Union schools still face layoffs with new budget

UNION - Local school board members may have found \$890,000 in their budget to reduce potential layoffs, although the district still faces a \$5.9 million budget shortfall.

About 149 staff members - including teachers, custodians and secretaries - were originally slated to be laid off with the budget presented April 24. However, school administrators said they've reduced that number by about 100 after devising a new budget, which passed April 26.

"I'm happy to announce today, that we're down to 49," Superintendent Gregory Tatum said regarding the number of projected layoffs. "So we're pushing that number down. We're working very hard to ensure that as many of our folks that we brought in here maintain a

The \$890,000 discovered by school board member Jeff Monge at the April 26 meeting could be the result of an overestimation from last year's budget. About \$560,000 was allocated for physicians and related services last year, but this year's budget had \$1.45 million slated for the same expense.

"It may be a mistake," Monge said at the meeting, noting that the expense constituted a 159-percent hike. "What have we spent this year to show that need? Because that's a tremendous increase.

Director of Special Services Kim Conti said physicians and related services account for nurses and out-of-district behaviorists, which have seen increases over the years. More nurses are needed to attend to students' physical needs, Conti said, even when children travel on buses.

The nearly \$133 million dollar budget was approved April 26 in a 5-2-1 vote with one member absent, although school board members were unsure how much money had actually been used for physician and related expenses in the 2017-18 fiscal year. Some members See UNION, Page 14

Springfield police chief adds town administrator to duties

SPRINGFIELD - Police Chief John Cook has added the duties of township administrator to his role - at least tem-

Cook, who will remain chief of police, was appointed as acting township administrator April 24, following the resignation of Ziad Shehady. Cook took on the new position April 27

Shedhady resigned this month to take a similar position in Red Bank.

The township administrator is responsible for the day-to-day operations and overall management of all municipal departments.

A resolution to appoint Cook passed 4-1, with Springfield Township Committee Commissioner Maria Vassallo casting the lone vote against the measure.

"I received this (resolution) at 6:02 p.m. this evening, this is not personal," Vassallo said. "But I do not understand how we can be so quick to do something like this. How can we pass this and not have a discussion on this? We are not making the right decision here."

Mayor Richard Huber noted that the appointment is only temporary until the committee can discuss filling the fulltime position at its May 7 meeting.

The timing and execution of the resolution was also questioned by resident Jerry Fernandez during the public comment portion of the meeting.

Fernandez asked Huber how he expected the committee to vote on a resolution added so late to the agenda. He also questioned how the chief will fill both roles, and how much time the chief will commit to the administrator posi-

"This is a position that pays quite a bit for a reason. This decision should have been discussed among the committee,' Fernandez said.

He also suggested that the committee should have tabled the resolution or have gone into closed session to discuss it.

"I needed someone to be the administrator," the mayor answered. "It is my recommendation on a temporary basis. We need someone to be in charge. I told everyone here at the next meeting we could put someone else in charge.

Cook did not respond to questions from LocalSource as to how he will tackle two township positions before press time this week.

Freeholder Carter to seek Green's seat in assembly

Union County Freeholder Linda Carter has announced she will seek the state Assembly seat of Jerry Green, who died April 18, after serving 26 years in the state Legislature.

To fill the vacancy, a convention comprised of Democratic Committee members from the 22nd Legislative District will take place Tuesday, May 15, in Scotch Plains.

The 22nd District includes Clark, Fanwood, Linden, Plainfield, Rahway, Scotch Plains and Winfield, as well as Dunellen and Middlesex in Middlesex County and Green Brook and North Plainfield in Somerset County.

Carter resides in Plainfield.

'Like everyone else, I was incredibly saddened by Jerry's passing," Carter said in an April 26 release from the Union County Democratic Party. "As my longtime friend and mentor, I saw Jerry fight for everyday people who felt their voices were never heard. If I'm fortunate enough to succeed him, I am eager to continue that fight in the General Assembly."

Carter was first elected to the Union

County Board of Chosen Freeholders in 2010, and won subsequent elections in 2013 and 2016.

Her announcement received endorsements from Union County Democratic chairman and state Sen. Nicholas Scutari, who represents the 22nd Legislative District, Middlesex County Democratic Committee Chairman Kevin McCabe and Somerset County Democratic Chairwoman Peg Schaffer, as well as Assemblyman Jim Kennedy, also of the 22nd District.

Green, who was first elected to the Assembly in 1992, had not attended any legislative sessions since winning re-election to his seat in November 2017. Through a release, he announced in January he would be resigning his post as chairman of the Union County Democratic Committee due to an undisclosed illness, setting off an internal party battle to replace him. Scutari ultimately defeated Fanwood Mayor Colleen Mahr for the post.

Green died two days after his 79th birth-

No cause of death was announced.

County introduces budget with 1.75 percent tax hike

UNION COUNTY — The county freeholders introduced a preliminary budget of about \$483.7 million on April 26, which would raise the county tax levy by 1.75 percent on an average house.

An early version of the 2018 executive budget totalled about \$489 million, but was reduced after an ad hoc efficiency committee reviewed the numbers.

"This was done without any loss of jobs, reduction of services or negative impact on our stellar bond rating," said Freeholder Bruce Bergen, who also chairs the board's Fiscal Committee. "This board is now in a position to adopt a budget with the lowest tax increase in at least 15 years."

The dollar amount of the average house assessed at \$163,500 will not be released until the budget is approved

by the state, county spokesman Sebastian D'Elia said.

Last year, the county received about \$512 million in revenue, but only spent about \$497.6 million, records show. There was a surplus of about \$22 million in last year's budget, which is expected to increase to about \$24 million this year.

Some of the largest spending increases in this year's budget were in the areas of health insurance for employees, public safety, recreation, education and retirement funds.

For example, the group health insurance plan for county employees is slated to increase by \$2.375 million in this year's budget. The county spokesman said the rise was due to "increased costs for health insurance, plus we'll be soliciting quote for a new contract year effective July 1."

Cuts and increases were made in the area of public safety, with one of the highest increases going to the Union County Prosecutor's Office. Between salaries and operating costs, the office would receive an additional \$475,000 in funding this year for a total of about \$24 million.

