and Roselle police departments, the Union County Sheriff's Office Identification Unit and the Union County Police Department Ballistics Unit resulted in Cadet being identified as a suspect. He was arrested without incident and charged on April 18, lodged in Union County Jail pending a first appearance and detention hearing in Superior Court.

Democratic Party, but a public memorial was being planned. No details were available. Green served as a county freeholder for two non-consecutive terms. In the Assembly, he chaired the Housing and Community Development Committee and was a member of the Health and Senior Services Committee.

Legislators on both sides of the aisle, including Assembly Republican Leader Jon Bramnick, sent condolences to Green and his family.

Bramnick represents the 21st Legislative District, which includes parts of Morris, Somerset and Union counties.

"Jerry Green was a friend for 30 years," Bramnick said in an April 19 statement. "We understood that talking to each other and treating each other with respect was very important. I will miss Jerry and thank him for his service to our state. My thoughts and prayers are with his family."

LocalSource previously reported that Green had not attended any legislative or voting sessions since at least November, when he was re-elected to serve another term.

Other local lawmakers, including state

Sen. Joseph Cryan and Assemblyman Jamel Holley also remembered Green. Both represent parts of Elizabeth, Hillside, Union and Roselle in the 20th Legislative District.

"Jerry Green was a champion of civil rights and was on the frontlines in our state in the fight to provide an affordable and accessible education for all of our children and to provide affordable housing for everyone," Cryan said in a statement.

Holley, meanwhile, called the late assemblyman an inspiration in an April 19 statement. "Jerry was a hard-working man his entire life; he never retired," Holley said. "He never stopped trying to help others get ahead. I will never forget his service to New Jersey, as he was focused on creating better policy and inspiring conversation on the issues that truly matter in our state.

"I will miss my friend, my mentor and the reason why I am committed to serving others."

Prison art teacher showing students' work at Kean

UNION – Larry Mocks was serving a relatively short prison sentence in another state when he decided to depict the routine lifestyle of incarceration. He used pens, markers, coloring pencils calendar cutouts among other – albeit limited – materials.

His art is among many others created by American inmates on display at the Karl and Helen Burger Gallery on Kean University's campus through July 23.

Other artwork in the exhibit titled "Cellblock Visions" include sculptures crafted from hand soap, purses weaved from cigarette boxes and decorated envelopes.

After having viewed "Cellblock Visions" at Kutztown University in Pennsylvania, director of Kean's galleries, Neil Tetkowski, sought out curator Phyllis Kornfeld to bring the exhibit to Union.

Kornfeld has been an art teacher within the American prison system for over 30 years, and the Kean exhibit displays art created by prisoners over a 20-year period.

"Larry is telling his full story in a very successful way," Kornfeld said of Mock's artwork in a phone interview.

Mock's mixed-media piece, "Time's Up," shows three prisoners weighed down by massive clocks, all surrounded by calendars.

"Larry is thoroughly expressing the significance of being chained down by time," Kornfeld explained.

Kornfeld started teaching prisoners in 1989, and, now 80, still continues to this day. Currently teaching at a small prison in Massachusetts, Kornfeld said at her career peak she visited 16 county and maximum security prisons across the United States. With a degree in art from the University of the Arts in Philadelphia, Kornfeld decided to teach art to prisoners after seeing a position open up at an Oklahoma state penitentiary. "The opportunity came up, and I found it very intriguing," she said. "I was hired to hold classes at three prisons for women of all security levels, from minimum to death row, and two medium security prisons for men."

In explaining her teaching style, Kornfeld informed LocalSource that her classes underscore the basics in art, but they are mostly aimed at trying to get the prisoners to unleash their creativity.

"Prisoners have the same potential for good and evil just like the rest of us," she said. "And it is possible to illicit goodness just as it easy to illicit violence," Kornfeld said.

Inspired by her student's emotion depicted in artwork, Kornfeld said she never once in 35 years felt like she didn't want to go to work.

"I address the best part of every man and woman I speak to," and, she said, they reciprocate the respect.