Payments to the employees' retirement system would see an increase of about \$1 million this year, totalling about \$15.5 million, while the police and firemen's retirement fund would see an increase of about \$340,000.

Decreases in spending were made in operational costs across the board and in salaries for the division of facilities management. Salaries would decrease by about \$730,000, while the operating budget would increase by about \$217,000.

Public hearings on the budget have been held in Kenilworth, Scotch Plains and Elizabeth. A final hearing will be held May 17, at 7 p.m. in Elizabeth before a vote is taken on the spending plan.

Absentee ballots available for June 5 primary election

Vote-By-Mail ballots for the June 5 primary election have been available in Union County's Westfield and Elizabeth offices since May 1, the Union County Clerk's Office announced.

The U.S. Senate and House of Representatives will top this year's primary ballots, while county freeholders and local municipal elections also will be decided.

A Vote-By-Mail ballot in Union County may be received via mail by calling the county clerk's election division at 908-527-4996 or requesting one through the Union County Clerk's Office's free mobile app.

Applications for Vote-By-Mail ballots are available for download at unioncountyvotes.com. The application must be received in the office by May 29, to be valid for the primary election. An application can be obtained in person at the County Clerk's Elizabeth or Westfield offices. Voters picking up their application form in person may do so until 3 p.m. on Monday, June 4.

In-person applicants can use the "onestop service" to fill out their application, submit it, receive their ballot and cast it in a secure box in one visit. This service is available at both the Elizabeth and Westfield offices. Under new state law, voters who use this service must present a current N.J. driver's license or a N.J.-issued identification card with their name, address and photo.

The Union County Main Clerk's Office is located at the Union County Courthouse in Elizabeth at 2 Broad Street, Room 113. Regular office hours in Elizabeth are Monday through Friday; 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. As a convenience for voters, this office will be open Saturday, June 2, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The Westfield Annex is located in the Colleen Fraser Building at 300 North Ave. East. Office hours are 8 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays; 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays; and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturdays. The Westfield office also will be open for its regular Saturday hours June 2, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Proposed Roselle budget would increase taxes \$15 per home

ROSELLE -- The borough council introduced on April 25 a preliminary \$32 million budget, which could result in a \$15 increase for a local home assessed at \$140,000.

The proposed tax levy would be a .12 percent increase over last year, said Chief Financial Officer Judith Curran. Overall, the budget rose by about \$3,800 this year.

The council also voted to establish a "cap bank" of \$326,000 that can be used over the next two years. A cap bank is an accounting measure that enables municipalities to avoid strict adherence to annual state-legislated budget appropriation limits.

"Thanks to this finance committee, we did a wonderful, wonderful job," Council President Reginald Atkins said at the meeting. "And I just want to say thank you for your diligence and your hard work."

Public safety expenses — which includes the police and fire departments — could see an increase this year. There are currently 53 police officers in the department, Councilman Samuel Bishop said. The borough is looking to increase that number to 56 soon and possibly 59 in the future.

Curran said the increase costs includes promotions within the police department. Four police officers were promoted in February, according to a press release from the borough.

The budget increased by about \$72,000 in salaries for the police department, while fire department wages rose by about \$74,000.

A \$30,000 interlocal municipal services agreement for a public relations position with the board of education was nixed in this year's budget, too. Councilwoman Denise Wilkerson asked if that money

could be used to give the mayor an assis-

The CFO explained that there was some leeway in the budget to hire someone, but the position would first have to be created by the borough council.

The borough has a weak mayor-strong council system of government, and the

mayor was not in attendance at the the April 25 meeting since she was at a conference.

Other council members, meanwhile, praised the CFO and borough attorney Karen Brown for their work on the budget. Bishop, the 5th Ward councilman, called the budget "something we could be proud

of"

"Karen, we've never had — since I've been sitting up here — the level of communication. You know, we really appreciate that, and also the depth of understanding. It's been very refreshing."

A public hearing for the budget is scheduled for May 30 at 7 p.m. in borough hall.

Kenilworth to implement 'no-knock' solicitor regulation

KENILWORTH — Local governing officials are to implement a "no-knock" registry to stop unwanted door-to-door solicitation after hearing complaints from residents in April.

The amended ordinance introduced at the April 25 meeting would have residents register their addresses with the borough clerk to stop salesmen, or anyone canvassing, from knocking on their doors.

"This ordinance establishes a registry, which contains a list of addresses of those premises where the owner or occupant has notified the borough clerk that the resident wishes to prohibit persons and entities from canvassing, soliciting, peddling," Councilman Lawrence Clementi read at council meeting

A public hearing of this ordinance will be held May 23.

"The 'no-knock' registry will be given to solicitors, and will advise them that the addresses on the list do not wish to be disturbed," Mayor Anthony DeLuca told LocalSource on April 27. "Fines will ensue if the solicitor does not pay heed to the registry." DeLuca noted that, through research, the council learned that many nearby towns have a "no-knock" registry and have been "very successful in keeping unwanted solicitors from homes that were registered."

The ordinance follows complaints from residents at an April council meeting. In addition to residents' concerns, a live petition circulated on the website MoveOn.org urging the council to adopt a no-solicitation rule.

While the borough can't ban solicitation altogether, DeLuca said, "we looked how other towns were handling unwanted solicitations."

"Along with our no soliciting and peddling ordinance that is already in place, as well as a diligent police force, we believe the 'no-knock' registry will complement an already viable solution to unwanted solicitations in our borough," DeLuca told LocalSource.

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Hillside man indicted in \$1 million fraud scheme

A Hillside man has been indicted on charges of wire fraud in connection with an advance-fee scheme that defrauded four victims of more than \$1 million, according to an April 16 release from the U.S. Prosecutor's Office in Newark.

James Adkins, 65, who was originally charged along with three others in December 2017, with one count of conspiracy and four counts of wire fraud, was indicted on the additional counts on April 16, prosecu-

Adkins was indicted along with Jerrid Douglas, 44, of Freehold; Roy Gillar, 45, of Las Vegas; and Harold Mignott, 55, of Voorhees. Douglas and Gillar also were charged with one count of transacting in criminal proceeds.

The April 16 superseding indictment added three counts of wire fraud against Adkins, two counts against Douglas and one against Mignott.