Bringing up one particular success story, Kornfeld recalled speaking to a prisoner after having noticed him stealing materials. She explained prisoners operate in a world where they "depend on a barter system" so she expected her materials would get stolen.

"But after I called aside the particular man, and addressed the issue, he never took another item from me again," she said.

"I am convinced that art making is a natural human impulse, and everybody has the potential," Kornfeld concluded. "There is capacity to create beauty in anyone."

Cryan, Scutari sponsor bill to ban 'ghost guns'

UNION COUNTY — A new bill sponsored by two local state senators would ban the purchase of gun parts or a kit to assemble a firearm.

State Sens. Joseph Cyran and Nicholas Scutari sponsored the legislation which would ban "ghost guns," or "an unlawfully manufactured firearm for which the sale or distribution chain from a licensed retailer to the point of its first retail sale cannot be traced by law enforcement officials."

"This 'do it yourself method of assembling these 'ghost guns' allows the owner to avoid the laws and regulations that 'are meant to keep firearms out of the hands of those who pose a danger to themselves or others," said Cryan, a former Union County Sheriff, in a statement. "They are just as deadly and just as dangerous, especially in the hands of those who are prohibited from owning guns for good reasons."

Scutari noted that a gunman in California recently created a semiautomatic weapon at home with gun parts, killing and injuring several people.

The gunman, who was killed by police, was not supposed to have a gun because of a restraining order, Scutari said.

"Anyone can make a gun at home and with untraceable parts we don't know where the weapon came from or where it is going," Scutari said in a statement. "It makes it harder to investigate gun crimes and to prevent the illegal distribution and use of firearms."

A "ghost gun" is one without a serial number, which usually appears on a firearm's frame or receiver — essentially the working part of the gun, explained Evan Nappen, an attorney based in Eatontown who focuses on weapons charges.

The serial number on the frame or receiver is federally registered, while other parts are not required to be registered.

Nappen added that the bill is redundant since manufacturing a handgun, rifle or shotgun without a proper license is already outlawed in New Jersey. Building a



machine gun, sawed off shotgun or assault firearm is outright banned, too.

"The bill is evidence of a complete lack of education and understanding of guns," Nappen said in a phone interview.

"...If they did (understand), they wouldn't ban 'untraceable' parts because every firearm made has untraceable parts except for the receiver."

He also compared the proposed legislation to banning the purchase of car parts from vehicles with different VIN numbers.

He said there's nothing "nefarious" about buying parts to swap something such as an undesirable gun forearm for a licensed firearm owner.

"It's completely misguided and misinformed and absolutely put forth for political purposes," he said.

The bill has the support of Gov. Phil Murphy, who called the proposed bill "common sense gun legislation."

"As gun violence continues to plague our country, New Jersey will lead the way by setting a higher standard for gun safety," Murphy said in an April 16 statement. "I look forward to the full Senate voting on these bills as soon as possible to combat the public health crisis of gun violence."

The bill would make the purchase of gun parts to make an untraceable firearm a third-degree crime carrying a three-to-fiveyear sentence, a fine of up to \$15,000 or both.

The bill passed the state Senate Law and Public Safety Committee on April 12 and was referred to the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee. The legislation is part of a package of seven bills on "gun safety" measures.



Ballister prosecutor feted for aiding family

UNION COUNTY — The prosecutor that secured the conviction of a Union man for killing his Cranford girlfriend, has been honored by the Union County Prosecutor's Office as part of National Crime Victims' Rights Week.

The awareness week that started on April 11 honored victim rights and those who advocate for them.

Among those honored was Scott Peterson, who received the Gladiator Award following his conviction last fall of Matthew Ballister, who killed his girlfriend at his Union home, dismembered her body and disposed of the parts in several trash bags in an industrial area in Newark.

The Gladiator Award is given to an assistant prosecutor or detective who demonstrates "extraordinary commitment and zeal to ensure that the criminal justice system treat victims with compassion and dignity during the prosecution process," the state Office of the Attorney General's website writes.

Peterson has served in the Union County Prosecutor's Office's Special Victims Unit since October 2016, an April 11 UCPO press release states. Prior to working for the SVU, Peterson spent five years working on the county's Homicide Task Force.

Peterson's conviction of Ballister in the murder of April Wyckoff came after a six-week trial. Ballister admitted he killed Wyckoff, but insisted her death was accidental.

A UCPO press release notes that Peterson kept in constant contact with Wyckoff's family following the murder, and throughout the trial, forming "a tight-knit bond with them."


After the verdict, Ballister was sentenced to 70 years in state prison in December.

Other UCPO staff members that were honored include, Ted Merced, and Azucena "Susie" Arias.

"Scott, Ted, and Susie represent the absolute best of our Office – they view their work as a calling," acting Union County Prosecutor Michael A. Monahan said in the release. "It's fitting that they receive this deserved recognition during National Crime Victims' Rights Week."



Take back drugs and take back our cities

If you're familiar with specific days when various cities accept guns handed in by the public, no questions asked, a similar day will be on Saturday,

April 28, called Drug Take Back Day. Taking place in conjunction with the Drug Enforcement Administration's National Take Back Day, which is also on Saturday, April 28, local law enforcement agencies, specifically the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention Team, will work to raise awareness of the dangers of prescription and over-the-counter drug abuse. There will also be 17 permanent collection sites in local municipal police departments and two medical disposal locations throughout Union County.

If this feels invasive, the intention of this service is not to police your property; rather, it is to assist you in getting rid of some of the most dangerous substances in your home, specifically, unused prescriptions and over the-counter-medications in your bathroom closet. Too often, youth sneak pills out of curiosity, something that could lead to more severe drug abuse. Rather than risk interested parties breaking into your homes or rummaging through your garbage, searching for these drugs, you should take the proactive step of taking unwanted or unused medications to collection sites, where they can be destroyed in an environmentally friendly manner.

The medical disposal locations in Union County are:

· ShopSmart Pharmacy, 570 N. Broad St., Elizabeth; and


· Short Hills Pharmacy, 40 Chatham Road, Short Hills.

Residents can dispose of their unused prescription drug medications by placing them in the marked collection sites. Dropping off medication is anonymous and safe. Residents should remove any identifying information from the medical containers, such as their name, address, telephone number and doctor's name. Medications that are collected are brought to a licensed facility, where they are safely disposed.

We are living in the middle of a crisis. The opioid epidemic that began in the late 1990s and continued through the first two decades of the 2000s has grown so large that now, according to the DEA, nearly half of all opioid deaths in 2016 involved prescription opioids. Opioids, a diverse class of strong painkillers, including oxycodone, hydrocodone and fentanyl, have a high risk of addiction and overdose and, due to their sedative effects on the part of the brain that regulates breathing, has the potential to cause respiratory depression, and may cause respiratory failure and death. In 2015, there were more than 50,000 deaths from opioid overdose, more deaths than by either car accidents or guns. The danger is real.

Be proactive. Take inventory of your prescription and over-the-counter medication. Secure your medicine. Dispose of unused, unwanted and expired medicine at an American Medical Chest Challenge Disposal site. Do not share the medicine prescribed to you and talk to your children and physicians about the dangers of prescription drug abuse.

They are listening.

The coming avalanche

Get ready for the onslaught. The likely candidates in the 7th Congressional District, which covers most of the suburban parts of the county, are storing big dollars. As of last week, incumbent Republican Leonard Lance has \$850,000 in his campaign account. His likely opponent, Democrat Tom Malinowski, has \$740,000 in the bank.

A good bet is that most of that money will pay for the fliers in your mailbox and the ads on cable.

For Lance, one of the last of an almost extinct group of so called moderate Republicans, the biggest fear is the anti-Trump wave from last year may spill over to this year's election.

But there may be a bigger threat at his door. One of the municipal clerk's in the district observed the other day: "Has anyone looked at the changing demographics in the area.'