All four defendants were out on bail and were to be arraigned at a later date before U.S. District Court Judge John Michael Vazquez in Newark Federal Court.

According to the new indictment, from March through June 2016, Mignott, Adkins, Douglas and Gillar agreed to defraud "Victim Company A" out of approximately \$1 million.

As part of the scheme, the defendants allegedly convinced two individuals who ran the company to enter a joint-venture agreement with the defendants' New Jersey-based shell company. The defendants reportedly said their company could acquire and provide Victim Company A with a "standby letter of credit" backed by Mexican gold bonds.

A standby letter of credit is a guarantee of payment issued by a bank on behalf of a client that is used should the client fail to fulfill a contractual commitment.

Victim Company A wanted access to the standby letter of credit so it could purchase raw gold overseas and sell it to gold refineries. As part of the joint-venture agreement, Victim Company A agreed to pay the defendants \$1 million for the bank fee associated with the letter of credit.

In order to cover up the scheme and acquire Victim Company A's funds, the defendants allegedly made numerous "misrepresentations," according to the indictment, including a phony letter from a major international bank saying that it would provide a letter of credit to the defendants' shell company in the amount of 1 billion euros.

However, after Victim Company A transmitted \$800,000 to the defendants, the defendants did not provide the letter of credit or anything of value. Instead, the defendants reportedly used the money for items like luxury cars, expensive watches, mortgage payments on their personal residences and large cash withdrawals.

In addition, Adkins and Mignott allegedly defrauded a farmer from Iowa - identi-

fied as "Individual Victim 3" - of \$90,000 in 2013. As part of this scheme, Adkins and Mignott induced Victim 3 to enter into a joint-venture agreement with their shell company and told him that if he provided \$90,000, they would give him a letter of credit so he could obtain financing for his pork business, according to prosecutors.

To persuade Victim 3 to transfer the money, Adkins and Mignott allegedly said their company would complete lucrative oil and gas transactions that would yield significant revenue. However, after Victim 3 transmitted \$90,000, Adkins and Mignott did not give him anything.

Also Adkins and Douglas allegedly defrauded "Victim Company B" of approximately \$250,000 in 2015. Adkins and Douglas reportedly induced the founder and owner of Company B to enter a joint-venture agreement with their shell company, saying their company could acquire and provide Company B with a letter of credit, which would provide financing for Company B's biotech business operations.

Company B wanted to obtain the standby letter of credit to fund cancer research as part of its biotech business. As part of the agreement, Company B agreed to pay Adkins and Douglas \$1 million for the bank fee associated with the letter of credit.

However, after Company B transmitted \$250,000 of the \$1 million to Adkins and Douglas's shell company, Adkins and Douglas failed to produce letter of credit or anything else, instead taking the money for their personal use, according to reports.

The conspiracy and wire fraud charges each carry a maximum potential penalty of 20 years in prison and a \$250,000 fine. The money-laundering charges each carry a maximum penalty of 10 years in prison and a \$250,000 fine.

Elizabethtown Gas issues digging alert

Elizabethtown Gas is asking all homeowners and contractors beginning outdoor projects - as the weather turns warmer - to be aware of underground utility lines, including natural gas pipelines and to call 8-1-1 before beginning any digging activities.

A call to 8-1-1 connects to New Jersey One Call, which notifies the appropriate utility companies of the intent to dig. Professional locators are then sent to the requested digging site to mark the approximate locations of underground lines with flags or spray paint. Yellow paint indicates the presence of underground natural gas pipelines. Once lines have been accurately marked, residents should respect the marks and use the appropriate tools to dig carefully. Digging without knowing the approximate location of underground utilities can result in serious injuries, service disruptions and costly repairs when natural gas, electric, communications, water and sewer lines are damaged.



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

Reporting sexual assault is first step, officials say

CRANFORD — Back in February, a Union County College employee saw what he thought was a student carrying a weapon on campus. The employee notified campus security, who along with police, approached the student and confiscated three fake guns, one resembling a rifle and two resembling pistols

It was an example of the campaign: If you see something, say something.

This phrase was repeated by the college's administration during an April 25 panel discussion about sexual assault.

"Report it to campus authorities, professors or staff members," Mensah Peterson, dean of student affairs, said at the event. "From there, it is the employee's responsibility to tell administration. At the administrative level, the local police would then be called."

Brian O'Malley from the Union County Prosecutor's Office Special Victims Unit added: "If questions of complaint or a law violated arises, then the local police would refer the case to the UCPO, where we would conduct an investigation."

The crime of sexual assault has a different legal definition in each state. In New Jersey, it reads as "the penetration, no matter how slight, in which physical force or coercion is used or in which the victim is

physically or mentally incapacitated."

In the United States, one in five women experience attempted or actual sexual assault during their college years, according to statistics from the U.S. Department of Justice. The same statistics show that men are also victimized. It has been noted that more than 6 percent of men experience attempted or actual sexual assault in college.

In recent years, reports of sexual violence and assault on college and university campuses has led to increased education and prevention campaigns, such as the panel discussion that occurred at the UCC Cranford campus.

During the discussion, four panelists fielded questions ranging from how law enforcement investigates these criminal matters to the definition of consent.

Recalling a 2005 criminal case handled by Union County Assistant Prosecutor Caroline Lawlor, she noted it had originated from a report to the administration by a UCC professor about a student who had been sexually abused by her biological father.

Because the abuse happened since the

student's childhood, "She didn't know it was an issue until she read a class-assigned book at UCC that involved an incestual relationship," Lawlor said.

After hearing questions and comments from fellow students, the woman confided in her professor, who then reported the abuse.

"The father is now incarcerated," Lawlor stated.

This anecdote sparked one young woman in attendance to ask if state law enforces a time limit on reporting sexual violence to authorities.

Sharing a personal experience of a man following and pinning her against a wall, she said wanted to report the incident, but didn't know if it was too late to do so.

"You don't have to worry about the length of time to report it," O'Malley responded.

Under a state law that passed in 2014, the statute of limitations was expanded from 90 days to five years, giving the victim time to decide whether they want to report the crime, Lawlor said.