It brought to mind, the occurrence when last week a home sale down the street from me brought forth a startling event. A couple with a child were actually moving from Hoboken to Cranford. The question is will the new urban residents bring with them a propensity to vote Democratic.

Lance knows something about challenges. A few years ago he survived a tough race against then state Assemblywoman Linda Stender. But the rise in the anti-Trump feeling is still seen as the major challenge to his continuing service.

Lance, has shown spunk. When other congressman were skipping public meetings, Lance sailed against the tide and confronted the angry citizens. Two weeks ago at a congressional hearing, he was tough and to the point in grilling computer wizard Mark Zuckerberg. Lance is also widely considered to have one of the most efficient congressional home office operations in helping constituents.

That may all be for naught. In a surprise move, the Democratic Congressional campaign committee in Washington has named Malinowski to their red to blue program.

This means that in the effort to flip marginal Republican districts to the Democratic side, the powers that be will assist an "anti-Leonard Lance campaign"

In the kind of high praise reserved for potentially successful candidates, the chairman of the national Democratic Party, Ben Ray Logan, announced: "Tom's deep knowledge, unwavering principles and dedication to regular folks will make him an excellent congressman. No matter the challenge or obstacle, Tom gets the job done and it's why he's built such a strong campaign"

The GOP fighting to keep the seat in their column is expected to counter the anti-Trump effort with an anti-Nancy Pelosi effort. The theme is that if the Republicans lose control of the congress Nancy will be returning as speaker.

Beyond the demographic change, the thinking among the political insiders is that it's tough to knock out an incumbent. Difficult but not impossible. Two years ago, little known Democrat Josh Gottheimer won in a traditionally Republican district in Bergen County and western New Jersey.

Last week a Political Action Committee named 'Coalition for Progress" raised \$75,000 for independent assistance to Malinowski, a former assistant secretary of

Safe Haven provides unwanted infants with option: life

Recently there have been three disturbing incidents of young infants being abandoned by their mothers, two fatally. What makes this even more appalling is that there is a law designed where these infants could have been left in safe hands without any penalty to the parent.

The following information was obtained on the New Jersey Safe Haven website page. According to national statistics, from 1991 to 1998, child abandonment in public places increased 62 percent. Of the 105 children abandoned in public places in 1998, 33 were found dead.

To help deal with this problem, the district attorney in Mobile, Ala., conceived the idea of establishing a "Safe Haven" for unwanted infants. The pilot program proved to be successful, with five babies left at hospital emergency rooms.

On Sept. 1, 1999, Texas became the first state to pass legislation allowing a parent to give up an infant anonymously. Louisiana, Alabama and Minnesota established laws in early 2000. New Jersey was the fifth state to pass Safe Haven legislation, modeled after the Texas law. The movement continued to grow and, today, all states have a Safe Haven law.

On Aug. 7, 2000, the NJ Safe Haven Infant Protection Act became law. The law was sponsored by Assembly speaker Jack Collins and Assemblywoman Charlotte Vandervalk and Sens. Anthony Bucco, Gerald Cardinale, Diane Allen and John Girgenti.

The law allows a distressed parent who

is unable or unwilling to care for an infant to give up custody of a baby who is less than 30 days old, safely, legally and anonymously. All that is required is that the baby be brought to a hospital emergency room or police station in New Jersey. As long as the child shows no signs of intentional abuse, no names or other information are required from the person delivering the infant.

The NJ Safe Haven Infant Program is administered by a NJ state agency. The Legislature appropriates monies yearly to fully fund this program. No private money is donated to this program. As of 2016, 62 precious babies have been saved who would have otherwise been abandoned or killed.

If the child is not claimed within 21 days, then termination of parental rights will begin and the child will be placed in foster care temporarily, until permanent placement for adoption can be arranged.

The law was expanded on Aug. 10, 2015, to include the premises of the fire stations, ambulance, first aid and rescue squads that are staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week, as drop off locations.

Here are the answers to some frequently asked questions:

• What is the purpose of the Safe Haven Law? - To protect unwanted babies from being hurt or killed from unsafe abandonment.