"We understand the delay in disclosures. We understand there is fear and embarrassment," O'Malley said. "We fully expect that, and as long as it fits within statutory limits, the report is accepted."


Other questions focused on the legality of consent.

While there is a long complex definition as to what constitutes consent, Lawlor said it boils down to "common sense."

"No means no. If someone is intoxicated, they can't consent," she said.

The panel was organized to commemorate Denim Day, an international campaign against sexual assault that was triggered by an Italian Supreme Court ruling in the 1990s. In that case, the justices overturned a rape conviction because the victim was wearing tight jeans, so they reasoned that she must have helped her rapist remove her jeans, thus giving her consent.

The next day, women in the Italian Parliament dressed in jeans to show solidarity with the victim.



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UCEDC receives \$250,000 grant from

The UCEDC was one of 12 organizations in the nation to be funded through Wells Fargo's Diverse Community Capital program in 2017.

UCEDC President Maureen Tinen said in a press release. "Access to capital remains a struggle for women and minorities and this grant will allow us to redouble our efforts to reach them with innovative financing solutions.

The UCEDC offers training services and financing options to start-up and established businesses, with a focus on job creation and community development.

The organization has recruited a seasoned community advocate to spearhead its grant-supported outreach and strategic partnership initiatives. Michael Miller, a community development officer, will work public and private entities to increase awareness of and access to the UCEDC loan programs.

Since its inception in 1977, the UCEDC has loaned over \$30 million to small businesses throughout New Jersey, helping to create and retain more than 6,000 jobs. In 2017, the UCEDC approved 61 small business loans totaling \$9.6 million.

Minority-owned businesses accounted for 54 percent of those loans, while women-owned operations represented 69 percent, according the release.

County launches recycling aid mobile app

Union County officials have launched Recycle Coach, a free mobile app designed to help make recycling and solid waste information more accessible to residents.

Recycle Coach provides accurate, up-todate information on Union County's recycling events as well as local recycling schedules in a handy, user-friendly mobile format, the county said in an April 25 release.

The app provides personalized collection schedules based on place of residence. Once a resident downloads Recycle Coach, their calendar will list Union County recycling events along with local curbside garbage and recycling schedules.

The app will advise if there are changes in local collection due to holidays or weath-

Recycle Coach users can also set up recycling reminders and improve their recycling rates through a "What Goes Where?" search tool.

The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection is the first state to purchase the Recycle Coach app and make it available to all New Jersey residents free of charge.

The Recycle Coach app is available on the Google Play and Apple Store, and can also be accessed through the county website at ucnj.org/recycle-coach.





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
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

Final phase of Union Center streetscape will begin in May

UNION – Work to improve the sidewalks and streets along a portion of Stuyvesant Avenue is slated to begin in May, completing the remainder of a streetscape project that began in 2016.

Phase II of the streetscape project will include new bump-outs, lighting, granite accents, tree pits and engraved corner designs. The stretch to be improved runs along Stuyvesant Avenue between Morris and Elmwood avenues.

Underground utility lines were inspected and improved upon as necessary last year along Stuyvesant Avenue, township spokeswoman Natalie Pineiro said in an April 19 email.

The first phase was completed last fall between Vauxhall Road and Morris Avenue, and included a raised mid-block pedestrian crossing and seating. Both parts of the project will have uniform features, Pineiro said.

The engineering company that did the first phase of the project, Maser Consulting and Arterial Design Studio, will also take on the second phase, and S. Batata Construction will be doing the construction, Pineiro said.

The overall cost of the project is \$2.2 million, LocalSource previously reported.

The streetscape project is included in the 2018 Road Program, which has three phases that include milling, paving, curbing and adding wheelchair ramps to dozens of roads in the township, Pineiro said.

The streetscape project "will take place in addition to all phases of the 2018 regular road program, but the streetscape is, in and of itself, a separate program focused on completing the transforma-

tion of Union Center," Pineiro said.

The overall road program includes 20 streets and an additional 64 roads uprooted by utility work will also be serv-

iced. Repairing the roads has been a priority for Mayor Suzette Cavadas.

"One of the most important duties carried out by the Department of Public Works is ensuring the safety and quality of our roads," Cavadas said in a statement.

The road program will be funded by the capital improvement spending from the town, with a county infrastructure grant and a Community Development Block Grant.

The county also is expected to work on Stuyvesant Avenue from Vauxhall Road to the border of Irvington. The state, meanwhile, is slated to work on Morris Avenue from the Springfield line to Caldwell Avenue, and also along Morris Avenue between Lehigh and North avenues. The following roads will be repaved as part of the 2018 road program:

Phase I:

- Berkshire Drive
- Carlsen Drive
- Pilgrim Way
- · Union Avenue

Temporary overnight lane closures begin on Routes 1&9

A resurfacing project on U.S. Routes 1&9 has begun that will require overnight lane closures between Woodbridge and Linden, state transportation officials have

Black Rock Enterprises, a contractor for the New Jersey Department of Transportation, is scheduled to close one lane on Routes 189 in each direction, from around Production Way in Woodbridge until just north of Dennis Place in Linden, for milling and paving. At least one lane will be maintained throughout construction. The work is being coordinated with local police and will be done overnight to minimize disruptions to traffic and businesses through this corridor, the NJDOT said in an April 27 release.

Other counties throughout New Jersey have similar such groups. The 200 Club of Union County has more than 393 members and awards memorial scholarships, scholarships of academic excellence and grants for continuing education.

The keynote speaker is Patricia Ann Norris-McDonald, mayor of the village of Malverne, NY, and the wife of Steven McDonald, an NYPD officer who was left a quadriplegic in 1986, following a shooting in the line of duty. She co-authored the book, "The Steven McDonald Story," with her husband and appears often with him to speak about

faith and forgiveness.

It's easy to gloss over the accomplishments of police officers and firefighters. After all, they are only doing their jobs.  Cranford Police Department Detective Thomas Stiansen and Officer Gregory Federici, who assisted the Cranford Police Department in evacuating multiple bedridden patients during a fire at a rehabilitation and nursing home facility;

Quirks and colors of the home gardens in Asheville

Last week I described the wonders of the Biltmore Estate gardens in Asheville, N.C. Both formal and naturalized areas are glorious, with beautifully cultivated and maintained landscapes full of specimen trees, shrubs, perennials and annuals. I am quite sure that the moment a petal drops in one of the formal areas; the petal is scooped up and composted. If two petals drop, the annual in question is replaced with a fresh one. Biltmore is, after all, a world-renowned tourist destination. Those tourists pay for and expect to see a certain standard of perfection. As far as I can tell, they will never be disappointed.

But there is much more to Asheville horticulture than Biltmore. The city of about 89,000 is home to a number of historic neighborhoods, each with its own distinctive character. The trait that links them all is gardens. From the smallest bungalow to the most ornate Queen Anne Victorian, a large number of Asheville homes boast colorful gardens.

Asheville is located in a valley surrounded by the Blue Ridge Mountains. The "valley" is far from flat, however, and the city is built on a series of rolling hills. Residential lots are often on uneven ground and many have front retaining walls of either stone or

concrete. Residents evidently use the retaining walls as blank canvases. I have never seen so much creeping phlox — Phlox subulata — cascading over concrete in shades of pink, white, blue-purple and purple. After the phlox flowers fade, the evergreen foliage will remain, softening the walls' edges in all four seasons. Alongside the phlox, I also saw quantities of white Aubrieta or arabis, another popular "cascade" plant. In my experience the lovely, spring-blooming Geranium x cantabrigiense Biokovo will cascade in a polite manner and look good while doing it.

Many Asheville residents with dry-laid stone walls plant small specimens in the crevices. These also flow down the walls. This pocket-planting technique was used extensively by mid-20th century English gardening maven Margery Fish, author of the classic "We Made a Garden."

Mrs. Fish frequently tucked small, hardy geraniums in her crevices. In Asheville, wall gardeners insert additional phlox and forget-me-nots into the spaces between the stones. In my walls at home, I

have found that violets work well too.

Suburban practitioners of Conventional Good Taste rarely trouble themselves with front gardens. They will cover their naked foundations with shrubs — preferably evergreens — to avoid offending the neighbors, and perhaps surround those shrubs with a narrow ribbon of annuals, changed out seasonally. Most CGT front lawns are uninterrupted by flower beds that might distract from the rolling waves of lawn grass.

In Asheville, the situation is different. Smaller front gardens, especially those in front of the many distinctive bungalows, may have little or no grass and a profusion of flowers, flowering shrubs and other ornamental plants. When I was there, Fothergilla, a shrub in the witch hazel family that bears white, bottlebrush-like flowers, was in bloom everywhere. We also saw a few of the hardier camellias. Late daffodils still bloomed and tulips were making an appearance. Virginia bluebells or Mertensia seemed quite happy in the North Carolina soil, as did Spanish bluebells -Hyacinthoides hispanica. Vertical spaces in large and small gardens were sometimes covered by wisteria, which was beginning its bloom cycle in mid-April. The aptly nicknamed Carolina jessamine, or Gelsemium sempervirons, a native plant with fragrant, yellow flowers, was blooming with wild abandon on arches and trellises.

Why the abundant front gardens? In many places the backyards appear to be small or difficult to cultivate because of steep slopes. On some lots, the sunny space may be in the front rather than in back. It might also be that Ashevilleans just like surrounding themselves with color. Their house paint choices often tend toward bright shades that are outside the typical northeasterner's comfort zone, with lively accent colors on the trim or architectural features. The bed and breakfast where we stayed was a good example, painted vivid mustard yellow with red-orange trim. Needless to say it was ornamented with an inspiring, colorful garden.

Ashevilleans know that having a front garden is a little like wearing your heart on your sleeve. It takes courage, but makes for a more colorful life.

Downsizing belongings for the move to senior housing

Becky knows that her parents should be planning to relocate to a senior living community. Their house takes a lot of physical and financial resources to maintain. She worries about the yard work, snow removal and the two flights of stairs. While her mom and dad agree that they should move, they are frightened by the idea of packing up 40 years of belongings and memories.

As exciting as choosing and moving to a new home can be for many, downsizing one's home at any age can be a daunting task. Doing so as an older adult can seem like an ending to a life instead of a new beginning. It is important to give the process of packing and reducing belongings plenty of time, to embrace and celebrate the emotions and memories that surface, and to provide support to ensure the process goes smoothly.

Whether you are downsizing your home and moving to a senior living community or you're helping your parents with their move, here are a few tips to keep in mind.

It is important to be well organized prior to packing. Keep a notebook with inventory lists, thoughts about who to give items to and to-do lists. Take photos of and get floor plans with measurements of your new home. Itemize and measure what furniture you will need. Make a floor plan of the new space with ideas of what will go where; double-use items are a plus. Research and note local charities, donation outlets and removal services, and what type of items are collected; charities can be specific about what they will take. Check with your municipality about curbside trash, bulk

item limits and permits for containers if required. Research moving companies and schedule the move date; keep in mind that prime moving season includes the months of May through September, so book your moving company as soon as possible.

The next step is to create a list of items you will need to pick up before the move. This list should include packing boxes, dish boxes and closet hanger boxes; packing materials, tape and markers; large heavyduty trash bags; and colored stickers, which can be used to identify who should receive which item.

Make a calendar. A calendar full of important dates will keep you on target for your moving date. Give yourself plenty of time, at least two to three months, to accomplish your goal and keep in mind an elder's energy levels and abilities. Make a calendar with reasonable benchmarks, such as completing one room per week with two to three work hours at a time; dates for loved ones to come over and choose items; and dates of pick up and drop off of items.

Also be sure to provide and receive physical and emotional support. Welcome involvement by children, friends or other loved ones to aid in the selection process. Focus on the opportunity to design and decorate a new space with special treasures. Consider hiring a professional organizer or downsizing consultant; professional

assistance with downsizing costs range from \$40 to \$200 per hour. Do not rent a storage locker; it will just delay the inevitable and add unneeded expense.

When you start downsizing your home, relocation experts advise utilizing the OHIO rule: Only handle it once. Meaning if you pick it up you must pack it or relegate it to its pile.

To ensure you follow this rule, pack one

room at a time. Keep items that you love and bring you joy each day. Give away items that you know others would enjoy or can be donated — use your color stickers! Toss items that are broken or can be recycled. Engage a couple of people familiar to and liked by your elder to help with packing.