• Do you have to call before bringing in the baby? – No, you can walk in anytime.

 Is there someone a parent or guardian can talk to in order to find out where to bring the baby? – Yes, the parent can call the Safe Haven Hotline at 877-839-2339 and get the address and/or directions for any of the eligible drop off locations near them.

• Does the person dropping off the baby have to answer any questions at the dropoff location? – No, nothing is required they will record any information that is shared such as health, race, date of birth, place of birth, medical history of the parents, etc. This could prove useful in caring for the child, but none of this information is required in order to drop off the child.

• What happens if a woman voluntarily provides her personal identifying information to hospital staff while delivering her baby? – Unfortunately, then her anonymity will no longer be protected under NJ Safe Haven and the state will have the mandate to search for the infant's father and/or relatives.

• What happens to the mother when she drops off her baby? – She will be offered medical treatment and social services. She can refuse if she wishes. Once she has safely turned over the baby, she is free to go. She can complete an anonymous questionnaire and drop it in any mailbox. This is not a requirement and is done only if the parent desires. • What happens to the baby once he or she is dropped off? – The child will be examined and given medical treatment, if needed. Then Child Protective Services will immediately take custody and place the child in a foster or pre-adoptive home. After 21 days, procedures to permanently get the child adopted will be taken by the state.

I have written columns on this subject several times in the past. I encourage readers to share this useful information with your family, friends, churches, social groups, etc. Maybe it will help prevent another precious unwanted baby from losing his or her precious life.

Hillside building employee arrested for DWI in township car

HILLSIDE — A building department employee faces charges including DWI and driving with a revoked license while using a township vehicle, according to a

police report.

Hillside police reported Richard Thacker was driving in a vehicle with the township seal on the door April 5 around 11 p.m. without any lights along Long Avenue. Police followed the blue 2000

Ford Explorer into the McDonald's parking lot on U.S. Route 22, a police report obtained by LocalSource through a public records request said.

Police smelled alcohol on Thacker's breath and his speech was slurred when they pulled up to tell him he was driving with no lights on, the report said.

Thacker, 48, told officers he was headed to ShopRite and was an employee at the township building department. He said he had permission to use the vehicle, the report stated.

Thacker stated he had a "couple drinks" earlier in the evening when officers asked if he had been drinking at all. A sergeant was called to the scene and an officer performed field sobriety tests on Thacker.

During the walk and turn test, Thacker "showed difficulty performing the test," the report said. Police reported Thacker also showed "signs of nystagmus" — or involuntary eye movement — when a horizontal gaze test was performed, and was then arrested. At police headquarters, an Alcotest — an alcohol breath exam — was conducted. The report obtained by Local-Source did not show what Thacker's blood alcohol concentration was.

It was not immediately clear how Thacker was driving a township vehicle with a revoked license. A woman who answered the phone at the building department said "he's not here," when LocalSource asked to speak with Thacker. A message left at the office for him was not immediately returned, either.

The case was transferred to Union municipal court, where he also faces failure to use lights when required. As of April 18, no attorney was listed for Thacker, a Union court official said.

It was not immediately clear what position Thacker held in the building department or if he was put on paid or unpaid administrative leave as a result of the charges. It was also unclear if Thacker had permission to drive a township vehicle at 11 p.m.

"The Township of Hillside is aware of the unfortunate events surrounding longtime employee Richard Thacker," township spokeswoman Natalie Pineiro said in an April 23 email. "The township has taken immediate disciplinary action against Mr. Thacker and any other personnel actions will be handled internally by the Township."

Thacker earned about \$35,000 annually as a township employee, state records show. He was scheduled for a pre-trial conference on May 3 in Union Municipal Court.

New Jersey to receive federal opioid funds

UNION COUNTY - New Jersey soon will be receiving nearly \$13 million to combat opioid addiction awarded as part of a \$485 million program from the federal Department of Health and Human Services

The money was distributed among 50 states, four U.S. territories and the associated states of Palau and Micronesia.

"This is more than just additional funding - these resources come attached to priorities designed to combat the crisis and drive down the terrible opioid abuse statistics," said Rep. Leonard Lance, who represents parts of Union County, in an April 19 press release. "This problem has hit every community."

The state Department of Health received the funding to continue existing programs, department spokeswoman Donna Leusner told LocalSource.

Programs that will absorb the funding are to "include drug treatments for the uninsured, and recovery coaches who work in emergency rooms in all 21 counties," Leusner said.

"We are expanding recovery coaches in the 10 counties with the highest number of opioid deaths," she added.

An additional \$1 billion in federal funding to fight opioid addiction is expected to be awarded in September.

The newly distributed funds from the

HHS notes that every state will use the money in a variety of ways.

"These funds will help support evidence-based efforts at the state level to prevent misuse of opioids in the first place, expand access to effective treatment options for people in need, and support recovery for those who have prevailed," Health and Human Services Secretary Alex Azar said in the April 18 press release.

Texas recieved the largest portion in funding, \$27 million, while U.S. territories, including the Virgin Islands, Northern Mariana and American Samoa received the smallest, \$250,000.

Aside from federal funds, the growing number of cases in the state has led to the creation of a new office within the Office of the Attorney General.

The Office of the New Jersev Coordinator of Addiction Response and Enforcement Strategies, or NJ CARES, was announced in February and will be responsible for overseeing addiction-fighting efforts.

NJ CARES also is to partner with other agencies and groups committed to identifying and implementing solutions to opioid and drug addiction, a Feb. 22. OAG press release said.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, opioids kill approximately 90 Americans a day.

In New Jersey, the death toll remains to climb.

Recent data released by the OAG shows 846 overdose deaths occurred from the beginning of the year through April 16.


In Union County, the death toll has increased by nearly 50 percent from 2015 to 2017, totaling 279 fatal overdoses.

"Those 279 fatal overdoses included at least one in every Union County municipality," Union County Prosecutor's Office spokesman Mark Spivey told LocalSource.

Spivey also noted that five towns have had more than 20 deaths, including Elizabeth, Plainfield, Linden, Rahway and Union.

Corresponding to the rising number of deaths is the use of the opioid reversal medication naloxone, sometimes better known by the brand name Narcan, which has a 95 percent survival rate.

As of April 23, naloxone had been deployed 67 times by local police departments in the county, the UCPO reports.





Last year, Johnson won at top-seeded and defending champion Governor Livingston 9-5 in the quarterfinals. GL was also ranked No. 1 in the state at the time, with a record of 15-0. After J.P. Stevens, which fell to 3-9, tied the game for the third and final time in the bottom of the fifth at 9-9 on an RBI-single by Steven Zederbaum (he led all players with four hits – three singles and a double), it was Turek who stepped up to the plate to lead off the top of the sixth.

The J.P. Stevens pitcher this time was Zederbaum. Turek crushed his first offering the other way, smoking a home run over the 330-foot left field fence to give Johnson the lead for good at 10-9.

"It was a fastball outside, a pitch I was ready for," Turek said.

In the bottom of the frame with a runner on first and one out, it appeared that Johnson relief pitcher Kyle Adorno had thrown a wild pitch as the ball sailed past Turek and went to the backstop.

However, courtesy of very small backstop space, the ball came right back to Turek, who then gunned down the runner attempting to move from first to second.

"This was a big win for us," Turek said. "After beating Woodbridge and Westfield we got some confidence. We feel like we can make some noise now."

Johnson's fourth pitcher – Adorno – was the winning pitcher. The freshman earned his first varsity victory after allowing just one run on four hits while pitching the final three innings complete.

J.P. Stevens scored in four of its first five at-bats, but Adorno kept the Hawks off the scoreboard in the sixth and seventh innings.

Gonzalez, a sophomore right hander, had his fastball working quite effectively. He struck out nine and was also around the plate the entire game, walking just one.