Once you have packed up the items that you will be keeping, and your loved ones have Continued on Page 14

Union County does not monitor ozone pollution. Middlesex County received an A and Essex County, a B rating. Both counties are adjacent to Union County. New Jersey is also ranked as one of the worst ozone pollution areas. New Jersey has improved in soot pollution since the last report.

Residents of Union County should be concerned why adjacent counties have healthier air than Union County. Even Bergen and Hudson counties have a B rating. Possibly, the county freeholders should authorize a study about why the county air is not as healthy as other communities, with recommendations to improve air quality. The

health of all residents is at risk for breathing unhealthy air.


Donate your old coats

I dried fig, chopped up

Salt and pepper to taste

Step

In a medium-sized frying pan, heat up the oil over medium flame.

Add in the cooked millet and stir until coated with the oil.

Add in the prepared fava beans and combine with the millet.

Add in the rosemary and the figs, salt and pepper to taste and serve immediately.

Can top with a crunchy nut or seed, like roasted sunflower seeds.

Union schools facing layoffs

(Continued from Page 1) acknowledged that the \$560,000 allocated last year may have been an underestimation, hence the allocated increase for this year.

Sherry Higgins and Mary Lynn Williams voted against the budget, saying they wanted more information. Vito Nufrio abstained from the vote and Nancy Minneci was absent.

The \$890,000 could be used to further reduce the estimated 50 layoffs, but would not decrease the tax levy, said school board Business Administrator Gregory Brennan. This year's tax levy is 2.3 percent -- or about \$75 -- for the average house assessed at \$45,946, the superintendent told LocalSource after the meeting.

Assistant School Business Administrator Manuel Vieira said that if fewer nurses and behaviorists were needed, money set aside for that could later be used to cover other expenses. School board attorney Paul Griggs confirmed that changes to the budget can be made during the year.

The budget was passed with the "understanding" that Superintendent Tatum would present the board's concerns about the nursing expenses to the county superintendent.

Brennan said the \$5.9 million budget shortfall came from a fund balance decrease. There were also increases due to out-of-district students attending district schools, special education, salary raises and health care costs. "We had increases in special education costs," "Brennan said. "We went from 130 out-of-district students to 150 and that averages \$100,000 between special education tuition, aides, health services and transportation."

Teachers and parents filled the Union High School Library, where the school board meeting was held April 26. Rich D'Avanzo, vice president of the local teachers union, said at the meeting that he was concerned with "the overdevelopment of the township of Union," and how new residential units might impact the budget in future years.

"The township of Union ... and the Board of Education are pretty much on different paths," D'Avanzo said. "There's not too much conversation on these developments and how it impacts schools in particular."

Steven Le — who sits on the Union Planning Board and is an outspoken critic of some school board members — said the number of students enrolled in the district has decreased during the last decade.

"For all intended purposes, it's about the nature of the developments," Le said. "I'm on the planning board and I am proud of what I have done on the planning board and ensuring our town's center looks nice and that there's investment in our town center. And the fact of the matter is, some of these developments are mostly one-bedroom apartments."



Sandler & Schneider rock NJPAC twice in a row

Dynamic duo of comedy unite to film upcoming Netflix special in Newark

Multi-talented Hollywood funnyman Adam Sandler has been making audiences laugh out loud for nearly 30 years. His movies have grossed more than \$3 billion worldwide and include memorable box office blockbusters such as "Grown Ups," "Happy Gilmore," "Big Daddy" and "The Wedding Singer." On his current standup comedy tour, Sandler has wisely reteamed with his longtime friend Rob Schneider, a fellow Saturday Night Live alumnus and frequent film co-star. Schneider is no slouch in the hit movie department either, delivering raunchy yet entertaining hits such as "Deuce Bigalow: Male Gigolo" and "The Hot Chick" as well as writing, directing and starring in his own recent Netflix series called "Real Rob."

The double bill of Sandler and Schneider consisted of a two-night-only residence inside nearby New Jersey Performing Arts Center in downtown Newark, and their debut show on the evening of April 26 was a standing-room-only affair. Schneider got things rolling with a brisk yet funny 15-minute set, wringing big laughs out of topical stories ripped from today's headlines. Whether it was riffing on the lurid ongoing President Trump/Stormy Daniels debacle or shredding our nation's flawed immigration policies, he was not afraid to tackle "touchy" subjects that other comedians might consider too polarizing.

"I love immigrants," Schneider proudly declared. "Immigrants are what made this country great! He paused, adding wryly, "Well, not the new ones."

The diminutive comedian proceeded to recount his own embarrassing #metoo movement experience in graphic detail in which he fell victim to during his early casting call days as well as re-enacting how the late astrophysicist Stephen Hawking — in full voice box and wheelchair mode — callously dumps his first wife. In poor taste? A packed house of fans inside NJPAC who are now laughing uncontrollably would beg to differ.

Schneider then turned the evening over to Sandler, who entered amid a flurry of lights, sounds and smoke. The stage design resembled something more reminiscent of a rock 'n' roll concert than a comedy club, with Sandler flanked by his pianist/backing vocalist Danny to his right and a rack of guitars to his left. Dressed casually in sneakers, jeans and a generic baseball jacket, he appeared every bit the regular Joe he typically portrays in many of his most popular movies.


"New York, New York. It's a hell of a town!" he exclaimed. "Newark? Newark? It's a town. It's nice."

Sandler wasted no time in giving his fans what they have come to expect from him: that quirky mix of goofy, ill-tempered manchild musings peppered with silly songs. Lots of silly songs. Announcing that his beloved grandmother had just turned 101, the audience responded with a lengthy, "Awwww." In which he replied, "So I gave her 101 punches to the shoulder."

Since his initial days as a breakout star on SNL during the early 1990s, music has played a significant part in Sandler's comedy arsenal. Many of his most endearing characters, such as the cheesy Opera Man or his spot-on imitation of mumble-mouthed rocker Eddie Vedder, were elevated by his passion for song. When it comes to composing, his works will never be confused with the Great American Songbook but clever little ditties about getting diabetes or peeing in the shower or simply shaving his beard kept the audience chuckling.

Perhaps it was the unavoidable and intrusive army of giant cameras, production crew members and security staff

involved with filming him for an upcoming Netflix special, but Sandler's opening 30 minutes were undeniably a bit sluggish. Successful standup comedy is a delicate balance of rhythm, confidence and timing and a few overly vocal fans obnoxiously blurting out their favorite Sandler movie quotes clearly had him rattled. Fortune would soon smile on the comedy box-office champ in the form of a busty, over-zealous fan who rushed the stage for a big hug. He graciously obliged her unscripted request then watched in horror as she tumbled backwards into the first row of the shocked crowd. After making sure she was not injured, Sandler was a new man. The awkward encounter was exactly what he needed to break the ice and let the real games begin.

The guy who has made a fortune from behaving like an unruly little boy reminded the audience that he is now 51 years old, happily married for over 20 years and is the proud father of two young daughters. The common problems and daily grind of married life were summed up within the insightful lyrics of "Walking On Egg Shells;" the song's point being that marriage is difficult but humor can be distilled from our everyday existence. Contrasting the over-parenting style afflicting many of today's millennial families, Sandler recalled his own father's "hands off" approach to child rearing.

"My dad only came to visit me one time at school when I was in the eighth grade," he recounted. "He stuck his head in my classroom and yelled at me, 'Where's the rake? It's not on the nail in the garage!"

The second half of his nearly two-hour set was pure comedy gold, with the humorous anecdotes taking a backseat to his penchant for musical showmanship. New wave-styled songs like "My Uber Driver Smells Bad" and "UFC Ears" were random and ridiculous and near perfect. Brandishing a harmonica, strong Irish brogue and a high-powered flashlight, he focused the beam of light on several unsuspecting fans and basically insulted them with verse after verse of "The Funnyman." Those insulted were no doubt thrilled by the dubious distinction of now possibly being immortalized in his upcoming Netflix show.

Adam Sandler solo is a wonderful thing. But toss nutty Rob Schneider into the equation and their comedy chemistry ignites and becomes combustible. The loudest laughs arrived as Sandler stood centerstage, crooning forlornly about two male astronauts engaged in an illicit outer space love affair. Sounds dumb and childish, right? But dumb and childish is where these guys sparkle. Halfway through the aptly-titled "Space Station 69" the NJPAC audience looks upward to see something descending from high above the stage. It's Schneider as Uri the gay cosmonaut, garbed in a bright orange spacesuit suspended in midair by invisible cables. Singing of his undying love all the while somer-saulting midair in slow motion, Schneider eventually arrives upside down and red-faced at Sandler's feet. The two comedians are laughing so hard that they can barely finish their duet.

Beyond the juvenile locker room humor and fart jokes that imbue much of Sandler's best work is a proudly pounding, generous heart. A sense of wistful innocence and sentimentality has permeated many of his most successful projects. Backed by a large screen showcasing hilarious yet heartbreaking photos and videos of his dearly departed SNL castmate, Chris Farley, Sandler sang the praises of his fallen friend all the while handling both rhythm and lead guitar parts in an effortless Springsteen-esque fashion. Moved by the emotional rawness and sheer brilliance of his performance, the audience roared in approval. It's that other soft side of Sandler, an intangible depth, that many of his detractors don't seem to recognize or appreciate.

After a brief departure, Sandler returned to the stage for a quick encore, asking his delighted fans, "Are you ready for the dumbness?"

But the little boy from Brooklyn who has grown up to be a global comedy juggernaut already knows the answer. Sandler and Schneider may like to play dumb, but they both know full well that the class clowns are often the smartest kids in the room. And to paraphrase the oft-mimicked catch phrase from "The Wedding Singer":

"They can do it!"

Exotic tick spreads to Union County at Watchung Reservation

The longhorned tick, also known as the "cattle tick," which first appeared in the United States in November at a Hunterdon County farm, has spread to Union County's Watchung Reservation, state officials have

The N.J. Agriculture Department said in an April 25 release that the National Veterinary Services Laboratory on April 23 confirmed the presence of the tick, native to East Asia and Pacific regions such as Australia and New Zealand.

The tick is known to cause disease in cattle and also Russian spring-summer encephalitis, Powassan virus, Khasan virus, and tick-borne encephalitis virus in

Samples of the tick had been originally collected in May 2017 as part of ongoing

Various local, state and federal animal health officials, and Rutgers University are working together to identify the range of the ticks and develop a plan to eliminate the pest from Union County, the release stated.

After being discovered in November at the Hunterdon County farm, about 40 miles from the Union County location, it was confirmed to have overwintered in Hunterdon County on April 17.

Like deer ticks, the nymphs of the longhorned tick are very small and can easily go unnoticed on animals and people, the agriculture department said. This tick is known to infest a wide range of species and has the potential to infect multiple North Ameri-

Union man charged in \$2 million check fraud scheme

A Union man is one of two who have been charged for their alleged roles in a phony check scheme that stole over \$2 million in merchandise from multiple home-improvement stores throughout the country, according to a press release from the U.S. Prosecutor's Office in Newark announced.

Lessie Dickerson III, 33, of Union, and John Muyeka, 42, of Sayreville, were arraigned April 17 on an indictment accusing them of one count of conspiracy to commit wire fraud and two counts each of wire fraud. Muyeka is also charged with one count of producing false identification documents. Both defendants were arraigned before U.S. District Judge Katharine S. Hayden in Newark Federal Court and pleaded not guilty.

According to the U.S. Prosecutor's Office, starting in December 2013 and continuing through February 2017, several individuals, including Dickerson and Muyeka, conspired to obtain merchandise or store credit from home-improvement stores in locations along the eastern United States, including New Jersey, by purchasing items with fraudulent checks.

Muyeka allegedly produced false driver's licenses from New Jersey and other states using photographs of his conspirators, along with fictitious names, addresses and dates of birth, then provided the fraudulent identification documents to his conspirators.

Dickerson and others allegedly entered homeimprovement and other retail stores and purchased several high-value items like air conditioners or hardwood flooring with a fraudulent check with a phony name but authentic account and routing numbers, or by pretending to be an authorized signatory on a store credit account that Dickerson and others had previously opened with a phony check.