"I was locating my fastball, while my curve was off," said Gonzalez, whose pitching record improved to 3-0, with two wins as a starter (Bishop Ahr and Brearley) and one (Dayton) in relief.

Gonzalez retired the side in order in the first, third, fifth and sixth. He struck out the side in the fourth.

"I was feeling it right away," Gonzalez said.

The only batters to reach against Gonzalez were juniors Ivan Rosa twice and Vincent Rappa once. Rosa led off the second with a double to center, moved to third on a wild pitch, and was then driven in by Rappa, who followed with a sacrifice fly RBI to center.

Cranford kicker Ambrosio will be among best Part of Union County contingency that will play in Phil Simms North-South Game

PISCATAWAY - When Valentino Ambrosio went to attempt his first extra point, kicking the ball had nothing to do with the play.

"It was raining and when the ball was snapped it went right through the hands of the holder," said Valentino, referring to Roselle Park's season-opener four years ago on an inclement weather Saturday afternoon at Pingry.

"I actually picked the ball up and tried to run with it and got tackled," Ambrosio continued. "I never kicked it.

Ambrosio successfully kicked extra points after Roselle Park's next three touchdowns that Sept. 13, 2014 date in Somerset County, a 135-pound, 14-yearold freshman beginning to make his mark as one of New Jersey's top placekickers.

He had never put on a helmet, wore pads or even made an attempt to run with a football prior to becoming Roselle Park's kicker in 2014.

Ambrosio's No. 1 passion at the time was soccer, a sport he began to play at the age of 2.

Just over three years later Ambrosio has gone from novice kicker to one of the best in the Garden State

Ambrosio was on hand Sunday at Piscataway High School as a member of the North squad - its kicker - as Media Day was held for the Phil Simms New Jersey North-South All-Star Football Classic.

The 39th game will take place Monday, June 25 at 7 p.m. at Kean University's Alumni Stadium in Union.

The South leads the series 19-17-2. The North has never led. The South won last year's game at Kean 30-22. The first year was 1979, with no game being played in 2002 because of thunder and lightning.

With the South winning again last year, the North will now have to win the next three games to take a lead in the series for the first time.

This is the fifth year that Phil Simms is involved, with the Honorary Captains being former New York Giants and San Francisco 49ers center Bart Oates for the North and former Philadelphia Eagles and Baltimore Ravens player L.J. Smith for the South.

Oates was Simms' center when the Giants won the Super Bowl for the first time after the 1986 season. Oates won two Super Bowls with the Giants and one with the 49ers.

He played all three seasons in the United States Football League (USFL) in the summers of 1983, 1984 and 1985 with the Philadelphia/Baltimore Stars before joining the Giants for the 1985 season. Oates is from Albany, Ga. and played collegiately at Brigham Young.

Smith starred at Highland Park and graduated from the Group 1 Middlesex County school in 1998. He also played for the South in the 1998 North-South All-Star Game, won that year by the North 33-31.

Ambrosio (5-9, 160) played his first two years at · Park and his last two at Cranford after his fami-

· August of 2016, right before his junior

As Ambrosio was finishing 8th grade he was kicking field goals bare-footed at Roselle Park's Herm Shaw Field when it was suggested by friends that he might want to try out for the football team his freshman year - as its kicker, of course.

"My father didn't want me to play football, but I made my own decision," said Ambrosio, whose parents both Italian. Valentino was born in the United States.

"I talked to Terry (Roselle Park head coach Terry Hanratty) and we worked it out so I could be on the team and still play club soccer," Ambrosio said. "I remember the first time I put on the uniform and put a helmet on over my head, it was nerve-wracking."

Ambrosio is grateful for all the support Hanratty and his staff provided in order for him to play both football and soccer.

"The day of my first game against Pingry I was able to leave at halftime - Roselle Park led 27-0 at intermission and won 33-0 - to play club soccer." Ambrosio said. "I remember my first extra point kick was good, but it hit the right upright and went through.'

Ambrosio's first field goal was at arch rival Brearley on a Friday night his freshman season. It was a 25-yarder in the second quarter of an eventual 34-24 setback.