During some of the transactions, Dickerson and others allegedly displayed the fake driver's licenses that had been created by Muyeka, which either duplicated the phony name imprinted on the fraudulent check they presented for payment or matched the name of an authorized signatory on a store credit account that they had previously opened.

In total, Dickerson, Muyeka, and others allegedly stole more than \$2 million in merchandise from various retailers in New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Delaware, North Carolina, Georgia, Virginia, Connecticut, Massachusetts, South Carolina and Texas.

Dickerson and Muyeka each face 20 years in prison and a \$250,000 fine for the wire fraud charges. Muyeka faces 15 years imprisonment and a \$250,000 fine for the charge of producing false identification docu-

These criminal charges are mere accusations. A defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty in a court of law.

Find way to post comeback win over Brearley

ROSELLE PARK - Madison Hummel just completed seven innings of one-run pitching.

With her team down a run and just three outs away from its first loss, it was up her to get things going when she led off the bottom of the seventh,

After fouling off several pitches and down in the count, Hummel came through with a hit to center that she raced to second for a double.

If the ball had stayed up just a bit longer Hummel would have flied out to center.

Those types of things become magnified in a game when teams the caliber of Brearley and Roselle Park clash.

Four batters later and the bases loaded now with one out, Hummel would slide home with the tying run on a 6-2 fielder's choice hit by Paige Junior, with the throw home wide to the first base side.

Two batters later with the bases still loaded and now two down, leadoff batter Hailey Ortega walked on four pitches, sending home Junior from third and giving the undefeated Roselle Park softball team a 2-1 come-from-behind Union County Conference-Mountain-Division victory in Thursday's game played at Roselle Park High School.

Roselle Park improved to 12-0 overall and the defending champs led the UCC's Mountain Division at 7-0.

"I was pretty confident at the plate and knew I would hit the ball," Hummel said of her seventhinning at-bat that started the game-winning rally.

"I talked to my dad before my at-bat in the seventh and he told me not to swing at the first pitch," Junior said. "I knew I wasn't going to get a pitch as good as that to swing at again, so I did.

"It was kind of nerve-wracking on the bases. The ump was pretty consistent the way he was calling strikes. We all had faith in Hailey."

Brearley, which fell at home to Roselle Park 1-0 on April 14, had a four-game winning streak snapped and fell to 8-3 overall and 5-2 in the Mountain Division.

It was the second straight time Brearley lost in the bottom of the seventh at Roselle Park. The first time was by the score of 4-3 in last year's North 2, Group 1 state championship game.

Roselle Park improved to 5-0 in one-run games and produced its third win in its final at-bat.

The Panthers previously won games in the seventh inning on the road at Bridgewater-Raritan 5-4 on April 11 and at Metuchen 9-5 on April 19.

Both pitchers excelled, with Hummel – a junior right hander – tossing a six-hitter, while striking out 11 and walking one to improve to 10-0.

"We knew this would be a tough game," Hummel said. "I thought I pitched well even though I gave up those hits."

Brearley senior righty Michelle Capizzano allowed just three hits – the last two by Hummel – while striking out eight and walking three. Capizzano now has 501 strikeouts and 48 wins for her varsity career.

"Michelle pitched real well," said Brearley head coach Amy Efchak, at the helm of the Bears since 2003. "We got hits, but didn't get bunts down."

Six different Brearley players hit safely, including Capizzano, Caitlyn Ryan, Alyssa Filippone, Nikki Smith, Karyn Shimazu and Olivia Pate.

Hummel was 2-for-2, with a single, a double, a walk and a run. Ortega had Roselle Park's first hit, a two-out single to center in the third.

Hummell struck out the side in the first, while Capizzano pitched perfect innings in the first, second, fifth and sixth innings.

With two outs and a runner on first in the top of the first, Capizzano singled to center and then Ryan produced an opposite field RBI-single to right to give Brearley an early 1-0 lead.

"We worked with Caitlyn to go the other way and were happy when she got that hit to right field," Efchak said. "She had a good game."

That advantage stood up the whole game until the bottom of the seventh.

After Brearley third baseman Shimazu caught a foul ball with runners on second and third in the bottom of the seventh, the Bears were two outs away from handing Roselle Park its first loss.

So close - once again - for Brearley, yet so far.

"There's a lot of little things in a game like this," said Roselle Park head coach Fran Maggio, at the helm of the Panthers since 1997. "I told the girls that we're happy that we won, but that it could have gone the other way.

"Michelle Capizzano pitched great. It was just unfortunate for her that the game ended the way it did."

If these teams meet again in the Union County Tournament it would only be in the final, since they are on different sides of the bracket. They could meet once more in the North 2, Group 1 playoffs.

"Maybe next time," said Efchak, whose team last defeated Brearley two years ago. Roselle Park was 3-0 against Brearley last year and is now 2-0 so far this year.

"There's always the cat-and-mouse element to these games," Maggio said. "I thought Madison pitched well, although she got behind in the count a bit more and Brearley took advantage the way they hit the ball."

After hits by Smith and Shimazu produced runners on first and second with one out in the sixth, Hummel retired the next two Brearley batters on a strikeout and a ground ball back to her. "Madison got out of jams," Maggio said. "That's the key for us. Madison keeps us in the game even when she's not pitching her best."

UCT BASEBALL: JOHNSON AT GL IN THE QUARTERFINALS FOR THE SECOND STRAIGHT SEASON

When Johnson went to Berkeley Heights this time last year they faced a Governor Livingston baseball team that was 15-0, ranked No. 1 in the state for the first time and averaging nine runs.

Johnson's resume at the time read 7-7. The Crusaders rebounded from a 1-6 start to earn the Union County Tournament's ninth seed.

Defending champion GL, which captured the event for the first time in 2016, was the top seed and sought to repeat.

The winning team scored nine runs all right, but that squad was Johnson, not GL.

GL finished one of its most successful seasons at 26-4, even if it didn't include a second straight county championship.

As the month of May commenced, GL was 12-2-1 and on a roll again, winners of nine straight and 10-0-1 in its last 11 after winning Monday.

Johnson was 7-6 and had lost two of its last three after fashioning a four-game winning streak and winning six of seven following a 0-3 start.