'It took me a couple of games to get used to football, but I loved the Friday night lights," Ambrosio said. "Coach Hanratty made the special teams part of practice early so I could then leave and play soccer.

"He was okay with that. I didn't miss any football games. He was great to me."

Ambrosio's club soccer squad is the New York Red Bulls Academy team out of Harrison. He is a midfielder.

"I began kicking a soccer ball at age 2 and joined the Roselle Park recreation team at. I think, age 6 or 7." Ambrosio said. "I was scoring six goals a game."

In the 2015 season-opener at home against Pingry his sophomore season, Valentino kicked a 46-yard field goal in a 38-0 Panther triumph.

"I had to work on my kickoffs, because my freshman year they were landing inside the 5, they were inconsistent," Ambrosio said. "My sophomore year I started to get some touchbacks.

"Obviously, as a kicker I want to make a field goal and put up three points on the scoreboard, but if I don't get the opportunity in a game then I'm also satisfied if I can get my kickoffs through the end zone."

Right before his third high school season Ambrosio was no longer a Roselle Park resident.

"My parents wanted to move to Cranford and I had no say, I had to deal with what was going on," Ambrosio said. "I contacted (Cranford head coach Erik) Rosenmeier, filled out all the paper work and was able to get in the six practices I needed before the season started.

'Coach Rosenmeier didn't know who I was, but like Coach Hanratty he adjusted the practice schedule for me.

"I was able to practice Wednesdays and Thursdays and then leave for soccer. He was fine with that.

"Both coaches I had – Terry and Erik – were great to play for and very accommodating."

"I was happy that he kicked for Erik, because I root for Erik's teams," Hanratty said. "I think Erik does things the right way."

Rosenmeier was fortunate enough to have two excellent placekickers before Ambrosio. Troy Kettler kicked on the 2011 North 2, Group 3 state championship team and Joe Norton on the 2015 one.

Then Ambrosio came along.

"The first time I saw him kick I knew," Rosenmeier said. "The sound was different, like a great drive hitting a golf ball."

His first game with Cranford – the season-opener his junior season of 2016 at Memorial field – he kicked a 21-yard field goal and made both extra points in a 41-17 loss at home to Somerville.

The next game he kicked all five extra points in a 35-0 home win over Voorhees. Then in Cranford's first road game – on the grass at Rahway's Veterans Field – he kicked a 45-yard field goal in the fourth quarter of an eventual 40-34 single overtime defeat. He also kicked a 26-yard field goal in the third quarter.

Ambrosio made 6 of 8 field goal attempts his junior year and 5 of 9 his senior season, including a 45-yarder in a 34-21 home win over eventual Central Jersey, Group 2 state champion Hillside.

"I had an awesome time at Cranford, I can't even explain it," Ambrosio said. "Cranford in general, school also, has been great. "In the two years he was with me I can make the argument that he was responsible for 2-3 a year," Rosenmeier said. "He never missed an extra point and the biggest thing was that he had over 80 kicks go through the end zone. If he didn't have a kickoff that went through it was unusual.

"To make a team have to go 80 yards to score makes the probability of that team scoring much lesser. That's what he did for us.

"A perfect example of that was last year's Rahway game. Rahway was 2-0, we were 0-2 and trailing 14-0 at the half. Plus, we had to kick to them to start the second half.

"Valentino kicked the ball through the end zone and then we got a turnover and scored. He kicked it through the end zone again, we held them and then we scored again."

Cranford scored three touchdowns in the third quarter of its 2017 home-opener that night against Rahway to take a 21-14 lead. Ambrosio closed the scoring in the fourth quarter by kicking a 39-yard field to help give Cranford an impressive 24-14 comeback victory.

"We don't win that game without him," Rosenmeier said. "I think he had only eight kickoffs in two years that didn't go through the end zone."

Rosenmeier said that Summit 2013 graduate Michael Badgley, who starred collegiately at Miami, and Ambrosio were the two best kickers he ever saw.
